THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT is made this 4th day of January 2021

BETWEEN

MAHSA UNIVERSITY of Jalan SP 2, Bandar Saujana Putra, 42610, Jenjarom, Selangor Darul Ehsan, Malaysia (hereinafter referred to as "MAHSA")

AND

ST. JOSEPH'S COLLEGE OF COMMERCE (AUTONOMOUS), #163, Brigade Road, Bangalore -560025, Indian (hereinafter referred to as "SJCC")

WHEREAS

The Parties hereto, recognising the benefits of establishing international links, wish to strengthen the ties between their respective institutions by entering into this Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA").

NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED

1. The purpose of this MOA is to develop co-operation and promote mutual understanding and excellence in practice-based education, research and knowledge exchange between the Parties. Both agree to strengthen ties of friendship and to promote Cultural, Educational and Scientific Cooperation.
2. In furtherance of this purpose the Parties agree to develop the following activities in collaboration in areas of mutual academic interest:
 - 2.1 Exchanges of academic and administrative staff and mutual visits to pursue research and to lecture
 - 2.2 Exchanges of students and/or study abroad programmes and other enhancements to the student experience
 - 2.3 Identifying opportunities for conducting collaborative research and development
 - 2.4 Identifying opportunities for conducting lectures and seminars and organising symposia and conferences
 - 2.5 Exchanges of academic information and materials
 - 2.6 Promoting collaboration in fields of mutual interest
 - 2.7 Promoting other academic co-operation and collaboration as mutually agreed.

3. The Parties hereby agree that the development and implementation of specific activities developed under this MOA will be the subject of formal written agreements negotiated and entered into separately, which will deal with the financial arrangements, confidentiality, ownership and use of intellectual property, publication of articles or other work and other relevant matters and shall depend upon the availability of resources and financial support of the Parties concerned.

4. Parties acknowledge the need to promote the programme and activities and hereby agree to use promotional materials that have been approved by the other Party.

5. Both Parties agree that staff and students of either institution engaged in any activities shall carry out these activities in accordance with the laws and regulations of their respective countries after full consultation and approval.

6. This MOA may only be amended by a written agreement signed by a duly authorised representative of each Party.

7. Any notice or request given or made by one party to the other under this MOA shall be in writing in the language of English to be sent to the following emails: MAHSA: syriac@mahsa.edu.my
SJCC: internationaldesk@sjcc.edu.in

This MOA shall commence of the date of its execution by the last Party to sign and shall remain in force for a period of five (5) years.

8. Either Party may terminate this MOA by giving six months' notice in writing to the other stating the reasons for the termination, consent of which shall not be unreasonably withheld. The termination of this MOA shall not affect the implementation of any specific activities established under a separate agreement prior to such termination.


