MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT is made this 4th day of January 2021

BETWEEN

MAHSA UNIVERSITY of Jalan SP 2, Bandar Saujana Putra, 42610, Jenjarom, Selangor Darul Ehsan, Malaysia (hereinafter referred to as "MAHSA")

AND

ST. JOSEPH'S COLLEGE OF COMMERCE (AUTONOMOUS), #163, Brigade Road, Bangalore -560025, Indian (hereinafter referred to as "SJCC")

WHEREAS

The Parties hereto, recognising the benefits of establishing international links, wish to strengthen the ties between their respective institutions by entering into this Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA").

NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED

- The purpose of this MOA is to develop co-operation and promote mutual understanding and excellence in practice-based education, research and knowledge exchange between the Parties. Both agree to strengthen ties of friendship and to promote Cultural, Educational and Scientific Cooperation.
- In furtherance of this purpose the Parties agree to develop the following activities in collaboration in areas of mutual academic interest.
- Exchanges of academic and administrative staff and mutual visits to pursue research and to lecture
- 2.2 Exchanges of students and/or study abroad programmes and other enhancements to the student experience
- Identifying opportunities for conducting collaborative research and development
- 2.4 Identifying opportunities for conducting lectures and seminars and organising symposia and conferences
- 2.5 Exchanges of academic information and materials
- 2.6 Promoting collaboration in fields of mutual interest
- Promoting other academic co-operation and collaboration as mutually agreed.

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- 3. The Parties hereby agree that the development and implementation of specific activities developed under this MOA will be the subject of formal written agreements negotiated and entered into separately, which will deal with the financial arrangements, confidentiality, ownership and use of intellectual property, publication of articles or other work and other relevant matters and shall depend upon the availability of resources and financial support of the Parties concerned.
- Parties acknowledge the need to promote the programme and activities and hereby agree to use promotional materials that have been approved by the other Party.
- 5. Both Parties agree that staff and students of either institution engaged in any activities shall carry out these activities in accordance with the laws and regulations of their respective countries after full consultation and approval.
- This MOA may only be amended by a written agreement signed by a duly authorised representative of each Party.
- 7. Any notice or request given or made by one party to the other under this MOA shall be in writing in the language of English to be sent to the following emails: MAHSA: syriac@mahsa.edu.my SJCC: internationaldesk@sjcc.edu.in

This MOA shall commence of the date of its execution by the last Party to sign and shall remain in force for a period of five (5) years.

- 8. Either Party may terminate this MOA by giving six months' notice in writing to the other stating the reasons for the termination, consent of which shall not be unreasonably withheld. The termination of this MOA shall not affect the implementation of any specific activities established under a separate agreement prior to such termination.
- Nothing in this MOA shall be construed as creating any legal relationships between the Parties.



Whilst at Swansea University such students/scholars will be subject to the same regulations as other Swansea University students/scholars.

The performance of students/scholars at Swansea University, as well as the number of students/scholars recruited, will be reviewed annually by the Learning and Teaching and Recruitment Committees of the relevant Colleges at Swansea University.

Details of the facilitation arrangements described at clauses 1.2.1 and 1.2.2 are set out in the addendum attached to this agreement. Swansea University reserves the right to terminate any of these facilitation arrangements on the basis of evidence that prior study at ST. JOSEPH'S COLLEGE OF COMMERCE is not equivalent to the appropriate level of study at Swansea University.



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Concordia College and St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous)

This Memorandum of Understanding (the "Agreement") dated as of February 14, 2018 (the "Effective Date"), formalizes a relationship between 5t. Joseph's College of Commerce, Bangalore(hereinafter "SJCC, Bangalore), located at #163, Brigade Road, Bangalore-560025, India and Concordia College (hereinafter "Concordia"), a New York not-for-profit education corporation, located at 171 White Plains Road, Bronxville, New York 10708, United States of America.(hereinafter, collectively referred to as the "Parties"). The intent of the Parties is to develop a long term mutually beneficial relationship whereby students of SJCC, Bangalore may be eligible to enroll and participate in a transfer undergraduate degree program of academic study at Concordia. Upon successful completion of the academic program of study the students will be conferred a degree by Concordia.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Concordia is accredited by the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and offers various academic programs at the undergraduate and graduate level; and

WHEREAS, SJCC, Bangalore is an autonomous institution affiliated to Bangalore University and is accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with 'A' grade; and

WHEREAS, Concordia will offer the American Transfer Program ("ATP") and Graduate Studies Program to the students of SJCC, Bangalore, as explained in APPENDIX A and APPENDIX B, to this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to cooperate to promote Concordia's programs of academic study; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the covenants and conditions expressed in this Agreement, the Parties hereto mutually agree as follows.





