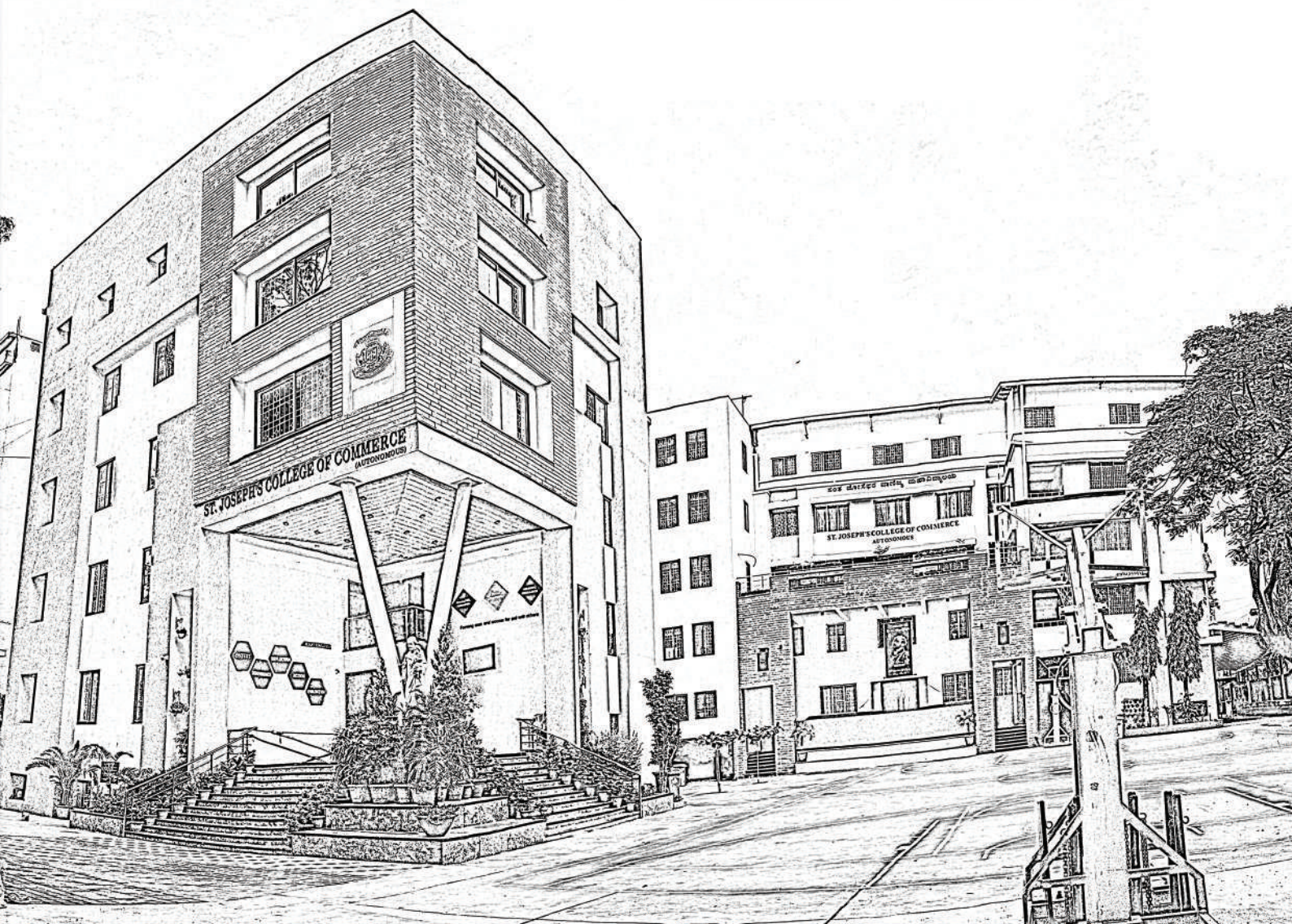

## A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE





## 1. A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

St. Joseph's College of Commerce (SJCC), formerly a part of St. Joseph's College, established in the year 1882, is managed by the Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES). The BJES is a unit of a Catholic religious order called the Society of Jesus founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola in 1540. The Department of Commerce was established at St. Joseph's College in the year 1949 which later became an independent college with its own building on Brigade road in the year 1972.

The college has in its vision a model for higher education which encourages individuals to dream of a socially just world and in its mission a strategy to empower individuals in realising that dream.

With an objective to impart quality education, the college has been innovating in all aspects of higher education. These innovations were further bolstered with the granting of autonomous status to the college by UGC in September, 2005. From then on, the college has taken a lead in reforming curriculum and syllabi, examination and evaluation pattern, and teaching and learning processes through the Board of Studies, the Academic Council, and the Governing Council composed of eminent academicians, industry experts, and notable alumni.

The college has undergone four cycles of NAAC accreditation starting from the year 2000 in which it secured 'five stars'. The college was graded an 'A' grade, in the year 2007 and 2012. and recently in February 2021 the college was re-accredited with an 'A++' grade and a CGPA of 3.57/4. SJCC is one of the first colleges in Karnataka and the very few institutions in the country to have secured A++ grade in the fourth cycle under the Revised Accreditation Framework (RAF). In 2010, the college was declared a 'College with Potential for Excellence'. In 2011, SJCC was recognised as a Research Centre by Bengaluru City University. The college is ranked 93rd in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) ratings of the Ministry of Education, Government of India in 2022.

Since its inception, the college has offered diverse programmes in Commerce and Management. In 2022, the college transitioned into a multidisciplinary college with the integration of two new undergraduate programmes: B.A. English (Hons) and B.Sc. Economics (Hons).

The college aims at holistic development of students fostering in them academic excellence, social concern, and character formation; shaping them to become "men and women for and with others". The motto of the College 'Fide et Labore' (Faith and Toil) serves as the foundation for the vision and mission of the college.

### 3. GOLDEN JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

The Golden Jubilee year was inaugurated on the College Day of the academic year 2021-22. Due to the constraints imposed by the second wave of the pandemic, the Golden Jubilee Celebrations Committee was constituted at the beginning of 2022. Academic and cultural programmes were organised around the core attributes of the institution namely, Academic Excellence, Character Formation and Social Concern.

During the academic year 2021-22 the college conducted a few academic and cultural programmes. The Department of Hindi organised a National Level Workshop, titled *Navalekhakh Prashikshan Shivir* in collaboration with Central Hindi Directorate, New Delhi, from April 28 to May 5, 2022. On May 11, 2022, the Postgraduate Department of Commerce organised a National Level Conference on *Decoding Contemporary Changes Affecting 21st Century Higher Education in India: In the context of NEP 2020*. The Department of Kannada organised a National Conference on *21st Shathamana Kannada Sahithya matthu Cinema Nayaka/ki Paathragalu (Emerging Protagonists of 21st Century – Kannada Literature and Film)* on May 5 and 6, 2022. The Hashmi Theatre Forum of the college staged the play *Knight of Dreams* on May 20, 2022 directed by Dr. T.H. Lavakumar on the legacy of the cannonball moment.

#### REPORT ON THE ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES 2022-23

The Golden Jubilee year witnessed an array of academic activities organised by all the departments of the college. The Academic Committee formed sub-committees to plan and organise national level seminars and conferences.

#### National Conclave by the Department of Commerce

*The National Conclave on Pedagogical Enhancement Under NEP 2020: Re-envisioning Industry and Academic Alliances* was held on October 17, 2022. The Chief Guest on the occasion was Shri Pradeep P, (IAS), Commissioner, Dept. of Collegiate Education and Technical Education, Government of India. Dr. Gowrisha, Professor & Director-CESS, Bangalore was the Guest of Honour. The Keynote Speaker for the day was Dr. Anand K. Joshi, Country Policy Advisor, ISDC. Dr. Charles Lasrado SJ, Principal, and Dr. Suganthi Pais, HoD, Commerce also addressed the participants during the inauguration.

The Conclave comprised of panel discussions on diverse topics. The first panel discussion mainly focused on the National Education Policy and its prospects with a multidisciplinary approach which integrates skill development as a significant component. Ms. Sumitra introduced the panellists — Dr. Vinod Kumar Murthy, Dr. Karan Kumar Shetty, Dr. Akash Pirgal, Dr. Philip Varghese and the moderator Mr. Ravi Richard to the participants.

The second panel discussion was curated around the theme of banking and insurance. Ms. Swetha Joseph, Assistant Professor at SJCC welcomed the panel members — Dr. Sharan Kumar Shetty, Mr. Ravi Richard, Mr. Vincent Arogyanadhan, and Mr. Satya Sidhartha Panda. The panellists shared their opinions on the importance of the banking industry. The speakers highlighted the significance of starting more NBFCs, small banks, and supporting these initiatives.

The third panel discussion designed around the theme of finance largely emphasized three areas — change, chance, and choice. The topics discussed included the framework NEP offers for Indian education to meet global standards, and elevate the student learning experience.

Mr. Braj Kishor Gupta made the opening remarks during the panel discussion on the theme of human resource. He opened the discussion by explaining the role of NEP in bridging the gap between academia and the industry. Mr. Girish Kumar pointed out that in today's world,



students need to mould themselves to suit the dynamic business world. Mr. Sam Joshua spoke about the scope of the NEP framework to support students to become efficient resource persons. Mr. Vignesh K.V. expressed that NEP is introduced to focus on the concept of a “growth mindset” — to seek out new challenges and accept failures as a part of the growth process.

The final panel discussion was conducted around the topic of marketing. The session focused on the pedagogical practices that institutions need to implement and develop to help students become industry ready. The discussion on marketing revolved around topics related to communication and basic skills like Excel and ERP. The panellists shared their perspectives on marketing, especially its influence as an integral component of a company.

### National Conference by the Department of Business Administration

The BBA Department of St. Joseph's College of Commerce organised a National Conference titled *Modelling Innovation and Efficient Management of Business in the Arena of Industry 5.0* on October 14, 2022. The conference commenced with the inaugural address by the Guest of Honour, Mr. Suresh Narasimha, Co-creator, Co-create Ventures. He shared his perspective on the importance of technology and innovation in the contemporary world. Mr. Suresh also spoke about his journey in founding different tech start-ups over the last two decades. Mr. Lokesh Venkataswamy, CEO, Managing Director & Design Thinker of Innomantra was the Chief Guest at the conference. He delivered the Keynote Address emphasizing the significance of artificial intelligence and its role in Industry 5.0.

The conference had three insightful technical sessions on different topics. The first technical session was steered by Mr. C. S. Sudheer, Founder and CEO, Freedom app, Indianmoney.com. During the session, he interacted with the participants on the topic *Transformational Leadership in the Age of Digitalisation*. The next session titled *Re-envisioning Talent Management for the 5th Industrial Revolution* was delivered by Mr. Girish Kumar, FIII Group CFO, Bhaghirathi Travels. The final technical session was steered by Mr. Ashwathanarayana Shastry, Managing Partner, 72 Degrees Consulting Services, LLP Ex-Associate, Vice President, Infosys Limited. He spoke about modelling human skills and interactions in the digital ecosystem. The conference also had research paper presentations in which research scholars from reputed institutions across the nation presented their papers.

### Panel Discussion and Art Exhibition by the Department of English

The Department of English, St. Joseph's College of Commerce, Bengaluru organised a one-day event *Subalternity on Streets* on September 28, 2022 as part of the Golden Jubilee Celebrations. The event was conducted in three sessions – a panel discussion, an art exhibition, and a musical evening.

The panel discussion included artists – Mr. Param from Chitrakala Parishath, Ms. Shanthi from Aravani Art Project and Mr. Jayasingh an independent photographer from Madurai. The panellists shared their journey of creating art in the public space. Also, the politics of art in the public space and accessibility of the same was discussed with reference to their work. The panelists emphasised on the democratisation of the public space to ensure the visibility of art forms from the margins. The second session of the day was an art exhibition and an interaction with the Bangalore-based muralist Ms. Girija. The organising team arranged a photo exhibition of her artwork. Ms. Girija shared the stories behind the creation of wall art in Malleshwaram. She also emphasised the need to create counter-narratives to question gender and caste oppression. Her artwork — Parijatham and its inception story were well received by the students.

The highlight of the evening was Kathala Haadu (Songs of the Dark) by Mr. Naada Maninalkur. The session comprised of intriguing songs and engaging conversations around spirituality and communal harmony, making it a surreal experience for the participants.

## SOCIAL OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) considers social outreach as an integral characteristic in forming women and men for and with others. For the institution's 50th year, a set of programmes were organised to mark its commitment to the marginalized and the vulnerable in society. For this, the institution's Social Outreach Activity Committee worked towards setting up community libraries, conducting awareness programmes on financial literacy among rural women and youth, and providing support to nomadic tribes settled in both rural and urban Bengaluru.

The committee held a series of discussions and deliberations to develop a plan of action to reach out to the marginalised communities. The plan included setting up community libraries in villages to assist young students. The institution collaborated with Shramana Shraddha Kendra and Shramana Sanskurti Trust, Tippur, Doddaballapura. Shramana Trust has been working for the past few years with the mission of raising educational and cultural awareness among the communities in Doddaballapur.

### Community Library: A Collaborative Venture

The community library was envisioned as a collaborative venture between St. Joseph's College of Commerce and Shramana Shraddha Kendra. The Doddaballapur taluk was selected for the community library project as the institution has had a long-standing association with the villages in the taluk through the NSS rural camps organised there.

Shramana Samskurti Trust helped locate an unused building in Channaveeranahalli, Doddaballapur taluk for the community library with the approval of the local panchayat. The primary objective of the library was to reach the many school dropouts who had no access to further education. The village youth along with the students of SJCC helped build the library. The library was painted colourfully and a little garden was added to attract the children of the villages around. The NSS volunteers were also an active part of the project and they organised a book drive in the college where around 500 books were donated to the library.

### Institutional Support to the Library

The institution appointed three coordinators, Mr. Kemprij, Mr. Irfan, and Ms. Arpitha to manage the library and conduct community intervention activities in select villages of Doddaballapur taluk. The college also funded the procurement of book racks, stationery items, books, a computer, and provided honorarium to the library coordinators.

### Training for Library Coordinators

A series of workshops were conducted for the library coordinators to help them run the community library. The coordinators were responsible for encouraging children to visit the library. They designed a time schedule for the library and conducted several engaging activities for the students.

### Inauguration of the Library

The community library at Channaveeranahalli, Doddaballapur taluk was inaugurated on July 17, 2022 by Fr. Charles Lasrado, SJ, Fr. Pradeep Anthony, S.J, Mr. Venkataramanaiah, the MLA of Doddaballapura taluk, Mr. Lokesh, Government school teacher, and the community members of Channaveeranahalli. The inauguration event was covered in the state and local newspapers.



## Independence Day Celebrations

On August 15, 2022, Independence Day was celebrated in Channaveeranahalli of Doddaballapura taluk at the community library. Along with the flag hoisting, the community library volunteers spread awareness regarding the importance of education towards building a prosperous community and nation. Activities and games were conducted for the student users of the library.

