

## Examination Committee Meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> November , 2014

### Agenda:

The results of the just concluded odd semester examination was discussed.

The overall pass percentage are as follows-

At the outset appreciation was expressed for the meticulous evaluation process carried out by the evaluators and the reviewers. It was observed that an improvement was required in the IIIrd semester results of B.Com. Many students had not cleared the Financial Management and Cost and Management Accounting I Paper. It was observed that the results of 5<sup>th</sup> semester B.Com TT was low as it was the first batch of Tourism. The results of the BBM department and needed improvement

The members expressed that the format provided for the Board of examiners facilitated in checking the Question Papers, eliminating errors and out of syllabus questions. The Question paper template provided to the QP setters was also appreciated. It gave the Question Papers a neat and uniform appearance and brought about standardisation.

The chairperson expressed that the students should be aware of the evaluation process used by the teachers for the 20 marks component of CIA. The students should be informed well in advance on how the CIA will be evaluated and the corresponding dates and the topics. It was expected that the teachers should innovate and find creative ways of conducting CIA. It was suggested that teachers can conduct at least three evaluations of 10 marks each and consider the best two. The difficulty of entering the CIA marks in the ERP in case of three evaluations was expressed by some of the committee members.

The COE put forward the existing rule of promotion to the 5<sup>th</sup> semester only after clearing all papers of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semester and suggested a minor change to it. It was suggested that the students can be promoted to 5<sup>th</sup> semester if they clear the 1<sup>st</sup> semester and to 6<sup>th</sup> semester if they clear the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester. As the results of the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester supplementary is published after the commencement of 5<sup>th</sup> semester, students will be aware if they are eligible to go to 6<sup>th</sup> semester in advance.

The COE expressed the difficulty of the examination centre regarding the students not collecting their marks cards on time and also the difficulty with regard to some students reporting to have misplaced or losing their marks card. It was suggested that the marks cards may be given to the students when they complete the course. After the publication of results for reference students could be asked to download a copy of the provisional marks card available in the student login online.

The controller of examinations brought to the notice of the committee that some students pass the ESE but are not able to clear the papers due to low CIA marks even after repeated attempts. Many students even get a year back because of low CIA as there is no provision to improve the CIA marks got during the study of the semester, (the weightage for CIA being 50%). After some deliberation it was decided that for the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semester students who have got less than 15 marks in CIA out of 50, and who had a possibility of getting a year back, a CIA

improvement test can be conducted during the supplementary exam provided such a student has cleared the ESE. It was agreed that the same can be followed for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year students only after one year from passing out of the college. As per the UGC guidelines it was decided to move to a 10 point grading system for the 2015 batch of Choice Based Credit System. It was decided that Ms. Nirmala Joseph, Mr. Raj Sadhwani and Ms. Sneha Rai will work on the details of the grading system.

The Chairperson thanked the members.

## Examination Committee Meeting held on 3<sup>rd</sup> May, 2015

### Agenda:

1. Results Analysis of the End Semester Examination March/ April 2015

The meeting started with a prayer. The results of the B.Com, BBM, MCom and MIB was placed before the committee by the COE. It was observed that the final year students of B.Com, BCom TT and BBM had performed well with a pass percentage of 90.37%, 92.06%, 81.97% respectively. It was also noted that the first batch of B.Com TT had topped the college in the results. This was a remarkable improvement compared to their previous performances. Concern was expressed by Prof. Ravi Richard on the second year results generally being low. Other members felt that it was due to some of the practical papers present in the second year. It was expressed that it could also be due to more attention given by second year students on supplementary papers if any as they will not be eligible to attend final year unless the first year papers were cleared. Members felt that a detailed presentation of results subject wise and class wise needs to be shown to the faculty during the staff meeting. After deliberations the committee approved the results for declaration.

The effort of the Board of Examiners in scrutinizing the question papers was appreciated. The detailed scrutiny of question papers has improved the quality of the papers and eliminated the possibility of errors in the question paper.

