ABOUT THE COLLEGE



About the College

Brief History of College

St. Joseph's College of Commerce (SJCC), originally a department of St. Joseph's College, established in 1882, is managed by the Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES), a unit of the Society of Jesus, a Catholic religious order founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola in 1540. The Department of Commerce was established at St. Joseph's College in 1949, and in 1972, it became an independent institution with its own campus on Brigade Road.

SJCC has continually focused on innovation in all aspects of higher education, with the goal of delivering high-quality education. This commitment was further solidified in September 2005, when the college was granted autonomy by the University Grants Commission (UGC). With this autonomy, the institution has led significant reforms in curriculum development, examination and evaluation methods, and teaching-learning processes, under the guidance of its Board of Studies, Academic Council, and Governing Council, which comprises distinguished academicians, industry leaders, and notable alumni.

SJCC has undergone four cycles of NAAC accreditation, starting in 2000, earning a 'five-star' rating initially. The college was awarded an 'A' grade in both 2007 and 2012, and in February 2021, it achieved an 'A++' grade with a CGPA of 3.57/4. This makes SJCC one of the first institutions in Karnataka and one of the few in the country to secure an A++ grade in the fourth cycle under the Revised Accreditation Framework (RAF). In 2010, the college was recognized as a 'College with Potential for Excellence,' and in 2011, it was designated a Research Centre by Bengaluru City University. The BCU Research Centre at SJCC has since been renewed for the period 2022-2023 to 2025-2026.

In the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2024, SJCC secured the 55th position in the college category. Additionally, it achieved impressive rankings in various national surveys, including The Week Magazine Best College Survey 2024, where it was ranked 10th among the best commerce colleges in India. India Today Magazine ranked SJCC 13th, and Outlook Magazine placed it 12th among the top commerce colleges in the country. Furthermore, the All India Association for Christian Higher Education (AIACHE) recognized SJCC for its achievement in the NIRF rankings.

In recognition of its academic leadership, Miles Education awarded the prestigious Award for Excellence in Academia to Dr. Charles Lasrado SJ, the Principal of St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous). SJCC also received an appreciation certificate from ITC Limited for its significant contribution to the nationwide Well Being Out of Waste recycling initiative. These recognitions highlight the college's commitment to academic excellence and social responsibility.

The college fosters academic excellence, social responsibility, and character building, preparing its students to become "men and women for and with others." The motto of the college, 'Fide et Labore' (Faith and Toil), forms the cornerstone of its vision and mission.

The Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society, hereinafter called BJES, is a registered, non-profit making, non-sectarian, non-governmental, educational organisation engaged in education, research and training. It is run by the Karnataka Jesuit Province. St. Joseph's College of Commerce is one among the many Jesuit Educational Institutions governed by BJES.

Governing Body, BJES

The Governing Body of the Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES) is responsible for the overall management of the institution including the financial aspect. The Provincial of the Karnataka Jesuit Province is the President of the BJES and is appointed by the Superior General of the Society of Jesus. The Society of Jesus, commonly known as Jesuits, was founded by St. Ignatius Loyola in 1540 and is headquartered in Rome. The Provincial of the Karnataka Jesuit Province is the President of the Governing Body of BJES. The Vice President of BJES and the Appellate Authority is the Rector of all the institutions under BJES and is the chairman of the Governing Body of St. Joseph's College of Commerce. He is in charge of all the aspects of the institution under the direction of the Provincial President of BJES. The Principal of St. Joseph's College of Commerce is a member of the Governing Body of BJES.

The leadership functions of the college are vested with the Principal, who is the Academic Director and has autonomy in academic matters. The Principal is duly assisted by the Finance Officer of the institution. The Principal is responsible for creating an ambience conducive to intellectual pursuit by faculty and students. The outstanding achievements of the staff, students and alumni are the result of leadership and governance which bear testimony to the academic excellence pursued by the college. Jesuit Higher Education Association South Asia (JHEASA), and international autonomous association for Higher Education meets annually to evaluate and enhance the quality of education in all institutions. This year Rev. Fr. Daniel Fernandes SJ took charge as the Rector of St. Joseph's Institutions and the Vice President of BJES and the college is happy to have him back in the institution in a new position. Welfare Measures for the Staff

The BJES as well as the College management endeavours to persistently make the work environment better in all its institutions and considers the respective staff feedback and suggestions for the better and improved functioning of its institutions.

Cloud-based HRMS: The college has recently implemented a Cloud-based HRMS and Payroll Software system, a significant enhancement to our welfare staff measures. This integrated solution offers a seamless approach to managing various HR tasks including payroll processing, attendance and leave tracking, performance appraisals, and tax declarations. Additionally, it streamlines the process of accessing important documents such as payslips. With this software, every staff member can conveniently access comprehensive information pertaining to their salary, attendance, leaves, and more, all from a centralized platform. This advancement ensures efficiency and transparency in our welfare staff measures, enhancing overall organizational effectiveness.

The college has various employee benefit programmes that promote and support the overall well-being of its workforce. Mentioned below are some of the employer welfare schemes

Group Insurance: The institution provides a comprehensive group medical insurance coverage to its employees. Catering to more than 220 number of faculty, non-teaching, support staff and family members of the employees.

Education Support : The staff provides concession on tuition fees to the children of teaching and non- teaching staff. This concession facility is a common practice across all educational institutions administered by BJES.

The fees and conveyance charges incurred by the faculty towards attending conferences, seminars and academic workshops is reimbursed by the college to all the participants as a way of encouraging professional development and career advancements.

Support Measures for FIP and Doctoral Research: Teachers engaged in research work and other faculty development programs are given paid leave of up to one year, subject to certain conditions. Apart from this, a

reduction in workload and relaxation in invigilation duty is extended to them. Leave of up to six days is also granted for the purpose of preparation for viva - voce.

Further, there is a provision for seed money which is given to promising research projects after an evaluation of their potential economic and commercial viability.

Annual Recreation Tour: Keeping in mind that periodic rejuvenation is key to continued viability, staff recreation trips are organised annually which is a refreshing combination of fun learning and social bonding. Staff Outreach Program - Staff are also involved in social outreach activities undertaken in different parts of the states by BJES, such as Manvi, Raichur and Mundagod.

Uniform for Non-teaching Staff : Every year the non-teaching staff are provided with uniforms.

Maternity and Paternity Leave : Women employees are granted maternity leave for a duration of 90 days and in the same context men are granted 15 days of paternity leave.

Additionally, nursing mothers are granted flexible working hours to accommodate the special needs of mothers and newborns.

Marriage Leave : Employees of the institution are entitled to paid marriage leave of six days.

Workload Flexibility for Office Bearers: Faculty who are in charge of crucial administrative and academic responsibilities such as IQAC, HOD, coordinators of quality assurance bodies and other allied positions are granted workload flexibility within the framework of institutional requirements and regulations.

Additional Financial Support: In cases where faculty members need to take long leaves due to prolonged medical conditions, the management, after reviewing their financial situation, has a provision for distributing their full salary.

Earned Leave of 30 days is provided for the non-teaching staff.

E-governance in Institutional Operations

The institution has adopted appropriate measures to ensure effective workflow and carries out administrative activities efficiently with its state-of-the-art information system and electronic communication services (via the Internet and intranet). For this purpose, the institution has a suitable ERP system with a well-designed policy. The ERP system ensures agility of the operating environment including software and hardware infrastructure. It operates seamlessly with state-of-the-art infrastructure hardware and ERP software is expertly managed by a dedicated team of professionals.

Financial Management and Resource Mobilisation

The institution has developed a rigorous system for the management of financial transactions. The Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES), which runs the institution, has constituted a financial committee that approves the budget of the institution, conducts periodic internal audits, and monitors financial transactions and resource mobilisation. The Finance Committee of the institution prepares the annual budget based on the specific needs of the institution wherein various departments predict major expenses for renovation and maintenance of the building and allocate the required budget, evaluate and implement the approved budget.

The budget is then presented to the Governing Board of Management and once the board approves, it is sent to the President for approval. The President gives his comments and approves the budget. After incorporating suggestions, the budget is finalised.

Accounting Practice

The Finance Officer is responsible for managing and overseeing the financial operations of the institution. This includes budgeting, financial planning, financial reporting, and ensuring compliance with regulations and policies. The finance office works with other departments to ensure that financial resources are being used effectively and efficiently. In terms of authorisation, the Finance Officer is the authorised signatory for financial transactions and documents and manages financial data from the organisation.

Internal Financial Audit

At SJCC, the practice of internal financial audits plays a crucial role in ensuring transparency, accountability, and efficiency in financial management. These audits are conducted periodically to assess compliance with established financial policies, identify potential risks, and recommend improvements for better fiscal governance. By thoroughly reviewing financial records, transactions, and internal controls, the audit process helps maintain accuracy and integrity in financial reporting. This proactive approach not only strengthens financial discipline but also fosters trust among stakeholders, reinforcing SJCC's commitment to sound financial practices.

Mobilisation of Funds and the Optimal Utilisation of Resources

The college identifies fees as a primary source of income. Other key sources of funding include:

- ♦ UGC funding through UGC management-sponsored research
- ♦ UGC MRP grants
- ♦ College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) grants
- ♦ Special assistance grants under the 12th plan
- ♦ Autonomy grant from UGC ICSSR

Additional funds are gathered through the below-mentioned means:

- ♦ Fees from self-financed programmes offered by the college
- ♦ Revenue from the government and private educational exams, conducted in our well-equipped classrooms
- ♦ The well-maintained infrastructure of the college enables us to let out space for professional programmes during the break between semesters.
- ♦ The computer centre also generates revenue as it is allowed for professional use by other companies or institutions.
- ♦ The auditorium has also been used for various programmes. Service charges are levied for the college playground and auditoriums when it is used by the public.
- ♦ A list of funding sources is maintained to keep track of all transactions to enable back-tracking whenever necessary.
- ♦ At the time of admissions, parents of students are given an Appeal Letter, requesting them to contribute towards the mid-day meal scheme of the college.
- ♦ Additionally, a few parents voluntarily donate towards the fees of other underprivileged students and help the institution in terms of its resources.

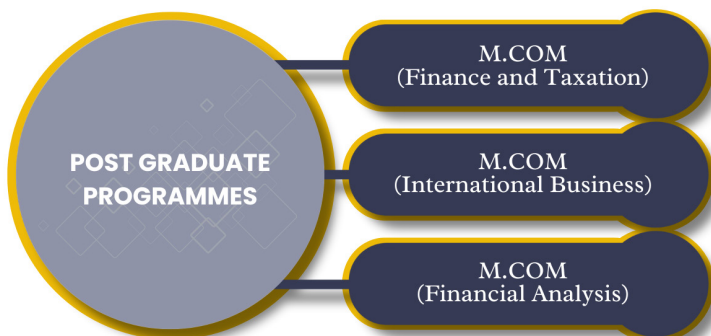
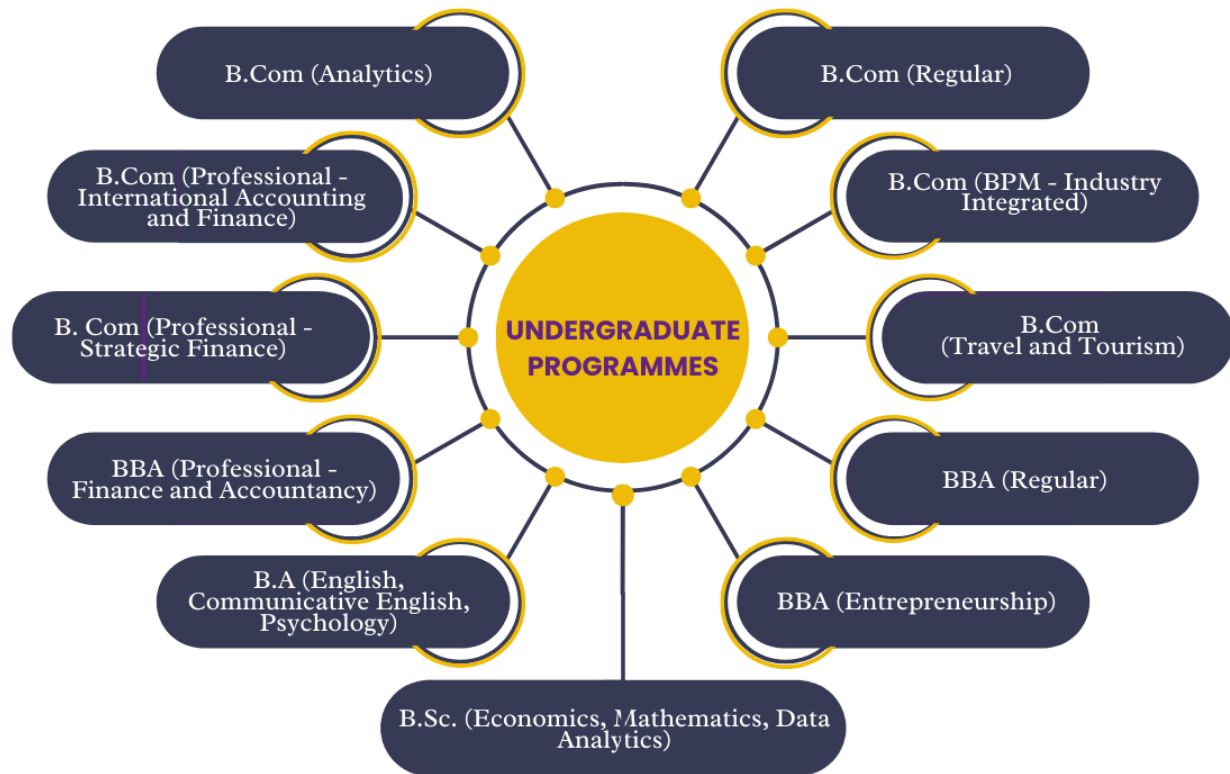


- ◆ Industries and the Alumni Association of the college extend their financial assistance to the college by sponsoring students and awarding them with scholarships.