## Community Library: Sustainability of an Idea

Through the community library, the Social Outreach Committee attempted to build a sustainable social venture. This project was designed as a sustainable venture where the institution provides support for a period of ten months. The library coordinators were trained to develop a plan to sustain the community library. The future of the community library will be monitored and documented by the institution and will remain committed to provide support in the form of guidance and mentoring when required.

## Health Awareness Drive

On November 2, 2022, a health awareness drive on menstruation was conducted along with free distribution of menstrual cups to women in Channaveeranahalli and Tippur. This awareness programme was led by SJCC in association with the Shahi Garment Union and Shramana Samskurti Trust. Health experts spoke during this drive in which roughly 200 women participated and said that the health of rural women is very important for the progress of the country and that governments should make serious efforts in this regard. Ms. Annapoorna shared information on the management of menstrual period and the use of 'menstrual cup' which is a sustainable option.

## Akshara Swatantra: Book Distribution Drive

The Social Outreach Committee recognised that students in Doddaballapur had academic requirements and organised a book distribution drive called 'Akshara Swatantra'. From the college library's inventory, certain books in good condition were selected and segregated to be withdrawn. On August 2, 2022, the books were transported to Government First Grade College in Doddaballapur to be distributed to B.Com and M.Com students. Students were allowed to pick any two books of their choice. The book distribution drive was highly appreciated by the Principal, staff, and students.

## STAFF WELFARE ACTIVITIES

### Staff Team Building

On June 27, 2022, a staff outing was planned for both academic and non-academic staff. The members visited AREA 83, a resort off Bannerghatta road. The outing helped the staff build stronger connections through team-building activities while also providing a window to relax. On October 30, 2022, the non-teaching staff of the institution was taken for a 3 days trip to Delhi.

### Workshops

- A Financial Literacy Workshop was organised for the support staff on April 5, 2022. Mr. Ashoka T.A. and Dr. Hanumantharaya were the resource persons for the workshop.
- A Microsoft Excel Skill Development Workshop was organised for the administrative staff on April 20, 2022. Mr. Kumaresan, the System Administrator at SJCC, and Mr. Ramesh Babu Grandhi, Assistant Professor at SJCC were the resource persons.

## Mementoes and Merchandise

The Memento and Merchandise Committee was involved in obtaining and distributing custom designed stationery items, mementos, and memorabilia. The committee distributed diaries with flap, spiral notebooks, folders, pens, flasks, jackets, and mugs.

## Countdown to the Closing Ceremony of Golden Jubilee

A series of events relating to the core attributes of SJCC, namely, Academic Excellence, Character Formation and Social Concern were organised leading up to the closing ceremony.

## Roundtable Conference

The institution hosted a Roundtable Conference on *Global Professional Education: Developing Leaders for an Inclusive Society* on October 19, 2022. The conference brought together pioneers of global professional education from the field of accountancy and management. National and international heads of professional bodies, Principals, Deans, Registrars and Professional Programme Coordinators from other colleges, select industry representatives were also part of the conference. The session began with a welcome address and prayer. The Provincial of Karnataka Jesuit Province and the President of BJES, Fr. Dionysius Vaz SJ, delivered the inaugural address online. He emphasised the role of higher education institutions in creating transformational leaders for an inclusive society. CA Chethan Venugopal, the moderator, gave the introductory address which underlined the need for an inclusive leader who creates platforms with substantial representation from the marginalized communities in decision-making.

The panel members discussed the preparedness of professional bodies, higher education institutions, and the industry in working towards inclusive and sustainable growth. The panel deliberated on the need for providing holistic education within professional programmes and how professional programmes can prepare students in taking up leadership positions in





business/governmental organisations. The panel discussion emphasised a dynamic learning environment that equips students to forge their career paths and develop critical skills and global competencies that can help them become transformational leaders. The session ended with the moderator summarizing the deliberations.

### Paraspara: Celebrating Cultural Diversity

Cultural diversity, social inclusion, and concern for the marginalised have been regarded as a fundamental characteristic of SJCC. The initiatives undertaken by the extension and outreach associations have enabled the institution in weaving its learning ecosystem around social concern. During the course of its year-long Golden Jubilee Celebrations, a cultural festival named 'Paraspara' was organised involving artists and artisans who practise marginalised art forms. This cultural festival was held on November 3, 2022. Renowned folk artist and the first transgender Chairperson of Karnataka Janapada Academy, Padma Shri Manjamma Jogathi was the Chief Guest for the event.

The college hosted and provided a platform to various artisans performing art forms that are on the verge of extinction due to increased digitilisation. These artists are supported by different Non-governmental Organisations (NGO). NGOs such as Parampara, Chethana, Nallah, Agasthya Foundation, Ajjiya Aramane, Guledgudda, and the Charaka Collective were invited to exhibit their artwork. The event was curated by Dr. Kuruva Basavaraj, a prominent member at Janapada Loka. A clay art workshop, conducted by Mr. Sandeep was one of the highlights of Paraspara.

The faculty members Mr. Prakash Raju, Dr. Christina Aroojis, and Mr. Ashoka T. A. were the convenors of this cultural festival. The faculty members in the organising committee consisted of – Dr. T. ### Details of the Folk-Art Groups

**Devara Kallalli**, performed by Mr. Girish and team is from the Siddi tribal group mostly residing in coastal districts of Karnataka.

**Hejje Mela**, also called Muharram songs. Led by Mr. Hidayath and team, the performance showcased the desire and need for Hindu-Muslim spiritual coexistence.

**Manteswamy Kavya** is a popular artform in regions like – Mandya, Mysore, Chamarajanagar and Ramanagara. The performers, through the songs chronicle the miracles of Manteswamy who lived in the fifteenth century. This folk art performance was led by Mr. Neelagara Siddaraju and team.

**Doddaata**, a combination of music and dance usually performed after harvest is a unique art form presented by Mr. Basavaraj Shiggao and his team.

### Animum – A Short Film Festival on Mental Health

The Latin word 'ANIMUM', refers to the 'mind' or 'soul'. ANIMUM, is a short film festival, conceptualised to educate and sensitise the larger public towards issues related to mental health. Combining the powerful techniques of storytelling and filmmaking, it provided a platform for creators to narrate experiences about mental health issues. This year, the film

festival carried the theme 'Mental Health Among Emerging Adults'.

Two categories, both the students and the public were invited to submit entries for the film festival, ANIMUM. Registrations were open for participants from various parts of India from September 30, 2022. The festival received a total of 81 registrations pan India – 10 in the public category and 71 in the student category. On November 1, 2022, in the preliminary round of screening, an invited jury of 3 members comprising Fr. Pradeep Anthony SJ, Visual Media Expert; Mr. Samson Roy, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Psychology, Sampurna Montfort College; and Ms. Rajeshwari Muthukumaran, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Psychology, Christ Deemed-to-be University, shortlisted 17 films for the grand finale.

The final round of screening was held on November 4, 2022 which began with a short inaugural with the members of the grand jury – Ms. Rachel David, actress; Mr. Rajesh PI, Director and actor; Dr. Ashwini N V, founder of Muktha Foundation. The inaugural was followed by the screening of the 17 shortlisted movies. Around 250 participants attended the interactive masterclass on filmmaking by Mr. S D Arvind, a renowned movie director from the Kannada film industry. This was followed by an elaborate Q&A session where participant queries about filmmaking were addressed by Mr. Arvind. **Academic Performance Index (API) Task Force:** The Academic Performance Index (API) Task Force was established with the objective of framing the parameters for the Faculty Academic Performance Indicators (FAPI). The framework for considering the performance appraisal of the faculty members was formulated taking into consideration the UGC Regulations (2018) and the ethos of SJCC. The Faculty Academic Performance Indicators (FAPIs) are processed under the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) for the purpose of promotion of the teaching fraternity. FAPI Scores are proposed based on the teacher's self-assessment. The minimum FAPI score required by teachers varies for different levels of promotion in the Institution. The self-assessment scores are based on objectively verifiable records. It is then finalised by the Screening and Selection Committee. The College constituted an internal committee to develop an Academic Performance Index model to be implemented at SJCC. The API model being developed is in accordance with the UGC guidelines, customised as per the requirements of the institution.

### Welfare Measures for the Staff

BJES as well as the College management endeavours to persistently make the work environment better in all its institutions and considers the respective staff feedback and suggestions for the better and improved functioning of its institutions.

In addition to that, the college ensures that the teaching and non-teaching staff work with a sense of solidarity. The college management organised an extensive faculty development programme for its teaching staff from March 8-11, 2023. A faculty trip to Mumbai from Cochin was planned and various team-building activities were a part of the programme.

### E-governance in institutional operations

The institution has adopted appropriate measures to ensure effective workflow and carries out administrative activities efficiently with its state-of-the-art information system and electronic communication services (via the Internet and intranet). For this purpose, the institution has a suitable ERP system with a well-designed policy. The ERP system ensures agility of the operating environment including software and hardware infrastructure.

### Financial Management and Resource Mobilisation

The institution has developed a rigorous system for the management of financial transactions. The Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES), which runs the institution, has constituted a financial committee that approves the budget of the institution, conducts periodic internal audits, monitors the financial transactions, and resource mobilisation.

The Finance Committee of the institution prepares the annual budget based on the specific needs of the institution wherein various departments predict major expenses for renovation and maintenance of the building and allocate the required budget, evaluate and implement the approved budget. The budget is then presented to the Governing Board of Management and once the board approves, it is sent to the President for approval. The President gives his comments and approves the budget. After incorporating suggestions, the budget is finalised.

### Accounting Practice

The Finance Officer is responsible for managing and overseeing the financial operations of the institution. This includes budgeting, financial planning, financial reporting, and ensuring compliance with regulations and policies. They also work with other departments to ensure



that financial resources are being used effectively and efficiently. In terms of authorisation, the Finance Officer is the authorised signatory for financial transactions and documents, and manages financial data from the organisation.

### Finance Audit

The internal audit was carried out by a group of three professionals appointed by the BJES during the academic year. The audit for 2022-23 was done for the books of account for the financial year 2021-22. The interim audit was done from February 2, 2022 to February 11, 2022 and the final audit was done from June 6, 2022 to June 13, 2022.

### Mobilisation of funds and the optimal utilisation of resources

The college identifies fees as a primary source of income. Other key sources of funding include:

- UGC funding through UGC management-sponsored research
- UGC MRP grants
- College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) grants
- Special assistance grants under the 12th plan
- Autonomy grant from UGC ICSSR

Additional funds are gathered through the below-mentioned means:

- Fees from the self-financed programmes offered by the college
- Revenue from the government and private educational exams, conducted in our well-equipped classrooms
- The well-maintained infrastructure of the college enables us to let our space for professional programmes during the break between semesters.
- The computer centre also generates revenue as it is allowed for professional use by other companies or institutions.
- The auditorium has also been used for various programmes. Service charges are levied for the college playground and auditoriums when it is used by the public.
- A list of funding sources is maintained to keep track of all transactions to enable back-tracking whenever necessary.
- At the time of admissions, parents of students are given an Appeal Letter, requesting them to contribute towards the mid-day meal scheme of the college through sponsorship.
- Additionally, a few parents sponsor the fees of other underprivileged students and help the institution in terms of its resources.
- Industries and the alumni association of the college extend their financial assistance to the college by sponsoring students and awarding them with scholarships.
- The endowment of funds by the alumni helps the college disburse the money to deserving students coming from economically and socially backward sections of society.

Students of the college also raise funds for cultural activities and reach out to people affected by natural calamities. The college prepares a budget for all the grants received in order to ensure effective utilisation of the fund.

## 6. A REPORT ON INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) plays a vital role in maintaining high academic standards. IQAC sets the benchmark for pedagogical practices and holistic development of the student community that transcend traditional classroom lectures. IQAC also monitors research, extension and consultancy activities.

### Quality Initiatives of IQAC

#### Rankings of the Institution

IQAC facilitated the collection and submission of data for the annual ranking procedures of the institution under the *Times of India-BBA Institute Ranking India Today Ranking, the Week Ranking, and the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF)*. With the active involvement of the Ministry of Education's Innovation Cell (IIC), the IQAC also successfully submitted the institution's data for the *Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements (ARIIA)* rating, which is an initiative by the central government. It has consistently maintained its ARIIA rating under the non-technical institutions of the country.

#### IT audit

The IT audit happens once in two years and it was done by the IQAC on May 25, 2022. Dr. Butchi Babu Muvva was the external audit expert. The report of the audit was submitted to the Principal. The IT department integrated the recommendations made during the IT audit.

#### Feedback on Curriculum

Feedback from the staff members on the curriculum was initiated by IQAC with the help of the Heads of the Departments.

#### Feedback from Stakeholders

Feedback from the stakeholders such as alumni, parents and students was initiated. The compiled report was submitted to the Principal for further analysis and consideration.

#### Staff evaluation

Staff evaluation for the odd and the even semesters was conducted by IQAC. All the students studying in the various undergraduate and postgraduate programmes participated in the same.

#### Students Progression Report

Every year, IQAC records data of students' progression to higher education and the placement of outgoing students.

#### Orientation of SQAC

The nominated members of the Student Quality Assurance Cell (SQAC) for the year 2022-23 were oriented through a guest lecture Leadership Qualities for Young Leaders on October 20, 2022. The speaker for the session was Mr. Robin Vivian Frank, a faculty member of St. Aloysius College Bangalore.



## Activities of IQAC

- The IQAC newsletter was published in December 2022
- IQAC has submitted the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) 2021-22 of the institution.
- The AISHE report for the year 2020-21 was submitted in January 2023. AISHE, the All India Survey on Higher Education, is a Ministry of Human Resource Development initiative
- The Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS), Student Progression Survey, and Exit Survey of the final year undergraduate and postgraduate students were conducted in March 2023. The surveys and the exit interviews are annually conducted by IQAC.
- A day-long workshop on the various welfare schemes of the Central Government was conducted for the administrative and support staff on March 8, 2023, by Mr. Louis Chandrakanth, Finance Consultant, TCS, Bangalore. The workshop helped the administrative staff in planning their savings and investments.
- IQAC annually conducts open mic sessions for the students to enhance the quality of teaching and learning. Along with a common open mic a separate session of ladies' open mic is conducted as well, students address their concern in the open mic session. The open mic session includes the IQAC Coordinator and the Vice Principals. IQAC was instrumental in implementing various quality initiatives on campus based on the previous years' open mic session.