The COE reported the malpractice cases and the action taken by the Grievance and Malpractice Committee as per the Examination manual. The committee approved the same.











The committee discussed the change in the proportion of marks in CIA and ESE from the 2015 batch onwards. As passed in the BOS and Academic Council, the examination committee approved the weightage of CIA : ESE as 30 : 70 instead of 50 : 50. The committee unanimously decided to keep the same evaluation


pattern of CIA of 50 marks and then converting it to 30 marks. Marks obtained in 50 multiplied by 0.6 will give the corresponding CIA marks on 30.


The committee also discussed the changes in the marks card required for the 2015 batch due to the adoption of the Choice Based Credit System(CBCS). It was decided that the grade card should include the mandatory credits and the corresponding grades for Part C and Part D of the course structure which are foundation and skill development courses, Extension and extra curricular activities. The guidelines for awarding the credit was also explained by Ms. Muktha, the IQAC Co-ordinator. The committee also deliberated upon the additional credits that a student can earn. The choir, theatre club, sports, Business team, Dance and acoustics team were listed as the extra curricular activities from which a student can earn additional credits by considerable contribution. It was decided to draw up guidelines for the same. The Chairperson thanked all the members for their valuable suggestions.

## Examination Committee Meeting held on 5<sup>th</sup> November, 2015

### Agenda:

The meeting started with a prayer. The Chairperson appreciated the efforts of the ERP department on incorporating the changes in the grading system to the 1<sup>st</sup> year students results in a short span of time. Father asked Ms. Sneha to present the details of the results.

The results of the B.Com, BCom TT, BBM, MCom and MIB was placed before the committee. It was observed that the results of the 1<sup>st</sup> years was slightly better compared to the previous odd semester. BCom. 86.62%, BBM 76.08%, BCom TT 91.55%, MCom 89.47%, MCom (IB) 80.95%. It was observed that the BBM first semester the number of failures were more in Business Mathematics and Statistics. Ms. Rency informed that remedial coaching was provided to the students who had not studied Mathematics in their previous classes by Ms. Rathi. BCom and BBM 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester results were observed to be low 76.42% and 69.69%. The failures for BCom were more in Financial Management and Advanced Accounting. In BBM it was Corporate Accounting and Financial Management subjects that brought down the performance. Various possible reasons were shared. The pass percentage of final years was found satisfactory. The highest pass percentage was of BCom TT 1<sup>st</sup> Semester with 91.55%. PG department results were found satisfactory. The Controller Of Examination Expressed some challenges in incorporating the grades for extra curricular activities for first years as a few students were observed to be part of more than one association.











IQAC Coordinator Ms. Muktha expressed that some of the question papers contain very challenging questions which are difficult for student's to solve in the given time frame of the examination. Due to which average


marks scored in the subject reduces. She insisted that the teachers should be oriented to set papers keeping the time frame in mind and the proportion of easy, modest and very tough questions should be in the ratio of 30%, 40% and 30% respectively.


BCom TT Coordinator Raj Sadhwani felt that the corrections of Section C and D (15 marks questions) in theory papers should be more consistent. It is important to discuss the allotment of marks for section C and D in a more detailed manner in order to bring about consistency.

## Examination Committee Meeting held on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2016

### Agenda:

The meeting began with a prayer. At the outset Principal and committee members expressed that the Examination and Evaluation process was well conducted. The members also expressed their appreciation for the diligent and effective work done by Ms. Deena, Ms. Sukrutha, Mr. Rajendra and Mr. Joseph.

The COE Ms. Sneha Rai presented the results. The final year student's performance was the best with overall percentage of 95.68% for B.com, 90.67% for B.Com (T.T.) and 99.22% for BBM.

The IV semester result of UG was between 80% and 85% across B.Com & B.Com TT and BBM. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester results were also above 80%. Except for B.Com (Industry Integrated) which was 75.68%. This was because of the subjects Finance A/c for BPS and Cost Accounting were the number of failures were more. It was also noted that the first Batch of B.Com (Int. A/c and Finance) have passed with 88%. Principal requested the COE to prepare a detailed subject wise results to present during the staff meeting.