9. Nothing in this MOA shall be construed as creating any legal relationships between the Parties.

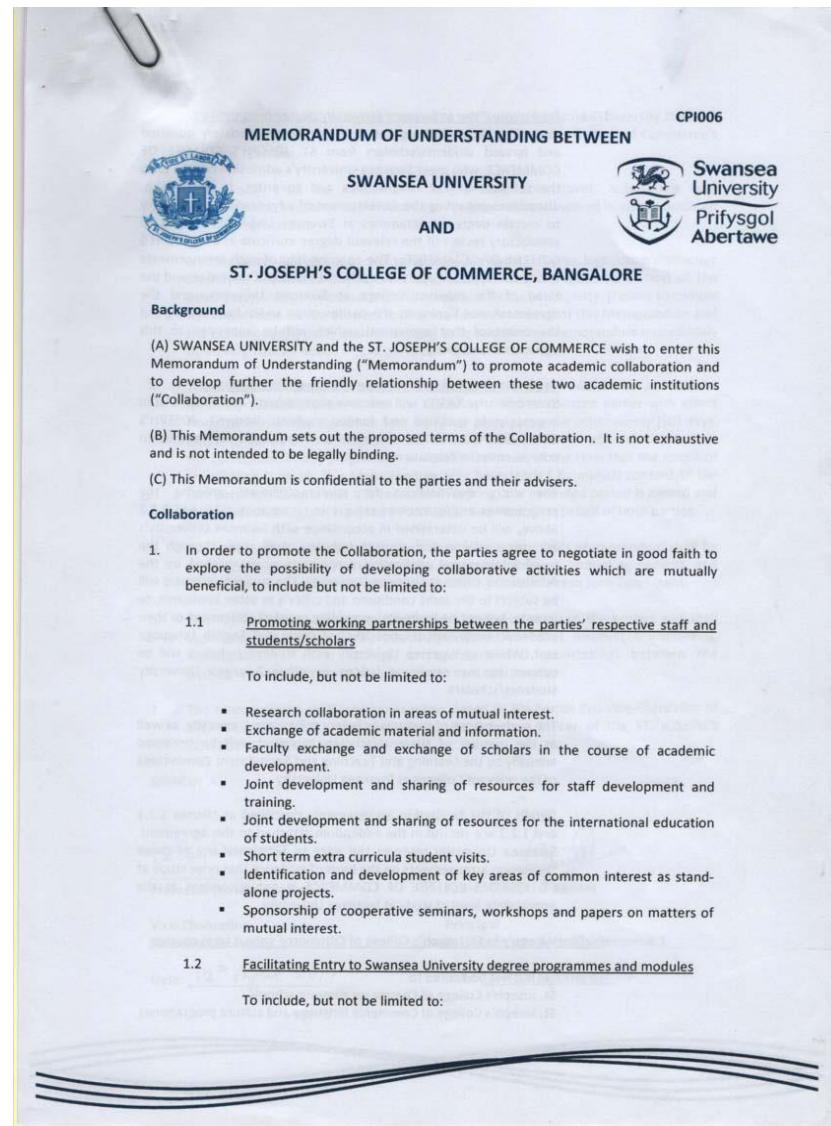

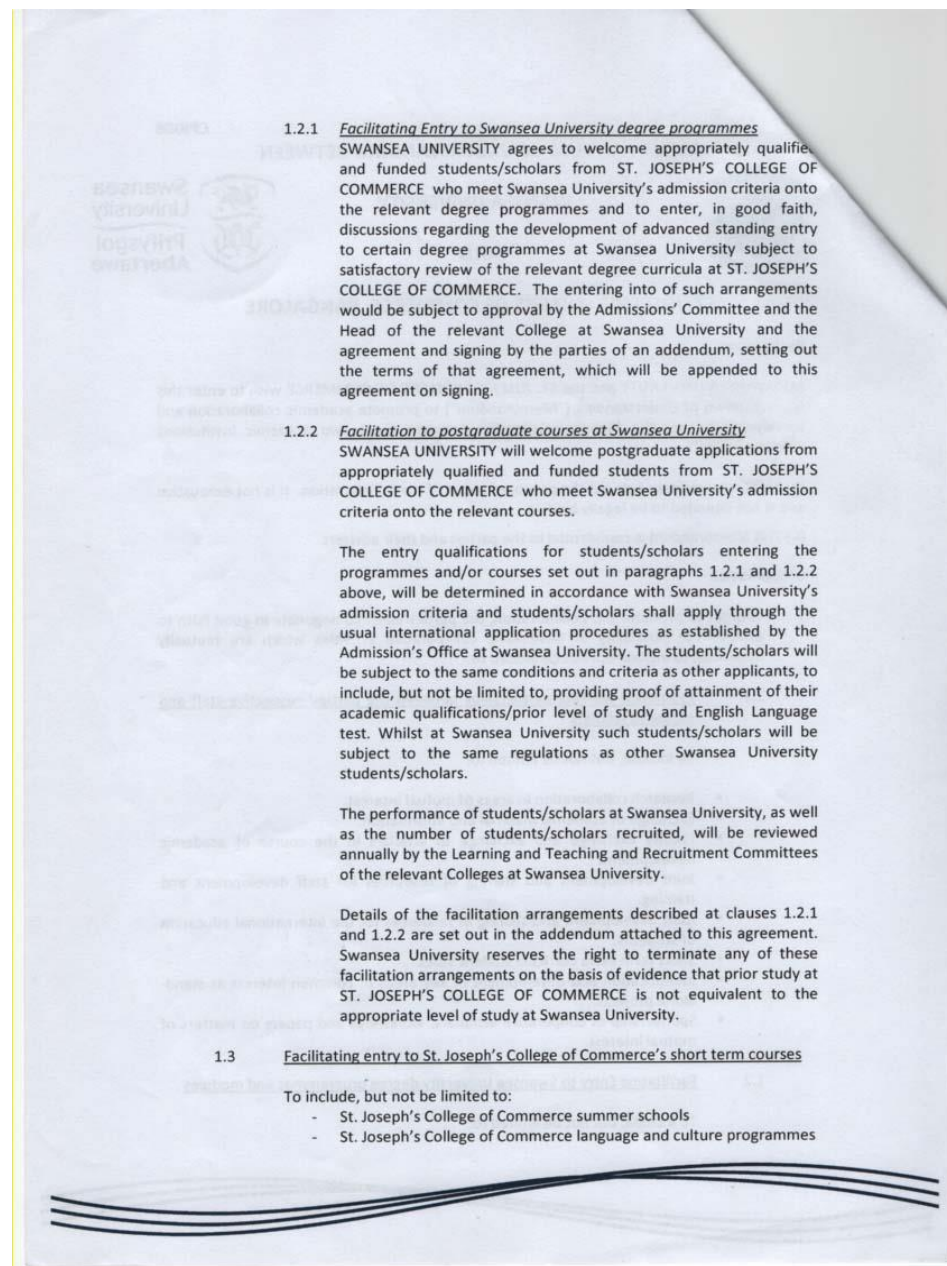

This Agreement confirms the intent of both parties to explore and facilitate academic collaboration.







Functional Memorandum of Understanding

St. Joseph's College of Commerce will welcome Swansea University students to participate in short term courses on St. Joseph's College of Commerce's campus.

2. Each Party shall be responsible for meeting the travel, subsistence and accommodation costs of its own staff and representatives, involved in visits associated with this agreement.
3. Neither party shall use, or permit to be used, the name, insignia, logo, other distinctive identifying feature or any intellectual property (whether registered or not) of the other party, except where such use is authorised by the other party. [Failure to comply with this clause will be deemed to be a fundamental breach of this Memorandum and the non-breaching party shall be entitled to terminate this Memorandum immediately by serving written notice on the party in breach of this clause].
4. This Memorandum shall commence on the date it is signed and remain in force for three (3) academic years in the first instance, unless terminated earlier with effect from the end of any Academic Year by either party giving the other ninety (90) days' notice to the other in writing, provided however that such termination shall not affect the completion of any programme or activity underway at the time that the notice of termination is given. This Memorandum may be extended by mutual consent of the two parties, provided that it is recorded in writing, the extended period is agreed and recorded in writing and is signed by an Authorised Person on behalf of both parties.
5. Any aspect of the Collaboration that is not mentioned in this Memorandum shall be discussed, agreed and/or resolved (as applicable) through mutual agreement, and each party covenants that it will make good faith efforts to reach such agreement.
6. This Memorandum constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and shall supersede and extinguish all previous agreements, promises, assurances, warranties, representations, understandings, arrangements and undertakings between the parties, whether written or oral, relating to its subject matter.
7. The Memorandum shall commence when signed by the Senior Pro-Vice-Chancellor of SWANSEA UNIVERSITY and the appropriate Principal Officer of the ST. JOSEPH'S COLLEGE OF COMMERCE.

