#### WHEREAS

The Parties hereto, recognising the benefits of establishing international links, wish to strengthen the ties between their respective institutions by entering into this Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA").

#### NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED

- The purpose of this MOA is to develop co-operation and promote mutual understanding and excellence in practice-based education, research and knowledge exchange between the Parties. Both agree to strengthen ties of friendship and to promote Cultural, Educational and Scientific Cooperation.
- In furtherance of this purpose the Parties agree to develop the following activities in collaboration in areas of mutual academic interest:
- 2.1 Exchanges of academic and administrative staff and mutual visits to pursue research and to lecture
- 2.2 Exchanges of students and/or study abroad programmes and other enhancements to the student experience
- Identifying opportunities for conducting collaborative research and development
- 2.4 Identifying opportunities for conducting lectures and seminars and organising symposia and conferences
- 2.5 Exchanges of academic information and materials
- 2.6 Promoting collaboration in fields of mutual interest
- Promoting other academic co-operation and collaboration as mutually agreed.

- 3. The Parties hereby agree that the development and implementation of specific activities developed under this MOA will be the subject of formal written agreements negotiated and entered into separately, which will deal with the financial arrangements, confidentiality, ownership and use of intellectual property, publication of articles or other work and other relevant matters and shall depend upon the availability of resources and financial support of the Parties concerned.
- Parties acknowledge the need to promote the programme and activities and hereby agree to use promotional materials that have been approved by the other Party.
- 5. Both Parties agree that staff and students of either institution engaged in any activities shall carry out these activities in accordance with the laws and regulations of their respective countries after full consultation and approval.
- This MOA may only be amended by a written agreement signed by a duly authorised representative of each Party.
- 7. Any notice or request given or made by one party to the other under this MOA shall be in writing in the language of English to be sent to the following emails: MAHSA: <a href="mailto:syriac@mahsa.edu.my">syriac@mahsa.edu.my</a> SJCC: <a href="mailto:internationaldesk@sjcc.edu.in">internationaldesk@sjcc.edu.in</a>

This MOA shall commence of the date of its execution by the last Party to sign and shall remain in force for a period of five (5) years.

- 8. Either Party may terminate this MOA by giving six months' notice in writing to the other stating the reasons for the termination, consent of which shall not be unreasonably withheld. The termination of this MOA shall not affect the implementation of any specific activities established under a separate agreement prior to such termination.
- Nothing in this MOA shall be construed as creating any legal relationships between the Parties.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING/Statement of Intent

This Memorandum is designed to formalize the relationship between Eastern Institute of Technology (EIT), New Zealand, and St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) Bangalore, (South India). It provides a foundation for continuing international and intercultural understanding between the two institutions as well as between the people of New Zealand and St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous).

The two institutions recognize the following principles:

 Both Institutions have a strong commitment to international education and recognize that a close relationship is of mutual benefit.

 Educational opportunities offered to students, and/or staff, significantly enhance mutual understanding between our two societies.

 Both institutions recognize the importance of on-going dialogue, consultation and cooperative efforts in establishing programmes for the benefit of students.

iv. For mutual respect and understanding, St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) and Eastern Institute of Technology agree to value each other's educational objectives and cooperate in the development of agreed projects.

The specific provisions of the Memorandum of Understanding shall be decided by mutual consent of both institutions with the more specific details to be worked through in the next stage. However, in general the following academic discussions have been held to date, and both parties commit to work with best endeavours to work through the necessary details and arrangements to achieve the following objectives:

 On successful completion of the St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) first year Bachelor degree, he/she will be eligible to continue on to the second year of the EIT Bachelor degree (once cross-credits have been established)

- On completion of a St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous)BBA/ B.Com with 60% the student may apply for the EIT Post Graduate Diploma/ Masters in Applied Management
- Faculty and staff of St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) will select academically capable and suitable students to undertake study at EIT and provide good predeparture information to them. The possibility of having an "information desk" at St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous), will be explored to provide information to students and parents
- St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) and EIT will investigate the possibility of student and staff exchange and delivery of custom programmes through the online medium

This preliminary Memorandum of Intent may be followed by further agreements which will outline the details of our cooperation with the mutual consent of both Institutions.