## NAAC Sponsored National Conference on *Innovation and Quality Enhancement in Higher Education Institutions in the Context of the National Education Policy-2020*

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of SJCC organised the NAAC sponsored One Day National Level Conference on April 17, 2023, with participation from several colleges across India. The theme of the conference was to outline the vision for a new educational system in India and make an attempt to answer the question of how NEP 2020 will serve as a milestone in achieving the country's inclusive development goals in the field of higher education. Dr. Charles Lasrado SJ, Principal delivered the welcome address and stressed the relevance of the conference in today's context of education. ## 7. CURRICULAR ASPECTS

### Curriculum Design and Development

The institution is dedicated to educating students in the fields of Commerce, Business, Arts, and Science alongside ensuring that they grow into self-aware individuals committed to social causes. The implementation of the Outcome-Based Education (OBE) model within the framework of NEP in the institution since the academic year 2021-22, synthesises the teaching and research experience of the faculty and guides the process of designing and developing the curriculum. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) helps enhance students' knowledge across different disciplines of study.

The various stakeholders of the institution are involved in the designing of the curriculum and the latest developments in the fields are taken into consideration for developments in the same. The alumni, subject experts and industry professionals are actively involved in the development of the curriculum to ensure that it is updated and benefits all the stakeholders of the institution.

### National Education Policy 2020

The State Government Task Force suggested NEP-2020 Implementation Framework for the higher educational institutions in Karnataka. The same had been revised from time to time with respect to courses and credits offered by the various programmes at the college. The NEP Committee had been active in meeting and ensuring the incorporation of the revised changes and disseminating the same to higher-ups in the Institution. The Committee had verified and suggested changes to the Model Programme Structures of all the undergraduate programmes before the syllabi were presented at the respective Board of Studies meetings. The NEP Committee organised regular meetings with the Heads of the Departments to review the road map of the programme and course structures for successive years.

For a better understanding of the NEP framework, members attended a one-day workshop and a two-day conference organised by Bengaluru City University (BCU) and the Centre for Educational and Social Studies (CESS)—the driving body for NEP, respectively. On May 11, 2022, the committee facilitated a *National Conference on Decoding Contemporary Changes Affecting 21st Century Higher Education in India: In the Context of NEP- 2020* was organised by the Post Graduate Department of Commerce. On October 17, 2022, the Department of Commerce organised a National Conclave on *Pedagogical Enhancement under NEP 2020: Re-envisioning Industry and Academia Alliances*. The NEP team addressed the first-year students during the Orientation Programme about the revised curriculum framework, the exit options, and the academic credit system established.

### Outcome-Based Education (OBE)

The institution follows the Outcome-Based Education (OBE) model of learning to redesign its curriculum, teaching-learning processes, and assessment. In order to create an outcome-based curriculum, the institution's specific Programme Education Objectives (PEOs) were designed. The PEOs led to the development of Programme Learning Outcomes (PLOs). PEOs and PLOs form the base of curriculum development containing multiple courses, each with specific objectives. Course objectives help in deriving the Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs), the competencies required, and indicators of the same.

### Multidisciplinary Approach

The four-year undergraduate honours programmes at SJCC offer a wide range of multidisciplinary programmes. Ability, vocational, professional and skill enhancement



opportunities are also offered by each programme. The four-year honours programmes across the disciplines of Commerce, Management, Arts, and Science combine conceptual understanding with practical engagement through lab courses, national and international field visits, internships, conferences, workshops, seminars, case study analysis, group discussions and research projects. The students can make a choice of two specialisations /electives in the fifth and sixth semesters and choose one of the specialisations/electives in the seventh semester to pursue the honours degree in that specialisation/elective.

### Academic Bank of Credits(ABC)

The college is recognised and registered under the National Academic Depository (NAD) and the students' academic records will be updated in the depository starting from the 2021 batches of the UG programmes.

The Open Elective syllabi on Mental Health and Well-being, and Building Emotional Intelligence to be offered to the BBA and the B.Com students were introduced and passed by

#### Brief Report

The Board of Studies meeting approved the course on Corporate Internship, Management Concepts & Organisational Behaviour for M.Com (IB), Introduction to Data Science and Python for Data Science for the PGD-ERP, Corporate Financial Management for PGDFM and PGDBA, Accounts and Finance for Managers for PGDBA, Strategic Brand Management & Marketing Communications, Data Science Applications – Sales & Marketing for PGDMM, Strategic Human Resource Management and International Human Resource Management (Including Training and Development), Data Science Applications – Human Resource Management and Compensation, Benefits and Labour Legislations for PGDHRM. The Panel of Examiners for the End Semester Examination was approved by the Board of Studies. The Board of Studies also recommended two external BoS members to the Academic Council for the academic year (2023-2024).

### Curriculum Enrichment

Holistic development of students is an important aspect of the institution's education. With professional programmes like BBA Entrepreneurship, ACCA, BPM (Industry Integrated), B.Com (Analytics), and B.Com (Travel and Tourism) the students widen their scope of employability. The curriculum is enriched with programmes like Advanced Excel, Tally, SPSS Digital fluency, Artificial Intelligence, SAP, Yoga, Environmental Studies, Indian Constitution and Psychological Well-being to give them hands-on experience with skills and creates a multi-dimensional perspective in them augmenting holistic development of students.

Industrial visits, international student exchange programmes and live projects, and exposure to the business world are embedded components of the curriculum. Furthermore, research culture is an integral aspect of the curriculum. Dissertations and minor and major research projects make students industry-ready and manifest the institution's holistic approach towards education. (Details to be found in the Teaching, Learning and Evaluation unit of this report)

### Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs)

The students of SJCC enroll in various interdisciplinary courses offered in the NPTEL SWAYAM portal. The duration of the courses enrolled for 8 weeks comprises weekly assignments. Currently, MOOCs are offered as Open Elective courses only to the 2nd Semester students and there are 163 students enrolled under MOOCs. Students started enrolling for MOOCs in June 2021, for the odd semester 2021-2022. There were a few mandatory specifications for the students to follow while enrolling for the courses in SWAYAM. The same was followed for even semesters as well. It is communicated to students who enrolled for the MOOCs that it is mandatory to take up the examination scheduled in SWAYAM to become eligible for receiving the certificate.

*Evaluation Procedure:* On completion of the weekly assignments and satisfying the criteria as per the course, the students are required to take up a final exam in a centralised examination centre. The assignments consist of 25% of their overall grade and the final examination consists of 75% of the overall grade.

**Status of Completion:** The above students are preparing to take up their final examination in the centralised examination centres, in the months of March and April, 2023. On successful completion, the students submit their certificate to the MOOCs coordinator and the marks are updated accordingly. A total of 66 students from the Odd semester were yet to take up the final examination. Out of these, 21 students have completed in January 2023. For the remaining students, follow-ups are being done to ensure completion at the earliest.

### Student-centric learning experiences

The learning experience of students at this college is the result of a well-designed teaching-learning process. The needs, interests, and capabilities of students are the primary factors in designing the pedagogy. The college aims to develop competencies such as critical thinking and problem-solving skills through student-centric teaching-learning methods. The teacher, in this context, acts as a facilitator who enhances the learning experience of the students. Experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies are some of the important student-centric methods of teaching-learning practiced in this College.

**Experiential Learning:** The College prioritises learning through experience and has created student-centric learning programmes such as industrial visits, internship programmes (social, corporate, and start-up internships), workshops, outreach programmes, rural exposure programmes, social visits, etc.

**Participative Learning:** To develop innovative as well as creative thinking skills among students, participative learning and applying problem-solving methodologies in the teaching pedagogy has been adopted. Activities under this include student seminars, group discussions, debates, quizzes organised as part of CIA, flipped classrooms (students are expected to go through the reading materials and come prepared for a classroom discussion), exhibitions by students, student clubs and associations activities aid in student participative learning as the activities are planned and executed by the students under the guidance of faculty members.

**Problem-Solving Methodologies:** Problem-solving methodologies are an integral part of all courses in all programmes. Along with theoretical explanations, practical knowledge is imparted to the students through practical courses like Tally, Excel, SPSS, and SAP which employ hands-on learning methods. Students are encouraged to take up Research Projects in which they need



to identify a research problem and apply problem-solving techniques learnt in the classroom to the problem. Book reviews and case studies are introduced in class. Library-based assignments like open-text tests and research-based library work for students are practiced.

## Teaching Processes

In addition to the above modes used for student-centric learning, teaching methods like Shared Teaching practice and the utilisation of technology through the use of LMS help students enhance their learning experience.

## Technology in Teaching

All classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors and the teachers make effective use of them to blend audio-visual content in classroom teaching. With innovative teaching methods utilising ICT like webinars, Edmodo, MOOCs, Moodle, and Coursera, the students gain knowledge through various online educational platforms as well. The academic performance of students, attendance records, and engagement in co-curricular and sporting activities are tracked by students, parents, and the faculty using the online ERP portal.

## Learning Management System (LMS)

Learning Management Systems (LMS) provide a platform for teachers and students to integrate various aspects of learning. Such a platform allows the students to track their learning levels and the faculty to innovate teaching strategies. The institution uses Linways software and MS Teams

as its learning management system. LMS like Moodle, Google Classroom, and Edmodo are used by teachers to provide instruction, conduct tests, and supply reading materials and links to online content. Technology is used in an efficient manner to enrich the learning experience for students.

#### Centre for Digital Education and Learning (CDLE)

The institution has taken an initiative to incorporate blended learning or a fully online approach in the teaching-learning process to transform the teaching pedagogy and the learning experience of the students. In order to bring in this transformation, the Centre for Digital Learning and Education (CDLE) was established in August 2022. CDLE would facilitate the development of online courses and their respective content. The centre has planned to eventually integrate video lectures developed and delivered by the institution's faculty members, reading materials to supplement classroom teaching, regular tasks assigned by the teachers, and examination and evaluation processes in a single online platform.

## 9. DEPARTMENT OF EXAMINATIONS REPORT

The Department of Examinations at St. Joseph's College of Commerce arranged a series of meetings with the various stakeholders at different levels to discover the scope for reforming the evaluation process and the various functions of the Department of Examinations. Meetings were conducted with the Exam Committee and the Total Quality Management team for planning and executing the examination processes and for the proper conduct of the exams smoothly. An orientation to students was done to familiarise the modality, rules, and regulations of the end-semester exams.

### Registration at National Academic Depository (NAD)

The college is one of the 100 eligible HEIs in the country to have registered under the National Academic Depository (NAD) this year. The institution has planned to upload the documents in a phased manner from the NEP batches of 2021 UG programmes. All other batches would be subsequently added. The college is awaiting the final approval from NAD after which the next step would begin. This would generate the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) IDs for the students and would further help them in the smooth transfer of their academic records to the ABC portal. The records available in the ABC portal would be available to the student for redemption of a Diploma/Certificate/Degree nationwide. The same academic records would also be deposited in the NAAC portal for online or digital verification purposes. The same could be used by the students for applying for higher studies or producing during job interviews.

### Golden Jubilee Initiative

On the occasion of the Golden Jubilee, the college has offered a golden chance to all the batches from 2008 to 2017. The Department of Examinations reached out to 29 students who could not complete their respective degrees within the time period of five years commencing from their admission. They have now been granted permission to complete their pending degrees. The proposal from the Department of Examinations was deliberated, discussed, and approved by the Total Quality Management (TQM), the Academic Council and the Governing Council. The students have registered for appearing in the exams and are in the process of completing their subjects for both the odd and the even semesters.

### IT Integration in Examination Processes

- Best answer scripts of the previous semesters' are kept in the library for reference by the students.
- The Department of Examinations appreciates the achievers with special certificates to encourage and motivate the students to do better.

- Used answer scripts are sent for recycling.

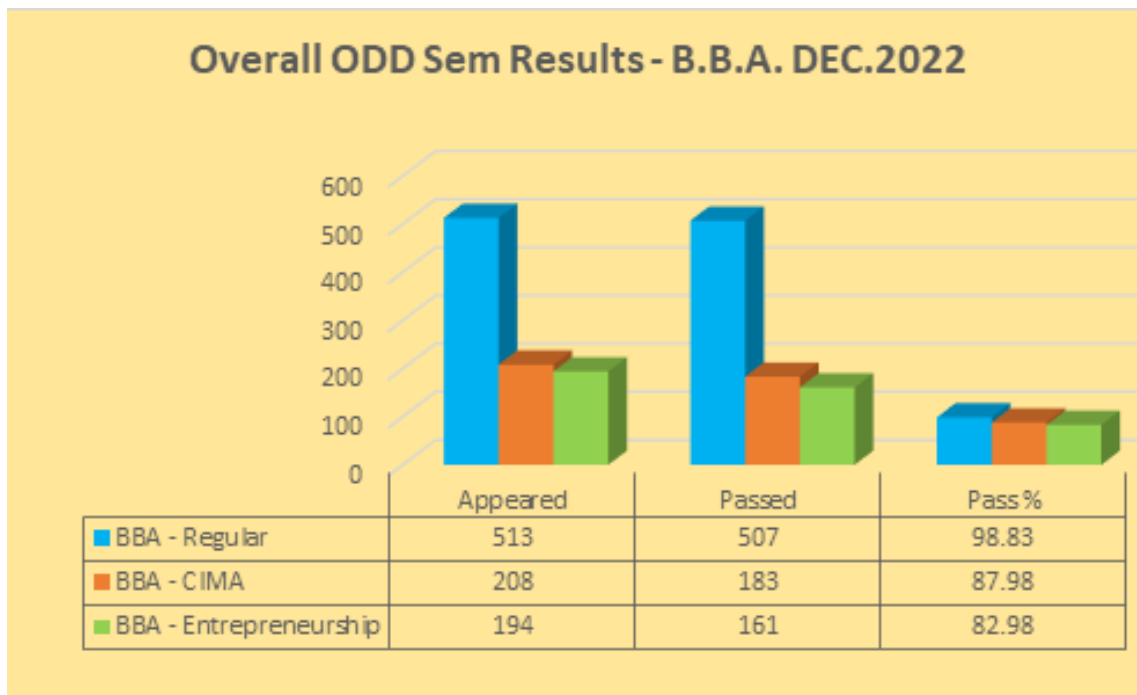
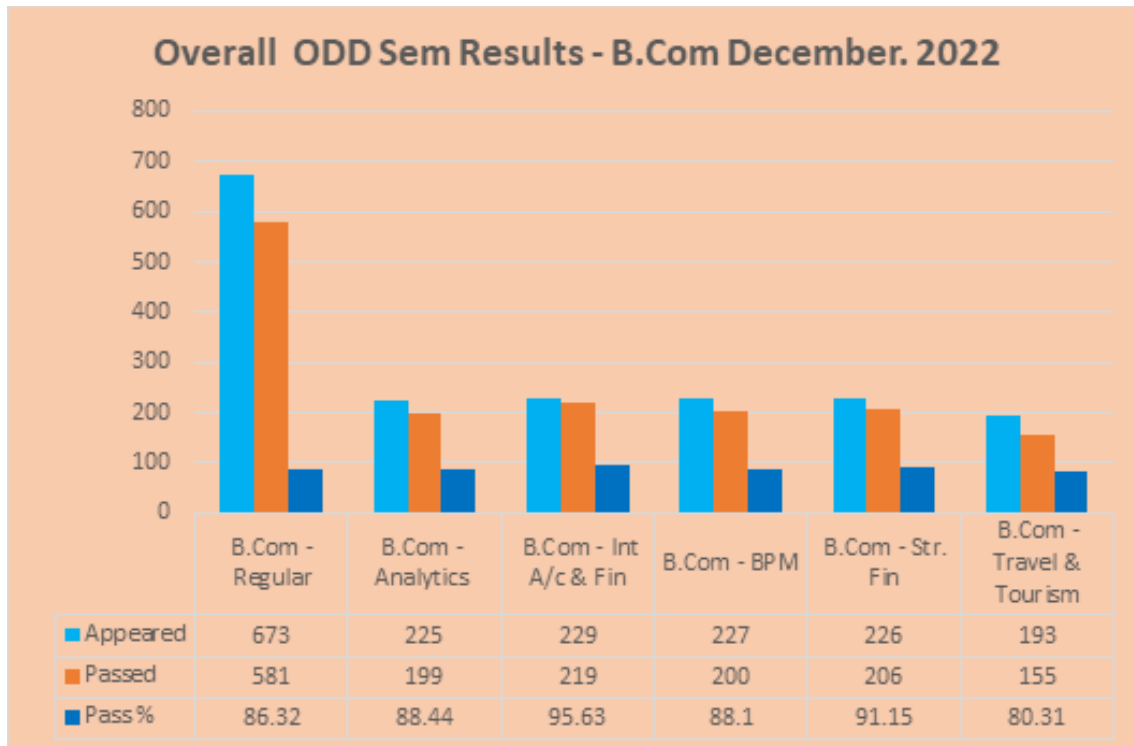