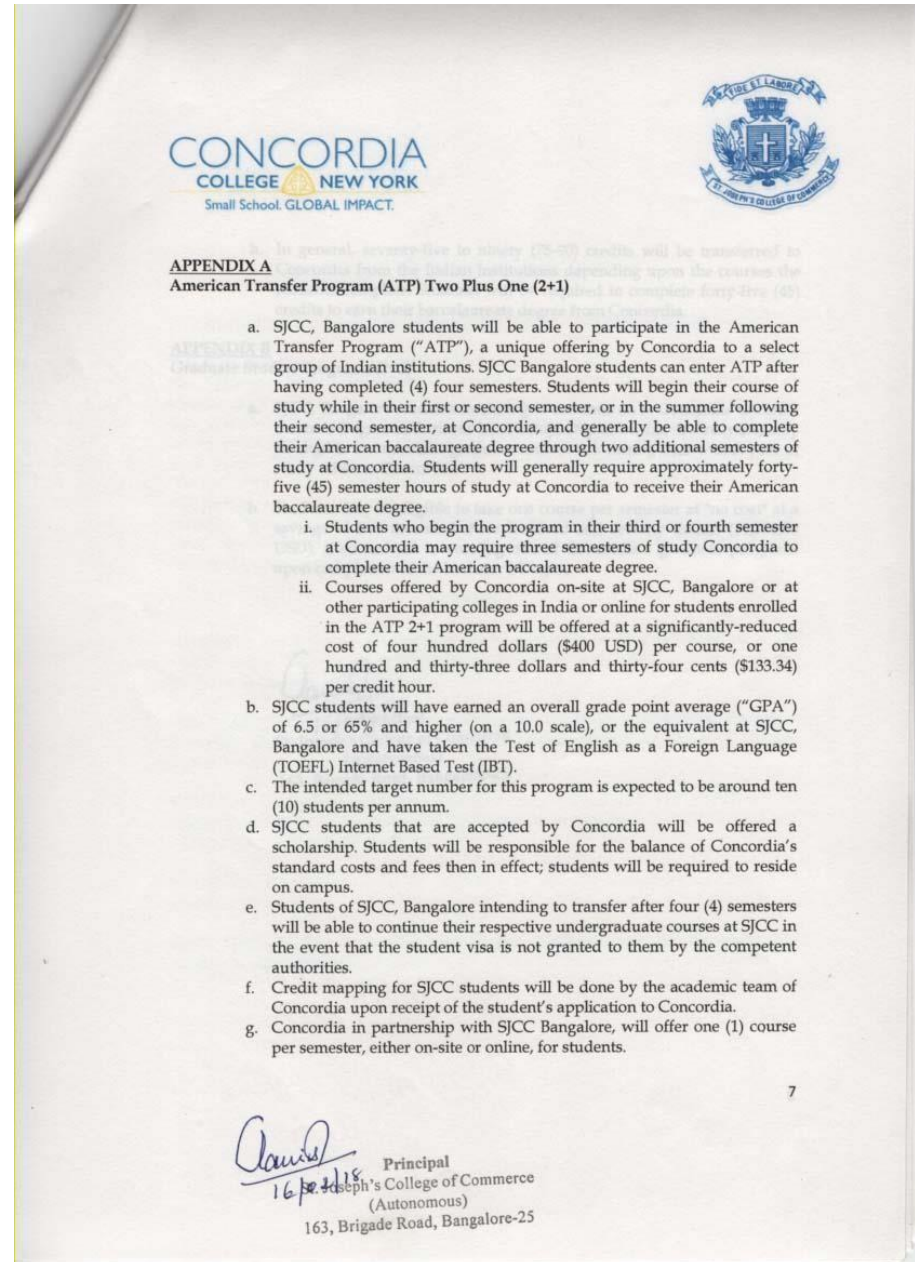


Section 10. Severability


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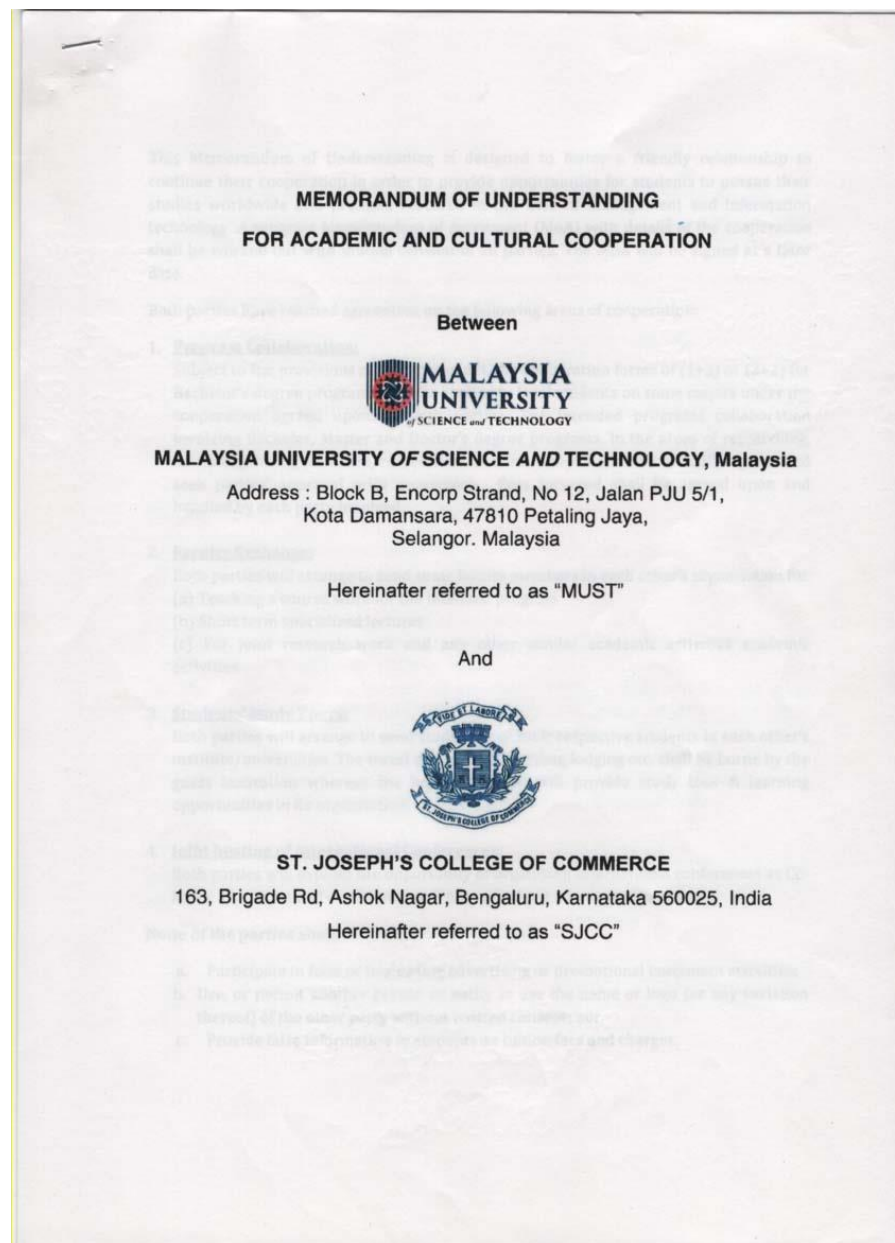

This Memorandum of Understanding is designed to foster a friendly relationship to continue their cooperation in order to provide opportunities for students to pursue their studies worldwide and promote research in the field of management and information technology. A separate Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) with details of the cooperation shall be worked out with mutual consent of all parties. The MoA will be signed at a later date.

Both parties have reached agreement on the following areas of cooperation:

1. **Program Collaboration:**

Subject to the provisions of this agreement, the cooperation forms of (1+3) or (2+2) for Bachelor's degree programs shall be applied to local students on some majors under the cooperation agreed upon by both parties. The intended programs collaboration involving Bachelor, Master and Doctor's degree programs. In the areas of researching, for co-organizing seminars/conferences on certain topics shall be mutually agreed and seek parties' approval prior commence. Fees incurred shall be agreed upon and handled by each party involved.

2. **Faculty Exchange:**

Both parties will arrange to send some faculty members in each other's organisation for

- (a) Teaching a course work for the intended program
- (b) Short term specialized lectures
- (c) For joint research work and any other similar academic activities academic activities.

3. **Students' Study Tours:**

Both parties will arrange to send study tour of their respective students in each other's institute/universities. The travel expenses & boarding lodging etc. shall be borne by the guest institution whereas the host institution will provide study tour & learning opportunities in its organisation.

4. **Joint hosting of International Conferences:**

Both parties will explore the opportunity of organising international conferences as Co-hosts. The terms and conditions shall be worked out on a case to case basis.

None of the parties shall:

- a. Participate in false or misleading advertising or promotional enrolment activities;
- b. Use, or permit another person or entity to use the name or logo (or any variation thereof) of the other party without written consent; nor
- c. Provide false information to students on tuition fees and charges.

All parties shall:

- a. Keep all information or materials acquired or produced in connection with this Agreement confidential and shall not use or disclose or otherwise make available to any person such information or materials in any form without prior written consent;

Follow the following procedures in relation to resolving any disputes arising from or in relation to the agreement:

- Use their best endeavours to resolve the dispute through negotiation on the principle of good faith (ensuring the dispute is handled by appropriate level of their respective management) and
- If the parties fail to reach a resolution to the dispute within 30 days (or such longer period as the Parties may agree upon in writing), the dispute shall be referred to and settled by a mutually agreed arbitrator and such arbitral award can be final, conclusive and binding on the parties.

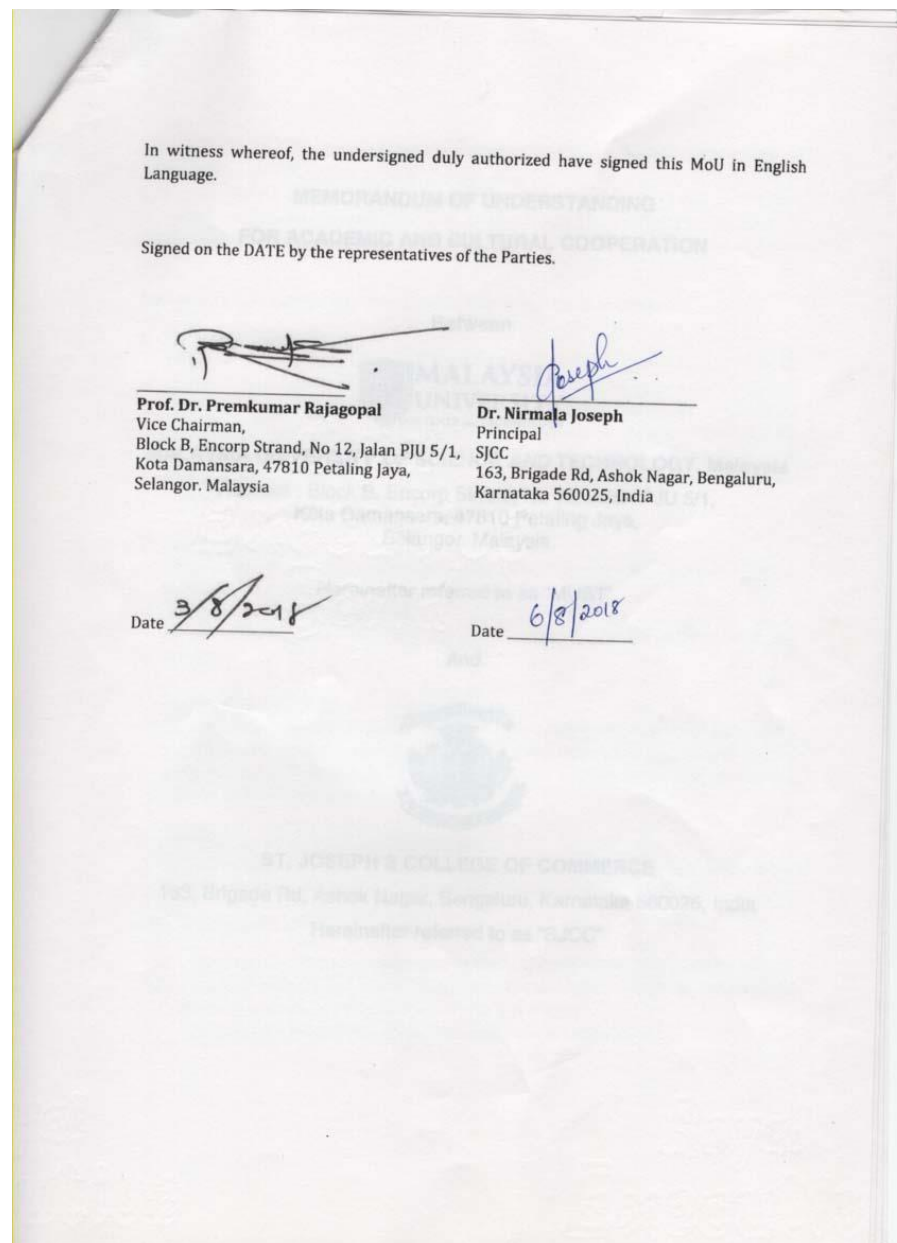
This Agreement

- a. Shall be effective as of the date of its execution by the Parties;
- b. Shall be valid for a period of 2 (two) years, unless terminated earlier pursuant to this Agreement.
- c. May be amended in writing signed by the Parties.
- d. May be terminated at any time by one party giving to the other Parties written notice of termination not less than 60 days in advance.
- e. May be terminated immediately by one Party sending written notice to the other Parties if the other Parties are in breach of any term of this Agreement and fail to remedy the breach within seven (7) days after being requested in writing or the other Party goes into liquidation or makes a composition or arrangement with its creditors generally, or take advantage of any statute for the relief of insolvent debtors; and
- f. May be renewed on terms agreed by the Parties on or before its expiration.



Each institution will designate an individual to coordinate this program and all endeavors that may derive from it. For this purpose, MUST designates Mr. Thanga Thurai Vengadasalam and SJCC designates NAME, DESIGNATION.

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
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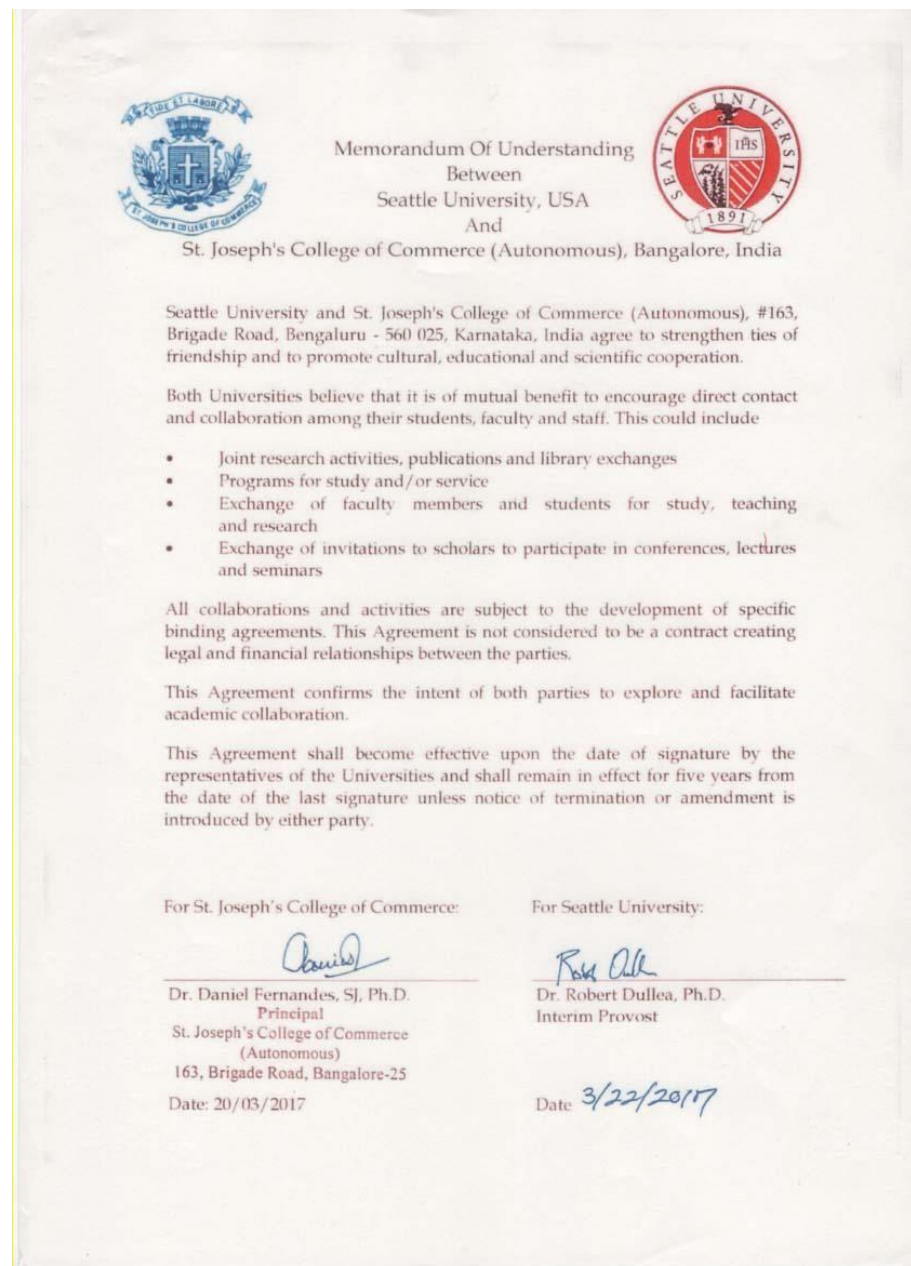
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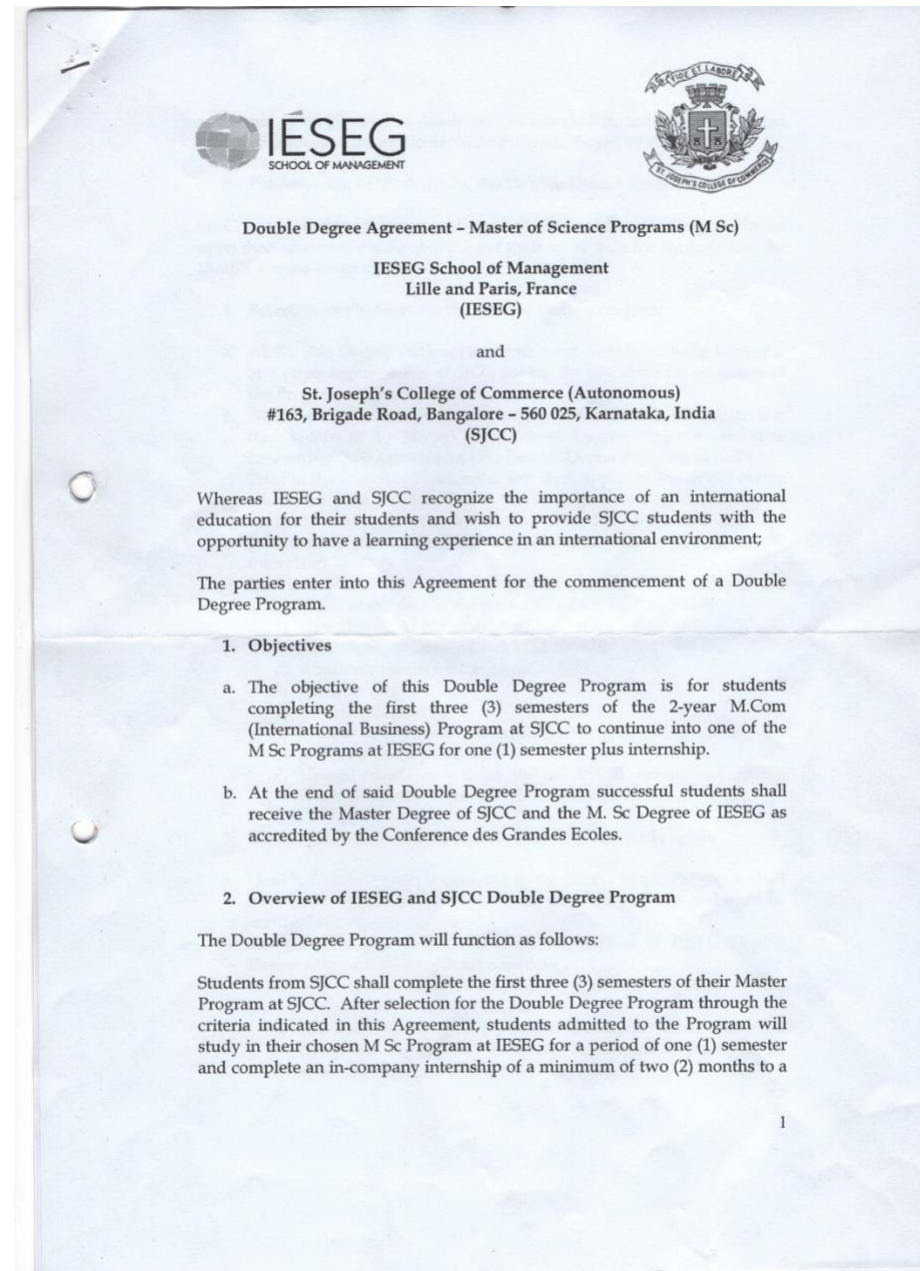

maximum of six (6) months. Academic Courses shall include all business and language courses of the particular M Sc Program chosen by the student.

3. Pre-Selection of Students for the Double Degree Program

SJCC is responsible for the pre-selection of students into the Program based upon their academic results at SJCC and their motivation for entrance into the Double Degree Program.

4. Selection of Students for the Double Degree Program

- a. All Double Degree Program students must comply with the academic and other requirements of SJCC during the first three (3) semesters of the Program taught at SJCC.
- b. At the end of semester 2, a representative of IESEG shall interview (face-to-face or by Skype) each Double Degree Program candidate concerning their entrance into the Double Degree Program at IESEG.
- c. Prior to the interview, each candidate shall apply on the IESEG online admission platform established for all degree-seeking students; and complete and print the application file. The document must be provided to the representative of IESEG at the beginning of the interview.
- d. Each candidate for the Double Degree Program at IESEG must provide a full dossier at the time of the interview which shall include:
 - 1) Completed application printed from the online IESEG admission platform (as indicated above);
 - 2) Academic results for the period at SJCC;
 - 3) Bachelor Degree;
 - 4) A Curriculum Vitae;
 - 5) A letter of motivation (in English) written by each student;
 - 6) A copy of valid passport;
 - 7) Unless otherwise waived by the IESEG coordinator of the Double Degree Program IELTS results of a minimum of 6.5.

5. Double Degree Program Students in IESEG Master Program

- a. Double Degree Program students in the IESEG M Sc Programs shall have all the rights and obligations of all M Sc students and shall be regular M Sc students of IESEG.
- b. According to the current Academic Regulations of IESEG Double Degree Program students must complete:
 - 1) One (1) semesters of academic courses as required by the academic regulations of IESEG;
 - 2) Either a four (4) to six (6) month in-company internship to be completed anywhere in the world; or a Thesis according to the academic regulations of the M Sc Program.

c. At present, the following M Sc Programs are open to all Double Degree Program students:

- International Business (MIB);
- Finance (FIN);
- Digital Marketing and CRM (CRM);
- Business Analysis and Consulting (BAC);
- Accounting, Audit and Control (AAC);
- Investment Banking and Capital Markets (BANK);
- International Business Negotiation (NEGO);
- Big Data Analytics for Business (BDA).

6. Award

All Double Degree Program students who succeed in the academic and other requirements in the M Sc Programs at IESEG shall receive the M Sc Degree of IESEG as accredited by the Conference des Grandes Ecoles.

7. Tuition

- a. During the Study at SJCC, students will pay tuition fees at SJCC
- b. Double Degree Program students shall pay the following tuition amounts for each of the M Sc Programs:
 - 1) 5400 € for the MIB; CRM; BAC; NEGO;
 - 2) 5625 € for AAC;
 - 3) 5850 € for BDA;
 - 4) 6300 € for MFM; FIN; BANK.
- c. There shall be a waiver of the administrative fee (currently 80 € for 2016) for all Double Degree Program students.
- d. All students are required to pay a deposit of €1600 in order to secure their seat in the program before the 15th of June in each year. Once the deposit is made, the acceptance letter shall be sent to the student.
- e. The parties acknowledge and agree that this tuition cost may increase in future years and IESEG agrees to advise SJCC in a timely manner of any of such tuition increases.

8. Expenses

- a. **Incidental:** Double Degree Program students shall pay all costs for housing, transportation, visa, food, books and all other personal and incidental expenses during their time in France at IESEG.

- b. IESEG Alumni Network: From September 2017, Double Degree Program students shall be required to pay the subscription to the IESEG Alumni Network which, for 2017, is fixed in the sum of 300 €.

9. Housing

- a. IESEG will provide assistance to Double Degree Program students to secure suitable housing for the period of time that they will be on campus. The cost of said housing shall be paid by the student.
- b. All Double Degree Program students must abide by the rules and regulations of the housing authority and IESEG will not intervene on behalf of any student violating any housing rules and regulations.

10. Health/Medical Coverage

- a. Double Degree Program students shall be required to have appropriate health and medical insurance for the duration of their stay at IESEG.
- b. Double Degree Program students must provide a name, address and phone number of an appropriate person to be contacted in the event of accident or illness.
- c. Double Degree Program student shall comply with any directives from IESEG regarding any health or medical issues, including but not limited to, any requirements of quarantine, compulsory medical visits and the providing of necessary medical information to the relevant health authorities of both the institution and the government.
- d. Double Degree Program students shall purchase the health/medical coverage (known as "sécurité sociale") in France according to the requirements of French law. It covers the student for one (1) academic year and costs approximately 215 €. If the student extends his education at IESEG (internship in France or abroad, thesis, retake exams etc.), he will be required to purchase this coverage for the following academic year (no matter how long the extension period).

11. Visa

- a. Each Double Degree Program student will be responsible for obtaining his or her own visa and completing the required immigration procedures needed to pursue studies at IESEG. In any case where the student has not obtained a visa of the host country, in cases required by law to do so, IESEG shall refuse admission to the student and shall advise SJCC.
- b. The IESEG agrees to provide an acceptance letter and other necessary documentation to be used by the student in obtaining the necessary visa.
- c. Any student failing to abide by the terms and conditions of his/her visa shall be immediately suspended from IESEG.

12. Program Coordination

Each institution will nominate a Program coordinator to ensure that the study proceeds according to a reasonable schematic plan and to ensure the terms of this Agreement are carried out. Each institution may name a successor to, or replacement of, its coordinator. Each Program coordinator will ensure that the partner institution has available to it all information appropriate to the promotion of the Program.

13. Duration, Amendment, Review and Termination of Agreement


- a. This Agreement shall be in force and be binding upon the parties for a period of five years from the date of signing. It shall be subject to revision, modification or renewal by mutual written agreement.
- b. The Agreement may be terminated at the request of either institution, provided such request is made in writing at least twelve (12) months before termination is to become effective. Any termination of the Agreement must take into account the rights of students already participating or accepted for any exchange to complete their stay.

14. Repatriation of Student Participants

In the event of an emergency, illness, accident or any other urgent situation in which a student participant is required or desires to return home, IESEG will make all reasonable efforts to assist said student in returning at the earliest possible time.



