The designed sessions will enable the participants to understand and critically reflect on a range of methods engaged in developing a case. Researchers, students and practitioners across disciplines will benefit from this FDP as it encompasses not only the basic concepts, techniques of case methods, but also intends to cover the entire loop of research by addressing the final outcome, i.e. publishing research output in form of case studies.

Experienced faculty and industry experts from premier institutions of the country will delivers the sessions.