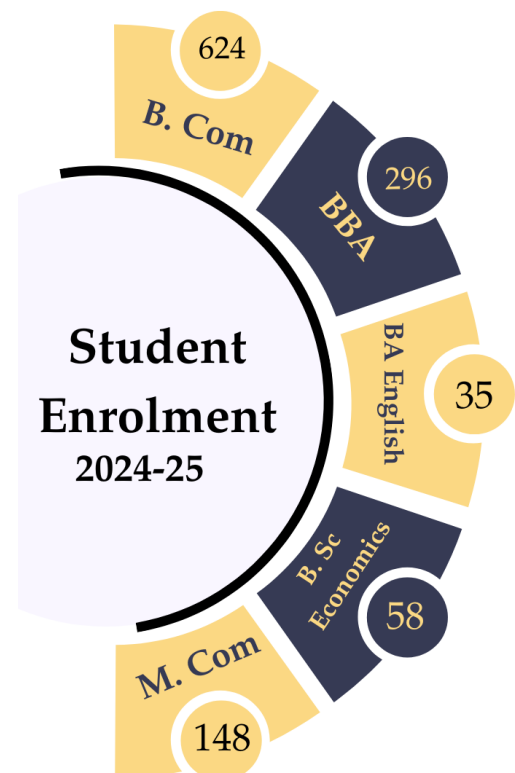

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) plays a vital role in maintaining high standards in all the academic activities on campus. The cell also helps in the holistic development of its student community. IQAC at SJCC focuses primarily on quality enhancement of teaching, learning, evaluation, research, extension and consultancy opportunities.

Quality Initiatives of the IQAC

Structure

The IQAC team is structured in alignment with the NAAC AQAR criteria, facilitating efficient information dissemination and cooperation for the preparation of the AQAR and other rankings.

Collection and Presentation of Data

The IQAC has enabled the collection and presentation of data for many ranking agencies, including The India Today Ranking, The Week Ranking, and Times Ranking. The IQAC is also enabled to participate in the NIRF and ARIIA rankings conducted by the Ministry of Education, Government of India.

Revision of Institutional Policies

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has organized a one-day session titled "Revisiting Our Institution Policies," on 25 August 2024. The primary objective of this workshop is to conduct a comprehensive review of 19 existing policies within the institution and to propose fifteen new policies for discussion. This initiative aims to ensure that the policies remain relevant and effective in addressing the evolving needs of the institution. Through collaborative dialogue and feedback from participants, the session will foster an environment of continuous improvement and support the institution's commitment to quality assurance and governance.

Workshop on Institutional Development Plan

On 16 August 2024, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) hosted a day-long workshop focused on the Institutional Development Plan (IDP) for all faculty members. The primary goal of this workshop was to actively involve faculty in shaping the institution's strategic direction and development objectives.

During the workshop, participants delved into various facets of the IDP. Discussions covered the plan's specific objectives, the strategies for its successful implementation, and the anticipated outcomes. This comprehensive exploration was designed to foster a collaborative environment where educators could collectively contribute their insights and ideas.

Course Feedback

Course feedback is a crucial component of maintaining and improving the quality of academic programs. It is to ensure a comprehensive understanding of students' experiences and perceptions of the courses offered. Currently feedback collection is underway for the even semester courses of the 2024-25 academic year. This process involves gathering input from all students enrolled in these courses, providing a broad perspective on various aspects such as course content, teaching methods, learning resources, and overall course effectiveness. The collected feedback is then disseminated to key administrative personnel, including the Head of the Department, Vice-Principals, and the Principal. By providing feedback to these individuals, the institution ensures that decision-makers are well-informed about the strengths and weaknesses of the courses. This enables them to take appropriate and timely actions to enhance the learning environment and student outcomes. This process ensures that feedback is used to drive continuous improvement in course design and delivery. The insights gained can inform pedagogical adjustments, resource allocation, and curriculum updates, ultimately contributing to a more effective and satisfying educational experience for students.

Participation in Awards for Excellence

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has taken proactive steps to gain recognition for the institution's excellence. To this end, the IQAC has submitted an application to the Xavier Board for consideration in two prestigious categories: 'Best College' and 'Best Extension and Outreach Activities'.

In addition to seeking external recognition, the IQAC actively promotes research and scholarly activity within the institution. As part of this effort, the IQAC encouraged faculty members to apply for the Best Researcher Award. This initiative aims to acknowledge and reward outstanding contributions to research.

Student Information Mobilisation and Action Taken: Proactive Measures

The IQAC is collecting data on student advancement into higher education and employment. This data will inform policy development and support participation in college rankings. Tracking student outcomes demonstrates institutional effectiveness and aids in accurate self-assessment.

The IQAC plays a crucial role in synthesising feedback and driving institutional improvement. As part of this process, the IQAC submitted a summary of reports from various sources, including the open house, exit interviews, and student satisfaction surveys, to the Academic Council (TQM) meeting. This submission ensures that student perspectives are considered in academic decision-making.

Furthermore, the IQAC compiles a comprehensive Action Taken Report based on feedback gathered from the student open house. This report details the actions taken by relevant authorities in response to the issues and suggestions raised by students. The Action Taken Report was presented at the meeting held on 25 August 2024, demonstrating the institution's commitment to addressing student concerns and fostering a responsive and accountable academic environment.

IQAC's Role in Preparing for Institutional Rankings

Aligned with NAAC AQAR standards, the IQAC promotes effective information dissemination and collaborative efforts in preparing the AQAR and other ranking-related activities. The IQAC plays a crucial role in collecting and presenting data to various rating agencies, such as The India Today rating, The Week Ranking, and Times Ranking. Moreover, the cell is instrumental in enabling the institution's participation in national-level rankings like the NIRF (National Institutional Ranking Framework) and ARIIA (Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements), both conducted by the Ministry of Education, Government of India. This comprehensive approach ensures that the institution is well-prepared for evaluations and can showcase its strengths effectively.

The Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) for the academic year 2023-24 was submitted on 21 January 2025. In addition, the All-India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) data for the academic year 2023-24 was submitted on 15 February 2025.

IQAC Team: NAAC Alignment & Rankings:

The IQAC's structure aligns with NAAC AQAR guidelines to promote efficient information flow and collaboration in preparing the AQAR and other rankings. This alignment ensures that the institution effectively meets the requirements for quality assessment and ranking processes, streamlining data collection and reporting efforts.

In collaboration with the Eco-club, a Green Audit is scheduled for the current academic year. This audit will likely assess the institution's environmental impact and sustainability practices, promoting ecological awareness and responsibility.



UBA Scheme Proposal

The Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) is a flagship program launched by the Ministry of Education (formerly the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD)) in 2014 with the core objective of enriching Rural India. IQAC has proposed an application to the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) to authorities and account of the work undertaken by our college students through NSS and Associations, which would hold substantial relevance for a broader audience. IQAC has applied for two proposals for the academic year to the UBA authorities waiting for the final result.

Mentoring Other Institutions

The online meeting on 26 September 2024, provided XITE College (Autonomous), Gamharia with actionable insights to enhance its examination processes, strengthen the role of the IQAC, and optimize autonomous college systems. The inputs emphasized the importance of continuous improvement, stakeholder engagement, and data-driven decision-making to achieve academic excellence and institutional effectiveness.

AAA – Academic and Administrative Audits

The Academic Administrative Audit (AAA) team is established to gather essential data, ensuring the IQAC operates efficiently. This data collection supports the IQAC's functions, such as preparing for rankings, maintaining quality standards, and streamlining accreditation processes. The AAA team's work is vital for the IQAC's data-driven approach to institutional improvement.

SQAC Orientation

To ensure effective operation, an orientation seminar took place on 15 July 2024, focusing on the roles and responsibilities of SQAC members. This aimed to equip the members of the Student Quality Assurance Cell (or similar body) with the knowledge and understanding needed to fulfil their duties in quality assurance processes within the institution.

IQAC Student Seminar AI & Creativity: Complement or Replacement

The IQAC Student Seminar on "AI & Creativity: Complement or Replacement" was held on 11 February 2025 at St. Joseph's College of Commerce, organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). Mr. Dayalan, a visiting professor, delivered an insightful session on AI's advantages and limitations, engaging more than 50 UG & PG students with real-world examples. He emphasized, "AI won't replace humans, but those who use AI will replace those who don't."

Two-day Faculty Development Programme

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organized a two-day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on "The Role of AI in Higher Education" on 20 February 2025. The event saw 335 faculty members from 15 states and Union Territories across India. It explored AI's impact on teaching, student engagement, and educational quality. Dr. K.S. Sowmiya Rani discussed AI in research writing, Dr. P. Malliga focused on AI in pedagogy, and Prof. Vimal Rarh and Dr. Vimal Jerald covered AI tools and assessments.

Financial Literacy Programme

On 22 February 2025, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducted a Financial Literacy Programme for administrative staff in the Conference Room, with twenty-eight participants. The initiative aimed to enhance financial knowledge, improving employee satisfaction and organizational efficiency.

CURRICULAR ASPECTS

At St. Joseph's College of Commerce, the curriculum fosters academic excellence, industry relevance, and holistic development through an outcome-based education model. It integrates theory with practical skills, emphasizing ethics, social responsibility, and sustainability. Workshops, seminars, and guest lectures by industry experts enhance learning. To build global competence, programs incorporate Fintech, Data Analytics, and Digital Marketing. Through these efforts, the college remains committed to producing well-rounded graduates prepared for an evolving professional landscape.

Curriculum Design and Development

The institution educates students in Commerce, Business, Arts, and Science while fostering social awareness. Since 2021-22, it has implemented the Outcome-Based Education (OBE) model under NEP, integrating faculty expertise in teaching and research to shape the curriculum. The Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) enhances interdisciplinary learning. Stakeholders, including alumni, subject experts, and industry professionals, actively contribute to curriculum development, ensuring it remains updated and relevant. The institution prioritises current industry trends to benefit all stakeholders and provide students with a well-rounded education.

National Education Policy 2020

The NEP-2020 Implementation Framework for Karnataka's higher education was proposed by the State Government Task Force and updated periodically to align with course and credit changes. The NEP Committee actively ensured these revisions were incorporated and communicated to institutional leadership. It also reviewed and suggested changes to the Model Programme Structures for all undergraduate programs before presenting the syllabi at the Board of Studies meetings.

State Education Policy 2023

The institution implemented the State Education Policy (SEP) in 2024-2025, customising Karnataka's model curriculum to its programs. It follows all government guidelines, ensuring compliance for 2024-2025 batches.

Indian Knowledge Systems

SJCC integrates Indian Knowledge Systems into its academics through seminars, workshops, and research. It promotes interdisciplinary learning, blending ancient wisdom with modern education to preserve and disseminate Indian knowledge. These efforts inspire scholars and professionals, fostering innovation while ensuring relevance to commerce and research.

Outcome-Based Education (OBE)

Our institution upholds Outcome-Based Education (OBE), focusing on specific learning outcomes through curriculum design, teaching, assessment, and feedback. OBE ensures students gain knowledge, skills, and the right attitude for success. It fosters critical thinking, communication, and lifelong learning, preparing them for modern challenges. This approach enhances academic growth and personal development, shaping well-rounded individuals ready for future endeavours.

Multidisciplinary Approach

SJCC's three-year undergraduate programs offer multidisciplinary learning with ability, vocational, professional, and skill enhancement opportunities. The four-year honours programs in Commerce, Management, Arts, and Science blend theory with practical experience through lab courses, field visits, internships, workshops, seminars, case studies, and research projects. Students select two specializations/electives in semesters five and six and choose one in semester seven to earn an honours degree in that field.

Curriculum Planning and Implementation

SJCC ensures academic excellence through a structured curriculum aligned with industry standards, blending theory with practice. Regular reviews, faculty expertise, and innovative teaching create a dynamic learning environment. Experiential learning through internships, industry collaborations, and skill-based courses equips students for professional success.

Department of Commerce

Odd Semester Meeting: 27 September 2024

Even Semester Meeting: 6 March 2025

During the Board of Studies meetings, key revisions were made to the B. Com syllabus for clarity, structure, and industry alignment. Modules like Business Economics and Financial Accounting were renamed, and content in Cost Accounting was reorganized to enhance conceptual understanding. The syllabus was updated to reflect ACCA and IndAS standards, while practical applications such as real financial data exercises were emphasised. Modern management theories were incorporated, and the Business Analytics elective was expanded to include AI topics. Additionally, the GST course was updated with e-filing processes, and course outcomes were revised to ensure industry relevance.

Department of Business Administration

Odd Semester Meeting: 26 September 2024

Even Semester Meeting: 7 March 2025

A new paper on the Indian Financial System was introduced, along with a key agenda item: launching a Capstone Project for BBA (Entrepreneurship) students to focus on developing comprehensive business plans. Even Semester Meeting: 24 February 2024

The BOS studies discussed the changes in the Programme Matrix for NEP and SEP batches. New subjects like Data Analysis using Excel and Monetary Economics were introduced for SEP. The fourth year was proposed and subjects like Public Economics, Regional Growth and Sustainable Planning, Game Theory, Financial Economics and Data Visualisation using Power BI were proposed.