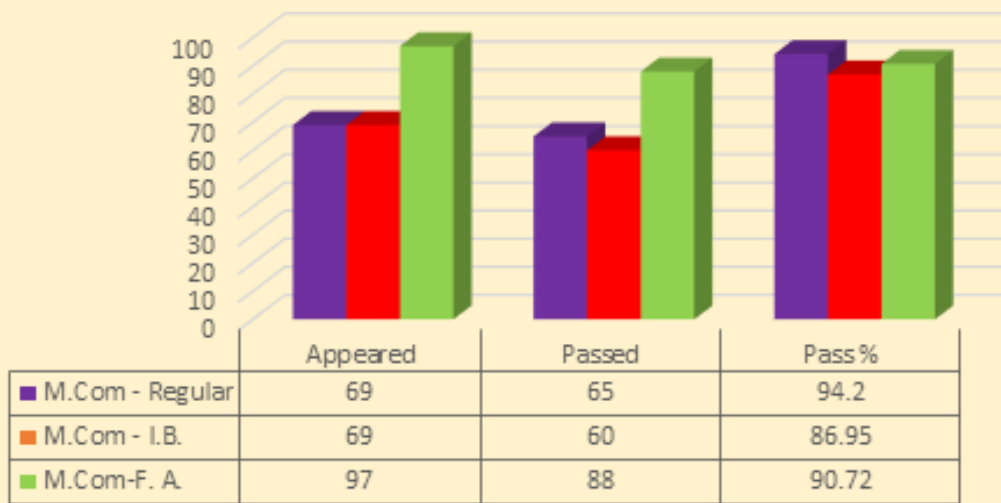
## Analysis of Odd Semester Results-December 2022



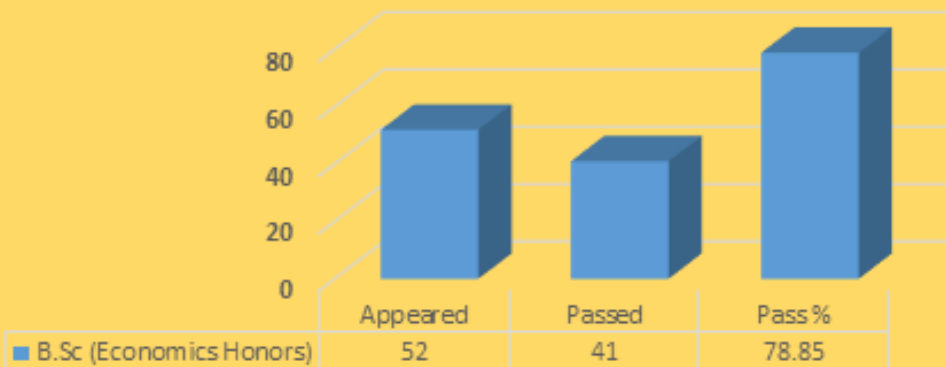




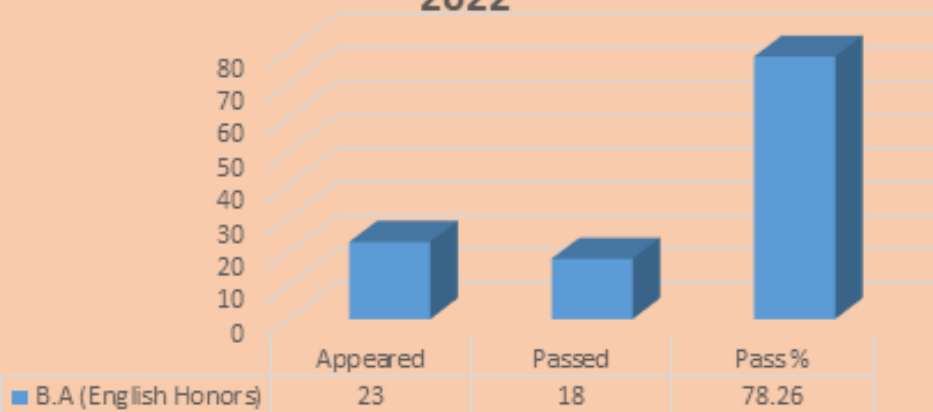
### Overall ODD Sem Results - M.Com DEC. 2022

### Odd Sem Results B.A (English Honors) Dec. 2022



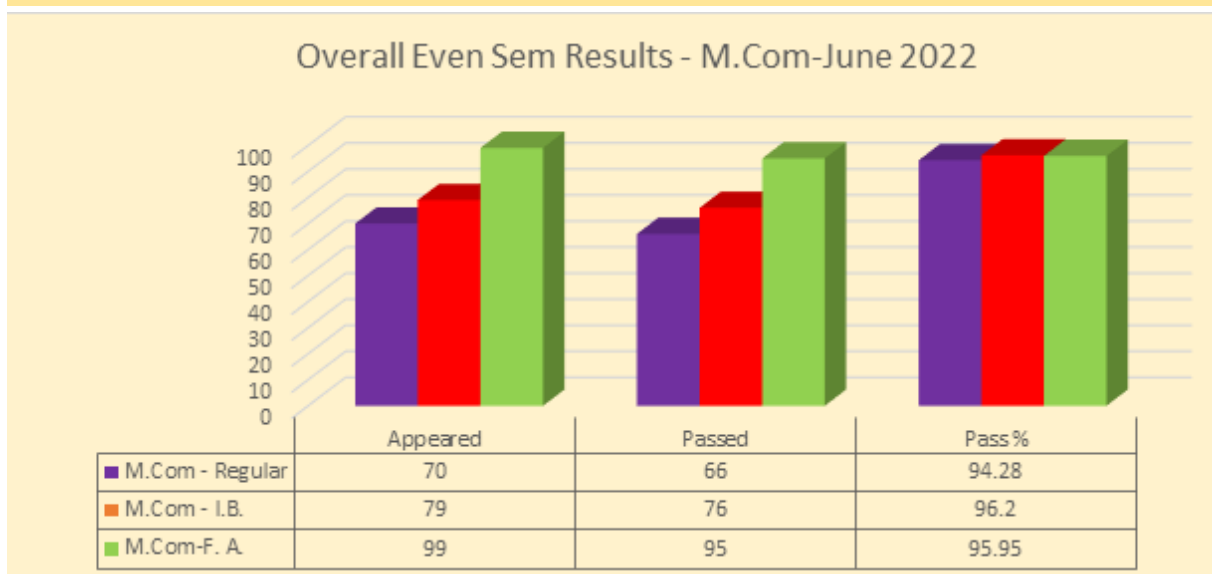
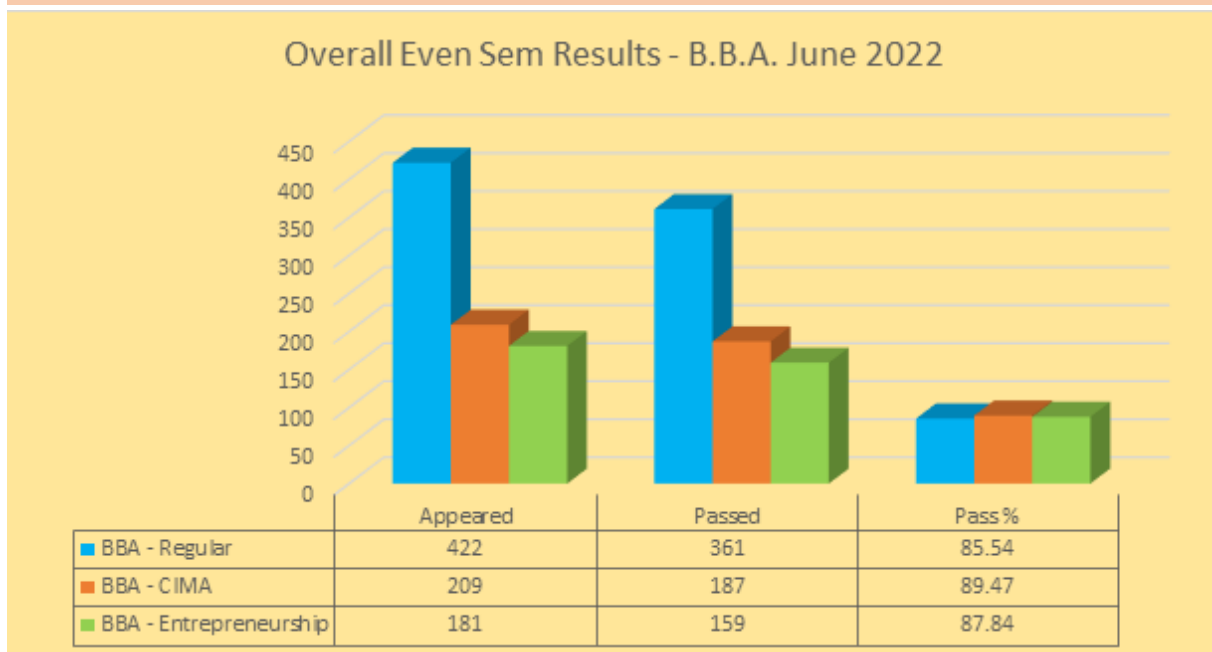
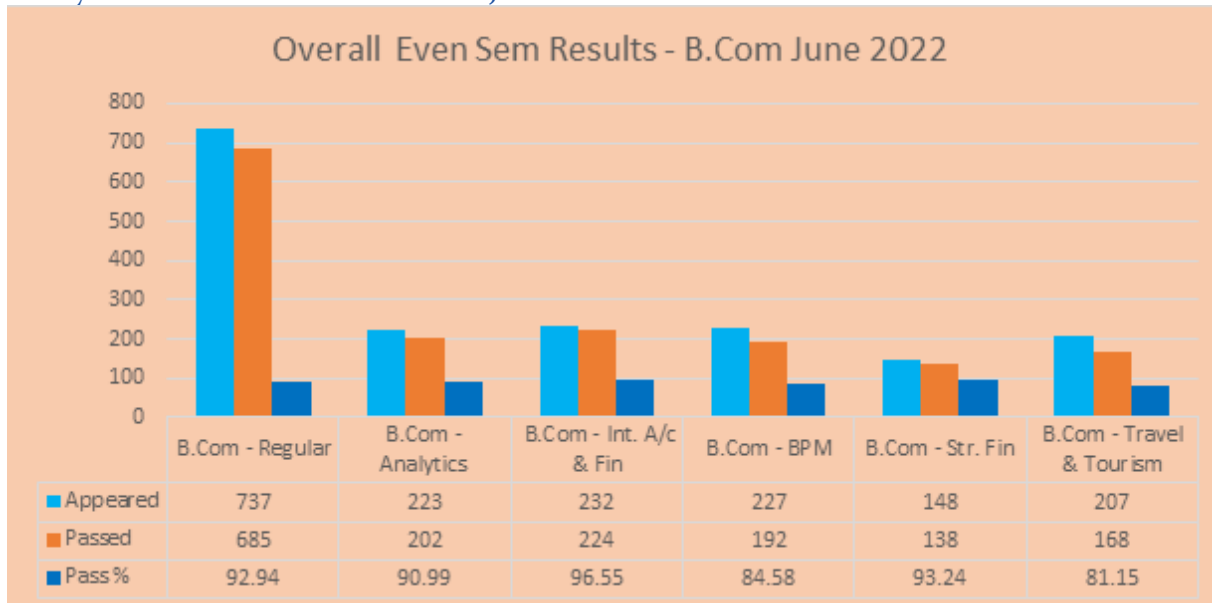

## 11. RESEARCH CULTURE

### Research at SJCC

Research is an integral component of academic excellence at SJCC. The college has a Research Centre recognised by the Bengaluru City University, and the centre plays a vital role in fostering research culture at the institution. The institution facilitates research in four significant parts – PhD Programme with Bengaluru City University (BCU), Department Research, BJES Seed Money Project, and Faculty (Individual/Joint) Research.

### PhD Programme with Bengaluru City University(BCU)

Bengaluru City University offers a comprehensive PhD programme aimed at providing students with an opportunity to undertake advanced research in a variety of academic disciplines. The PhD programme is open to both full-time and part-time students, and the duration of the programme ranges from 3-5 years depending on the discipline. Students are required to submit a thesis or dissertation at the end of their research, which is evaluated by a panel of experts.

### Department Research

The UG departments of Commerce, Management, Arts and Science as well as the Department of Postgraduate Studies in Commerce attribute great importance to research. These departments have formed exclusive associations to nurture the research culture among students.

**Mainframe Research Forum**, an initiative of the Department of Commerce is aimed at helping students develop an ability to effectively engage in research and guide them through guest lectures, workshops and training programmes in the field of computer software and formatting.

**The Quest Club** of the Department of Management helps students with logical reasoning and critical thinking. The activities of the club supplement the skill set of students in the field of research.

The Post Graduate Department of Commerce organises various programmes to enhance the research skills of the students. The Alumni Lecture Series, National Conference, Faculty Development Programmes and the annual department fest **Agamyā** offer an elaborate platform to the students of the department as well as researchers from outside the institution.

### BJES Seed Money Project

The Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES) provides funding for the faculty members of its institutions. The objective of the funding is to encourage research by the faculty members in the areas identified under the apostolic preferences of Karnataka Jesuit Educational Society (KJES). This initiative is a distinctive feature of research based on extension activities that are facilitated in Jesuit higher educational institutions.

