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National Service Scheme (Wing 1 & Wing 2)

- NSS commemorated the birth anniversary of the Indian social reformer Savitribai Phule who played a crucial role in shaping India's education system, with a special focus on educating the girl child, on 03 January 2022. To commemorate her birthday, NSS held a celebration on campus with the student. The NSS students also took part in the celebration by making placards with Savitribai Phule's remarks and paintings, NSS received over 30 placards.
- On the 12th of January, the NSS volunteers organized an online event. The principal addressed the student gathering and spoke about Vivekananda and his principles. There was a 'creative writing' and 'sketching' competition to emphasise on the significance of the day. The aim of the event was to sensitize the students about the philosophies, principles and ideas of Swami Vivekananda.
- National Voters Day was conducted on 25th of January 2022, the event was attended by 30 students. The National Voters' Day (NVD) was celebrated across the country to mark the foundation day of the Election Commission of India. The event was aimed at educating the student community about the importance of casting their votes.
- The Republic Day celebration was conducted online owing to the pandemic situation. The event was celebrated on the 26th January 2022. Dr.Charles Lasrado SJ, Principal of SJCC, hoisted the flag on the 73rd Republic Day. NSS volunteers conducted various activities like slogan writing, guess the

song, survival, quiz online. A large number of students participated in these activities.

- Every year, a blood donation is held to encourage students to donate blood to those who are in need. NSS volunteers organized an event with the support of hospitals to create awareness about the importance of blood donation. A blood donation camp was organized on 3rd March, 2022. The NSS team was assisted by five different hospitals NIMHANS, KIDWAI, Indira Gandhi Hospital, Victoria, and Vanivilas, who had come for the collection. Many students and faculty members came together to donate blood.
- The National Service Scheme of St. Joseph's College of Commerce organized a rural camp for 8 days in Channaveeranahalli village, Doddaballapur from 23rd to 30th April 2022. This year NSS is renovating a library for the village children, which will be used by future generations. Also, saplings were planted to honour the late actor Puneeth Raj Kumar.

Centre for Social Action (CSA)

- The Centre for Social Action (CSA) of SICC organized the following activities during the academic year 2021-2022:
- CSA commenced its activities this year with a "Social Exposure Programme" on 18th September 2022. A team of volunteers from the association visited Khader Sheriff Garden Slum, Lalbagh Road. Students interacted with the members of the community. The visit helped



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each member to not only become familiar with the unpleasant living conditions of the people in marginalized communities but also to acknowledge the privileges in life that one often takes for granted.

- In continuation to the Social Exposure Programme, CSA organized an experience-sharing session on 23rd November 2022 at 11am at the Xavier Hall. During the session the members shared their experiences from the visit and discussed the possible solutions to improve the life situation of the people living in the community, especially that of the school going children.
- On the occasion of World Peace Day, 21st September 2022. CSA, the Harmony Club, CARE, SCMI, and GNOSIS, together conducted a National Level webinar titled, "Youth as Facilitators for Cultural Harmony". Dr. Ram Puniyani, Chairman, Centre for Study of Society and Secularism Mumbal and former Professor, IIT Mumbal was the Resource Person. The webinar helped the participants understand the role of youth in shaping societies that operate with secular consciousness.
- CSA and the Outreach department of SJCC organized a talk on People's Movements and the Constitution, on 26th November 2022. Mr. Abhijit B, Assistant Professor of Law at Ramaiah Law College, Mr. Manohar Ranganathan (Executive Director of CARE), K S Lakshmi and Prashant S, student representatives from SJCC, shared their views on the topic.
- CSA and CARE organized a Panel Discussion titled, "Religion, Choice, and the Law in India" on 13th January 2022. The discussion addressed and explored the possible responses to some of the growing concerns about the freedom to practice religion and its political dimensions within Karnataka and India.
- CSA, Shramana Samskruti and CARE conducted an experience-sharing session on labor politics, titled "Threading Narratives: An Experience Sharing Session on Labour Politics" on 8th March 2022 to understand the challenges of the garment workers. Saroja K, Garment Labour Union activist addressed the participants. The session looked at how the agencies responsible for the wellbeing of garment workers respond to their concerns





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- On 1st April 2022, Harmony Club in association with CSA, Youth for Democracy and Constitution, Rotaract Club, and SCEAD International, organized a Discussion and Signature Campaign to express the institution's solidarity with students in Ukraine, at the Basketball Court. Mr. Katsumasa Maruo, the Deputy Council General of Japan was the Chief Guest of the event.
- On 16th May 2022, CSA in association with CARE, screened "Being the Other" an award-winning documentary, curated by its director, Mr. Amudha.
- R.P. The screening was followed by an engaging discussion on the issues addressed in the documentary.
- With a view to analyse the role of youth and media in ensuring social justice in the contemporary Indian societies, CSA and Harmony Club of SICC in collaboration with CARE organized a guest lecture titled, 'Youth, Media and Social Justice in Present Day India' on 15th May 2022. Ms. Ammu Joseph, an independent Journalist and writer delivered the lecture and responded to the questions raised by the participants.