Department of English

Odd Semester Meeting: 28 September 2024

Even Semester Meeting: 7 March 2025

The Department of English had initially confirmed the programme title as BA (English and Psychology), a double major with no electives for the upcoming batch. However, following the SEP format, the programme was revised to include three majors across all six semesters, leading to a general degree. The proposed programme, BA (English, Communicative English, and Psychology), was approved in the special Academic Council meeting. For the even semester, the framework of the General English syllabus was presented to the BoS members which was approved.



Department of Psychology

Odd Semester Meeting: 4 September 2024

Even Semester Meeting: 12 March 2025

The department conducted a review and approval of the syllabus for various courses. For the BA Sixth Semester DSC papers, two new courses—Abnormal Psychology-II and Organizational Psychology—were proposed and approved. The syllabus for the BA Second Semester DSC papers was reviewed and passed, along with the Open Elective course on Psychological Well Being. Additionally, a general review of department activities was carried out to assess academic progress and administrative matters, ensuring the smooth functioning of the department.

Department of Kannada

Odd Semester Meeting: 5 October 2024

Even Semester Meeting: 24 February 2025

The Department of Kannada follows a uniform syllabus across BBA, B. Com, BA, and B.Sc. programme, ensuring consistency in language instruction. During the 28th Academic Council Meeting, it was proposed that Kannada would be divided into Functional, Intermediate, and Regular levels for which the selection process is determined through a diagnostic test at the start of each semester. This approach was not pursued as the SEP did not mandate offering Functional Kannada. Consequently, students who had opted for Kannada as their language in the 10th and 12th grades were allotted Kannada as their language across all four semesters.

Department of Hindi

Odd Semester Meeting: 3 August 2024

Even Semester Meeting: 4 February 2025

The Department of Hindi reviewed the existing syllabus with a focus on updating content to make it more relevant and engaging for students. New texts on contemporary poems were introduced for the second semester from 2025-2026 onwards and the Indian knowledge system Part II was introduced to fourth-semester students with emphasis on the indigenous knowledge system of each state as an option for students. This unit is included in both the CIA as well as ESE.

Postgraduate Department of Commerce

Odd Semester Meeting: 27 September 2024

Even Semester Meeting: 6 March 2025

During the odd semester, changes in the courses of PGD (Data Science) were passed. The courses include Python Fundamentals, Introduction to ERP & SQL and Python for Data Science during the I semester. During the even semester, a course in Insurance is introduced by replacing Company Legislation and Compliance in III semester of M. Com (Finance & Taxation) and M. Com (Financial Analysis) programmes. Additionally, a proposal to introduce Teaching Practice Learning in the IV semester was brought to the table in the meeting. The Chairperson also reported on the department activities carried out during the odd and even semesters of the academic year.

Department of Data Analytics

Odd Semester Meeting: 5 October 2024

Even Semester Meeting: 12 March 2025

The meeting reviewed and approved the programme matrix for the newly started B.Sc. Economics, Mathematics & Data Analytics Programme as per the State Education Policy 2024. The board deliberated and finalised the syllabus for Data Analytics courses for the first, second and third semesters. The courses were Fundamentals of Statistics, Advanced Statistics and Fundamentals of Data Analytics. The suggestion by the board on practical papers to be taught, R Programming for first two semesters and Python Programming for third and fourth semesters was incorporated. The board of examiners list was also approved.

Department of Mathematics

Odd Semester Meeting: 3 October 2024

Even Semester Meeting: 11 March 2025

The programme matrix for the newly started B.Sc. Economics, Mathematics & Data Analytics Programme with deep specialisation in Economics as per the State Education Policy 2024 was presented, scrutinised and approved in the meeting. The board deliberated and gave valuable suggestions on the syllabus of various Mathematics courses for the first, second and third semesters. The courses were Fundamentals of Applied Mathematics, Linear Algebra, Introduction to Calculus and Advanced Calculus. The relevant inputs from the board were incorporated. The list of the board of examiners was approved.

Curriculum Enrichment

The holistic development of students is an important aspect of the institution's education. With professional programmes like BBA Entrepreneurship, ACCA, BPM (Industry Integrated), B. Com (Analytics), and B. Com (Travel and Tourism), the students widen their scope of employability. The curriculum is enriched with programmes like Advanced Excel, Tally, SPSS Digital Fluency, Artificial Intelligence, SAP, Environmental Studies, Indian Constitution and Psychological Well-being to give them hands-on experience with skills and create a multidimensional perspective in them augmenting holistic development of students. Industrial visits, international student exchange programmes and live projects, and exposure to the business world are embedded components of the curriculum. Furthermore, research culture is an integral aspect of the curriculum. Dissertations and minor and major research projects make students industry-ready and manifest the institution's holistic approach toward education.

Feedback System On The Syllabus

The process of revision and redesign of curricula is based on recent developments and feedback from the stakeholders. The feedback from all stakeholders in terms of its relevance and appropriateness in catering to the needs of society, the economy and the environment helps in improving the inputs. The institution collects and analyses the feedback reports from the various stakeholders and further prepares the action plan in the meetings of the Governing Council, Total Quality Management team meeting, and Board of Management.

Certificate Courses

Conferences, Conclaves, Symposiums & Public Lectures

International Conference by the Department of Commerce:

The International Conference on "Viksit Bharat @2047: Strategies for Inclusive and Sustainable Development" was held on 4 March 2025, bringing together 120 academicians and research scholars to discuss India's progress. The event was organised by Shivaji College, University of Delhi, and the Indian Commerce Association, Delhi NCR Chapter. It focused on economic growth, sustainability, and inclusivity with distinguished speakers like Prof. Dogan Gursoy, Prof. Robin Nunkoo, Prof. Ajay Kumar Singh, Prof. Madan Lal, and Mr. Vikram Sahay, sharing their insights on policies and frameworks essential for India's vision of becoming a developed nation by 2047.



Pitch Point by the Department of Business Administration:

Pitch Point, in collaboration with Thellion Ventures and Number Leader, provides a platform for students to pitch business ideas to real-time investors and industry experts. This initiative offered valuable feedback, helping participants refine and commercialise their concepts. Thellion's expertise in venture incubation supports emerging entrepreneurs, while networking with seasoned investors creates opportunities for funding, mentorship, and strategic partnerships. By fostering innovation and entrepreneurship, Pitch Point helped transform student proposals into successful enterprises, equipping them with the insights and connections needed to navigate the start-up ecosystem effectively.

Conclave by the Department of Professional Programmes:

The Department of Professional Programmes, in collaboration with the International Skill Development Corporation, UK, organized a conclave on "Revolutionizing Accounting and Finance: The Impact of AI and Automation" on 18 January 2025 at Loyola Hall. Over two hundred and fifty students and professionals participated, discussing AI's impact on accounting. Keynote speakers, Dr. Sathya Kumar and CA Pramod Hegde, shared insights, while a panel discussion led by Dr. Rakesh Nadig explored the shift towards data-driven advisory roles. The event also featured "Go for It," a finance quiz with cash prizes, providing valuable industry insights and practical learning.

International Seminar by the Department of Hindi:

The International Seminar on "Indian Knowledge Traditions in the Context of 'Viksit Bharat 2047'" was held on 28 February to 1 March 2025 at SJCC. Scholars, educators, and students explored India's traditional knowledge systems in shaping a developed nation. Ms. Neena Gupta and Dr. Monika Devi discussed language preservation and lifelong learning. With more than a hundred registrations, the seminar featured research presentations on education, gender roles, and morality, integrating tradition into modern education.

One-day Symposium by the Department of English:

The Department of English, in collaboration with the Sahitya Akademi, organized a one-day symposium titled "Negotiating Language, Space, and Identities" on 6 February 2025. Attended by a hundred and fifty participants from across the country, the event explored the role of translation in shaping linguistic and cultural identities. Dr. B. N. Sumithra Bai, a noted Kannada writer and critic, delivered the Keynote Address, discussing India's rich translation history and its role in knowledge creation. The symposium featured three engaging sessions covering Malayalam-Kannada-English, academic translations, and Tamil-Kannada-English translations. Scholars and translators, including Dr. Rekha Datta, Mr. Sudhakaran Ramanthali, Ms. Nagamani S N, and Mr. K. Nallathambi, shared insights on linguistic democracy, translation challenges, and the nuances of literary adaptation. The event concluded with a Valedictory Address by Professor K. S. Madhusudhana, emphasizing translation's importance in multilingual India.

7th Annual Republic Day Lecture by the Department of English:

The 7th Annual Republic Day Lecture Series, hosted by the Department of English at St. Joseph's College of Commerce, Bengaluru, was held on 3 March 2025. This flagship event invites a renowned public intellectual each year to discuss contemporary socio-political and cultural challenges in India. The Seventh Edition featured Ms. Aruna Roy, a social activist, professor, and former civil servant, who spoke on 'People's Movement and Constitutional Justice.' The lecture began with a joint recitation of the Preamble of the Constitution, followed by Ms. Roy's insights into activism, recounting her transition from the Indian Administrative Services to grassroots movements like the Mazdoor Kisan Shakti Sangathan. She emphasized activism as a collective effort rooted in equality and democratic values. Addressing issues like farmers' protests and decentralization of power, she highlighted the importance of transparency through the Right to Information. The lecture concluded with a critical discussion on the Digital Personal Data Protection Act and the need to speak truth to power.

Tribes 2024 by the Department of Economics

The Research in Behavioural Economics and Sciences (Tribes 2024) was held on 14 December, 2024. The keynote address was delivered by Dr. Junofy Anto Rozarina, neuroscientist and CEO of Beyond Nudge. She explored the intersection of neuroscience and decision-making, illustrating concepts like the Stroop Test and System 1 & 2 Thinking. This was followed by a panel discussion on Behavioural Science in Finance, moderated by Ms. Reshmi Mahesh, where experts discussed financial nudges and ethical considerations. A fireside chat with Mr. Parameswaran Venkataraman highlighted the role of behavioural design in healthcare. The Behavioural Science in Healthcare panel examined strategies for improving healthcare accessibility. Post-lunch, Ms. Devanshi Ray from Swiggy presented a case study on Prep Time Adherence, revealing insights from behavioural interventions in the food industry. The Behavioural Science in Technology panel explored macro behaviours, brand influence, and user research in tech. The Nudgeathon Prize Distribution at 2:45 p.m. recognized innovative solutions, with the Christ University team winning first place for their 'pee-buddy' initiative promoting better hygiene. Dr. Srinivas Madhusudhan awarded the prizes.

Incorporating Revised Bloom's Taxonomy, OBE-TLP ensures teaching strategies cater to different cognitive levels. A CO-PO Mapping Matrix helps stakeholders track progress toward broader educational goals. This model fosters structured, effective lessons, equipping students with the knowledge, skills, and competencies needed for professional and personal success.

Course Outcomes (COs)

Course Outcomes (COs) are designed to align with course content and objectives, ensuring comprehensive coverage of key knowledge areas. Faculty develop COs for each module or the entire course, using Revised Bloom's Taxonomy action verbs (T2 to T6) to promote higher-order thinking. Mapped to Program Outcomes (POs) and Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs), COs facilitate effective evaluation of student attainment. This structured approach ensures measurable learning outcomes, enhancing skills, knowledge, and competencies. Well-defined COs provide a clear framework for assessment, supporting academic rigor, continuous improvement, and alignment with Outcome-Based Education (OBE) principles.

Programme Outcomes (POs)

Programme Outcomes (POs) align with the Jesuit Education Model, institutional vision, and core values, ensuring academic excellence and holistic development. They establish benchmarks for cognitive and affective competencies essential for professional and personal growth. Structured to reflect graduate attributes, POs support lifelong learning. Each PO is mapped with Course Outcomes (COs) to ensure a seamless connection between courses and program objectives. Measuring PO attainment helps evaluate curriculum effectiveness and graduate success, ensuring alignment with institutional goals. This assessment validates the program's impact and feasibility, making it a crucial element in enhancing academic offerings and student development.

Student-centred Learning Methods

Basic Learning Practices

The learning experience of students at this college is the result of a well-designed teaching-learning process. The needs, interests, and capabilities of students are the primary factors in designing the pedagogy. The college aims to develop competencies such as critical thinking and problem-solving skills through student-centric teaching-learning methods. The teacher, in this context, acts as a facilitator who enhances the learning experience of the students. Experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies are some of the important student centric methods of the teaching-learning process, practiced in this college.

Innovative Teaching- Learning Practices

- ◆ **Experiential Learning:** The college prioritises learning through experience and has created student-centric learning programmes such as industrial visits, internship programmes (social, corporate, and start-up internships), workshops, outreach programmes, rural exposure programmes, social visits, etc.
- ◆ **Participative Learning:** To develop innovative as well as creative thinking skills among students, participative learning in the teaching pedagogy has been adopted. Activities under this include student seminars, group discussions, debates, quizzes organised as part of CIA, flip classrooms (students are expected to go through the reading materials and come prepared for a classroom discussion), exhibitions by students, student clubs and associations activities, aid in student participative learning as the activities are planned and executed by the students under the guidance of faculty members.
- ◆ **Problem-Solving Methodologies:** Problem-solving methodologies are an integral part of all courses in all programmes. Along with theoretical explanations, practical knowledge is imparted to the students through practical courses like Tally, Excel, SPSS, and SAP which employ hands-on learning methods. Students are encouraged to take up Research Projects in which they need to identify a research problem and apply problem-solving techniques learned in the classroom to the problem. Book reviews and case studies are introduced in class. Library-based assignments like OpenText tests and research-based library work for students are encouraged.

Academic Support for Students

Programmes for Slow Learners

Our students come from diverse cultural backgrounds. Teachers guide students in their respective journeys, equipping them with skills to fully benefit from what the institution offers. Many SJCC students are first-generation learners, and some have academic difficulties when compared to their peers. Keeping this in mind, the college has devised a Remedial Programme to identify students who need special academic attention, specifically to help them excel in their overall performance. The employed Peer Learning model is beneficial as the advanced learners actively engaging in academic activities with the slow learners is a learning point for both and helps in building their confidence, time-management and social skills. These classes are earmarked to strengthen students' subject knowledge and reduce dropout and failure rates as those who need special attention are tended to, through this programme.

Remedial Programmes

The remedial programme at SJCC is the backbone of academic excellence. In this programme students who require academic support are identified and offered one-on-one assistance by advanced learners.

The institution has structured remedial programs with a peer learning model to enhance the student's interest in learning and to make the learning process a more joyful experience. In this model of peer support, the teaching is handled by a 'student tutor' who will be responsible for teaching the 'student tutees' under the guidance of the subject teacher. The remedial coaching classes are scheduled online on the MS Teams platform as well as in the offline mode.

The remedial program kick-started by identifying the list of courses that require additional reinforcements through remedial sessions. Each class mentor scheduled a mentor meeting and discussed with their respective classes and identified the list of courses. The list was shared by the remedial program coordinators with the respective subject teachers.

The tutees were selected by subject teachers on the basis of low CIA grades, low attendance percentage and any student who voluntarily requests to be added to the remedial class. Proactive students who are capable of handling the peer teaching were chosen by subject teachers and were entrusted with the responsibility of student tutor. The tutors were guided with respect to the concepts and topics to be covered by the respective subject teachers. There was an excellent collaboration among the students through this faculty-guided peer-learning model.

An online orientation for the student tutors was conducted by the remedial team to provide the guidance on the remedial classes.

Remedial classes were conducted in the month of September 2024 for the first, second and third-year UG students through both online and offline modes.

Bridge Course 2024-25

The institution conducted a Bridge Course in Mathematics and Accounts for first-year students to support those who have either not studied the subjects or found them difficult to comprehend. The Bridge Course coordinator shared the details of the Bridge Course with all BBA, BCOM and B.Sc. first-year students during their admission. The course materials were made available on the college website. Students were asked to access the learning materials, such as the Bridge Course videos and worksheets once they confirmed their admission.

The bridge course for both Basic Mathematics and Accounts has been delivered using online mode. Online content in terms of lecture series was developed with the help of the institution's media team and was made available to first-year students.

The Examination was conducted for 20 marks and a total of 50 teachers invigilated the examination. The Re-Examination was conducted for the absentees on 12 and 13 August 2023. The Bridge Course marks were incorporated into their first CIA.

Orientation Programme

On 20 September 2024, an orientation session was organised by Ms. Bhargavi C.S. and Dr Neethu Anna Koshy on remedial Classes via MS Teams. During the session, Ms. Bhargavi C.S. provided an overview to the tutors regarding the remedial classes. She informed me that tutors would have the flexibility to conduct the classes either online or offline and that it was mandatory for tutors to take attendance, and proof of the classes too. This could be done either through screenshots from MS Teams or photos from offline classes. The teacher coordinator also informed the tutors that they would receive e-certificates for the same.

INSTITUTION'S INNOVATION CELL (IIC)

The Institution's Innovation Cell (IIC) at St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) is a registered cell (Registration no. IC202115549) with the Ministry of Education, Government of India that aims at systematically fostering the culture of innovation and entrepreneurship among the faculty and the students of the college. Started in 2017, the cell was functioning under the name of Innovation and Incubation Centre until it was renamed as Institution's Innovation Cell in 2022.

The primary mandate of the cell is to encourage, inspire and nurture young students by supporting them to work with new ideas and transforming them into prototypes while they are in their formative years. The cell establishes networks with the various IICs and entrepreneurial bodies across the country to promote innovation through multitudinous modes leading into an innovative eco-system in the campuses. IIC is registered under the National Innovation Start-up Policy (NISP) and YUKTI (National Innovation Repository) Portal, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India.

Activities of IIC

Icebreakers - Evolution 24

The "Icebreakers - Evolution 2024" took place on 12 August 2024. The event was organised by the Institution's Innovation Cell (IIC) to help students build teamwork, develop an entrepreneurial mindset, and learn more about IIC and its incubation wing.

Students were introduced to the four main wings of IIC:

- Innovation Wing – Encourages creative thinking and new ideas.
- Incubation Wing – Supports students in starting and growing their businesses.
- IPR (Intellectual Property Rights) Wing – Helps students and teachers understand patents, copyrights, and how to protect their ideas.
- Social Media Wing – Promotes IIC activities and entrepreneurship through digital platforms.

Through fun activities, the event gave students a chance to connect, collaborate, and explore entrepreneurship opportunities.

Back Your Corp

The Back Your Corp event was held on 21 August in the Media Room. A total of 22 participants competed in this intense corporate strategy challenge, with two judges evaluating their performances.

In this high-stakes competition, participants took on the role of CEOs defending their companies during a crisis. With their leadership, strategic thinking, and persuasion skills put to the test, they had to justify past corporate decisions, rebuild reputations, and out-manoeuvre their competitors. Faced with challenging scenarios, participants crafted strong arguments and delivered compelling narratives to convince the judges. "Back Your Corp" provided an engaging and realistic experience of corporate leadership and crisis management.

Entrepreneur EduTalk

The Innovation Wing of the Institution's Innovation Cell (IIC) at St. Joseph's College of Commerce successfully hosted the Entrepreneur EduTalk on 20 February 2025. The event provided an insightful discussion on entrepreneurship, focusing on the journey of starting and sustaining a business. The guest speaker for the session was Ms. Shveta Gupta, a successful entrepreneur and owner of multiple preschool franchises. Ms. Gupta provided insights into the challenges of building a business from the ground up, emphasising key aspects such as financial independence, business strategy, and sustainability. She also highlighted the realities of female entrepreneurship, discussing how she successfully set up her schools as a fully self-funded entrepreneur. The session encouraged participants to think critically about overcoming obstacles in business, emphasising the importance of resilience, strategic planning, and innovation.

Mentoring for the Development of Business Ideas

Two groups of students are currently being mentored to develop their business ideas. They are working on two concepts:

- Healthy Snacks Business – A venture to create nutritious and wholesome snack options.
- Influencer Collaboration Platform – A project that connects brands with influencers to promote products and services effectively.

The goal is to help them take their ideas from concept to reality, ensuring they are well-prepared to enter the entrepreneurial world.

Future Prospects

Hackathon 2025 – National Level Hackathon on Sustainable Solutions

The Institution's Innovation Council and School of Business, St. Joseph's University, in collaboration with IIC, St. Joseph's College of Commerce, will be hosting a National-Level Hackathon on Sustainable Solutions. Registration is open, and the event will culminate in the Grand Finale at the University of Kashmir, where finalists will showcase their projects.

CENTER FOR DIGITAL LEARNING AND EDUCATION (CDLE)



CENTRE FOR DIGITAL LEARNING AND EDUCATION

Centre for Digital Learning and Education (CDLE) is an initiative to incorporate blended learning or a fully online approach in the teaching-learning process to transform the teaching pedagogy and the learning experience of the students. Established in August 2022, it facilitates the development of online courses and their respective content.

Blended Teaching and Learning

Blended learning, a method that prioritises students' needs and integrates technology to leverage both in-person and online learning environments, has been embraced by SJCC to enhance the learning experience.

Activities of CDLE

Activities of CDLE During Odd Semester

During the odd semester of 2024-25, three open elective courses and two mandatory courses (Artificial Intelligence and Yoga) were conducted in blended mode on the SJCC Linways E-Learning Platform.

On 4 July 2024, CDLE organised a practical orientation session for teachers handling blended mode courses. The session covered uploading course banners, objectives, course highlights, creation of lesson plans, mandatory weekly assessments, and uploading e-content.

On 10 July 2024, CDLE Coordinator Mr. Vinay Pradeep visited open elective classrooms and gave students practical guidance on accessing e-content on the SJCC Linways E-Learning Platform. He also explained how attendance is captured on the platform and the importance of completing mandatory weekly assessments for the following courses:

- Sociology for Everyday Life (Shift 1 and 2)
- Economic Thinkers (Shift 2)
- Tourism in Karnataka (Shift 1 and 2)

The blended mode of open elective courses had an enrollment of 410 students.

Massive Open Online Courses

The students of SJCC enroll in various interdisciplinary courses offered in the NPTEL SWAYAM portal. The duration of the courses enrolled is 8 weeks consisting of weekly assignments. On completion of the weekly assignments and satisfying the criteria as per the course, the students are required to take up a final exam in a centralised examination centre. Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) were offered as Open Elective courses to the third-semester students in the odd semester and as a Skill Enhancement Course to the second-semester students in the even semester. Students started enrolling for MOOCs in June 2024, for the odd semester and December 2024 for the even semester in the academic year 2024-2025. There were a few mandatory specifications for the students to follow while enrolling for the courses in SWAYAM. It was communicated to the students who enrolled for the MOOCs that it was mandatory to take up the examination scheduled in SWAYAM to become eligible for receiving the certificate.

Evaluation Procedure:

On completion of the weekly assignments and satisfying the criteria as per the course, the students are required to take up a final exam in a centralised examination centre. The assignments consist of 25% of their overall grade and the final examination consists of 75% of the overall grade.

DEPARTMENT OF EXAMINATIONS

The Department of Examinations is pivotal in overseeing the formative and summative exams throughout the semester. It actively engages with various stakeholders in the institution through regular meetings, facilitating coordination among them. The exam department is instrumental in implementing incremental changes to enhance the efficiency of existing processes. The Controller of Examinations and their team are dedicated to introducing innovative practices and staying current with evolving times and technologies. Consequently, the pre-examination, examination, and post-examination processes undergo continuous improvement for timely and error-free outcomes. The timely publication of results is made possible by the collective effort and cooperation of all faculty members in the college.

| National Academic Depository

SJCC has been consistently ranked among the top 100 colleges in India, for eight consecutive years, hence it was chosen as a college for the pilot group of colleges under the National Academic Depository (NAD) last year. The institution has successfully uploaded the marks of the 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021 batches. SJCC is one of the first colleges in Karnataka to finish the process. The records available in the ABC portal are made available to the student for the redemption of a Diploma/Certificate/Degree nationwide. The same academic records would also be deposited in the NAAC portal for online or digital verification purposes. The same could be used by the students to apply and retrieve.

| Academic Bank of Credits

The college has established the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) in alignment with the guidelines of the National Academic Depository (NAD). As a registered and recognized institution under NAD, the college ensures that students' academic records for undergraduate (UG) programs are securely maintained and systematically updated in the depository.

Implemented in the year 2021, this initiative allows students to accumulate, transfer, and redeem credits earned across different recognized institutions, fostering flexibility and mobility in higher education. The ABC system enhances transparency, facilitates academic progression, and empowers students with greater autonomy in designing their educational journey.

| Unified University and College Management System

The Unified University and College Management System (UUCMS) is a cloud-based platform introduced by the Department of Higher Education, Government of Karnataka, for UG and PG programs. It is mandatory for all autonomous institutions to adopt this system. This software manages a range of functions, including student admission registration, admission approval, fee payment, attendance, entry of CIA and ESE marks, declaration of examination results, degree awarding, and other related processes. In addition, UUCMS offers mark cards via DigiLocker. SJCC has updated all the personal and academic records of each student from the academic year 2021-22 to make the documentation process more accessible and feasible for the students.

| IT Integration in Examination Process

SJCC uses technology to make exams more efficient, accurate, and student-friendly. Online systems help with exam registration, scheduling, and result processing, reducing errors and saving time. Digital platforms allow for online tests, quick grading, and secure exam management. Students can easily access exam details and updates through portals. IT integration also simplifies re-evaluation requests and result analysis. By using technology, the college ensures a smooth, transparent, and hassle-free examination process for everyone.

Green Reforms

- Assignments using the LMS platform are encouraged by all faculty members.
- Paper written assignments have been discouraged as far as possible particularly those submitted with plastic files or folders.
- The Examination Department has implemented the use of cloth bags (blue) instead of paper bags for packing answer scripts.
- Special bags have been designed specifically to pack question papers.
- Used answer scripts are sent for recycling.

Examination Reforms

Digital Evaluation

From the year 2024-2025, the Examination Department initiated the Digital Evaluation process which was a new beginning in the annals of the Examination Department process. As physical evaluation poses many challenges, to address these challenges, transitioning to digital evaluation using advanced and innovative technology offers significant benefits. Digital evaluation streamlines the process by automating repetitive tasks, ensuring accuracy in calculations, and securely storing answer sheets to prevent loss or damage. Moreover, digital tools can provide faster turnaround times, reduce manual errors, and allow for better tracking and transparency throughout the evaluation process. Digital evaluation allows for simultaneous evaluation, eliminating the need to wait for the first evaluator to finish (especially useful for double evaluation in postgraduate courses). Automated totalling eliminates manual errors, ensuring accuracy in the grading process.

Best Practices

- Projector with screen installed in the examination department for online meetings and deliberations.
- Previous years' question papers are uploaded to the college website for students as a ready reckoner.
- The Exam Calendar in the Student Handbook helps to bring about transparency, and awareness among the students and staff regarding the exam department calendar.
- Outcome Based Education Committee, Board of Examiners Committee and Question Paper Audit Committee help the faculty to set better QPs.
- Best answer scripts of the previous semesters are kept in the library for reference of students.
- Special certificates from the exam department for the achievers encourage and motivate the students to do better.
- Few internal assessment tests in the core subjects are conducted through Linways portal.

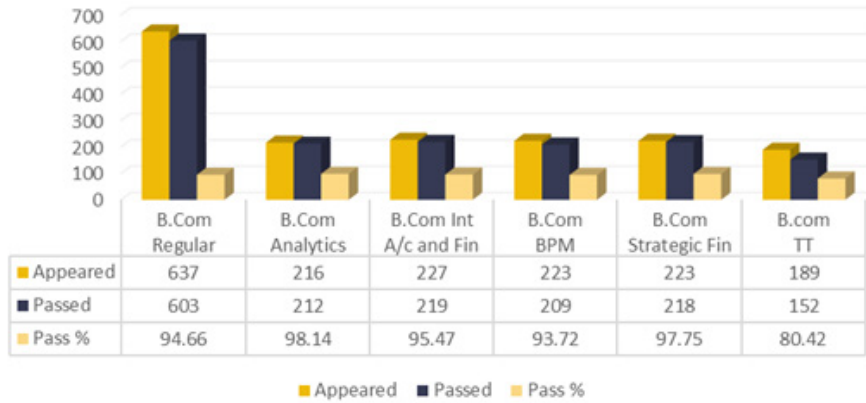

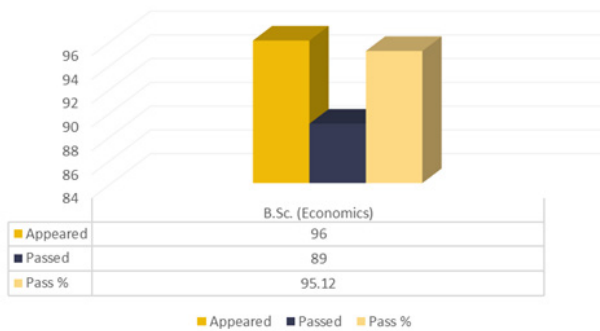

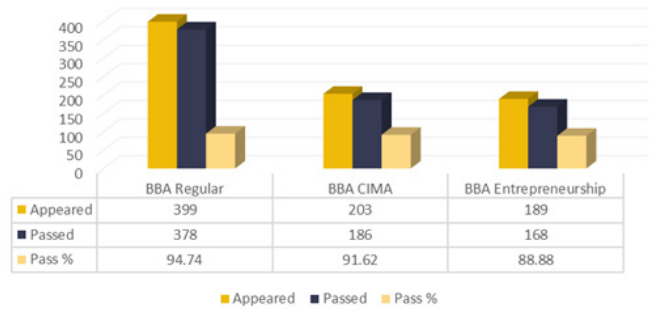
Overall Even Semester Results B.Com April 2024



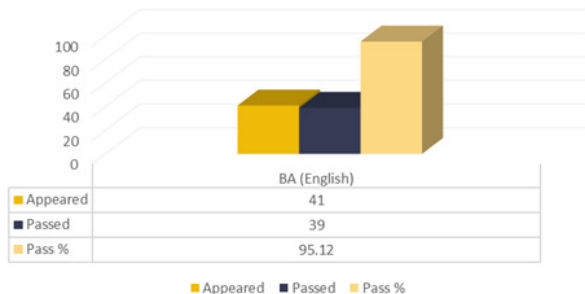
Overall Odd Semester Results - B.Sc. (Economics) April 2024



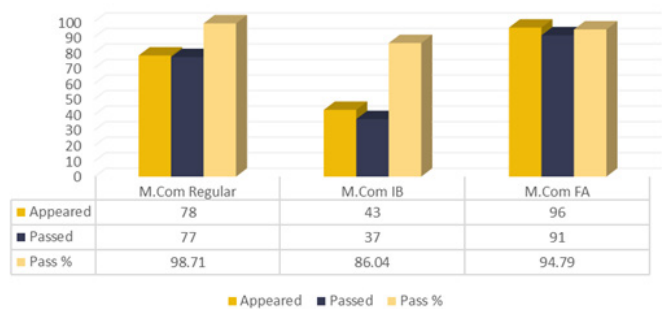
Overall Even Semester Results BBA April 2024

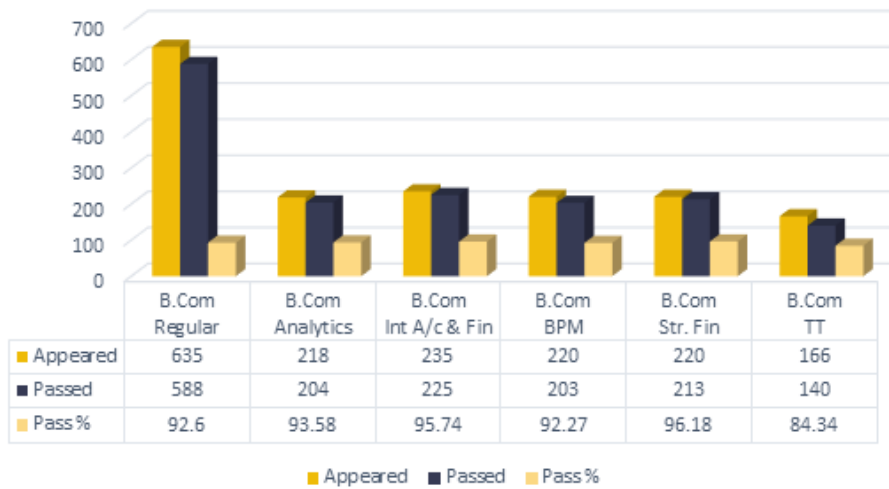

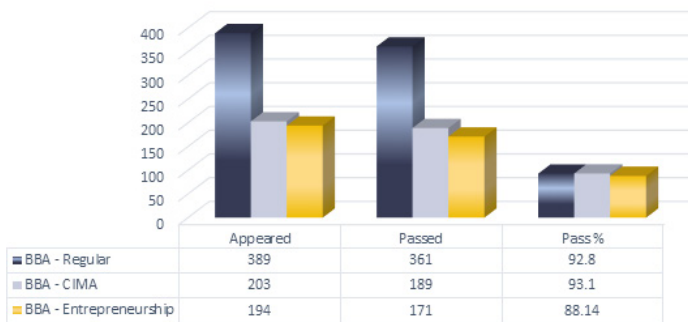

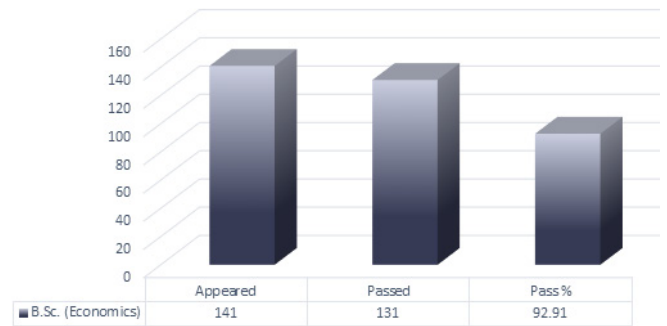
Overall Odd Semester Results - B.Com October 2024



Overall Odd Semester Results - BBA October 2024



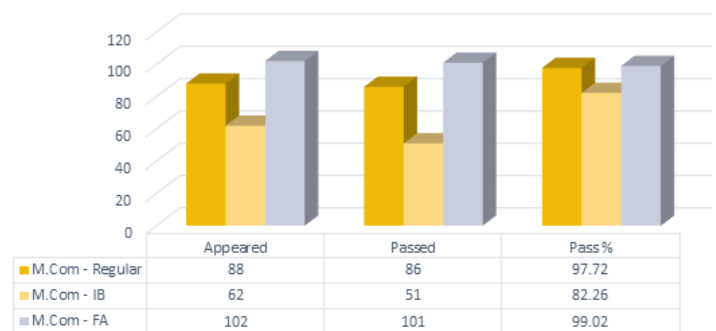
Overall Odd Semester Results - B.Sc. (Economics) October 2024

Research at SJCC

Research is an integral component of academic excellence at SJCC. The college has a Research Centre recognised by Bengaluru City University, and the centre plays a vital role in fostering research culture at the institution.

Objectives

- To foster a research culture among the faculty members.
- To promote excellence in research in higher education.
- To support multidisciplinary research.
- To develop a research-oriented attitude among young faculty members.

Research Centre

- 2010 - St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) was recognised as a Research Centre by Bengaluru City University (formerly, Bangalore University)
- 22 August 2022, an Expert Committee from Bangalore City University visited the SJCC Research Centre to assess its renewal of recognition. Following their evaluation, the Research Centre's recognition was extended for the period 2022–2023 to 2025–2026.

Committed to upholding the highest ethical standards in research, the Research Centre enforces a robust Plagiarism and Malpractice Policy. The institution employs Turnitin software for plagiarism detection, aligning with the UGC's Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism in Higher Educational Institutions Regulations, 2018. The Centre also adheres to the institution's Research Policy, fostering a research-oriented culture among both students and faculty members.

This year, one PhD scholar completed their doctoral degree under the guidance of faculty members recognized for Guideship by Bangalore University. Currently, 16 PhD scholars are registered under six faculty members at the Research Centre. Furthermore, Bengaluru City University has recognized eight faculty members as Research Supervisors under the SJCC Research Centre in the discipline of Commerce.

The Centre actively administers research funds from esteemed government institutions such as the UGC and ICSSR for minor and major research projects. SJCC MRR is a double-blind, peer-reviewed, open-access, refereed journal that delivers original, quality-based, and contemporary research findings in the field of management and business studies. It is a bi-annual publication published every year in June and December. The first issue of the journal was brought out in 2011. The journal is indexed in the J-Gate, I-Scholar, Google Scholar, and Academia.edu and each paper is given a Digital Object Identifier (DOI) number.

The journal accepts research articles, review articles, conceptual articles, case studies, book reviews, short comments on diverse issues, and solution-oriented findings in studies of management and business studies.

Highlights of SJCC MRR

Support for Girl Students

In line with the ongoing commitment to providing a safe and supportive environment, two beds have been added to the ladies' room. This initiative ensures female students have access to comfortable, well-equipped spaces for rest during their time on campus. By enhancing the facilities for female students, the goal is to foster an environment that supports their well-being, encourages personal growth, and allows them to focus fully on their academic and extracurricular pursuits. This addition reflects a dedication to creating an inclusive, supportive atmosphere for all members of the community.

Mentorship

Mentoring works as a support system for students and provides comfort. Every first-year class gets two mentors to mentor 40 students each. The mentors arrange meetings with students individually and help them address their concerns. Mentors keep track of academic performance, leave records and meet parents whenever required. In addition, they educate students about the college rules and facilities that they can avail of. Class mentors maintain student files that contain students' details and it is updated from time to time. This file is passed on to the mentors of the subsequent years of the programme.

Counselling Cell

The Counselling Cell of the college plays a pivotal role in student development and character formation, which aligns with the institution's core objectives. With four full-time counsellors, the department contributes to various initiatives on campus and actively participates in several cells and committees. The counsellors are key members of the Student Grievance and Sexual Harassment Cell, providing essential support to both students and parents when needed.

In collaboration with the Anti-Sexual Harassment and Redressal Cell, the counsellors organized a workshop titled 'Boundaries: Blueprint Towards Healthy Relationships' on 3 September 2024. This workshop, held for all first and second-year UG students, focused on raising awareness about boundaries, the protocols involved, and the consequences of boundary violations.

Personal Counselling

Students frequently seek one-on-one counselling sessions to address personal challenges. The college utilises Calendly, a seamless and confidential appointment scheduling platform, to facilitate these sessions. Students come for help with various issues, including:

- Peer pressure
- Transitioning to college life
- Adjustment and emotional issues (fear, anger, grief, anxiety)
- Academic challenges (performance, attendance, inappropriate behaviour)
- Low self-esteem, trauma, and other psychological distress

These personal sessions provide a safe space for students to work closely with counsellors to overcome their problems.

Group Counselling

As part of the outreach initiative led by Bembala, the counsellors conduct group counselling sessions with all first-year students in groups of 5-6. These sessions provide a platform for self-discovery, allowing students to learn from each other, embrace their strengths, and accept their shortcomings. The sessions help counsellors build rapport with students and spread awareness about mental health and the counselling process. This initiative ensures that first-year UG students are informed about the common concerns that affect them at this stage of life.

Student Support Services

In addition to one-on-one sessions, counsellors work closely with class mentors and teachers, who may refer students for emotional support. Counsellors also coordinate with family members when necessary to ensure comprehensive care. Moreover, in emergencies where students are hospitalized, the counsellors provide essential strength and support to both students and their families.

Psychological Well-being Programme

As part of the first-semester curriculum, all first-year students take a mandatory course on Psychological Well-Being. This 2-credit course, designed with five core modules, includes:

1. Introduction to Psychological Well-Being
2. Emotions
3. Boundaries and Relationships
4. Personality
5. Goal setting

The curriculum focuses on helping students become more self-aware, recognize the importance of emotions, establish boundaries in relationships, and explore aspects of personality development. Reflective activities, both individual and group-based, were integrated into the course, which spanned 12 sessions. Approximately, 1100 students participated, and they were assessed through skill-based activities and reflective exercises throughout the semester.

Additional Roles and Responsibilities

In addition to their primary counselling duties, the counsellors also:

- Assist class mentors during Industrial Visits and Outreach Programs organised by Bembala and other departments, promoting student interaction and engagement.
- Participate in mentoring sessions and take viva assessments for students completing mandatory social and corporate internships, evaluating the experiences gained by students during their tenures.
- Create infographics and psycho-educational posters on topics such as 'Boundaries', which are displayed across the campus.
- Facilitate workshops for teachers and staff on 'Guidelines for Addressing Boundaries with Students', following discussions with the administration.

The Counselling Cell remains committed to promoting mental health awareness and fostering a supportive environment for students, faculty, and staff. Through personal and group counselling sessions, student outreach, and collaborative initiatives, the counsellors continue to contribute to the holistic development of the college community.

Activities of Counselling Cell

Suicide Prevention Workshop

The Department of Psychology & Counselling organized a workshop on Mental Health & Suicide Prevention 101 on 22 November 2024. The session was led by Nelson Vinod Moses, Founder & CEO of QPR Institute India, an expert in mental health and suicide prevention. With 150 participants from various Bangalore colleges, the workshop focused on raising awareness about mental health, the biopsychosocial model, and suicide prevention strategies. The interactive session provided valuable insights and practical approaches to supporting those at risk. Participants received a digital e-certificate upon completion.

Animum 2024

The counselling team organised a national-level short film festival Animum on 22 November 2024. This year's theme, "Elevate and Empower", highlights the importance of mental health in the workplace.

Kairos 2024

Kairos is a structured gratitude initiative for final-year UG and PG students to reflect on their academic journey, appreciate mentors and peers, and explore ways to give back. Through guided meditation, peer appreciation, and gratitude activities, students express thanks and recognize their blessings. The program began on 22 February 2025, featuring three daily sessions and concluded on 1 March 2025.

Samagra (St. Joseph's Holistic Wellness Centre)

SJCC counsellors actively participate in Samagra's initiatives to enhance mental health services. Through Samagra meetings, key concerns are addressed, leading to proposed improvements like educational videos, blogs, and articles for mental health awareness. Students were introduced to counselling services during class-wise orientations, covering the counselling process, access to support, and recognizing signs for seeking help. An interactive session debunked myths about counselling. From 31 May to 6 June 2024, nine orientation sessions were conducted for UG students, each accommodating 350 participants. A separate session for PG students was held on June 10, ensuring broader awareness and accessibility to mental health support.

Parents-Teachers' Meeting

St. Joseph's College of Commerce prioritises interaction with parents to augment holistic development of the students. The Parent-Teacher Meeting conducted annually provides the parents a platform to address their concerns and issues regarding their wards. Such an interaction also gives the teachers an opportunity to get to know their students better. It, therefore, works together with the parents of the students to ensure that the education of their wards is in line with their expectations. Parent-teacher meetings allow for the institution to understand the concerns of the parents and address them, while also helping them understand the ethos of the college. Their support is an integral part of the educational mission of our college and thus, this interaction provides for better understanding of the stakeholders' views.

PTM for First-Year UG Students

The first-year parent-teacher meeting for the academic year 2024-25 was conducted on the campus on Saturday 17 August 2024.

The Online Parent Teacher meeting facility was made available to the parents who could not come for the offline meeting, for the parents who are staying outside Karnataka and India. The Online mode was conducted between 19 August (Monday) to 2 September (Monday) 2024. The online mode meetings were arranged and

conducted as per the convenience of the Class mentors and Parents during the work hours/ before 4 pm. It was decided to use any legitimate e-platforms like MS Teams/Google/Skype for the Online Mode. In some cases, where parents do not have access to use the E platforms, telephonic calls were also used to reach out to them.

PTM for Second-Year UG Students

PTM for second & third years (Shift 1 & 2) for the academic year 2024-25 was conducted between 21 September 2024 and 4 September 2024. It was not conducted in a centralized way, instead, a common mail was sent to all the parents of the students who are coming under the defaulters list on the basis of students who:

- Have scored less than 8 marks in one or more subjects in the Mid-Term Tests.
- Has less than 75% in-class attendance. (As per UUCMS guidelines from the UGC)
- Have backlogs in previous semesters.
- Have disciplinary Concerns.

Scholarships

There are various scholarship programs available at SJCC to support meritorious and economically disadvantaged students. These scholarships, offered by the Government of Karnataka, the Central Government, the college management, and the alumni association, provide financial assistance and encouragement to students excelling in academics, sports, and co-curricular activities. With dedicated committees overseeing the selection process, these scholarships ensure that financial aid reaches those who need it most, fostering an inclusive and supportive learning environment.

Government Scholarship

To provide necessary encouragement and motivation to pursue higher education, the Government of Karnataka and the Central Government provide various scholarship schemes to meritorious and economically backward students. At SJCC students are sent notifications of the scholarships and encouraged to apply for these scholarships. The college has also deputed a faculty-in-charge to channelise the scholarships and fellowships offered by the UGC.

Management Scholarship

The management awards scholarships to meritorious students coming from economically weaker sections of society. The Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES) has set up the Management Scholarship Fund. The college has set up a Management Scholarship Committee to recognise needy, meritorious and deserving students in academics, sports and co-curricular activities.

OSA Scholarship

The Alumni of the college have a fund and the income generated from the fund is used to grant scholarships annually to students from economically weaker sections of the society. The alumni have formed a committee that independently scrutinizes the applicants and holds interviews with their parents to determine genuine beneficiaries.

TRAINING AND PLACEMENT

The college maintains its exemplary reputation and has completed another successful semester-round of placement activities for its students which stands as a testimony to the continued faith reposed by the internal and external stakeholders of the prestigious Institution.

This semester for placements started with a detailed orientation given to the students about the placement process followed at the institution.

There are broadly two processes followed at the institution:

- Pre-placement Process and Skill Development comprises activities to prepare the pre-final/final year students of the institution for placement opportunities in their outgoing year. Activities ranging from career mapping, career guidance, and workshops on aptitude, soft skills, and technical skills to excel in interviews are organized for students.

The industry-academia interface is another focal area for the cell, through which it has courses, seminars, and guest talks in collaboration with companies during the academic year. Second-year students take up corporate internships to help them make an easy transition into the final recruitment process.

- The placement process followed at the institution is divided into three different phases for the smooth functioning of the placement activities.

Phase one includes a briefing on the college placement policy/code of conduct for students, a pre-placement workshop, a series of guest talks, and career mapping sessions. Phase two includes registration by students interested in campus placement. The final phase is when we have the companies visiting the institution to conduct an on-campus recruitment drive.

Pre-placement Process and Skill Development

Career Recruitment Training

Career Recruitment Training (CRT) is organized by SJCC in association with Disciples India Group with A two-week Employability Training Workshop to fine-tune the skills of students to make them industry-ready. CRT Prep conducted this workshop for the final year students from 24 June 2024 to 3 July 2024. Spread over two weeks, this workshop included quantitative modules, logical reasoning, resume building, mock interviews, and soft skills development sessions. The CRT Program was conducted on a virtual platform.

The organizations offered diverse roles varying from finance, accounts, marketing, and human resources, to name a few. Information about placements is made available to students through the college ERP & SMS system, E-Mails, social media platforms, and placement notice board.

For this academic year, 468 Undergraduate & Postgraduate students registered for campus placements (who are eligible for placement activities) of which 199 (including internship) students have been offered jobs by various companies, and many more are in the pipeline for recruitment and selection.

Recruitment Sessions and Future Internship Opportunities

Throughout the odd semester of the 2024-25 academic year, the Placements & Internship Cell organised recruitment sessions for various organizations visiting the campus. These sessions were aimed at selecting students for part-time corporate internships or internships feasible for the upcoming summer of the Academic Year 2024-25. The initiative was geared towards providing students with valuable opportunities to engage with industry professionals, gain insights into corporate culture, and secure internships that align with their career aspirations.

Corporate Internships for B. Com & BBA Students

Corporate internships have been an integral part of the academic curriculum for second-year B. Com and BBA students at our institution. These internships provide practical industry exposure alongside classroom studies, aiming to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world application. The primary objective is to enable students to gain firsthand experience in various functions of the industry, thereby enhancing their overall learning experience.

In the 2024-25 academic year, Corporate Internships were mandatory for second-year B. Com, BBA B.Sc, and BA students, requiring them to complete a 4-to-6-week internship before their fifth semester. This practical experience is supplemented by classroom learning and culminates in submitting a comprehensive report, evaluated through a viva voce, for credits. These credits are awarded in the sixth semester, contributing to the student's overall academic progress.

During the internship period, both online and offline internship opportunities were made available to students across India and abroad. Approximately 998 students from the 2022 batch undertook internships during this period. As of 24 September 2024, a total of 911 students have completed their internships, showcasing their dedication and commitment to gaining practical industry experience.

| Social Internship

The Social Internship is an integral component of the curriculum, designed to foster a sense of social responsibility among students. In the academic year 2023-24, a group of 566 B.Com students participated in Social Internships, dedicating 60 hours during their second year of study. These internships were completed before the commencement of their fourth semester, during the Summer Vacation of 2023. Upon completion, students submitted reports, which were evaluated through viva voce examinations. Credits for their participation were then allocated to the relevant department.

| Start-up Internship

The BBA Entrepreneurship Program of St. Joseph's College of Commerce has been designed with a vision to infuse experiential and high-quality education with a global focus. This Program involves a unique and dynamic combination of creativity, innovation, critical thinking and organisation, provided on an interactive platform that hones the students into becoming competent future entrepreneurs. In line with the objective of the Programme, the Students of the second semester of BBA are expected to intern in a Start-Up that is at least a year old and has a registered GSTIN Number for a period of 4 to 6 weeks during April and May. This internship will enable the students to inculcate critical thinking and use cutting-edge analytical tools and problem-solving skills to understand the workings of new businesses.

- To inculcate critical thinking among students, so that they are capable of identifying business opportunities by using cutting-edge analytical tools and problem-solving skills to start new businesses and implement processes to successfully understand these businesses.
- To create entrepreneurial managers for the corporate world.

- To develop family business successors as enterprising and knowledgeable owners of the business of their predecessors.

CAMPUS MINISTRY

Faithful to the Jesuit Catholic heritage, the Campus Ministry at St. Joseph's College of Commerce prioritises the spiritual well-being of all students while fostering their holistic growth. At the core of its mission lies the ethos of St. Ignatius, encapsulated in the concept of 'Finding God in all things.' the Ministry addresses the challenges and illusions of the times by imparting this distinctive spiritual ethos.

Ignitors – Integral Formation Program for First-Year UG Students

The Ignitors – Integral Formation Program orientation was held on 1 June 2024 with over 900 students participating. The program focused on soft skills, social awareness, and holistic development, covering topics like goal setting, communication, teamwork, time management, and student activism, alongside discussions on caste and gender discrimination, human trafficking, and child labour.

Sessions were led by distinguished resource persons from academia, corporate sectors, and social activism, including Mr. Ebenezer, Mr. Timothy, Mr. Varun, Mr. Samuel Price, Ms. Afreen, Dr. Wajeed, Ms. Brinda Adiga, Mr. Manohar, Mr. Kiran Jeevan, Fr. Cristeen Gayandas, and Mr. Prashant Kumar. Key sessions introduced students to mental health and counselling services, the college's social outreach initiatives, and character formation, emphasizing personal and social responsibility. The program reinforced the university's commitment to nurturing well-rounded individuals.

Footprints – Annual Retreat for UG & PG students

The annual retreat was conducted for Catholic students from the first, second, and third years of various undergraduate programmes and was held on the 1, 8, and 15 June 2024, with an additional session for postgraduate students on 22 June 2024, at St Joseph's Boys High School Chapel. Titled 'Footprints,' the retreat was conducted by the Campus Ministry team and provided students with an introduction to Ignatian spiritual practices and prayer methods. After the sessions, the participants shared a time of adoration led by the Revival Ministry, and opportunities for confession. Jesuit priests from the Karnataka Jesuit Province, along with diocesan priests, served as resource persons throughout the retreat. Approximately 750 Catholic students took part in this spiritual gathering, which culminated in the Mass of the Holy Spirit, offering a meaningful conclusion to the enriching experience.

Charity drive of Stationery

The Campus Ministry, in collaboration with AICUF (All India Catholic University Federation), organized a Charity Drive on campus aimed at supporting mission camps in North Karnataka. Instead of monetary donations, students were encouraged to contribute items in kind, with specific categories assigned based on their year of study. For undergraduate students, the contribution breakdown was as follows: first-year students brought in notebooks, second-year students donated geometry boxes, and third-year students provided various stationery items (pens, erasers, pencils, sharpeners, etc.). Postgraduate students contributed exam pads. The collection resulted in a significant number of items. These contributions were sent to the Bijapur Mission Station, which serves two primary causes: providing a home that cares for children affected by AIDS and supporting underprivileged students in the region. The drive was a significant step toward fostering generosity and social responsibility within the college community.

Hope for Education – Cause Drive

The "Hope for Education – Cause Drive" an initiative by the Campus Ministry at St. Joseph's College of Commerce, has made a significant impact by raising funds from students to support the education of children from the Devadasi community. This charitable effort reflects a strong sense of social responsibility and empathy and the unified commitment to making a difference that underscores the college's dedication to social upliftment and empowerment of marginalised groups. By actively participating in this cause, students are contributing to breaking cycles of poverty and discrimination, helping these young learners access opportunities for a brighter future.

Ignatian Week

The St. Ignatius Feast Celebrations at St. Joseph's College of Commerce were successfully conducted, uniting students from various disciplines to commemorate the college's founding father, St. Ignatius of Loyola. In observance of the feast, a range of events, including a poster-making competition, photography contest, and quiz, were held between the 24 and 26 July 2024. These activities provided an opportunity for students to demonstrate their talents and creativity. Cash prizes were awarded to both winners and participants as recognition of their achievements. The event was designed to promote a sense of unity, encourage creativity, and facilitate learning through a series of engaging and well-organized activities.

Campus Connect – September Edition - Intercollegiate Faith Event

Students from St. Joseph's College of Commerce participated in the "Campus Connect – September Edition," organised by Jesus Youth on 15 September 2024 at Christ Junior College. The event, titled "Catalyst – Igniting Faith," was attended by students from various Christian colleges, aiming to foster spiritual growth and unity. The program included sessions for reflection, worship, and discussions on faith. The students found the experience enriching, connecting them with peers from other institutions and enhancing their spiritual journey. Overall, the event successfully strengthened the participants' faith and sense of community.

Monthly and Feast Mass

Masses are held on the first Friday of every month and on special feast days in the college to nurture a sense of spiritual belonging and community among the students. These feast days include significant events in the Catholic calendar, such as the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which honours the compassion and love of Christ; the Feast of the Assumption of Mother Mary, celebrating her ascension to heaven; and the Nativity of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary, marking her birth. These celebrations aim to bring students together in worship and reflection, deepening their spiritual connection and shared faith. During the annual retreat, the Mass of the Holy Spirit was celebrated, offering participants a meaningful spiritual experience and invoking the Holy Spirit's guidance and inspiration. This practice encourages a regular rhythm of spiritual growth and reflection, providing students with consistent opportunities to engage in communal worship, uphold their faith, and reinforce their sense of unity within the college community.

Revival Prayer Service

Every Friday, a Revival Prayer Service is held at various venues across the college, bringing together students and faculty who voluntarily wish to deepen their faith. The group meets during the common hour, ensuring it does not clash with academic schedules, and typically includes around 20 participants. Members then engage in faith-sharing, where personal experiences and testimonies are openly discussed, fostering deeper connections. A reflection on the word of God follows, often involving scripture reading and discussions to inspire spiritual growth and understanding. The session concludes with intercessory prayers, where members pray for each other, the college, and wider concerns. This regular gathering promotes spiritual nourishment, builds community, and encourages a supportive, faith-based environment in the college.

Christmas Drive

The Christmas Charity drive was organised on 17 and 20 of December 2024, where we collected stationery and groceries that served charitable causes and were given to those in need during the holiday season. The students of AICUF in collaboration with Campus Ministry and Preethi Nivas Trust distributed the collected items to the needy.

**Christmas Carnival**

The Christmas carnival was a celebration in collaboration with AICUF, drawing crowds with its festive charm. Christmas celebration was featured with live entertainment such as music performances, dance, and fun game stalls which enhanced the spirit of Christmas.

Way of the Cross

During the season of Lent, every Friday of the week, the Way of the Cross Prayer was arranged for all Catholic students and staff during the common hour, and the prayer was conducted by the students. On average, about 100 students participated in the weekly prayer.

SOCIAL CONCERN AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

St. Joseph's College of Commerce (SJCC) has long been committed to fostering a spirit of social responsibility among its students. Through various outreach programs and community engagement initiatives, the institution ensures that students are not only academically proficient but also socially conscious individuals who contribute to the betterment of society.

Bembala: Outreach Programme

Bembala is a BJES community outreach programme designed for students of St. Joseph's Institutions, which is initiated to realise the Jesuit vision of life and education. The Institution envisions forming young men and women with a strong concern and commitment to the society they live in. At this juncture, the Bembala Team under the leadership of Fr. Daniel Fernandes SJ –Director, came up with many creative and innovative activities to sensitize our students by inculcating concern for society. Some of the activities conducted are as follows:

First-Year Initiatives

- Over 500 students participated in awareness programs on traffic safety and cleanliness. They held placards at key locations, promoting responsible driving and discouraging phone use. Public interviews were conducted to assess community awareness, encouraging safer road practices and a cleaner environment.
- To promote sustainability, students learned to make eco-friendly paper bags, producing 10,000 bags. These were distributed to local vendors, along with discussions on plastic pollution's impact on health, animals, and the environment. Vendors were encouraged to adopt paper bags as a step toward a greener future.
- Students attended 15-minute individual counselling sessions with professional counselors, focusing on mental health awareness and providing support for personal challenges. One-on-one mentoring sessions were also conducted, allowing students to seek personalized guidance for academic and personal growth. These initiatives fostered a supportive environment for student well-being.

Second Year Initiatives

UG/PG Rural Exposure Camp -Nelamangala. Sindagi and Manvi

Over 1,100 students from 17 batches participated in a rural exposure program at Nelamangala, Sindagi, and Manvi to understand village life and its challenges. They engaged in activities such as mindfulness sessions, village visits, brick factory work, and awareness campaigns.

During fieldwork, students cleared overgrown vegetation using tools like pickaxes and shovels, contributing to land conservation. Morning mindfulness practices, including yoga and meditation, helped improve focus and energy. At a brick factory, students assisted workers while gaining insights into industrial processes.

In villages, they conducted surveys on livelihood and agriculture, performed street plays on social issues like alcoholism and education, and organized awareness campaigns. Student danced to various Kannada songs to engage with the community in a leisurely manner. Additionally, students distributed stationery kits and painted government schools, fostering both learning and social impact. The program provided hands-on learning while strengthening students' connection to grassroots realities.

Other Activities

Independence Day Programme

Recycling of papers

A total of 2,381 kgs of scrap and unused paper were collected and handed over to ITC for recycling. By participating in this effort, students actively contributed to resource conservation, fostering a culture of environmental awareness and responsible consumption while making a meaningful social impact.

LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SERVICES

The library is fully automated for its in-house day-to-day activities using Koha open-source Integrated Library Management Software (ILMS). The automated modules include cataloguing and accessing, acquisition, serial control, member module, circulation, and in-out management.

Every year, the library at St. Joseph's College of Commerce makes an intensive effort to add both electronic and print resources to its collection. The library currently holds a collection of 33,355 print books on various branches of commerce, management, mathematics, statistics, languages, personality development, competitive exams, general books, ACCA, CIMA, CA, and CPT that are well-balanced and comprehensive. The library contains numerous useful reference books, back issues of periodicals, VCDs, DVDs, ACDs, Kindles, and CD-ROMs. In addition to print resources and maintaining user convenience and 24/7 access, the SJCC library currently holds 79948 e-books and 12000+ e-journals.

To upload academic integrity library provides a similarity/plagiarism checking service through Turnitin, this platform allows faculty, researchers and students to verify the originality of their work with web content or published content.

The library organises annual orientation programmes for new students and provides hands-on training on specific digital resources to improve their ability to retrieve information.

Print Resources

As of 31 January 2025, the library has continued to expand its print resource collection to support academic and research needs. Over the past year, several new additions have been made across various categories, enhancing the availability of resources for students and faculty.

Physical Infrastructure

The college underwent significant renovation and construction to enhance its infrastructure and facilities. These developments reflect the college's continuous efforts to provide a safe, modern, and well-equipped learning environment. These renovations and constructions include:

- The Administrative Office was renovated, along with the Finance Officer's cabin and Board Room 2 (basement).
- A new staircase was constructed, and essential modifications were made to the Ladies' Room, including a bed for resting and additional space.
- Five classrooms were upgraded with electrical facilities on the desks, while the media room also saw improvements.
- Fire safety measures were enhanced with the installation of equipment across the entire campus, and CCTV cameras were installed in all 44 classrooms.
- The AV 2 403 room was furnished with a podium, carpets, and blinds. Eight ladies' toilets and a gents' toilet were renovated, and a food court was furnished for students.
- To cater to dining needs, two canteens and a juice counter were built. A dedicated Students' Council room was set up as a décor space for student activities.
- A new generator with a capacity of 162 KV was purchased in exchange for the old one, and a new electrical panel room was constructed.
- A room for waste management was built near the football ground, reinforcing the institution's commitment to sustainability.

User-friendly portals provide real-time updates for students, staff, and parents, while integrated digital payment gateways simplify fee transactions. By managing the entire student lifecycle from enrollment to academic tracking, SJCC's ERP fosters digital governance, operational efficiency, and transparency, creating a technologically advanced academic environment that meets the evolving needs of modern education.

- Security infrastructure has been upgraded with the transition from Analog HD to IP cameras, extending surveillance coverage across the campus.
- A majority of systems have been upgraded from Windows 8 and 10 to Windows 11 Professional, ensuring compatibility with the latest software.
- Official email IDs have been created and provided to all students and staff members for streamlined communication.
- The institution's website has undergone a complete revamp to enhance user experience and accessibility.
- Scanners were procured for quick and efficient process of scanning answer scripts of the end semester examinations.

The mode of elections was offline where students had to report to college and cast their votes in the designated venues.



Investiture Ceremony

Activities Organised by Student Council

Leadership Camp

Kalotsav

Kalotsav is an intracollegiate fest organised by The Student Council to bring all the classes together and help the freshers learn to acclimatise college culture, foster teamwork, and showcase their talents through various creative and competitive events.

On 7 July 2024, the Student Council organised a pre-event to Kalotsav 2024 called the 'Ride to Kalotsav 2024', a charity event dedicated to supporting education for underprivileged children. Over 120 students participated enthusiastically in this cause. The ride began at 6:30 am from SJCC, with students biking together to Mydala Lake. At the lake, students conducted activities and spent time bonding with each other.

Pre-Kalotsav was a dynamic three-day event hosted to build excitement for the main fest Kalotsav from 8 to 10 July 2024. During the three days, various fun activities, including games and performances from council teams were the major attractions. Emphasizing collective responsibility, it called for efforts to safeguard India's 22 regional languages and their cultural significance.

- Guest Lecture-2, was organized on 9 January 2025 on the Indian Knowledge System exploring India's ancient intellectual traditions and their modern relevance. Dr. Gond discussed contributions to science, medicine, philosophy, and the arts, stressing Hindi's role in preserving this heritage. Coordinated by Sourabh and the core team, the event concluded with a vote of thanks and a lively Q&A.

- 'Nakshatra', an inter-college fest, took place on 30 January 2025, celebrating Hindi language and literature. It provided a platform for students to showcase creativity through competitions like 'Bollywood Dhamaka', 'Jnanpith Awarded Literature Talk', 'Creative Writing', 'Naatika' (theatre), 'Vaagjal' (debate), and 'Kavyagaan' (poetry and music).

Hashmi Theatre Forum

- A 'Community Theatre Show' was performed in Stride Pharma Premises in the Jigani Industrial Area, on 3 July 2024, for the employee gathering on the theme Unity and Leadership. This was also covered and captured in The Hindu newspaper article on 27 September 2024.

- A captivating rendition of William Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's Dream was performed as part of the Vividha Fest organized by the English Department of St. Joseph's College of Commerce on the 29 August, 2024 in the Loyola Hall. The play, directed by Dr. T. H. Lavakumar, showcased the dedication and enthusiasm of a large cast and crew.

- Hashmi Theatre Forum joined Souharda Sambhrama at Cubbon Park with Souharda Bharatha on 26 January 2025. Through mime, street play, folk music, and discussions, the event celebrated Republic

Day, constitutional values, and unity in diversity. Performances fostered civic responsibility and cultural appreciation. S. R. Mehroz Khan, Vice Chairperson of the State Guarantee Schemes Implementation Authority, graced the occasion.

- The Hashmi Theatre Association staged Kindi by T H Lavakumar, on 2 February 2025, at Kala Grama captivating the audience with engaging storytelling. A food stall offering snacks and drinks promoted the play and fostered community interaction. This initiative blended theatre, hospitality, and outreach, enhancing the audience experience.

- 'Enact 2025', a vibrant two-day theatre festival was conducted on 14 & 15 February, 2025 at Loyola Hall, celebrating storytelling and performance. Day 1 featured Ward No. 6 (Kannada). Day 2 featured The Library of No Books.

Debating Society

- 'Auctioned Arguments: Raise, Bid, Debate!' was the Debating Society's icebreaker for first-year members held on 27 June 2024, with thirty-eight participants in eight groups. Teams received 100-150 points based on bidding time, then presented debates on topics like 'Team Captain America vs. Team Ironman' and 'Ross vs. Rachel'.

- 'Voice Out', the Kalotsav 2024 debating event held on 13 July 2024, focused on journalism and debate skills. In Round 1, teams turned harmful social media trends into news headlines. Seven teams advanced to the final round, where one member played Manohar Lal Sharma and the other his lawyer, convinced judges (election committee) and the audience to vote for him.

- 'Unseen - The Blindfolded Debate' which was held on 20 August 2024 was a blindfolded 2 vs. 2 debate. Participants were given eight topics twelve hours before the scheduled time of the event and four minutes to present. The winners were decided based on the following criteria: oratory skills, original thinking and their ability to persuade. The topics of the debate included marriages in modern society, gender quotas in politics, and the adoption of more open immigration policies.



- 'Voice of the People', held on 11 February 2025, featured eight speakers discussing ethics and creativity in the age of artificial intelligence. The event encouraged critical thinking and analysis, fostering an engaging discussion. The session provided valuable insights into the evolving role of AI in student creativity, emphasizing ethical considerations and responsible innovation.

- 'What's Trending?', held on 20 February 2025, was a round table debate featuring participants from both the debating society and other backgrounds. The discussion centred on the trending topic 'India's Got Latent', specifically exploring 'India's Got Outrage: Is Media Sensationalism Influencing Indian Youth's Perception of Success and Fame?'. Moderated by three facilitators, participants presented their stances, rebuttals, and multiple perspectives, fostering a dynamic and thought-provoking exchange on the impact of media on youth aspirations.

- 'The Art of Debating', held in Room 116 on 25 February 2025, was a workshop conducted by Sanjana Rakesh from 2 BBA B, a student of the open elective class - Debate and Argumentation. She provided valuable insights into crafting a well-articulated speech, effective research, and strong argumentation techniques. The session aimed to enhance participants' critical thinking, persuasive skills, and structured debating abilities, equipping them with the tools to formulate and present arguments.

Quiz Club

- 'Battle of Wits' was conducted on 11 July 2024 during Kalotsav, consisting of 3 rounds: 2 written and a final oral round. The first place was secured by 2 B.Com D, second place by 3 B. Com B and third place by 1 B. Com C.

- A 'Quizzing Workshop' was conducted on 6 September 2024, for the 2024-25 members, led by former SJCC quiz club members Ms. Mohana Gopinath and Mr. Aditya Sareen. The workshop covered competitive quizzing aspects, including quiz hosting, question quality, formulation techniques, and solution strategies. Best practices for designing quizzes were shared, and members were taught how to overcome common errors. The workshop concluded with a quiz, applying the concepts discussed.

- 'Bing Quiz 2024' was conducted on 17 December 2024, featuring three rounds: two by the club and one by guest quizmasters Mr. Sean Pinto and Mr. Joshua D'Costa. The first place was secured by Abhishek M and Bhavya V, the second place by Annselm Gilbert and Annuj Alex and the third place by Tomaz K Melvin and Riddhi Kalra.

Serenata Chorale

- The association had an Ice Breakers Session on 6 July 2024 to help the association members get to know each other. A few games to help with this process. The choir was taught a few vocal exercises.

- 'Main Agar Kahoon' (Event 1), a duet singing competition was conducted on 12 July 2024, where 2 members from each class showcased their music skills, open to both English and Bollywood songs. 'Riff Off' (Event 2) conducted on the same day, was inspired by the Pitch Perfect series. This energetic competition tested participants' musical knowledge and spontaneity.

Through mentorship and evaluations, participants refined concepts, explored growth opportunities, and built confidence to navigate the startup ecosystem.

Finance Club

- On 10 July 2024 the Pre-Kalotsav, warm-up events for the main fest featured fun games like dumb charades, darts, pictionary, board games, etc, with six stalls manned by the core team of finance club, helping students earn brownie points for their classes. Children from a nearby government school were invited, creating a more inclusive and vibrant atmosphere. The event fostered teamwork, community spirit, and excitement for Kalotsav, making it a memorable experience for all those involved.

- The Finance Club's 'Goldman Sachs Internship Preparation Workshop' was held on 18 & 19 July 2024. It aimed at enhancing career prospects through resume reviews, interview training, and insights into company culture. Attendees networked with employees, participated in mock interviews, and gained strategies for success.

- The Budget Analysis which was held on 24 July 2024 successfully delved into the key announcements and economic implications of the Union Budget 2024. Expert panellists provided insightful discussions on the budget's impact on various sectors and policy changes. The event also addressed how the budget influences students and their future opportunities. This interactive platform enabled participants to deepen their understanding of the budget's priorities.

- On 12 & 13 August 2024, the Finance Club's Josephite's Premier League (JPL) blended IPL-style auctions with financial challenges. Teams bid on players, tackled crisis scenarios, and gained sports industry insights. The top two teams won prizes, with four judges assessing the final round.

- 'Can You Save the Money?' was held on 28 August 2024. It featured finance-themed crosswords, a fast-paced quiz, and a dynamic challenge testing knowledge, quick thinking, and teamwork. The team with the sharpest and fastest responses won.

- On 2 September 2024 the first InvestEd session explored 'Compounding as the 8th Wonder of the World!' Participants learned about compounding, the Rule of 72, and the compound interest formula. An interactive Q&A reinforced its impact on long-term financial growth.

- On 9 September 2024, the second InvestEd session, 'How to Begin Your Investing Journey,' introduced derivatives, focusing on futures and options. It covered their basics, differences from traditional investments, and roles in hedging and speculation. Participants learned key terms, strategies, and risks, ending with an interactive Q&A.

- On 16 & 17 December 2024, the Finance Club's 'Paradigm' event featured rounds on retirement planning, Islamic finance, portfolio management, economic reconstruction, and futuristic urban development in India. Participants applied theory to real-world scenarios, enhancing their understanding and fostering innovative financial thinking.

College Teams

College Editorial Committee

- The College Editorial Committee hosted 'ImaginInk', a creative writing competition on 13 July 2024. Participants had 50 minutes to craft a story or essay based on a visual prompt, showcasing their creativity and writing skills.

Department Association Activities

Department of Commerce

Through a diverse range of events, competitions, and interactive sessions, these associations aim to enhance students' academic, professional, and interpersonal skills.

ComUnity

- The ComUnity Association organized the Blend event on 4 and 5 July 2024. The event was organised primarily to help the freshers to get to know each other better. The main stage event featured each class participating as a team, with a flash mob in the basketball court. The competition unfolded over two

engaging rounds. It provided a platform for students to exhibit their talent, interests, and teamwork where they also interacted with so many fellow acquaintances of theirs.

- Zest was organized as an icebreaker event on 19 July 2024. The event was conducted for second-year students who are part of the ComUnity association. The event's primary objective was to introduce new members to each other and the association's core team. Zest was a resounding success, achieving its goal of fostering interaction and building a sense of community among second-year students.

- 'Risk 2024' was conducted on 8 and 9 August 2024. Inspired by the bustling Bombay Stock Exchange the event aimed at providing a virtually realistic Stock market experience to all its participants which closely represents the Indian market of Stocks. With more than 10 engaging sessions, the event simulated a dynamic stock market environment, challenging participants to make smart investment decisions & negotiations under pressure.

- On 16 July 2024, Colosseum conducted an informal introductory icebreaker session intended to boost collaboration and understanding among members of the associations. The coordinators briefed the members on upcoming events and the credit system.

- Logistician was conducted on 3 February 2024. Department of Business Administration

The Department of Business Administration fosters a dynamic learning environment through its various student-led associations, each dedicated to enhancing leadership, entrepreneurial, analytical, and managerial skills. From business pitch competitions and editorial initiatives to research-driven discussions and community outreach programs, these associations offer students hands-on experiences that bridge the gap between academics and industry.

Entrepreneurship Learning Initiative

- The Networker's Bingo was organized by the Entrepreneurship Learning Initiative on 22 July 2024, aimed to acquaint new members with the club, convey the club's agenda and goals, cultivate a welcoming environment, nurture connections, and dismantle barriers among participants. The event began with an introduction to the association followed by a human bingo icebreaker game where participants interacted with others to find individuals matching specific achievements or characteristics listed on bingo sheets.

- The SJCC Entrepreneurs Showcase was held on 22 August 2024 which aimed to highlight entrepreneurial opportunities for students by connecting them with small business owners from SJCC, provide practical insight on launching and growing small businesses, encourage networking and collaboration, and showcase diverse business models and strategies. The event featured three small business owners who showcased their products and answered a

The event was designed for ELI Members and 2nd Year BBA Students, with 25 participants attending.

- Jointly organized by the Entrepreneurship Learning Initiative (ELI) and Leadership Development Cell (LDC), on 24 February 2025 aimed to provide students with practical understanding of Go-To-Market (GTM) strategies and investment analysis, enhance decision-making and analytical skills, encourage collaboration, and offer a platform to apply entrepreneurial knowledge.

Fountainhead

- Fountainhead is an editorial of the Business Administration Department which releases a monthly magazine called Campus Chronicles. The October Edition of Campus Chronicles was released on 31 October 2024. The issue covered must-read business books that are perfect for reflecting and catching up during the vacation, a write-up on a student-owned business, an artist corner, and a fun challenge for students to try out and send over their answers. Campus Chronicles released its November Edition on 3 December 2024. This edition covered study techniques for students to try and apply to their academic life, a write-up on the new-age concerns of

the importance of higher education and a fun business management challenge. The December Edition of the monthly magazine covered helpful websites that students can use to take their academic success to the next level, an artist corner of a student, and a fun challenge for students to decode. The January Edition was released on 2 February 2025.

- The 'Grounds for Murder: Fountainhead Icebreaker Session' was organized on 16 July 2024 which aimed to conduct an icebreaker session with new members and address what Fountainhead does in the BBA Department.

- The 'Cinematic Craft' workshop was organized 6 September 2024 with an aim to introduce students to the fundamentals of shooting and video editing, develop practical skills in handling cameras and using editing software, and foster creativity and storytelling abilities through video production techniques. Led by the media team coordinator, Mr. Abhishek M, the workshop provided hands-on experience in video production, covering camera operation, shot composition, lighting, and video editing software. Participants learned to organize, cut, and enhance footage, frame shots to convey meaning and emotion, manage different lighting conditions, and apply essential editing techniques like trimming and adding transitions.

- 'Deep Dive: A Shark Tank Analysis Workshop' was conducted on 7 January 2025. The event aimed to understand differences between various pitches seen on the Shark Tank show, draw lessons from successful and unsuccessful pitches, analyze factors that help deliver good pitches, and enhance critical thinking skills.

Josephite Business Club

- Commixture was held on 4 July 2024 to facilitate networking opportunities for new members, communicate JBC's mission and vision, and motivate freshers to actively engage in club activities.

- Festing Season was conducted on 29 and 30 August 2024, at St. Joseph's Institute of Management (SJIM) by the Josephite Business Club for 165 participants from BBA, B.COM, B. The objectives were to inculcate the practice and aptitude for festing among participants through feedback, equip students to handle demanding scenarios, create networking opportunities, and allow practical application of classroom learning.

Project Smiles

- Smiles and Mingles was an ice-breaker event organized by Project Smiles on 19 July 2024 to foster a comfortable and engaging environment for participants to build rapport and create a positive atmosphere.

Lakshmipathi as the facilitator to help participants understand the process of navigating digital resources and databases provided by the college, identify reliable research resources, and enhance research skills through effective database usage and advanced

search techniques.

- The Quest for Knowledge: A Research Workshop held on 20 December 2024 with Dr. Nancy Christina as the facilitator, to enhance research skills (focusing on title selection, effective use of resources like Sci-Hub and Google Scholar), distinguish between different research types (clarifying differences between clinical/general research and primary/secondary data), and teach participants to identify research gaps and set clear objectives.

Department of Professional Programmes

and Mr. Raghav from Deloitte & CA Abhishek were the judges for the event.

Department of Economics

The Economics Forum is the official department association of the Economics Department, dedicated to fostering practical engagement with economic concepts. It serves as a platform for students to explore real-world economic issues, engage in discussions, and develop analytical skills through seminars, debates, and guest lectures by industry experts.

Economics Forum

- Arthashastra, an Annual Exhibition organised by the Economics Forum aims to showcase the practical thinking of its talented students through the display of models they create themselves. Arthashastra 2025 was a grand success with students of I and II BSc Economics having made models on all 17 Sustainable

Development Goals, while the students of III BSc Economics prepared charts on concepts and theories related to behavioural economics. The exhibition opened in the campus basketball court, with several student and faculty members visiting each model and chart, as the students explained the concepts and theories incorporated in them.

Department of English

Established in 2023, the goal of Artium has been to foster literary skills in an engaging and interactive way, offering students practical experiences that showcase the diverse roles of language and literature in everyday life. By immersing students in art and literature, through workshops, guest lectures and various other activities, the aim of Artium is to imbibe literary sensibilities and cultural appreciation among young enthusiasts.

Artium

- 'The Silent Script' was conducted on 8 June 2024 in room number 220, SJCC. The objective of this event was to evaluate participants' skills in dialogue and script writing. During the event, a fifteen-minute clip from Akira Kurosawa's 1951 Japanese film, 'Rashomon', was screened without subtitles. Participants were then tasked with writing scripts or providing dialogues for the characters in the clip. 'The Silent Script' was a delightful success, sparking creativity and encouraging everyone to craft imaginative dialogues and scripts.

- The 'Inter-class Mixer' was conducted on 28 June 2024 in AV2, SJCC. The objective of the event was to break the ice for the I BA students to help them get acquainted with the rest of the English Department.

- Artium hosted a gallery visit, 'Step into Stories told through Art' on 20 December 2024, at KYKYKNY Art Gallery. The visit aimed to enhance students' appreciation for art, encouraging creativity, critical thinking, and visual literacy while offering a broader perspective on art's influence in society.

- On 17 February 2025, Artium organized a student-led workshop titled 'Play, Pause, Praxis – Gender Equality' in room 116, SJCC. This event was hosted by Girija Hariharan, a Bangalore-based artist, muralist, and illustrator. Students from the Department of English actively participated, engaging in interactive games and discussions. The workshop concluded with a powerful stand against gender-based discrimination



and hate crimes.

Department of Hindi

Established in 1972, The Hindi Parishad of SJCC, driven by its motto Universal Harmony, Unity in Diversity & Light of Knowledge, is committed to recognizing literary excellence and fostering a deeper appreciation for Letters and Literature. It strives to enhance literary standards and criticism through skill development while promoting awareness of India's rich heritage through social initiatives. The Parishad encourages students to explore their potential by actively participating in organizing events, including its Intra-collegiate Fest, Indradhanush, and Inter-collegiate Fest, Nakshatra, which celebrate cultural and literary engagement.

This transition enhances efficiency by automating repetitive tasks, ensuring precise calculations, and securely storing answer sheets to prevent loss or damage. Additionally, digital tools enable faster processing, minimize manual errors, and improve tracking and transparency throughout the evaluation process.

Digitizing answer sheets allows for secure long-term storage, ensuring quick and easy access when needed. The use of QR codes helps maintain student anonymity, enhancing transparency and fairness in the evaluation process. A digital dashboard provides evaluators with an overview of a student's performance in a specific paper, streamlining the assessment process. Additionally, features such as remark sections and annotation tools enable examiners to provide precise and detailed feedback, improving the accuracy of evaluations.

The feedback from most of the stakeholders was very positive and encouraging. However, there are a few technical glitches that get resolved as the process evolves. The exam department will be moving forward evolving into a more perfect system digitally so that complete transparency, accuracy and credibility are maintained throughout the evaluation.