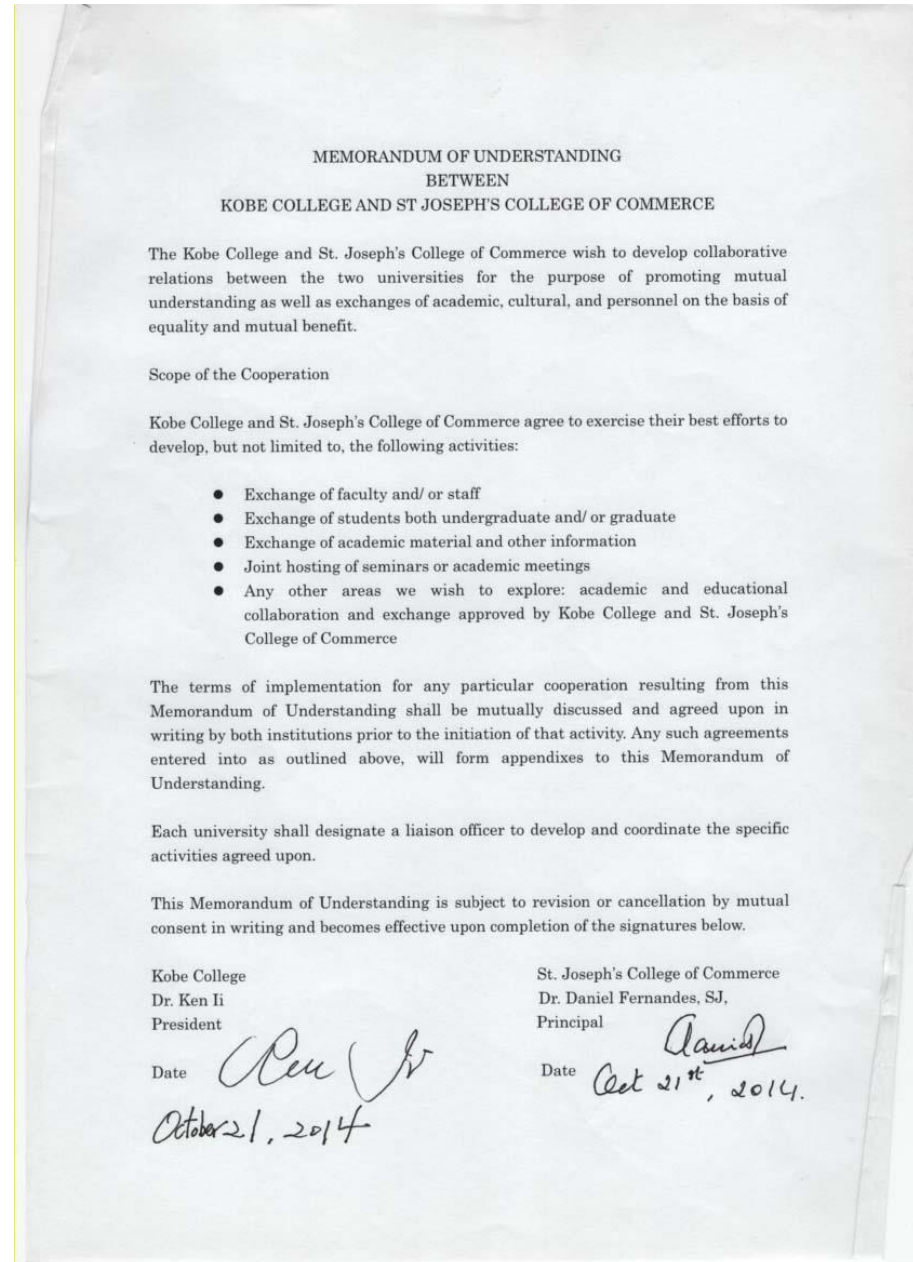

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

The Kobe College and St. Joseph's College of Commerce wish to develop collaborative relations between the two universities for the purpose of promoting mutual understanding as well as exchanges of academic, cultural, and personnel on the basis of equality and mutual benefit.

Scope of the Cooperation

Kobe College and St. Joseph's College of Commerce agree to exercise their best efforts to develop, but not limited to, the following activities:

- Exchange of faculty, ~~post-doctoral and/or staff~~
- Exchange of students both undergraduate and/or graduate
- Exchange of academic material and other information
- Joint research activities or publications
- Joint hosting of seminars or academic meetings
- Any other areas we wish to explore: academic and educational collaboration and exchange approved by Kobe College and St. Joseph's College of Commerce

The terms of implementation for any particular cooperation resulting from this Memorandum of Understanding shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing by both institutions prior to the initiation of that activity. Any such agreements entered into as outlined above, will form appendixes to this Memorandum of Understanding.

Each university shall designate a liaison officer to develop and coordinate the specific activities agreed upon.

This Memorandum of Understanding is subject to revision or cancellation by mutual consent in writing and becomes effective upon completion of the signatures below.