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Institutional Response to Covid-19 Pandemic

In 2020, at the initial stage of the pandemic, St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) effectively responded to the challenges that the marginalized communities faced. In this regard, the institution reached out to support the vulnerable individuals and families in dealing with the issues evolved. Similarly, this academic year too, the college continued the outreach initiatives through the Outreach Department, Associations, and Clubs. A detailed report of all the initiatives undertaken by the institution is furnished below:

Vaccination Drive

SJCC in collaboration with BBMP, Ashok Nagar, organised a Covid Vaccination Drive on 5th July and 4th August, 2021 for the students, faculty members, administrative and support staff. This drive was organized to help those who couldn't take the first dose of vaccination. 219 people including the teaching and non-teaching staff got vaccinated with Covishield in the 1st drive. In the 2nd drive 96 people got vaccinated with Covaxin and 142 were vaccinated with Covishield. In total 457 people were vaccinated during the drive.

Food Distribution Drive

On account of 75th Independence Day, the National Service Scheme (NSS) volunteers of SJCC visited the Gerizim orphanage on 15th August 2021 to organize a food drive. 15 volunteers from the association attended this drive. Participating in the Drive allowed the volunteers to comprehend the challenges faced by the children living in orphanages.

Social Visit and Fruits Distribution

CSA organized Social Visit and Fruits Distribution programme on 18th September 2022. A team of 27 volunteers from the association visited Khader Sheriff Garden Slum, Lalbagh Road. Students interacted with the members of the community which helped each member to understand the unpleasant living conditions of those who live in slums. The visit also made each one acknowledges the privileges, often taken for granted.



EVENT 6: TRIBUTE TO OUR REVOLUTIONARY "BHAGAT SINGH"





He came from a family of revolutionaries and freedom fighters. He made the decision to give his life for the sake of the country's freedom when he was very young. He was born on September 28, 1907, in a small village in British India's Punjab province. Bhagat Singh is a hero among India's youth. He was the one who made the most significant contribution to India's independence.

Our principal Rev. Dr. Charles Lasrado and Mr. Satish Anthony Y were the main guests on this day. Mr. Satish Anthony, the technical assistant of DRDO, graced his presence and shared a lot of insights and enlightened us about Bhagat Singh and his famous quote "Inquilab

Zindabad, Inquilab Zindabad", and also started his speech by stating that "don't fear failure in the first attempt because even the successful maths starts with zero only" the guest lecturer gave some motivation speech to all the students because they are the face of the next generation and it is necessary for them to play their duties in helping society. The NSS volunteers organised a celebration on October 2nd, and all of the village headmen of Thindlu were invited

as guests. The village chief spoke highly of Gandhiji and Lal Bahadur Shastri afterwards praising our NSS faculty co-ordinator Mr ASHOKA T.A, who worked extremely hard and has achieved greater heights today as a teacher and farmer, and who is an inspiration to all the community's children and youth.


After the national anthem, the NSS volunteers walked across the fields to give the saplings to the farmers. Some of the volunteers even planted saplings, which gave them a fantastic sense of accomplishment and pushed them to work even harder for the betterment of our environment. The volunteers learned how our farmers, are the "Backbone of our country," provide 60% of our GDP and spend their sweat and blood only to produce food for our economy. Before eating our meal, how many of us thank the farmer who worked extremely hard to obtain food on our plates? Do we believe that even the farmer gets three meals a day? How many farmers commit suicide as a result of agricultural failure? These are the questions that arise in our minds. So, the life lesson we learn from this plantation drive is to not waste food, to respect the hard work of farmers, and to maintain our environment and surroundings greener, to plant more trees so that the existence of life increases because our environment generates 70% of the oxygen we breathe. A greener environment leads to a longer life span.

EVENT 8: NSS ORIENTATION PROGRAMME



The NSS orientation program was conducted on October 7, 2021. This event was attended by all first-year students. This event began with a welcome dance, which was followed by a short prayer asking for God's blessing. Focus on providing comprehensive information on youth development programmes, team building, leadership skills, disaster management, and village adoption, among other things. concerns. The most significant accomplishment was that this event was televised on News 18 Kannada, which brought honour to our college and our association.

This is the first time a new event has been organized by an NSS volunteers. The purpose of a wall painting event is to promote people's social awareness by conveying a message that is connected to a political ideology or social awareness. The Telugu Government School in Vivek Nagar is where the wall painting is done. People in the neighbourhood used to dump garbage, spit on the walls, and loiter on the walls. People seem to have forgotten that schools in the area should be kept clean so that children studying there do not get any illnesses. The volunteers cleaned the entire school campus, both inside and outside, to make the surrounding environment look clean and well maintained.

Each of the 15 walls was painted with a different theme. The main purpose of this two-day event was to make art more accessible to the general public while simultaneously raising awareness about important social issues. The group believes that the defacement of the government school walls can be stopped by combining two great forces- Social Responsibility and Art. This was a truly eye-opening experience for each of us. People will be less likely to litter or spit on freshly painted and aesthetically appealing walls.


Savitribai Phule was the first female teacher of India; she is also known as the revolutionary feminist icon and a social reformer of India. Savitribai Phule was born on January 3, 1831, in the village of Naigaon in Satara district in Maharashtra state. She had the revolutionary flame to take forward women's education for the upliftment of women in the field of education and literacy. She, along with her husband, was comrades in arms in the struggle to educate women.

To commemorate her birthday, we held a celebration in our campus with the students. The NSS students also took part in the celebration by making placards with Savitribai Phule's remarks and paintings, we received over 30 placards. Our NSS coordinators and the heads of our language departments then explained Savitribai Phule's efforts, sacrifice, and service to us.

Savitribai is an iconic figure for Indian women who understood the true meaning of women's liberation long before feminism became fashionable.




The events are:
