The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) ensures that all the academic activities conducted on campus adhere to the established policies of the institution and all the other agencies and academic bodies under the state and central bodies. Autonomy Status Extension

This academic year SJCC applied for the extension of its feedback. autonomous status. The A++ grade with a CGPA of 3.57 was awarded to the institution in the fourth cycle of NAAC of autonomy up to ten years without conducting the onsite visit. Therefore, SJCC's autonomous status was extended for a period of ten years till the academic year 2031-2032.