Section 1. Mutual Responsibilities

- 1.1 <u>Application Process.</u> SJCC, Bangalore will initially select and screen applicants for Concordia's programs. Concordia reserves the right to deny or defer admission to any applicant.
- 1.2 Application Requirements. Students from SJCC, Bangalore must have a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 6.5 or 65% and higher (on a 10.0 scale), or the equivalent at SJCC, Bangalore and must have taken the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) Internet Based Test (IBT). All students must present application materials as requested by the Concordia admissions office.
- 1.3 The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). All education records of students from SJCC, Bangalore who apply and are accepted for admission to Concordia shall be the property of and maintained by Concordia.
- 1.4 Full-Time Status. All students must enroll and remain in a full course of study each
- 1.5 Payment for Services. Concordia agrees to provide SJCC, Bangalore with a one-time payment of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500 USD) per student, no later than the sixtieth (60%) day after the commencement of the student's first semester. Students must have first paid their college tuition fees in full before compensation can be provided to SJCC, Bangalore. In the event a student has paid a portion of their tuition by the end of the semester, an equal, prorated percentage of the compensation will be provided to SJCC, Bangalore. If under any circumstances, a student withdraws from Concordia's degree program after the add/drop period, Concordia is not liable to compensate SJCC, Bangalore for that particular student.

Section 2. Responsibilities of SJCC, Bangalore

SJCC, Bangalore hereby agrees to fulfill its assigned responsibilities as follows:

2.1 Marketing. SJCC, Bangalore will market and promote the academic programs of Concordia to their students. SJCC, Bangalore shall connect prospective students who have expressed interest in pursuing Concordia undergraduate or graduate degrees with Concordia's admissions office.



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2.2 Website. SJCC, Bangalore shall maintain a portal page on its website to market Concordia's programs to their students. Any content on SJCC, Bangalore's portal page regarding Concordia shall be subject to advance approval in accordance with Concordia's marketing materials approval policy, specified in 2.2.

2.3 Admissions Application Assistance. SJCC, Bangalore agrees to provide transfer certificates and transcripts for all students who apply to Concordia.

2.4 Legal Compliance. SJCC, Bangalore shall comply, at its own expense, with the provisions of all applicable local, state and federal laws, rules and regulations covering the services in connection with their responsibilities under this Agreement.

2.5 Admissions Assistance. SJCC, Bangalore agrees to appoint a coordinator located on their campus to serve as their liaison to Concordia in connection with this

Section 3. Responsibilities of Concordia

Concordia hereby agrees to fulfill its assigned responsibilities as follows: 3.1 Admissions Application Processing Concordia agrees to review all applications within two (2) weeks upon receipt of all completed application materials.

3.2 Scholarships

a. Concordia agrees to offer students of SJCC, Bangalore a scholarship of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000 USD) only per annum for students who meet all of Concordia's eligibility requirements, which includes a minimum of 6.5 GPA on 10.0 GPA or the equivalent at SJCC, Bangalore. Students shall have secured a minimum of eighty (80) TOEFL IBT/120 IBT. Students who have demonstrated English language skills, as determined by Concordia, will be exempt from the TOEFL/IELTS requirements.

b. Students will be eligible to apply for the honors program with an 8.5 GPA or World Education Services (WES) equivalent. Honors program students would be eligible to receive up to a maximum scholarship of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000 USD) per year, upon fulfilling Concordia's requirements.

3.3 Additional Assistance Concordia's India Liaison office will provide guidance and support to SJCC students regarding education loan application and visa application process.





- 3.4 <u>Tuition</u>. Tuition will be charged at standard advertised rates. Concordia reserves the right to modify its fee structure annually. Payment of tuition, fees, meal plans, housing costs, textbooks, orientation fees, travel expenses or other college charges are the responsibility of the individual student.
- 3.5 Individual student program mapping. Concordia will map each student's planner (completed courses) prior to their arrival on campus. SJCC, Bangalore must send the syllabi of all the courses taken by each student in SJCC, Bangalore, upon students' acceptance to Concordia, in order to facilitate the program mapping.
- 3.6 <u>Instruction Site for Courses</u>. Courses shall be taught by Concordia faculty on Concordia's campus located at 171 White Plains Road, Bronxville, New York 10708 and students will be required to register for a minimum of twelve (12) credits per term.
- 3.7 Marketing Materials. Marketing materials shall be provided by Concordia to SJCC, Bangalore and will include but not be limited to: announcements, brochures, flyers, social media posts on any social media site, and any other collateral marketing materials that may be disseminated in any medium. In addition, Concordia shall approve all Concordia-specific photos, graphics or images (i.e., photos of the campus, campus buildings, faculty or students).