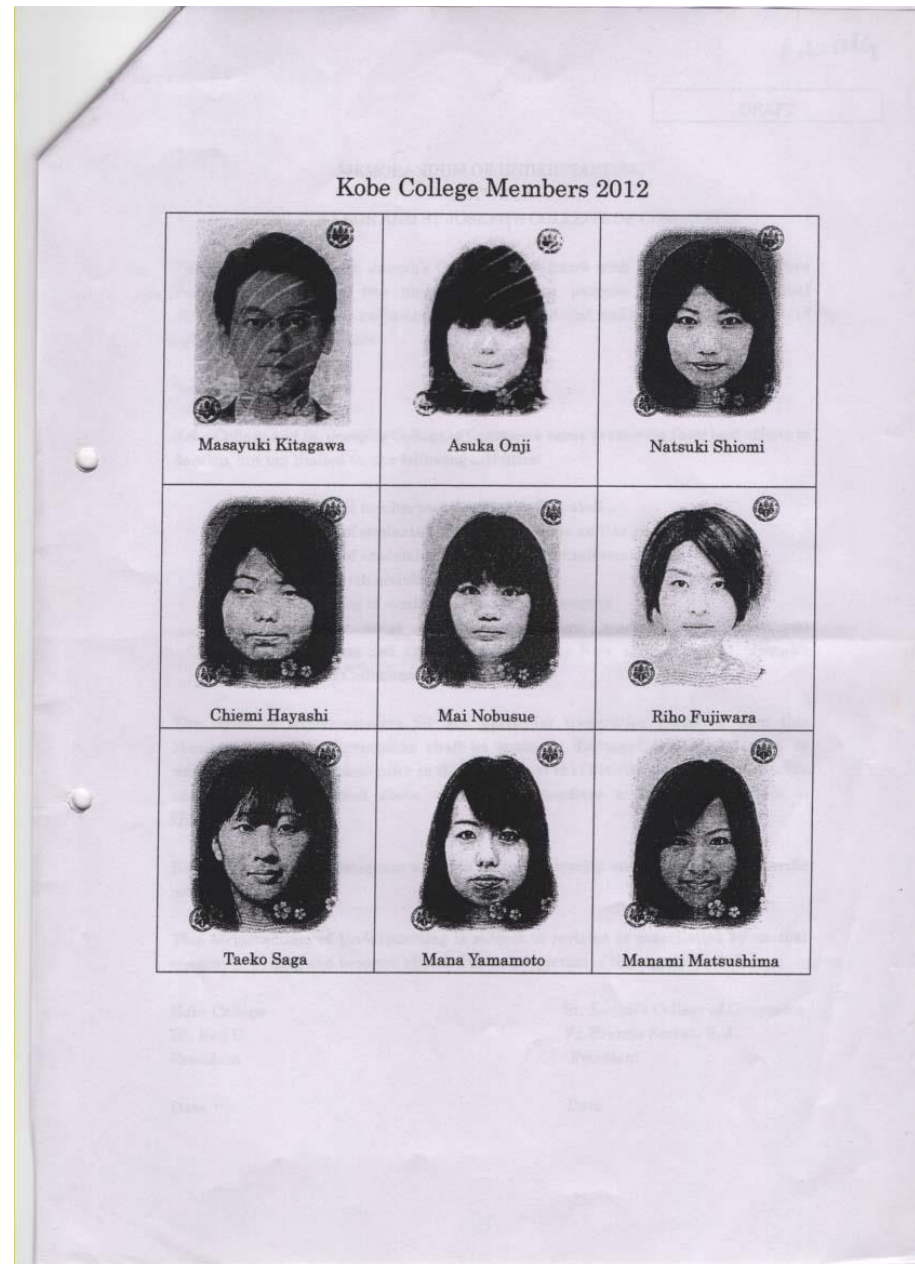

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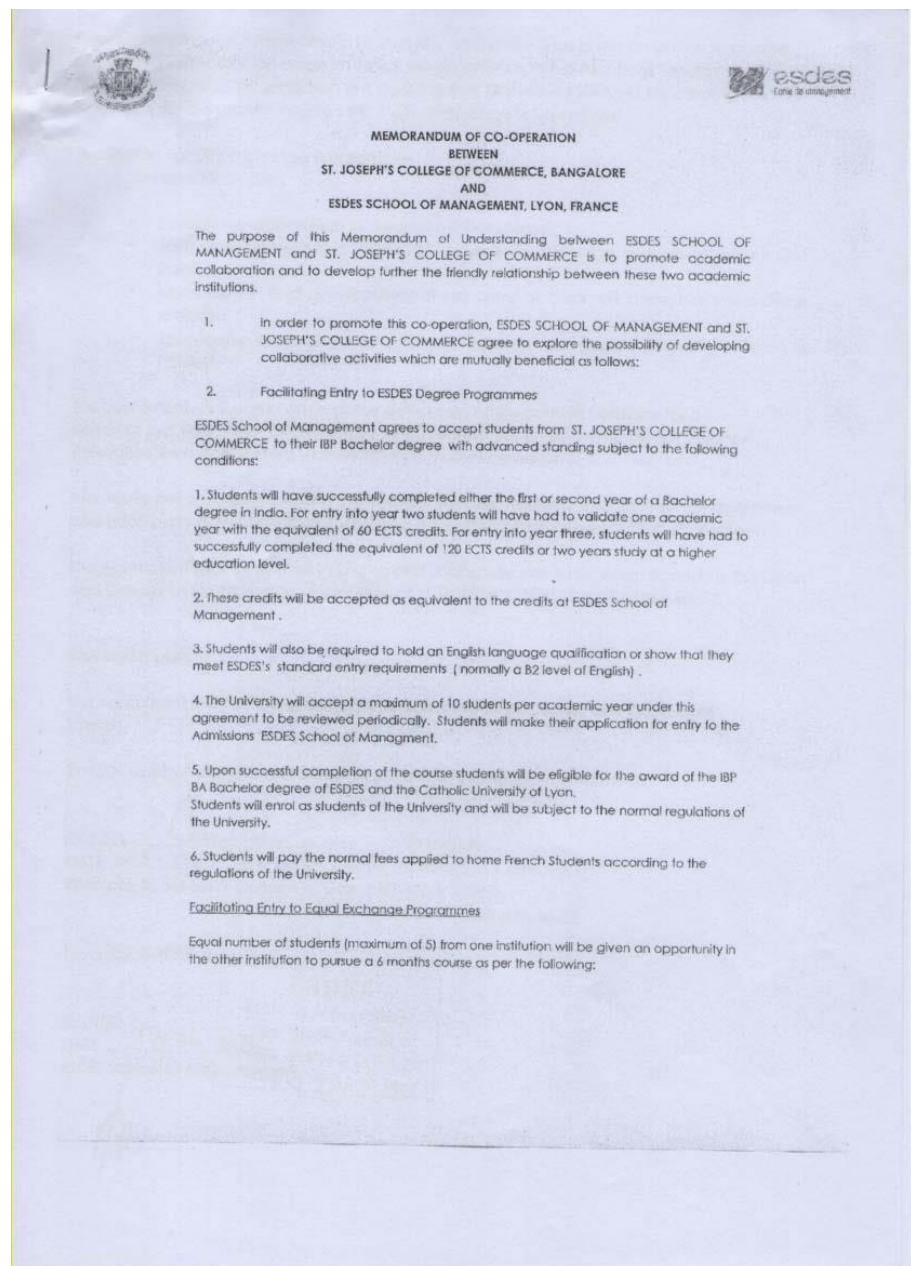

Functional Memorandum of Understanding

After completing first 3 Semesters in St. Josephs', students will be given an option to choose any of ESDES 6 months IBP program which will commence in the month of January. An equal number of students who are pursuing their Masters in ESDES will be admitted to St. Josephs' for a 6 months course which will commence in September.

Facilitating Faculty Exchange Programmes
This could include:

- Research collaboration in areas of mutual interest.
- Joint development and sharing of resources for teaching, staff development and training.
- Identification and development of key areas of common interest as stand-alone projects.
- Sponsorship of cooperative seminars, workshops and papers on matters of mutual interest.

This agreement shall commence at the date of signature and will continue for a period of four years after the first intake of students to the University, in the first instance. Thereafter, the arrangement is renewable by mutual agreement.


Any issues not mentioned in this agreement shall be resolved through mutual agreement, and each party covenants that it will make good faith efforts to reach such agreement.