### Faculty (Individual/Joint) Research

At SJCC, faculty members are actively involved in the field of research and present/publish their research work on various platforms of national and international repute. The faculty members are granted funding from the UGC, ICSSR and various other agencies to carry on their research work. The faculty members are part of Review Committees and Advisory Committees of reputed conferences and journals. They share their expertise in the field of research, in the capacity of Conveners, Resource Persons, and Panellists at conferences and seminars in various institutions across the country and in foreign universities.



## Research Centre

St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) was recognised as a Research Centre by Bangalore City University in the year 2010. The Expert Committee members from Bangalore City University visited the SJCC Research Centre on August 22, 2022 for the renewal of recognition of the Research Centre. Following this expert committee visit, the Research Centre status was renewed for the period from 2022 – 2023 to 2025 – 2026. The Research Centre has an effective Plagiarism and Malpractice Policy that governs ethical standards in research conducted in the college. The institution uses URKUND - Ouriginal software to detect plagiarism. The policy of the institution in detecting plagiarism is in line with UGC (Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism in Higher Educational Institutions) REGULATIONS, 2018. The Research Centre follows the Research Policy of the institution to develop and maintain a research-friendly environment among students and faculty members.

This year, 3 PhD Scholars completed their doctoral degree from the Research Centre. They were guided by the faculty members of the institution who are recognised for guideship by Bengaluru City University. Currently, 16 PhD scholars are registered under 6 faculty members at the Research Centre. College administers the funds received from diverse government institutions like the UGC and the ICSSR for minor and major research projects. The college strives to maintain a strong research environment by funding various FDPs, workshops and training programmes.

## Research Advisory Committee Meeting

The Research Advisory Committee (RAC) meeting was held on October 31, 2022 at 3.00 pm in the Board Room. A total of seven members from the Advisory Committee were present. Important discussions and deliberations on the functioning and the future of the Research Centre of SJCC were conducted. The next RAC meeting is scheduled on May 2, 2023 to discuss and deliberate on the activities of the Research Centre, PhD scholars' progress, and other research activities.

## SJCC Management Research Review Peer Review Journal (Print ISSN: 2249-4359)

The SJCC Management Research Review - SJCC MRR (ISSN 2249-4359) journal is the flagship journal of the college and is brought out by the Research Centre. SJCC MRR is a double-blind, peer-reviewed, open-access, refereed journal that delivers original, quality-based, and contemporary research findings in the field of management and business studies. It is a bi-annual publication published every year in June and December. The first issue of the Journal was brought out in 2011. The journal is indexed in the J-Gate, i-Scholar, Google Scholar, and Academia.edu and each paper is given a Digital Object Identifier (DOI) number.

The journal welcomes original research articles, review articles, conceptual articles, case studies, book reviews, short comments on diverse issues, and solution-oriented findings in studies of management and business studies. A unique feature of this journal is that we also accept manuscripts communicating to a broader audience about research projects financed by national and international funding agencies.

## 12. INSTITUTION'S INNOVATION CELL (IIC)

The Institution's Innovation Cell (IIC) at St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) was initially functioning under the name of Innovation and Incubation Centre since 2017. The IIC at SJCC—a registered cell (Registration no. IC202115549) with the Ministry of Education, Government of India aims at systematically fostering the culture of innovation and entrepreneurship amongst the faculty and the students of the college. The primary mandate of the cell is to encourage, inspire and nurture young students by supporting them to work with new ideas and transforming them into prototypes while they are in their formative years. The cell establishes networks with the various IICs and entrepreneurial bodies across the country to promote innovation through multitudinous modes leading to an innovative eco-system in the campuses.

IIC is registered under National Innovation Start-up Policy (NISP) and YUKTI Portal, Ministry of Education, GoI.

### Activities of IIC

#### Orientation

To highlight the facilities provided by the cell there was an annual orientation held for the first-year students of SJCC. The IIC Convenor, Dr. Ritty Francis, organised and coordinated the orientation on July 23, 2022. Students were made aware of the resources offered by the cell while also outlining the activities of IIC.

#### Workshop on Fostering Innovation through Podcasts

The innovation unit hosted a workshop on September 9, 2022. Mr Siddharth Peddi, MOL at Under 25 Universe served as the session's resource person. Podcasts as a notion and idea were introduced. The purpose of the workshop was to orient the interested faculty members about the expected outcomes of this innovative practice which is to be part of the teaching-learning process to reach out to a larger audience. The members were given a podcasting roadmap where information was shared with respect to the selection of podcast topics, selecting a guest panel, how to record, and where to publish the podcast.

#### Podcasts by students

The first batch of student-produced podcasts on current socio-economic concerns was recorded and reviewed by the innovation unit of IIC.

#### Advanced Session on Copyrights

The session was organised by the IPR unit for the faculty coordinators on September 10, 2022. Mr Jnana Teja, Research Associate Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, NLSIU was the resource person. He gave an account of the significance of copyrights/design and trademarks in educational institutions and how these could be further worked on for the institution's rankings. He elucidated the various steps involved in filing copyrights and responded to the queries and doubts raised by the faculty members.

#### Workshop Gathering - Let's Speak Our Idea

The Start-up unit of IIC hosted a workshop for aspiring entrepreneurs titled on September 12, 2022. The faculty in charge, Ms. Nischitha, gave an opening note to the attendees which were followed by the start-up coordinator presenting the upcoming events in detail and clarifying



doubts relating to the same. There was also a fun icebreaker activity where participants played a game of constantly rotating concentric rings and had to share answers to questions within a time limit of 30 seconds.

### Applied for Copyrights

The IIC successfully filed its application for the copyright on the Golden Jubilee logo. The copyright application was also filed for two research papers authored by Dr. Ritty Francis and Dr. Soney Haris. The application was filed on September 29, 2022.

### Workshop on Whys and Hows of IPR

The IPR unit of IIC organised the workshop for the student core team on October 29, 2022. The session was curated and presented by Ms. Shailaja Shastri, Associate Director of Cognizant Technology. Ms. Shastri presented the participants with practical insights into core concepts and explained the relevance of intellectual property rights and their function in securing protection for distinctly recognisable intellectual property.

### Start-up Mentoring Sessions

The Start-up unit of IIC also arranged individual mentoring sessions for student start-ups on November 2, 2022. With the mentor, Mr. Shashi Kiran Lewis, the incubatees discussed their concerns and challenges with setting up their businesses. Based on the inputs from the session, the students will provide timely progress reports. For student entrepreneurs and incubatees at SJCC, the Startup unit of IIC has been holding frequent mentorship sessions at both the individual and group levels. The mentoring sessions with Mr. Chandru Bolaki provided his mentoring sessions to the students start-ups at various phases of their start-ups.

### Workshop on IPR Filing and Protection

The IPR unit of IIC in collaboration with National Intellectual Property Awareness Mission (NIPAM), Ministry of Commerce and Trade, Government of India organised the online National level seminar on February 14, 2023, enabling many to protect and earn recognition for their academic contributions. The Resource Person, Mr Arpit Jain highlighted the various aspects of IPR and emphasised on the importance of protecting intellectual work in the academia.

### Power of Attorney

The institution signed its first Power of Attorney for the copyrights of two research publications by the faculty members Dr. Ritty Francis and Dr. Soney Mathews on February 27, 2023.

### Start-up Incubatees

In the year 2022-23, IIC has incubated 6 student start-ups and presently, 44 students are being mentored in the pre-incubation phase.

### Impact Lecture

An impact lecture was organised on March 23, 2023 for the students of the pre-incubation phase. The invited speaker for the talk was Mr. Ravindra Krishnappa, a venture capital professional and entrepreneur.

### IIC Council Meeting

The Annual Council Meeting of IIC was hosted on March 27, 2023. The meeting was attended by the Chief functionaries of IIC, their student representatives, incubatees, the alumni mentors and the academic counsellor of the institution, Vice Principals and the IQAC Coordinator.

The student coordinator of IIC, Keshav Dokania welcomed the members and presented a comprehensive report on the activities of the Cell. This was followed by the presentations of the faculty coordinators of the four units of IIC, who briefed their plans in the upcoming semester. Suggestions and recommendations were made by the Mr. Shashi Kiran Lewis, external expert for entrepreneurship, mentor, alumnus of SJCC and Director, Lewis Natural Foods Limited, Bangalore and Mr. Chandru Bolaki, external expert for entrepreneurship, mentor, alumnus of SJCC and Founder at BetOnIndia Technology, Bangalore, Founder, CareVision Security, California, Go East LLC, California.

## INVICTUS

INVICTUS is the flagship event of IIC which was hosted for the first time on April 6, 2023. The event focused on providing a perfect platform to network, grow and socialise. INVICTUS had three major aspects namely speaker session, business plan presentation and supporting young entrepreneurs (stalls). The resource person for the speaker session was Mr Shakti Prasad Tripathy, Head of the Department of Entrepreneurship, IIT Bombay. Mr. Tripathy gave his insights into the entrepreneurial world, along with his experience manoeuvring the students through his journey till he became the Head of the Department of Entrepreneurship at IIT Bombay. He took out his valuable time to help out and mentor the incubatees and pre-incubatees of St Joseph's College of Commerce.

The Business Plan competition opened up a platform for the young entrepreneurs of St Joseph's College of Commerce to present their existing ideas and business plans to Mr. Shakti Prasad Tripathy. The Supporting Young Entrepreneurs segment focused on providing visibility to emerging entrepreneurs by setting up Stalls on the Basketball court where the footfall of daily college students and social media helped them boom their business.

## Social Media Support

The Social Media unit of IIC has created Instagram, Twitter, and Facebook handles as per the directives of the Ministry of Education, Govt of India, and regular updates are posted to keep the page active.

### Seattle University, USA

The university is ranked among top national universities for its academics, student-centered teaching, service learning and leadership in sustainability. SJCC signed an MoU with the University on June 18, 2022. The agenda of the MoU was to encourage direct contact and collaboration among students, faculty, and staff in the areas of research, teaching, organising of conferences, lectures, and seminars.

### Swansea University, UK



Swansea University, UK is a research driven university that thrives on exploration and discovery. It shares a profusion of values with SJCC, including its emphatic drive to provide top-notch education to its students. The institution has applied for renewal of the MoU in order to continue with its academic transfer and cultural exchange programmes for the undergraduate students. The collaboration with Swansea University began in the year 2010 whereby students started participating in the 1 + 2 year twinning programme since 2010.

### United Nations Global Compact(UNGC)



United Nations Global Compact(UNGC) is a voluntary initiative launched by the United Nations in 2000 to encourage businesses and organisations to adopt sustainable and socially responsible policies and practices. As of 2021, the UNGC has over 12,000 signatories from more than 160 countries, including corporations, non-governmental organisations, and academic institutions. The first collaborative event with UNGC was for an International Webinar Series on Sustainable Development Goals-2030 (IWSSDGs) which was organised from 2021-22. Post IWSSDGs, the college conducted guest lectures and other academic activities in collaboration with UNGC. The MoU was renewed on July 27, 2022.

### Indo-Australian Chamber of Commerce



Indo-Australian Chamber of Commerce is a non-profit organisation that aims to promote economic and commercial ties between India and Australia. It serves as a platform for Indian and Australian businesses to connect, collaborate, and explore new trade opportunities. The institution renewed its MoU with the Chamber on October 20, 2022. The agenda of the MoU is to foster partnerships/agreements with leading educational institutions, universities, and corporates both in India and Australia.

### Montepellier Business School



Montepellier Business School is a French business school founded in 1897, with undergraduate and graduate programs in management and business administration. It has partnerships with over 80 universities worldwide and offers exchange programs to students. The institution is accredited by several organisations including the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) and the European Quality Improvement System (EQUIS). The institution signed its MoU with the business school on March 13, 2023. The agenda of the MoU is to provide an internationally recognised training programme on the sustainable economic transition to the students at SJCC.

### Eastern Institute of Technology(EIT)



Eastern Institute of Technology(EIT), New Zealand provides an extensive range of qualifications, comprising more than 130 options, varying from certificates and diplomas to degrees and postgraduate qualifications. The institution has a long-term MoU with EIT. Five students from SJCC had enrolled for a 1+2-year programme. They will be joining in July 2023 after completing their first year of BBA programme at SJCC.

### Global Immersion Programme with University of York

Global Immersion Programmes gives the students opportunities to visit foreign universities and understand cultures, histories, and literature. This academic year SJCC hosted global immersion programme called 'Vivran' – Global Connection and Cultural Integration' for the students from York University, UK August 23-27, 2022.

St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) hosted 15 students and 2 faculty members from York University, UK. Students from diverse backgrounds took part in this programme. Some of the activities in the programme included-yoga session, a session on Survival Hindi, and talks on Indian history, entrepreneurship, Indian economy, and business and politics in India.

### Enrolment for International Short-Term Programmes

#### **Ms. Pallavi Sharma, Regional Advisor, Southeast Asia, Tiffin University, Ohio, USA**

Ms. Pallavi Sharma visited the college on September 16, 2022, to orient the B.Com and BBA students on the opportunities for students to study abroad. A guest lecture titled Overseas Higher Education Opportunities was held wherein she addressed the students and took up a Q & A session.

#### **Mr. Siva Guda, Eastern Institute of Technology, New Zealand**

Mr. Siva Guda, the International Market Development Manager from EIT visited on November 18, 2022. EIT is SJCC's long-time collaborator where the institution has an MoU for the students' transfer programme for 1+2 or 2+1 programme. This academic year, five students enrolled in the transfer programme. Mr. Guda visited SJCC to interact with the students as well as their parents about the International Transfer Programme. EIT has been merged with 16 other colleges in New Zealand and now comes under one umbrella institute Tepekenge, which is the New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology.

#### **Mr. Kitiagawa from Kobe College, Japan**

Mr. Kitiagawa from Kobe College, Japan visited SJCC Campus on January 4, 2023. The Principal, International Desk Coordinator, and Assistant Coordinator were present for the meeting to discuss the details with regard to the exchange program between SJCC and Kobe College. After the pandemic, both the institutions have decided to resume their student exchange programme. It was agreed that the students of SJCC could visit Kobe College in the last week of October.

#### **Mr. Xavier Rajot from Montpellier Business School, France**

Mr. Xavier Rajot from Montpellier Business School, France visited on February 23, 2023, with the intention to establish collaboration with the institution. Mr. Rajot gave details on the various programmes offered by MBS and the opportunities for the SJCC students in terms of the Summer School Programmes and the Transfer programme (in a 1+2 or 2+1 pattern of study). MBS proposed to offer Summer School Programme fees concession and additionally, informed about the various merit based scholarships which could be availed by the SJCC students. It was agreed that an MoU would be drafted and signed between SJCC and MBS, for the same.