Section 4.Term; Termination

The term of this Agreement shall begin once signed and is intended to continue for a term of three (3) years or until terminated by one of the parties with ninety (90) days advance written notice, or unless there is a breach of this Agreement or violation of any laws on the part of either party.


Section 5. Entire Understanding

Neither Party may delegate any duties or assign any of its rights under this Agreement without the prior express written consent of the other Party, subject to any necessary legal approvals. This Agreement shall not be discharged, changed or modified except by an instrument in writing signed by a duly authorized representative of each of the Parties.

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

- a. SJCC, Bangalore students will be able to participate in the American Transfer Program ("ATP"), a unique offering by Concordia to a select group of Indian institutions. SJCC Bangalore students can enter ATP after having completed (4) four semesters. Students will begin their course of study while in their first or second semester, or in the summer following their second semester, at Concordia, and generally be able to complete their American baccalaureate degree through two additional semesters of study at Concordia. Students will generally require approximately fortyfive (45) semester hours of study at Concordia to receive their American baccalaureate degree.
 - Students who begin the program in their third or fourth semester at Concordia may require three semesters of study Concordia to complete their American baccalaureate degree.
 - ii. Courses offered by Concordia on-site at SJCC, Bangalore or at other participating colleges in India or online for students enrolled in the ATP 2+1 program will be offered at a significantly-reduced cost of four hundred dollars (\$400 USD) per course, or one hundred and thirty-three dollars and thirty-four cents (\$133.34) per credit hour.
 - b. SJCC students will have earned an overall grade point average ("GPA") of 6.5 or 65% and higher (on a 10.0 scale), or the equivalent at SJCC, Bangalore and have taken the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) Internet Based Test (IBT).
 - The intended target number for this program is expected to be around ten (10) students per annum.
 - d. SJCC students that are accepted by Concordia will be offered a scholarship. Students will be responsible for the balance of Concordia's standard costs and fees then in effect; students will be required to reside on campus.
 - Students of SJCC, Bangalore intending to transfer after four (4) semesters
 will be able to continue their respective undergraduate courses at SJCC in
 the event that the student visa is not granted to them by the competent
 authorities.
 - f. Credit mapping for SJCC students will be done by the academic team of Concordia upon receipt of the student's application to Concordia.
 - g. Concordia in partnership with SJCC Bangalore, will offer one (1) course per semester, either on-site or online, for students.







5. Double Degree Program Students in IESEG Master Program

- a. Double Degree Program students in the IESEG M SC Programs shall have all the rights and obligations of all M Sc students and shall be regular M Sc students of IESEG.
- b. According to the current Academic Regulations of IESEG Double Degree Program students must complete:
 - 1) One (1) semesters of academic courses as required by the academic regulations of IESEG;

9. Housing

- a. IESEG will provide assistance to Double Degree Program students to secure suitable housing for the period of time that they will be on campus. The cost of said housing shall be paid by the student.
- All Double Degree Program students must abide by the rules and regulations of the housing authority and IESEG will not intervene on behalf of any student violating any housing rules and regulations.

10. Health/Medical Coverage

- Double Degree Program students shall be required to have appropriate health and medical insurance for the duration of their stay at IESEG.
- Double Degree Program students must provide a name, address and phone number of an appropriate person to be contacted in the event of accident or illness.
- c. Double Degree Program student shall comply with any directives from IESEG regarding any health or medical issues, including but not limited to, any requirements of quarantine, compulsory medical visits and the providing of necessary medical information to the relevant health authorities of both the institution and the government.
- d. Double Degree Program students shall purchase the health/medical coverage (known as "sécurité sociale") in France according to the requirements of French law. It covers the student for one (1) academic year and costs approximately 215 €. If the student extends his education at IÉSEG (internship in France or abroad, thesis, retake exams etc.), he will be required to purchase this coverage for the following academic year (no matter how long the extension period).

11. Visa

- a. Each Double Degree Program student will be responsible for obtaining his or her own visa and completing the required immigration procedures needed to pursue studies at IESEG. In any case where the student has not obtained a visa of the host country, in cases required by law to do so, IESEG shall refuse admission to the student and shall advise SJCC.
- The IESEG agrees to provide an acceptance letter and other necessary documentation to be used by the student in obtaining the necessary visa
- Any student failing to abide by the terms and conditions of his/her visa shall be immediately suspended from IESEG.

12. Program Coordination Each institution will nominate a Program coordinator to ensure that the study proceeds according to a reasonable schematic plan and to ensure the terms of this Agreement are carried out. Each institution may name a successor to, or replacement of, its coordinator. Each Program coordinator will ensure that the partner institution has available to it all information appropriate to the promotion of the Program. 13.