B.Com HOD Prof. Ravi Richard and BBM HOD Mr. Raj Sadhwani expressed that the External members of the BOE present for scrutiny of the Question Papers found that most of the papers were of high standard and contained slightly difficult questions. They felt that theory questions were indirect. Ms. Muktha expressed that for theory papers the questions appear different because the teachers are


encouraged to frame the questions differently than using direct words like 'what is' , 'Explain' etc. However she felt that in practical QP's students should be tested on slightly simple questions. COE expressed that the external evaluators felt that the students have written well and performance was good for most of the papers .

Ms. Sneha Rai brought to the notice that from the following semester the Mid Term Test for 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> semester will be conducted for 30 marks and ESE for 70 marks. The new pattern for the QP needs to be discussed and decided upon. The committee decided to meet during 2<sup>nd</sup> week of June 2016 to finalize the same.



The meeting started with a prayer. The results of the BCom, BBA, MCom and MCom(IB) was Placed before the committee by the COE. In general it was observed that all the courses have performed reasonably well. It was made note by the members that the BCom (Int A/C and Fin) have performed well. BCom (Int a/c and Fin) 1<sup>st</sup> semester 93.75% and 3<sup>rd</sup> semester 92.21%. The BCom HOD Ms. Veenu suggested that the embedded papers of ACCA can have slightly modified pattern to align orientation and preparation same as the professional Exams.

During the Exams it was observed that the errors in the question papers are reduced because of the thorough checking of papers done by the board of Examiners and the suggestions incorporated before administering the paper.

This semester college tied up with ITC for recycling of used answer booklets into books which are distributed to Govt. School children. This was a welcome initiative and previously the process of shredding was used.

The COE shared the two malpractice cases and the action taken as per the Examination manual by the malpractice committee.

The meeting began with a prayer. The COE presented the results of the UG and PG Programmes for the even semester.

II Sem B.Com (Regular) 95.6 % , II Sem B.Com (IntA/C & Fin) 95%, II Sem B.Com (BPM) 93.5%

II Sem B.Com (Travel &Tourism) 78.7%, II Sem B.B.A. 90.8%

The results were observed to be exceptionally good for all courses. The members appreciated the same. The BCom Travel and Tourism results were comparatively low and it was felt the TT students were weaker in practical papers. Principal expressed that the orientation of the BCom and professional programmes, BBA programme and Travel and tourism programme was different and teaching and testing also should be made appropriately.

The change in the evaluation of CIA was also discussed for languages. Out of the 30 marks CIA the mid term evaluation happens to be 20 marks written test and only 10 marks component out of 100 is not based on written test. To give more weightage in marks for other forms of evaluation the languages Kannada, Hindi and Additional English are exempted from mid term test and the subject teachers evaluated the entire 30 marks of CIA. This change was appreciated by the members.

The other initiatives during the semester were also discussed. The exams for grade based Foundation Courses Indian Constitution and Environmental studies continued to be conducted on LMS platform moodles as 100 marks online test. This semester for some of the classes the test was also conducted through mobile phones. The students were very enthusiastic about the exams on phone some of them also expressed difficulty due to screen size and other technical issues.











From this semester the supplementary exams were separated from End semester Examinations and were conducted early so that the students will be free to prepare and attempt the ESE.




The COE informed the members that this academic year Examination calendar was incorporated in the handbook to give better clarity about examination dates. Mid Term Retest for some of the subjects was conducted as online test in Moodles and MCQ question banks were prepared for all the subjects. Mr. Raj Sadhwani, HOD of BBA department expressed that students preparation for the test may reduce when the retests are conducted as online MCQ test. Ms. Sneha the COE explained that practical courses were conducted as written test and only theory courses were given as online test. Ms. Veenu Joy HOD of BCom Department recalled the session on Blooms Taxonomy and preparation of question paper by Dr. Rajaram. She said that it helped the staff to understand the Blooms Taxonomy better and to differentiate questions of lower order thinking and higher order thinking.
