### **Ruby Jubilee Celebrations**

St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) came into existence in 1972 as an independent institution and has been consistently accredited by NAAC with an A Grade in the years 2000, 2007 and 2012. It was granted Autonomy in 2005 and recognized as "College with Potential for Excellence" in 2010. The 40 fruitful years has seen SJCC excelling in various streams, from strengthening student intake to curriculum development with the latest updations. ### **National Seminar:**

UGC Sponsored National Seminar on "New Strategies for Empowerment and Growth" held on 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> September 2012. The call for Papers elicited a response of sixty five articles written by over eighty eight authors. The compendium of forty six articles with the ISBN code was published on the first day of the seminar.

### **Inauguration**

For the inaugural session of the seminar the Chief Guest of the programme, Prof. M.I. Savadatti (former Vice Chancellor, Mangalore University) in his speech said that "Education system needs to be continuously upgraded". He made many comments on



problems faced in higher education: difficulty for the universities to manage with affiliated colleges; difficulty to measure growth, quality and innovation; rampant growth of coaching centres, etc.

Dr. R.S. Deshpande (Director, Institute for Socio & Economic Change, Bangalore) in his key note address commented that, the current curriculum contained too much theoretical content, compartmentalized approach and hence lacked problem solving skills. He said that there is a gap between what is taught and what is required and a gap between knowledge and skills.

#### **Technical Session - I**

The first session was taken by Dr Madheshwaran (Advisor to Govt of Karnataka Planning, Programme Monitoring and Statistics Dept). He dealt with the topic **“Access, Equity and Quality.”**

#### **Technical Session - II**

The resource person was Dr. Rajiv Prasad, Associate Professor, Amrita School of Business, Coimbatore, and the topic was: **Revamping Higher Education System - Curriculum Development and Pedagogical Methods.**

#### **Technical Session - III**

The second day started off with presentations by the participants; since the number of participants was large, three venues were fixed for presentations at which the moderators were: Prof. Dr. Cherian and Ms. Muktha, Mr. Ravi Richard, Rev Dr Stany D Souza, SJ and Ms. Veena Anand.

#### **Technical Session IV:**

Dr. Victor Louis Anthuvan, Professor, LIBA, Chennai, began his session on **“Empowering India into Higher Education”** with an intriguing question, “Is our Higher Education high enough?”

The theme was **‘Suggestive Roadmap of Higher Education in India 2020’** and the speaker of the session was Rev Dr Xavier Alphonse, Director ICRDCE and member, University Grants Commission.

## ACADEMIC PROFILE

### Admissions and Bridge Course

BBM admissions began with an entrance test conducted on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2012, followed by group discussions and personal interviews. The provisional admission process was completed by 30<sup>th</sup> April 2012.

However for B.Com admissions the delay of second PUC results by two weeks resulted in completion of the admission process only by the end of May 2012. As a consequence only the BBM students could avail of the Bridge Course classes conducted for Maths and Statistics. Remedial classes in Maths and Statistics were taken for B.Com students during the semester.

The total number of students admitted to various courses in May 2012 are B.Com - 318, BBM - 146, B.Com - Travel & Tourism - 80, M.Com - 35 & MIB - 50. The college strength now stands at 1627.

### IQAC

The year begun with focused objectives towards the NAAC re accreditation process. After submitting the Self Study Report in February 2012, the college looked forward for the NAAC Peer team visit. The committee appointed consisted of Prof. Vunnam Venkaiah, Chairperson, Dr. Fr. Davis George- Member Coordinator and Prof. Matabadal Shukla - Member who visited the campus on 11<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> December 2012.

The Peer team interacted with all the stakeholders and the concerned officers of the college who are at the helm of affairs to validate the report. The team appreciated the academic performance and reputation of the college, optimal utilization of autonomous status, well maintained infrastructure, ICT enabled teaching learning, twinning programme with foreign universities, committed staff and disciplined students.

The NAAC peer team suggested that the college should provide adequate flexibility in the formulation of the curriculum, measures to be taken to develop consultancy expertise and work towards the choice based credit system.

Based on the Self study report and the Peer team visit, the college was rated with a 3.37 CGPA - 'A' grade in December 2012.

In the month of August 2012, IQAC took the initiative of organising a PTA meeting. Feedback from Parents and their assessment of the institution were taken which were tabulated and analysed.

The IQAC facilitates the assessment and evaluation of teaching faculty by the students at the end of every semester, so that the feedback and reflection that arise from this exercise could provide valuable insight. Exit interviews from outgoing students provide insights to the institution on parameters such as relevance and satisfaction with the course, internships, testing methods, infrastructure, etc.

My appreciation to Ms. Ravi Darshini for the hard work, effort and time put into the preparation of the NAAC Self Study Report and for coordinating the activities of the IQAC.

## **CAMPUS RECRUITMENT AND INTERNSHIP**

The final placement season of the batch of 2012-13 at St. Joseph's College of Bangalore was a resounding success. The response from the industry has been overwhelming, with 13 companies competing in the process and making 154 offers to a batch in which 180 eligible students applied. Out of the 180 students who set out to pitch their skills, 94 students from B Com, 49 students from BBM and 1 student from M Com were hired.

The companies that participated in the final placement include Deloitte, Google, Goldman Sachs, Verity UBS, Target, Ernst and Young, IBM, KMPG, JP Morgan, Grant Thornton, HP and Dechlathon. Furthermore, summer internship facilities were offered by Goldman Sachs and Google.

The average CTC was 2.37 Lakhs p.a (excluding 10 students placed in Decathlon awaiting official offer letters). The eligibility criterion to attend the recruitment process in the college was 60% aggregate with a clearance in all the papers till the current semester.

Continuing the trend of the previous years, 2012-13 witnessed an efficacious placement season as 85% of the students who had applied for placement were placed in some of the country's leading companies. To further the placement cell's activities, the CVs of all students (including the ones who did not match the eligibility criteria was collected for the purpose of sending them out to various companies which had vacancies.

The Analytical ability, effective communication skills and leadership potential of our students along with the sound education that they receive at St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) has contributed towards making SJCC a preferred destination for campus recruitment.

## INFRASTRUCTURE

In order to promote excellence in teaching, and facilities for sports the following inclusions have been made to the infrastructure.

Redesigning and renovation on the ground floor to accommodate new office spaces for the Director, Secretary to Principal, Students Governor Office and HOD – BBM. Cabins for Reception, Cash/Accounts Department and Xerox center were provided for. Special space created to accommodate Placement officer and IQAC Coordinator, Renovation of rooms in the Basement to accommodate a new Media Centre for the conduct of technology based CPT and IPCC classes beamed via satellite in collaboration with ETEN Education.

The Board room was equipped with a wireless projector and remote control screen at a cost of Rupees One Lakh. Renovation of A.V. Room in the PG Department with false ceiling and audio equipment to facilitate foreign language classes. Reading Room facilities was created in the Library to enable students to bring in their learning material for study. A Reverse Osmosis Water Purification System was installed on the ground floor and the Gym room was renovated and equipments with new machines. A wooden court was laid out for table tennis by utilizing UGC funds.

Biometric system for attendance was installed and three new laptops were procured for Rs.1,20,000/- The college increased the band width of its internet connection by an additional 2 mbps. The firewall was changed and upgraded at a cost of Rs.2,10,000/- and new online test software was purchased. Additional projectors, computers, and printers were also acquired. Ongoing construction of 4<sup>th</sup> Floor, to accommodate a new Auditorium and some more classrooms.

## INTERNATIONAL EXPOSURE

### Exposure to India Programme

A group of students from Swansea University paid their annual visit to Bangalore. The college organized their month long stay from 5<sup>th</sup> August to 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2012. Lectures on topics such as “India through a Traveller’s View Point”, “Social and Cultural traditions in India”, “Pluralism in India” prepared the students for their month long stay. Yoga sessions were conducted for them and social visits included a trip to the Snehalaya Convent in Solur which provides preventive, promotive and curative health services to the poor villagers in the taluk. A trip to Narayana Institute of Neurosciences was an eye opener about the advanced technology that is available in India in the field of medical science. Industrial visit to Infosys sightseeing in Bangalore and cultural trips



to Mysore and Hampi enabled the students to have an all round exposure of the country.

### **Japanese Student Exchange Programme**

On 1<sup>st</sup> September, 2012, eight students along with a faculty member from Kobe College visited the college as a part of their cultural study for a stay of nine days. Three of our students, accompanied by staff member Ms Gretta Fertado, represented the college in the cultural exposure programme and visited Japan for nine days in October 2012. The trip included a visit to Kokuyo, one of Japan's leading companies dealing with stationery and furniture, a visit to a Buddhist and a Shinto temple, lectures on Universal Design and Business Culture in Japan, shopping at Wi shikita, sightseeing to Kyoto a place of historical and cultural importance visit to the temple of the Golden Pari Mion, Nijo Castle, shopping at Yodobashi a large electronic store and a visit to the Panasonic Centre. The SJCC students also put up a traditional dance performances and two presentation on "The Role of Women in Indian Society" and one on "Indian Economy Post Liberalisation".

### **Study Abroad Programme**

As per the terms of agreement of the MOU signed with IESEG School of Management this year, three of our students took up the dual MIB Course at Lille campus, France. Thus they are able to obtain a second postgraduate degree from a foreign university.

#### **a. London School Of Economics - Summer Programme**

Ten students from the Department of Business Management attended a 20 day course in the esteemed London School of Economics in courses such as International Business Environment and Global Communication in July & August 2012.

#### **b. International Industrial visits**

In October 2012 a group of BBM students accompanied by their HOD, Ms. Nirmala Joseph and two staff members were able to undertake an industrial cum educational visit to six cities in the USA. Amid the turbulence caused by the tornado 'Sandy' managerial skills of decision making were put to the test. However students were able to benefit from their educational experience and the visit to NASA, the White House, Epcot Centre, The University of Central Florida, Empire State Building, the Abraham Lincoln Memorial and NASDAQ were the highlights of the trip.

The post graduate students accompanied by Ms. Veena Anand and Mr. Ashfaque undertook an international industrial visit to Mauritius in November 2012. They were able to visit Port Louis, the Glass museum, Ship model factory, and University of Mauritius among other scenic tourist spots.

## STUDENT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

In order to promote wholistic development of students and to sensitise them to the needs of the society, the following programmes were conducted for the benefit of the student community.

**Social Analysis - Integral Formation Programme:** Conducted for all students by "The Youth Commission of the Karnataka Jesuit Educational Society" was held on 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> June and on 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> July 2012.

### **Orientation Programmes:**

The purpose of an orientation programme is to reinforce the motto and vision/mission/objectives of this Jesuit institution and to prepare the students for the forth coming academic year. These programmes were conducted for all undergraduate and postgraduate classes.

### **Retreat for Catholic Students:**

Faith formation for Catholic students was organised on the same dates and conducted by the Redemptorist Priests who were part of the Igniters Team and focused on the topic "Forgiveness and God's Love".

### **Student Support and Scholarships**

The Management sponsors midday meals for 90 students, and 110 students were given Management Scholarship/Fee Concessions of Rs.14,76,500/-, KPMG gave 32 scholarships amounting to Rs.6,00,000/ for need cum merit students. The college disbursed Rs.1,64,649/- received from the Government for SC/ST students and Rs.26,268/- for Minority students and Rs.12,600/- from other Government scholarships.

### **Special Programmes conducted by the Counselling Department**

The Counselling Department of the college comprises of four counsellors, three of whom are full time and one part time. Counselling provides guidance and assistance for students and gives them space to talk about their troubles and explore difficult feelings in an open environment that is very confidential. Some of the major issues dealt with include Depression, Anxiety, Relationship Issues, Poor Academic Performance and Peer Pressure.