#### **Meeting with the members of the Consulate General of France**

The members of the Consulate General of France visited on March 24, 2023. The visit included Mr. Thierry Berthelot- Consulate General of France in Bangalore, Dr. François Xavier Mortreuil- Attache for Science and Academic Cooperation and Ms. Lucille Guillet- Science and Academic Cooperation Officer. The members present from SJCC were Dr. Charles Lasrado SJ-Principal and Ms. Ankitha Antony- Faculty and Assistant Coordinator of the International Desk. Mr. Xavier briefly described the scope of Higher Education in France and the relation between SJCC and various French Universities and how they can be strengthened. The possibility of offering French as an Open Elective course was discussed as this would be helpful for those looking to take up educational or career opportunities in France. Mr. Thierry Berthelot expressed his intent to further the academic collaboration between SJCC and the different Universities and Business schools in France in order to provide a plethora of opportunities to the students. The members of the Consulate General of France also interacted with the students who had attended



the Winter School Program in Toulouse Business School, France in January 2023. Mr. Xavier also informed them of the different possibilities for higher studies, various job prospects in France and also French companies situated in India.

## Activities of the International Desk

### Education tour to Spain in collaboration with Thomas Cook, June 29-July 8,2022

The educational tour to Spain was organised for 38 students accompanied by two faculty members. Highlights of the tour included a guided city tour of Toledo, an industrial visit to Sword Factory, an educational visit to IE University (Instituto de Empresa University) for a workshop on sustainable innovation and technology, guided city tours to Madrid, Seville, Valencia, Barcelona, Sagrada Familia, Montserrat, Camp Nou & La Rambla, to Old town & Lladro, bull ring, Las Ventas Plaza De Toros, Royal palace, horse carriage ride, flamenco show, the world of handcrafted porcelain figurines.

### Study abroad talk series Episode 3 – The Choose France Tour

Embassy of France in India - Indo-French Chamber of Commerce & Industry hosted “The Choose France Tour” on October 13, 2022 at the Taj Westend, Bangalore. This tour allowed the students to get in touch with 35+ French schools making one on one interaction available to find out more about scholarships, admissions, courses, and programmes of study. Eighty students registered to participate in the tour and an interactive session was organised exclusively for the students of SJCC on September 28,2022. Mr. Yash Khakhar, Manager from Campus France, Bengaluru was the resource person who gave a detailed presentation on the educational and work opportunities in France.

### International Lecture Series Episode 1 – Organisational Culture

An International Lecture series was organised for final year PG students on October 10, 2022, on the topic Organisational Culture & Effectiveness. Professor Jossy Matthew from the School of Management, Swansea University, UK shared his expertise on the significance of organisational culture in both India and abroad.

### Collaboration with Department of Commerce for Travel Expo 2022

The B.Com (Travel and Tourism) programme celebrated its illustrious decade-long presence at SJCC. To commemorate this twin accomplishment, the department conducted a travel fair on November 5, 2022. The ‘Travel Expo 2022 – Explore, Enrich, Enthral’ was set to showcase an amalgamation of diverse cultures, enriching knowledge, and enthralling excitement. The International Desk initiated the collaboration with educational partners for the fair. Immersion India Outbound and Gen Next Education. The collaborators provided career guidance and information on international study and job opportunities during the expo.

## 14. STUDENT COMMUNITY

Student support is one of the significant aspects of holistic learning practices followed at the institution. The institution, through its diversified curricular programmes and co-curricular activities, aims to offer a wide variety of platforms to help students identify their passion and encourage their intellectual curiosity. In order to realise this vision, the institution has designed an effective student support framework.

The college extends financial aid to deserving candidates through scholarships and freeships. It has established mentorship programmes, workshops, pre-placement support, and guidance aid amongst many others to meet the changing demands of holistic education pedagogy. The institution also offers an inclusive learning environment for students irrespective of their social and religious backgrounds. Students with disabilities are also given additional support in terms of their movement on campus and during examinations. Attempts are made to help learners at different learning levels through remedial classes, bridge course tests, and individual tutoring sessions.

The Counselling centre arranges confidential counselling sessions for students to ensure their emotional well-being. Thus, the student support initiatives of the institution have been instrumental in enhancing the overall learning experience of the student community. Above all, the multidimensional training offered at SJCC prepares students for efficiently dealing with diverse real-life challenges.

The college makes learning conducive for students who pursue professional programmes like Association of Certified Chartered Accountants (ACCA), Certified Management Accountant (CMA), and Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA). (Details in the unit on Professional Programmes)

### Student Diversity

The institution attracts students from all walks of life and hosts a diverse student population comprising students from different religious, social, economic, and linguistic backgrounds.

### Student Enrolment

The call for applications was sent out on February 15, 2023 for all the UG programmes. The last date to apply was on April 5, 2023. The entrance aptitude test was conducted on campus. After the aptitude test, three rounds of interviews were conducted. Following which, the final list of provisionally selected candidates was notified.

### Scholarships

#### Government Scholarship

In order to provide necessary encouragement and motivation to pursue Higher Education, the Government of Karnataka and the Central Government provide various scholarship schemes





to meritorious and economically backward students. At SJCC students are sent notifications of the scholarships and encouraged to apply for these scholarships. The college has also deputed a faculty-in-charge to channelise the scholarships and fellowships offered by the UGC.

### Management Scholarship

The management awards scholarships to meritorious students coming from economically weaker sections of society. The Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES) has set up the Management Scholarship Fund. The college has set up a Management Scholarship Committee to recognise the meritorious students in academics and co-curricular activities. The committee encourages the identified students to apply for the management scholarship.

### OSA Scholarship

The institution's Old Students Association (OSA) sponsors scholarships for numerous deserving students. The total corpus fund is currently Rs.1,37,40,000. The interest earned from this fund for the current year is Rs.22,60,000 and the same had been disbursed towards the OSA Scholarship. In 2022-23, students requiring financial assistance were invited to apply for academic scholarships. Students were shortlisted based on their applications and screened on the basis of academic excellence and the assessment of their financial background. Shortlisted students were called for an interview along with their parent/guardian.

### Orientation Programmes

The orientation programmes for the undergraduate and postgraduate students were held from August 1-20, 2022. Along with the general orientation programme, specific orientation programmes were also conducted. The Principal welcomed all students to the campus on behalf of the management. The orientation committee briefed students about the rules and regulations of the college, the course structure, the code of conduct, the organisation structure of BJES, and the examination process and placement procedure for all students. The orientation team updated the newcomers about the ethos of the institution and the role of IQAC in ensuring the quality of teaching and learning practices.

The Counselling Centre of SJCC briefed about the holistic development programmes offered by the institution. Separate sessions were conducted to educate the first-year students about the upcoming sports events, association and extension activities. The students also had an interactive session with the faculty members of the Post Graduate Department and the management representatives. The values of faith and toil were highlighted throughout the orientation programme.

## Programmes for Slow and Advanced Learners

### Bridge Courses

Bridge Courses in Mathematics and Accountancy for first-year B.Com, BBA and B.Sc (only Mathematics) students were conducted to support students who had either not studied the subjects or had found the respective subjects difficult. Students who actively participated in the bridge course classes picked up the required subject skills to manage their regular classes.

All newly admitted students of B.Com, BBA & B.Sc were informed regarding the Mathematics and Accountancy Bridge Course during their admissions and the course materials were made available on the college website and through YouTube links. Students were asked to access the learning materials once they confirmed their admission.

- The respective Mathematics and Accountancy teachers of first-year classes guided the students to solve the worksheets. All the first-year students submitted the solved Mathematics worksheet by August 17, 2022, and the Accountancy worksheet by August 29, 2022.
- The Bridge Course test was conducted offline. The mathematics test was on August 20, 2022, and the Accountancy test was on August 27, 2022. Both Shift 1 and Shift 2 students wrote it on the same day (Shift 1 -10:00 am to 11:00 am and Shift 2 - 11:30 am to 12:30 am).
- 640 students from the first year of B.Com, 300 students from the first year of BBA, and 40 students from the first year of B.Sc attended the Bridge Course.
- A re-assessment was conducted for those students who were absent on the test date and marks were submitted to the coordinator.

### Remedial Programmes

The institution restructured the remedial programs with the peer learning model in order to enhance the students' interest in learning and to make the learning process a more joyful experience. In this model of peer support, the teaching is handled by a 'student tutor' who is responsible to teach the 'student tutees' under the guidance of the subject teacher. The remedial coaching classes were scheduled online on the MS Teams platform as well as in the offline mode to make the program effective. The remedial programme at SJCC is the backbone of academic excellence. In this programme, students who require academic support are identified and offered one-on-one assistance by the advanced learners. In 23 courses, 60 students tutored 319 students for the odd semester for a span of 207 hours. Remedial classes were conducted in the month of November 2022 for first, second, and third-year UG students.

## Student Welfare Committees

### Grievance and Malpractice Prevention & Redressal Committee

Any type of grievance that students want to express, pertaining to other students, management, staff, infrastructure, CIA, examinations, and any other concerns can be discussed with teachers/Class mentors/ and the Controller of Examinations respectively. It could also be brought to the notice of the committee depending upon the gravity of the issue. The committee examines the complaint and suggests appropriate measures and actions to ensure justice for the students.

### Sexual Harassment Prevention and Redressal Committee

The institution has constituted a Sexual Harassment Prevention and Redressal Committee to ensure that the students, teachers and non-teaching staff can work together in an environment that is free of gender violence, sexual harassment and discrimination. Students who come across any form of sexual harassment are expected to bring it to the attention of the Committee.

### Anti-Ragging Cell

To root out ragging in all its forms from the institution, an anti-ragging cell has been established as per the guidelines of the UGC. Ragging in any form on campus is banned by the institution. The Anti-Ragging Cell takes strict action against those found guilty of ragging or abetting ragging. All complaints pertaining to any kind of ragging by any student or group of students within or outside the campus are to be reported to the 'Anti-ragging Cell'.

### Equal Opportunity Centre

The institution has established an Equal Opportunity Centre as per the guidelines of the UGC to oversee the effective implementation of policies and programmes for students from disadvantaged communities, to provide guidance and counselling with respect to academic, financial, social and other matters and also to enhance the diversity within the campus.

## Support for Girl Students

The institution strives to make the college a safe space for girl students. Girl students are provided with extra support in various ways to enhance their learning experience at the institution. Some of them are mentioned below:

- The Ladies Room - A common space for girls with necessary facilities
- Sexual Harassment Prevention and Redressal Committee - A statutory committee formed to ensure speedy grievance redressal and prevention of sexual harassment
- Health & well-being support - For physical and mental health and the overall well-being of the student
- Women's Forum – an association to educate, empower and ensure an encouraging space for women that promotes meaningful discussions
- Class Ladies Representatives – To ensure representation of girl students and also to establish a formal contact point for girl students to express their concerns
- Women Empowerment Programmes - To empower girl students through talks, workshops and campaigns
- Safety & Surveillance - CCTV cameras installed to deter unruly behaviour and ensure the safety of women on campus
- Women Counsellors – personal and social counselling, specifically by lady counsellors to listen to the concerns of girl students
- Representation of Women in Student Council – the institution ensures equal gender-representation in leadership positions
- Exclusive Open House for Women – IQAC organises Open House to listen to and address the concerns of girl students.

In addition to the above-stated initiatives, the college ensures that female faculty members accompany students on every off-campus camp, study tour and other academic activity. The college strives to build healthy spaces that promote the harmonious coexistence of students irrespective of their gender and other backgrounds.

## Mentorship

Mentoring works as a support system for students and provides comfort. Every first-year class gets two mentors to mentor 40 students each. The mentors arrange meetings with students individually and help them address their concerns. Mentors keep track of academic performance, leave records and meet parents whenever required. In addition, they educate students about the college rules and facilities that they can avail of. Class mentors maintain student file which contains students' details and it is updated from time to time. This file is passed on to the mentors of the subsequent years of the programme.

## Counselling

The college has four full-time counsellors who play a vital role in character formation which is one of the core objectives of the institution. The counsellors are active members of various cells and committees in college and undertake other responsibilities as and when required. The counsellors are also active members of the student grievance and sexual harassment cell, offering support to students and parents when the need arises.

## Personal Counselling

The counsellors meet students for one-on-one personal counselling sessions. Students come with issues related to peer pressure, transition into college life, adjustment issues, emotional



issues like fear, anger, grief, and anxiety, academic issues like performance, attendance and inappropriate behaviour, low-self-esteem, trauma and other psychological distress.

### Group Counselling

The counsellors meet the students in groups of five to six as part of the outreach program. This session provides them with a space for self-discovery by learning from each other, recognising and embracing their strengths and capabilities besides accepting their shortcomings. This also gives the counsellors a chance to build awareness among the students.

### Student Support

In addition, teachers refer students to counsellors when they feel that the student requires emotional support. Counsellors also recommend teachers give special attention to students who require help. Family members are also met by the counsellors when the need arises. The counselling team has also extended their services to students in times of emergencies when they have been taken to the hospital from college, to provide support and comfort.

### Psychological Well-being Classes

As part of NEP's mandatory credit subjects, the first-year students had a course on Psychological Well-Being. The Holistic Studies Department developed a course plan for the same with five modules based on the PERMA model. This included topics on Positive Emotions, Relationships, Meaning of life, goal setting and Achievement. The classes were divided into ten sessions of one and a half hours each and it was conducted online. Approximately, 900 students attended the classes. An exam for the same was held on November 21, 2022. These sessions were designed to help students become more aware of themselves, and others around them, using a lot of reflective activities and exercises.

## Activities of Counselling Department

### Eating Disorders Support Group

Ms. Jumainah Marian Haris, a final year B.Com student organised a support group meeting was October 21, 2022 during the common hour. Around 20 students participated and Ms. Jumainah shared her testimonial with the group. All the participants shared their stories and what motivated them to be a part of the group.

### Class on Leadership and motivation

On October 14, 2022, the department conducted two sessions on leadership and motivation for first, second, and third-year students who were free during the 4th hour and the 5th hour in the Xavier Hall. Fr. Bala Yesu CPPS served as the resource person for the same.

### Leadership Camp

The Department was actively involved in organising a two-day leadership camp for the student Council, Department, and Association coordinators on September 11 and 12, 2022, at NBCLC. Fr. Bala Yesu CPPS served as a resource person at the retreat, along with Capt. Jaison Thomas. It was a fruitful learning experience for the students with two days of activity-based and group-based learning through moments of self-reflection.

### Human Resource Development (HRD)Classes

The second-semester students had a course on Human Resource Development (HRD) spread across five modules based on the topics of personality development (personal &

interpersonal development), boundaries, and emotional development. The classes were tailored to cater to the present generation of students, focusing more on skill and situation-oriented exercises to develop life skills in young adults. One class per week was scheduled with the first-year students of B.Com, BBA, B.A., and B.Sc. across the semester with attendance being a mandate as there is no form of examination or credits given to the students for the same. These sessions were designed to help students become more aware of themselves, and others around them, using a lot of reflective activities and exercises.

