The sum total of human experiences defines the cultural anatomy of a society. It is vital to retain and engender spaces that will remain committed to upholding the socio-cultural infrastructure, a prerequisite for living life in harmony. This initiative is an attempt to reimagine the cultural consciousness that views youth as primary negotiators of cultural differences.

SJCC's Centre for Social Action and Harmony Club in collaboration with CARE, SCMI, GNOSIS, SAHAYA, and Infant Jesus Evening College are organizing the webinar series and activities to raise questions on the role of youth in building societies that thrive on cultural harmony. The sessions are curated to encourage students to participate in the process of shaping societies that operate with secular consciousness. The process of building environments free of prejudgments, where individuals engage with diverse worldviews need to begin through informal conversations on the street, in the dining room, playgrounds, among friends, and on campuses! The inaugural episode of the National Level Webinar Series titled, Youth as Facilitators for Cultural Harmony will be held on the occasion of World Peace Day, i.e., 21st September 2021.