Each counsellor meets on an average of four to five students a day and takes one or two HRD classes every day. The following are a glimpse of their responsibilities in the college

- Contacting and meeting the parents/guardians in case of unusual behaviour/attendance shortage/academic performance/other issues
- Holding discussions with the teachers regarding the progress of students
- Evaluating and selecting the students for different kinds of scholarships like KPMG, Management, etc.
- Accompanying students for industrial visits, outreach programmes or sports tournaments.

- Organising special guest lectures and seminars on various topics such as addiction, sexuality, relationships, stress management, etc.

### **Certificates Courses**

Certificate courses are conducted in the College to equip our students with wide ranging skills that are required for their professional and personal lives; to build confidence and help in acquiring lucrative jobs in the corporate world. These courses are designed in consultation and collaboration with people from the industry and the academia. While these courses are highly focused and specific they are also intended to create a general awareness of the corporate world and skills of adaptability.

Each course is conducted over one semester and is of 60 hours duration. The classes are conducted either in the morning, before the regular classes start, or in the evening. The course instructors are chosen by taking into account their expertise in the subject and their ability to communicate well with the students. ### **Enactus**

Project Unnathi is the maiden project which was started in the year 2009, to help artisans from Pottery Town to market their products more profitably. The activities of the members this year include

- Negotiations with hotels and Event Management Companies as potential customer sources. The project is currently in its final stage.

Project Arthik Gyaan: It is an ongoing program aiming to provide a definite skill set that is essential for success in a competitive environment to students from economically challenged backgrounds. The program focuses on three major areas:

- Essentials for tackling job market
- Personal Management
- Elementary courses on Computer Applications and Web browsing

During the year Enactus students from SJCC have identified and are working with students from a Community College, an NGO and a Vocational Training Centre to implement this scheme.

### **Social Extension Programme by M.Com students**

This was organized by Karnataka State Council For Child Welfare in association with the NGO “Janadhare’ with support from first M.Com students of St. Joseph’s College of Commerce. More than 200 differently-abled children from 17 special schools, showcased their talents in the cultural activities at the Bal Utsav Ulas held in the Bal Bhavan Auditorium, Cubbon Park, Bangalore. Students of SJCC, volunteered with the “Janadhara” members.

### **Visit to BOSCO**

BOSCO, is an NGO working for the Young at Risk (i.e., children living on the streets, child labourers, abandoned / orphaned children, victims of drug abuse, victims of child abuse, begging children, rag pickers etc ). It provided an opportunity for the first year

students of M.Com and MIB to reach out to the neglected children & youth on the streets of Bangalore. It was a three day outreach program initiated by Mr. Alfred Santhosh and Mr. Varun Kaul. This outreach program was an eye opener to the students as they got to witness the harsh realities of some children who struggled on the streets for survival. They realized not only how much they had been blessed with in life but also the need and responsibility to extend support to this strata of society.

July was an auspicious month with our Table Tennis teams romping home victorious in the Bangalore University Table Tennis championship. Both our men & women teams won the championship and our women's team retained the championship for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year in succession scoring a Hatrick.

Our Women's Table Tennis Team and our Throwball team won the championship at the St. Johns Medical College tournament. Our throw ball team which had won 3 championship trophies during 2011-2012.Started their campaign by winning the St. John's medical college throw ball championships.

Our women's Basketball team won the Bangalore University championships and though a regular team of softball is not there in the college our men's softball team won the Bangalore university championship this year.

Our Tennikoit women's team under the able leadership of Ms.Apeksha, a former Indian player won the Bangalore university Tennikoit championship for the 1<sup>st</sup> time in Ramnagar Jan 2013.

One of the significant achievements of the year is that our women's Athletic team won the overall team championship of 42<sup>nd</sup> Bangalore University Athletic championships in which 212 colleges participated. This is the first time in the history of our college that a women's athletic team has won the overall championship in BU sports meet. Our men athletes also won few medals.

It is a pleasure to place on record that our college has won 8 championship trophies of the Bangalore University this year, the highest number of trophies any college affiliated to Bangalore University has won and is being awarded a special trophy for achieving this distinction.
