Brief history of St. Joseph's College of Commerce


St. Joseph's College of Commerce (SJCC) is run by the Society of Jesus, a catholic religious order founded in 1540 by St. Ignatius of Loyola. The members of the society of Jesus have been active in the field of education throughout the world. Loyola College, Chennai, St. Xavier's University, Calcutta and St. Xavier's College, Mumbai, St. Joseph's College, Trichy are some of the premier institutions in India run by the Jesuit Order. St. Joseph's College of Commerce was formerly a part of St. Joseph's College, established in the year 1882 as an educational initiative by the French foreign mission Fathers. In 1937, the management of the college was handed over to the Jesuits, a worldwide Catholic religious order with a special focus on education. The Department of Commerce was established in the year 1949 and it became an independent college in 1972. It is recognized under Section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act. It became an autonomous institution in October 2004. St. Joseph's College of Commerce was recognized as a "College with Potential for Excellence" in February 2010 by UGC.

The College has undergone four cycles of NAAC Accreditation starting from the year 2000 in which it secured 'five stars', next in the year 2007 an 'A' grade, in the year 20212 again an 'A' grade and recently in 2021 an A++. It is one of the very few institutions in the country to have secured A++ grade in the fourth cycle under RAF and the first college in Karnataka to do so.

The college aims at a holistic and integral formation of its students, fostering in them a spirit of academic excellence, social concern and character formation, shaping them to become "men and women for and with others".

Total Quality Management (TQM) Team

The Total Quality Management (TQM) team of the institution works towards the realization of the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. Examination and Evaluation

The Examination Department of SJCC conducted the End Semester Examination from 2nd December onwards. The Department organized mock exams to allow students to get back to the practice of writing exams offline. Also, with a view to enhance the performance of student community and to help them efficiently handle the exam pressure, the college arranged regular revision sessions, and remedial classes. These well-structured initiatives allowed the students, especially those who needed additional academic support, to confidently prepare the End Semester Examination.

Sports and Cultural Activities

After the commencement of offline classes, the institution also organized seminars, conferences, guest lectures, and workshops across disciplines dealing with a wide range of topics. Also, the institution organized interclass and intercollege cultural festivals, association activities, and sports activities. SJCC organized Dhwani, one of the most popular intercollege cultural festivals in Bangalore, ENACT - a national level theatre festival, SPIEL - a city level sports festival, and business competitions like Chanakya and Virtuoso. Apart from these offline cultural and sports festivals, the College also organized two NSS Camps, Blood Donation Camps, Social and Industrial Visits, and a Cyclathon to create awareness on the need to reduce carbon footprint. These festivals, witnessed active participation from students from different states, and offered ample opportunities to participate in the 'beyond the classroom learning' - a unique aspect of the curriculum at SJCC.

Academic Programmes with a Futuristic Vision

All the programmes, such as the seminars, conferences,guestlecturesandculturalactivities that SJCC organized since the commencement

of online classes emphasized on the needto adapt to the new normal. Seminars and conferences, and guest lectures discussed diverse dimensions of the road ahead by looking at the ways to decode the changes affecting the contemporary Indian higher education sector, especially in the context of NEP- 2020. The events also addressed concerns related to the necessity for continuous innovation in the digital space, diverse aspects of new normal in travel business, and raised questions about the future scope of cryptocurrency. The discussions also shed light on the significance of devising a set of effective mechanism that synthesises both online and offline services. This enabled the institution to develop strategies to convert setbacks into comebacks and challenges into opportunities, in the new world that thrives on innovative practices.

All the above-mentioned systematic deliberations adopted by the institution enabled SJCC's transition from offline to online and later back to offline environment.

BJES Twinning Programme

The twinning programme is an outreach initiative of BJES, to bridge the gap in learning and resources between the rural and the urban society. This collaborative work of fifteen sister Institutions in Bangalore is carried out, in order to reach out to the less privileged in its mission stations of North Karnataka. Each institution of BJES works with another Jesuit institution in rural Karnataka to share its resources and expertise. BJES has the following priority areas under this programme:

- Collaborate to conscientize and empower the target groups in twinning centres
- Enhance health, hygiene and emotional well-being
- Skilled training for livelihood and employment
- Caring for Mother Earth by collaborating with our twinning partner
- Sharing of human and financial resources with our twinning partners to educate and empower people

Vision: Jesuits journeying together with our collaborators to build an inclusive society of justice, equality, reconciliation and fraternity by transforming individuals.

A four days Faculty Development Programme was conducted for the faculty members of Loyola College, Manavi, The FDP was held from 23rd August to 2021 to 26th August 2021. The FDP began with a General Orientation by the Ms. Sneha Rai and Dr. Raja Jebasingh, Vice Principals of SJCC. The faculty members of Loyola College visited the facilities at SJCC following which they attended a session on 'Introduction to Research' with Dr. Deepika Joshi as the resource person. The next session was on 'Research Paper Writing' with Dr. Raja Jebasingh as the resource person. The faculty members were engaged with SPSS training workshop for the last two days by Dr Sridhar.

Leadership Camp for students from SJC, Hassan

A leadership Camp was conducted for 40 students from St. Joseph's College, Hassan. The camp was organised on 21st September 2021 at St. Joseph's College of Commerce, Bengaluru.

The leadership camp began with a team building session by Mr. Raj Sadhwani followed by a session on Theatre by Dr. T H Lava Kumar. On day two the students were engaged in a session on 'Students in Governance' by Dr. Nirmala Joseph and Dr. Veenu Joy followed by a street play titled 'Go Corona Go'. Also, the students were briefed on the College Associations of St. Joseph's College of Commerce by Mr. Vinay Kambipura. The students of SJC, Hassan interacted with the Student Council of SJCC, followed by a Campus Visit, the Leadership Camp ended with theatre activities.