### Samagra: St. Joseph's Holistic Wellness Centre

The counselors are actively involved in the Samagra meetings since August 2022, with one meeting a month at the Samagra office. During these meetings and discussions, various concerns have been raised and discussed. These discussions have been extremely insightful with case presentations, book reviews, and group interactions. The team also worked on a video and blog on 'Gratitude', which was published on the Samagra website. Every quarter, each counsellor contributes one blog article on various topics around mental health which is published on the Samagra website. Every month each counsellor writes an FAQ based on the common concerns faced by the students of the varied age groups and possible ways to address them, which too is published on the Samagra website.

### Parent-Teacher Meeting

The institution prioritises interaction with parents for augmenting the holistic development of students. The Parent-Teacher Meeting conducted annually provides the parents a platform to address their concerns and issues regarding their wards. Such interaction also gives the teachers an opportunity to know their students better. It, therefore, works together with the parents of the students to ensure that the education of their wards is in line with their expectations. Parent-teacher meetings allow the institution to understand the concerns of the parents and address them, while also helping them understand the ethos of the college. Their support is an integral part of the educational mission of the college and thus, such interaction provides a better understanding of the stakeholders' views

### 1st year UG PTM

The meeting with the parents of the first-year students was held on November 12, 2022, from 9:00 am to 1:30 pm in the college premises. The parents who could not attend the meeting in the offline mode attended it online or through a call in the 3rd and 4th week of November after the College Golden Jubilee celebrations were over. The meeting was held to discuss the marks, attendance, and general behavior of the students with their parents. This helped the parents gain insight into the student life at SJCC and understand the progress of their wards. The parents' feedback was also collected at the end of the meeting and the same has been submitted to the IQAC for further analysis.

### 2nd and 3rd year UG PTM

The meeting with the parents of the 2nd and 3rd year students was held from November 14-16, 2022. The attendance shortage and marks were communicated to the students through the mail during the 1st week of November 2022. Later students were called to campus based on class mentors' availability and the same concerns were informed to the parents personally. Consent forms were also collected from the parents. A few parents who were not able to come and meet the class mentor were informed about their ward's attendance, midterm exam marks, and backlogs through call/online meeting.

## 15. TRAINING AND PLACEMENT

The College maintains its exemplary reputation by creating industry-ready and competent individuals who get placed through the placement activities organised by the College Placements Cell. The College has a faculty-in-charge who is the Placements Officer on the campus and plays a seminal role in connecting the students to the industry. Over the years, the students of the college have been placed in prestigious and renowned industries.

### Placement Orientation

Students at the institution are provided detailed orientation by the Placements Cell. Placement orientations were conducted for UG and PG Students. More than 500 students from B.Com, BBA, and M.Com were interested to take part in placement drives for the academic year 2022-23.

### Pre-Placement Process and Skill Development

The Pre-Placement Process and Skill development activities prepare the pre-final/final-year students of the institution for placement opportunities. Activities ranging from career mapping, career guidance, and workshops on aptitude, soft skills, and technical skills to excel in interviews are organised for students. The industry-academia interface is another focal area for the cell, through which it has courses, seminars, and guest talks in collaboration with companies during the academic year. Second-year students take up corporate internships to help them in an easy transition into the final recruitment process.

### Pre-Placement Process and Skill Development Outline

Career Recruitment Training (CRT) is organised by the Placements Cell during the beginning of the odd semesters for pre-final and final year students in association with the training institution. This year it was organised in association with Disciples India Group. A ten days Employability Training Workshop was organised to fine-tune the skills of students with an aim to make them industry-ready. CRT Prep conducted this workshop from August 20-30, 2022 for the final year students. Spread over ten days, this workshop included quantitative modules, logical reasoning, resume building, mock interviews and soft skills development sessions, and personal interviews. CRT Program was conducted in a virtual platform.

## Career Mapping Session

July 7, 2022

Deloitte organised a two-hour session on How you can become the future Auditor? The session helped the students to prepare themselves for the placements. The programmes also covered Deloitte's recruitment process for Audit & Assurance practice. More than 250 students participated.

EY GDS Leader flagship session was conducted to make the students aware of the career opportunities in the Assurance Service Line in EY GDS (B.Com and M.Com) and the growth opportunities within EY (EY Badges, EY Tech MBA, Global Mobility Program, etc). Mr. Chung G Tham member of the Business team addressed the students. Around 135 participants were a part of the programme.

January 27, 2023

RBI\_Awareness Campaign in Educational Campuses conducted on the campus included a presentation on career opportunities in the Reserve Bank of India. The target audience for the campaign was female students pursuing undergraduation/post-graduation courses in Management / Statistics / Law / Commerce / Economics / Econometrics / Banking / Finance. More than 85 students attended the session.

Originally started in 2011 with 9 countries, the current iteration of YTPY brings together future tax leaders from across 18 countries. The tax environment is constantly transforming to reflect legislative, regulatory, and technological changes. Now more than ever, Tax is taking a seat at the global table, traversing borders to highlight the power in international, multilateral thinking and decision-making. Reflecting on this landscape, the competition places a strategic emphasis on digital readiness and innovation. The YTPY competitions are spread across the year. Two students qualified for the YTPY competition and were offered internships.

November 28, 2022

## Recruitment 2022-23

The recruitment exercise commenced in college as early as the second week of August 2022. The organisations offered diverse roles varying from finance, accounts, marketing, human resources, to name a few. Information about placements was made available to students through the college ERP and SMS system, E-Mails, social media platforms, and placement notice board.

For this academic year, 468 undergraduate and postgraduate students registered for campus

placements (who are eligible for placement activities) of which 350 students have been offered jobs by various companies, and many more are in the pipeline for recruitment and selection.

## Internship Report of the Undergraduate Programmes

Internship is mandated by the National Education Policy-2020 and is a compulsory part of the curricular aspects to facilitate the integration of theoretical learning through application and practice at the workplace. The Placement Cell assists students to pursue internships in corporate offices, industries, and non-profit organisations to connect and apply the concepts learnt in the classroom. Three distinctive internship programmes are conducted by the Placements Cell at the campus:

a. **Corporate Internships:** The Corporate internships are conducted for the 2nd year B.Com and BBA students. It aims at enabling the students to get practical exposure to different functions of the industry that further supplements classroom learning with practical experience. All the students pursuing their fourth semester of B.Com and BBA are required to undergo a Corporate Internship for a period of four to six weeks before the commencement of their fifth semester. After the completion of the Corporate Internship, the students are expected to submit an Internship Report which is evaluated through a viva-voce by the evaluators for the credits to be allotted. The credits for the same are awarded to the students in the sixth semester of B.Com and BBA.

For the Academic Year 2022-23, about 926 students belonging to the batch 2020 pursued their online or offline corporate internships between the fourth week of June 2022 and the first week of August 2022 across India and outside.

**Internship Recruitment for Pre-Final Year Students 2022-23:** The Placements Cell organised recruitment sessions by various organisations which visited the campus during the odd semester of 2022-23 to select students for part-time corporate internships or internships that could be pursued during the summer of Academic Year 2023-24.

a. **Social Internship:** Social Internship is an essential part of the curriculum as it imbibes in the students the spirit of social concern. The 2021 batch of students from B.Com, BBA (Regular) and BBA (Professional) took up Social Internships for a period of 60 hours during their second year. Students of BBA (Regular) and BBA (Professional) pursued their social internships during the semester break before the commencement of their third semester and the students of B.Com completed their internship before the commencement of their fourth semester in the month of January 2023. The Social Internship reports were submitted by the students post which a viva voce examination was conducted to evaluate their internship. The credits for the same were shared with the concerned departments.

b. **Start-Up Internship:** Start-up Internships for the BBA (Entrepreneurship) programme are designed with a vision to infuse experiential and high-quality education with a global focus. This curriculum involves a unique and dynamic combination of creativity, innovation, critical thinking and organisation, provided on an interactive platform which hones the students into becoming competent future entrepreneurs. The second-semester BBA (Entrepreneurship) students undertook internships in both the online and offline mode at start-up enterprises for a period of 4 to 6 weeks during the semester break prior to the commencement of their third semester. The students submitted their Internship report and took up a viva-voce exam. The credits of the viva-voce were shared with the department for the credits to be allotted.

### Library as a Learning Resource

The library is fully automated for its in-house day-to-day activities using EASYLIB Integrated Library Management Software (ILMS). The modules that have been automated are cataloging and accessing, acquisition, serial control (periodicals control), member module, circulation, and in-out management, and it has a Web-OPAC to search library holdings.

The SJCC library encourages faculty, researchers, and students to use the subscribed print and electronic resources. General orientation on library resources, etiquette, services and facilities is provided to all users. The library also has institutional membership in NLIST and the DELNET consortium, which allows for additional database and e-resource access.

Digital academic resources were made available via a remote access platform, allowing for easy access both on and off campus. Students and faculty use their individual login credentials to access the resources.

## 17. INFRASTRUCTURE AND IT REFORMS

The college has a policy in place for maintaining and upgrading its physical infrastructure and IT facilities. The institution upgrades its IT facilities on a regular basis

### Physical Infrastructure

- Light roofing infrastructure has been added to the building to reduce the weight and increase energy efficiency. 30mm roof puff sheet for 3,741 sq. ft. area was added adjacent to the playground.
- The construction of the Boys Hostel is nearly finished, comprising of 90 rooms that can provide lodging to 180 students.

### IT Reforms

During the admissions for the academic year 2023-24, the college resumed the OMR based Entrance Examinations for the Department of Business Studies i.e., SMAT (St. Joseph's Management Aptitude Test), and for the Department of Commerce i.e., SCAT (St. Joseph's Commerce Aptitude Test).

The college has upgraded the following IT facilities:

- Upgraded and added of Internet Leased Line to 400 mbps from 300 mbps to provide better connectivity.
- Purchased 65 desktop computers for the college. Out of these, 37 computers are installed in Computer Lab 1, 2 in the Research Centre, 1 in the Placements Cell. The remaining 25 computers were upgraded to i7 12th Generation Systems have been installed in the Administrative office, Offices of the Departments of Commerce, Business Administration, Post Graduate Department of Commerce, Office of the Controller of Examinations, ERP Centre, Library and Sports Department.
- Procurement of 5 nos. of i7 Laptops for the Heads of the various Departments
- Procurement of Wireless Range Extender for better performance
- Installation of high-end Ceiling Speakers with Amplifier in computer labs (Lab1 & Lab2) for various events
- Procurement of Projectors for Class Rooms, Research Centre and the Office of the Controller of Examinations
- Upgraded and added the existing CCTV Cameras from Analog HD to IP Cameras.

## 18. CAMPUS MINISTRY

### Orientation

The Campus Ministry in collaboration with Samagra - St Joseph's Centre for Holistic Wellness and Bembla Outreach Centre orientated the students during the Orientation Programmes held from August 1-6 and 11, 2022. Sessions on mental health and wellness, social concern and character formation were conducted by the Campus Ministry Animators from various Jesuit institutions of Karnataka Jesuit Province.

### Mass of the Holy Spirit

The Campus Ministry celebrated the Mass of Holy Spirit on August 10-12, 2022 for the first, second and third-year students respectively. The Mass was celebrated by Fr Denzil Lobo SJ, Fr Avinash Lobo SJ and Fr Arun Panackal SJ in three shifts in the Loyola Hall and the Xavier Hall.

### Annual Retreat

The Annual Retreat for the Academic year 2022-23 was conducted in three batches for all the UG and PG students. The retreat for all the students was organised by the MAGIS Group of the Karnataka Jesuit Youth Apostolate, under the leadership of Fr. Maxim Dias, SJ and Sch Reuell Paul, SJ. The retreats were organised in three different batches for all the UG and PG Catholic students in the months of August and September 2022. The Annual Retreat had about 900 Students from both UG and PG batches. The retreat enlightened students to see all things new in God, to discover themselves, and to discover the role of God in their lives.

### Monthly Mass

A Holy Mass was celebrated on October 18, 2022, for both UG and PG students in Xavier Hall. The mass was celebrated by Fr. Praveen Kiran Martis, SJ, and Fr. Avinash Lobo, SJ. Every first Friday of each month, Holy Mass was celebrated for the staff and the students during the common hour by various teaching and student priests available on campus. On the first Friday of the year 2023, the members of the student council organised the liturgy.

### Golden Jubilee Thanksgiving Mass

The Golden Jubilee Thanksgiving Mass on November 19, 2022 was celebrated on a grand scale which witnessed an audience of more than thousand people. The Mass was celebrated by over 80 priests in the presence of many religious sisters from various congregations. All the classes took part in an offertory during the Mass which was later to be extended to the needy in society.

### Distribution of Offertory

In continuation with the Golden Jubilee Year Thanksgiving Mass, the offertory collected from various classes in cash and kind was distributed to deserving people in the month of January 2023. A group of students visited the slums of Halasuru in Bangalore and distributed dry ration kits on January 17, 2023. The dry ration kits were prepared out of the food grains and items collected during the Thanksgiving Mass. The distribution drive was carried out by the SJCC Campus Ministry team in collaboration with St. Vincent De Paul unit of Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Halasuru. Ms. Sharon P V, the Campus Minister, Ms. Asha Joseph, the coordinator for the offertory collection, and Fr Praveen Martis, SJ the Campus Ministry Director along with 10 students took part in the distribution of the kits. The offertory received in the form of money was distributed in Harihar in two equal parts on January 8 and 7, 2023. The first part was given



as a scholarship to six needy students of St. Aloysius PU College, Harihar. In the second part, various necessary items were purchased for the Sudhama Ashram in Harihar which is run by the Missionaries of Charity sisters. In the Ashram, the sisters strive to give a dignified life to about 30 differently abled women. Ms. Sharon P V, the Campus Minister, Mr. Arul Isaac, the member of the offertory team for the Thanksgiving Mass, Ms. Sharon Sneha Britto, Ladies' Secretary-Shift 2 and representative of the Student Council, and Fr. Praveen Martis, the Campus Ministry Director were the 4-member team who went to Harihar to execute the offertory distribution.

### Ash Wednesday Mass

In order to spiritually usher in the season of Lent, Ash Wednesday Mass was organised in two venues (Loyola Hall and Xavier Hall) on February 22, 2023 for all Catholic staff and students of the college. The Mass was celebrated by the Principal of the College, Rev. Fr. Charles Lasrado, SJ and the Finance Officer, Rev. Fr. Anthony Pradeep, SJ. The student participation in the Mass was very good. Fr. Charles Lasrado also shared with the students a few interesting online spiritual materials and links for personal prayer and reflection.

On April 4, 2023, a one-day Lenten Retreat was organised for all the Christian teaching and administrative staff at Prerana - Centre for Ignatian Spirituality, Mount St Joseph, Bangalore. The sessions began at 9.00 and concluded at 4.00 pm. The resource person for the retreat was Fr. Joe Mathias, SJ and Dr Stan Lobo, SJ. The retreat included spiritual talks, faith sharing, confession, adoration, examination of consciousness and Holy Mass.

## 19. BEMBALA OUTREACH PROGRAMME

A programme titled 'Bembala' (Support) has been designed to methodically initiate the extension and outreach activities by the BJES. The Bembala Team under the leadership of Fr. Brian Pereira SJ –Director, came up with many creative and innovative activities to sensitise the students by inculcating in them the concern for society.

