Social Visits

a. Cottolengo Special School

Eighty students from 2 B. Com B visited the Cottolengo Special School in Whitefield, Bengaluru on March 31, 2022. The visit helped them understand the issues faced by people who live with physical and mental health problems as well as learning disabilities.

b. Government Urdu Model Primary School