The 'Social Concern' aspect of education has been incorporated into the curriculum of all programmes offered by the institution. Bembala programme has been designed as a mandatory course for all programmes offered by the institutions run by BJES. This programme incorporates the Jesuit philosophy of education, the national objectives and priorities and meets the goals of national education policy. It combines both, a theoretical understanding of society including societal issues, and practical, purpose-based and action-oriented activities.

The theoretical section of the 'Bembala' programme consists of Human Resource Development classes, lecture series, talks and screening of documentaries. Students are encouraged to discuss and debate on social issues in classes. The practical aspect of the programme includes field visits, rural exposure camps, attending public events and documentation work. The areas covered in both theoretical and practical stages include environment, human rights, education, disabled people, senior citizens, sexual minorities, women, urban poor and the youth. The programme makes the students look into the aspects of livelihood, health, education, rights and support of communities covered under the above-mentioned areas. All students are required to put in 60 hours of community service as a part of their programme requirement.

### Bembala Outreach Activities 2022-23

#### Vigilance Awareness Week – Awareness on Corruption

As a part of the Vigilance Awareness Week October 31, 2022, to November 4, 2022, the Hindustan Aeronautics Limited, Helicopter Division, Vigilance Department collaborated with the St. Joseph's Institutions to create awareness among students and the public about Corruption Free India for a Developed Nation. The students of SJCC participated in the awareness campaign for the public by making creative posters and putting them up on display at different traffic signals. The students interacted with the public about their views on corruption and performed a street play in different public squares.

#### Children's Day Celebration

On the occasion of Children's day November 14, 2022, Bembala organised "BALMELA". The students of St. Joseph's College of Commerce conducted various activities for the students studying in different schools, children living in the slums, and NGOs to celebrate Children's day. Singing, dancing, games, motivational stories and playing videos for the children were some of the activities the children were engaged with. Around 300 sets of books and stationaries were distributed to the children studying in government schools in Wilson Garden, Makkala Jagruti, Balamandira, Moulana Azad Model School, Markham Road, and government PU College in Austin Town.

#### UG Rural Exposure Camps to Solur

Around 1880 UG students of the second and final year from the batches 2020 and 2021 took part in the rural exposure camp at Solur from September 2022- January 2023. The UG students received the same exposure as the PG students, participating in activities like planting saplings or plantains, removing invasive plants, sowing seeds, working in a brick factory,



painting walls, conducting village surveys, holding cultural events, and staging street plays to amuse and inform the villagers about the various social issues that are faced in that village. The students underlined the need for higher education in terms of country building and encouraged the dropout students to pursue their higher education. Few also gave the people stationary and ration kits.

Activities like planting saplings, working in brick factory, wall painting, village survey and street plays related to social evils eradication were enacted. The students also motivated the school dropouts in the village to pursue their education and explained to them the need for higher education towards nation building.

### Paper Cover Making and Distribution

Around 12,578 paper bags were made by the first-year students of B.Com, BBA, BA English and B.Sc Economics during the year and distributed to local Kirana shops and street vendors, to create awareness among the public to use cloth bags instead of plastic bags. This initiative allowed the students to think about sustainable development.

### Bhavishya Jyothi – Teach to Reach

Bhavishya Jyothi is a Community Outreach Project of St Joseph's Institutions. The project envisions training the first-generation learners from the marginalised sections and helping them pursue further studies to excel in their careers. Every year, there are about 600 students identified from Std. 10-12 in the slums and from disadvantaged backgrounds. This year the students of SJCC in eight batches reached out to 250+ deserving students across Bangalore studying in colleges like Our Lady of Bon Secours, PU College, BBMP PU College Austin Town, Methodist High School, Maulana Azad High School, Shivaji Nagar, in the slums of KS Garden and MV Garden. The training was provided in building English proficiency and computer skills. On completion of the training, the students are provided with certification of the Bhavishya Jyothi Programme. Besides this, the programme also offers career guidance and counselling to the beneficiaries.

### Traffic Awareness Drive

There were various awareness drives organised by the Outreach Department to sensitise the students and the community about traffic rules and regulations. These were conducted for all the second semester students of the UG programmes. All the classes were allocated specific dates to complete the awareness activities. The Traffic Awareness Drive focused on raising awareness about Traffic Rules and Regulations as per the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988. Each class was divided into small groups and they had to spend an hour spreading awareness at the assigned signal points in the neighbourhood. The outcome of this program was to sensitise students about their contribution towards civic senses development among the youth and society.

### Recycling of papers

As an environmental initiative a total of 1,706 kg of scrap or unused papers were collected and given to ITC, which was recycled and utilised to make notebooks. These notebooks were then distributed to students studying in various government schools and living in the slums on Children's Day to Govt PU College, Austin Town (110 Books & 110 Pens), Makkala Jagruti, Balamandira (250 Books & 250 Pens) and CARE (50 Books & 50 Pens).

### Observation of World Forestry Day and World Water Day

The students of 1st and 3rd years participated in a silent rally on March 21, 2023 on the occasion of World Forestry Day and World Water Day to raise awareness about the importance of preserving water and forests. With the message "Forests are no one's property to destroy; they are everyone's responsibility to protect", the students began the rally at St. Joseph's College





of Commerce and travelled through the main streets of Brigade Road, Church Street, and MG Road before concluding with a pledge at St. Joseph's Evening College by the guest of honour Shri Chakrapani Y, IFS.

# STUDENT COUNCIL REPORT





## 20. STUDENT COUNCIL REPORT

The management believes that student participation in the academic decision-making process is essential to the overall progress of the institution. Hence, it has made sure that students participate in the affairs of the college at various levels and play a role in the decision-making process.

Citizenship training is an integral part of education at this institution. As part of the citizenship training, the college has instituted a Student Council which is elected directly by students. The Student Council comprises President, Vice-president, Treasurer, General Secretary, Academic Secretary, Cultural Secretary, Sports Secretary and Ladies Secretary. There is a clear division of responsibilities among the members of the Student Council with the President as the head. A faculty member is appointed as the Student Governor who will facilitate the activities of the Student Council.

The responsibility of the Student Council is to represent the concerns of the students, organize cultural, academic and sports programme for the students. The council also takes the initiative in organizing programmes and activities directed towards the welfare of the student community.

The extended Student Council includes the Student Department Coordinators, Student Association Coordinators, and the Academic, Cultural, Sports and Ladies representatives of each class in the college. This extended body helps the Student Council in maintaining a network among all students. It also provides opportunities for students to take up leadership positions. They ensure the holistic development of the students in the college.

The Student Quality Assurance Cell (SQAC) is an important part of IQAC and its major work is to develop structures and systems for constant improvement in the overall performance of the college. The SQAC members are student representatives identified from each class, to assist the IQAC in ensuring excellence at the classroom level.

### Students Council Nominees in Committees:

- Board of Studies
- Extended IQAC
- Equal Opportunity Cell - A student coordinator is nominated to the Equal Opportunity Cell, whose responsibility is to work with the staff coordinator in realizing the objectives of the cell.
- Women's Forum- The Women's Forum of the college has a student coordinator and an assistant coordinator along with a staff coordinator. The student coordinators of Women's Forum organize programmes and activities in sensitizing students about gender. The Forum also provides a space for girl students to voice out their concerns.

### Student Participation in Open House

An important way in which students become part of the management of the institution is, through the Open House conducted for the students. Two Open Houses are conducted every year: a general one and one specifically for girl students. The suggestions and concerns voiced by the students are taken into account by the IQAC and an action plan is created.

### Annual Elections

The notice about elections was released by the Student Governor, Dr Preemal Maria D' Souza on August 12, 2022 post which the candidates filed their nominations. The list of eligible candidates was released on August 20, 2022. Election campaigns were scheduled from August 22-24, 2022. The elections were held on August 25, 2023. The two venues for voting were Xavier Hall and Loyola Hall.



### Investiture Ceremony

The Investiture Ceremony of the Student Council and the Department Coordinators was held on August 29, 2022, with all the class representatives and teachers gracing the occasion. The Chief Guest for the Investiture Ceremony was Mr. Albert Rebello with over 38 years of hospitality experience across India and abroad, gained in the world-renowned hotel chain, The Taj Hotels, Resorts & Palaces. He was Voted India's best Incentive Hotel by WORLD MICE AWARDS. The vote of thanks was proposed by Tristan Jude Stapleton, the newly elected President of the Student Council.

### Teachers' Day Celebration

The Student Council Celebrated Teacher's Day on September 5, 2022, in Xavier Hall and hosted a cultural event and some games for the teachers and the non-teaching staff. In the end, The Student Council conducted a few games for the teachers to refresh and enjoy their day.

### Onam Celebrations

Onam the traditional festival of harvest in Kerala and in the southwestern part of India was celebrated by the Student Council on the campus on September 7, 2022, under the name of Natil Evadiya? (Where is your native?). The Decor team made a beautiful "pookalam" with flowers and a ceremonious dance performance was carried out by the students expressing their wishes to all the natives of Kerala.

### Annual Leadership Camp

The Annual Leadership Camp for the newly elected leaders was conducted from September 9-10, 2022 to train and orient them to become better leaders and achieve greater feet with the team. Over 70 students including coordinators, assistant coordinators of all associations, department coordinators, and members of the student council attended the camp at the National Biblical Catechetical & Liturgical Centre (NBCLC), Bangalore. The Resource Persons of the camp were Captain Jaison Thomas, an Ex. Army officer and an accomplished professional with a rich experience of 19 years and 2 months in Business Development, Sales & Marketing, Product Promotion / Launches, Team Management, and Training & Development. An exemplary communicator with proven skills in Content Development, designing & conducting customized training programs geared towards optimizing knowledge and operational efficiencies of client organizations. ### Leadership Camp for Class Representatives

- Enhance health, hygiene and emotional well-being
- Skilled training for livelihood and employment
- Caring for Mother Earth by collaborating with our twinning partner
- Sharing of human and financial resources with our twinning partners to educate and empower people

#### Vision

Jesuits journeying together with our collaborators to build an inclusive society of justice, equality, reconciliation and fraternity by transforming individuals.

#### Mission

#### Deployment of the vision

St. Joseph's College of Commerce fulfils the vision and mission of the Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES) to bridge the gap in learning and resources between the rural and the urban society and works collaboratively with the BJES. During the academic year 2022-23, St. Joseph's College of Commerce extended its support and help to Jesuit brothers and high school students of Hassan and Mundgod.

#### Exposure Programme for Brothers from Dharwad & Hassan

Various sessions giving exposure to technology were conducted for the Jesuit brothers from Dharwad and Hassan who visited the institutions this year. Three brothers from Hassan were in the campus from September 23 to October 1, 2022 and two brothers from Hassan visited the campus from October 11-15, 2022. Practical sessions on graphic designing, MS Excel, Tally, ERP package and session on GST were organised to help them enhance their technical skills.

#### Leadership Camp for students from St. Joseph's School, Hassan

Forty high school students from St. Joseph's School, Hassan along with three teachers visited the institution November 22, 2022 as part of their Leadership Camp. The students were from Grade VIII to X. Dr. T. H. Lavakumar conducted a session on 'Theatre and Learning' and the students actively participated in the same.



### Education Tour - Sambhota Tibetan School, Mundgod

Seventy students and four faculty members from Sambhota Tibetan School in Mungod affiliated to CBSE visited various prominent colleges in Bangalore as part of their Educational Tour. On November 15, 2022, they paid a visit to the institution. The students were taken for the campus visit and given an overview of the various program options for undergraduate studies offered by the college. The student council interacted with the group and stressed on the skills acquired through extracurricular activities and leadership roles. The placement coordinator Mr. Giridhar Naidu gave an insight on what the industry expects for good placements and how students can plan for the same during their undergraduate studies.

### II. Bembala Outreach Programme

As the name of the programme BEMBALA suggests, it aims to reach out to the deprived groups and vulnerable sections of society and create opportunities for education, awareness and skill enhancement. It intends to create a learning process for faculty and students, through exposure to community needs, problems, and issues. #### IV. Faculty And Student Well-Being Initiative

The Institution has taken a special initiative to facilitate the well-being of the students and the faculty through the intervention of SAMAGRA-St Joseph's Holistic Wellness Centre. Samagra is a Holistic Wellness Centre established in the year 2021 by the Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES) and was conceived with a vision to empower individuals with mental health awareness and to offer support and assist them in maintaining holistic health and wellness. It is a platform for all the counsellors in various BJES institutions to come together for their professional development and to offer their expertise to all stakeholders involved. The two main tenets of Samagra are Arivu (Awareness) and Neravu(Support). Regular workshops/webinars, training modules and lectures for capacity building of staff and skill building for students/ general public are undertaken with the aim of empowering individuals with crucial life skills needed to cope with the everyday challenges of today's world. The centre comprises a multi-faith prayer hall/ meditation room, a workshop/seminar room and offices for counselling (individual and group). To understand the impact of SAMAGRA on the students a feedback was collected from the students wherein 80% of the students have given 10/10 rating to the sessions conducted.



## V. ANNUAL REPUBLIC DAY LECTURE SERIES

The Annual Republic Day Lecture Series introduced by the Department of English is a vision of Dr R Rajaram, the former Head of the Department of English. The Republic Day Lecture Series is designed as a space for dialogue and interaction around the themes of democracy, pluralism, and the idea of India. The lecture series was inaugurated in 2019 by Prof. Rajendra Chenni and was followed up by lectures from Prof. Anand Teltumbde, Prof. G N Devy and Ms. Patricia Mukhim. Each lecture is intended for the general public for the purpose of broadening sensibilities.

The fifth edition of the Annual Republic Day Lecture Series was hosted by the Department of English on February 4, 2023. Prof. (Dr.) Shiv Vishvanathan, Indian public intellectual and social scientist, was the speaker for the year who delivered a lecture on 'Ethics, Earth, and the Anthropocene'. There were over 150 people in attendance which included scholars, researchers, teachers, activists, artists, students, and parents.

In his lecture, Prof. Vishvanathan explored the need for a new language and a new paradigm to understand and articulate the contemporary human condition. For this, we need stories and myths that remind us about our relationship with the earth. 'As many folklores are on the verge of extinction, we need a new way of making memories come alive, a new way of speaking with the past and future', he added. He also urged universities to encourage plurality of ideas, playfulness, experimentation, dialogues and most importantly, dissent.

## VI. OSA SCHOLARSHIP

The institution's Old Students Association (OSA) sponsors scholarships for numerous deserving students. In 2022-23, students requiring financial assistance were invited to apply for academic scholarships. Students were shortlisted based on the applications and screened on the basis of academic excellence and the assessment of their financial background. Shortlisted students were called for an interview along with their parent/guardian.

## VII. MID-DAY MEAL FOR STAFF AND STUDENTS

The College has a mid-day meal scheme for thirty eight staff members and eighty two students through which they can avail their breakfast or lunch from the college canteen.
