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A Brief History of the College

St. Joseph's College of Commerce (SJCC), formerly a part of St. Joseph's College, established in the year 1882, is managed by the Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES). The BJES is a unit of a Catholic religious order called Society of Jesus founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola in 1540. The Department of Commerce was established at St. Joseph's College in the year 1949 which later became an independent college with its own building in Brigade Road in the year 1972.

The college has in its Vision a model for higher education which encourages individuals to dream of a socially just world and in its Mission a strategy to empower individuals in realizing that dream. With an objective of imparting quality education in the field of Commerce and Management, the college has been innovating in all aspects of higher education over a long period of time. These innovations were further bolstered with the granting of autonomous status to the college by UGC in September 2005. From then on, the college has taken a lead in reforming curriculum and syllabus, examination and evaluation pattern, and teaching and learning methods through the Board of Studies, the Academic Council and the Governing Council composed of eminent academicians, industry representatives and notable alumni.

The college has undergone four cycles of NAAC accreditation starting from the year 2000 in which it secured 'five stars', next in the year 2007 an 'A' grade, in the year 2012 again an 'A' grade and recently in February 2021 an 'A++'. It is one of the very few institutions in the country to have secured A++ grade in the fourth cycle under the Revised Accreditation Framework (RAF) and the first college in Karnataka to do so. The college was declared as a 'College with Potential for Excellence' in the year 2010. In 2011 SJCC was recognized as a Research Centre by Bangalore University. The college has been ranked 74th in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) ratings of Ministry of Education, Government of India, in 2021 and it has been the only college from Karnataka to make it consistently to the top 100 in the country.

The college offers diverse programmes in Commerce and Business Administration faculties. Under the faculty of Commerce, it offers B. Com (Regular), B. Com (Professional International Accounting and Finance), B. Com (BPS Industry Integrated), B. Com (Travel and Tourism), B. Com (Analytics), B. Com (Professional - Strategic Finance), M. Com (Finance & Taxation/ Marketing & Analytics), M. Com (International Business) & M. Com (Financial Analysis). Under Business Administration, it offers BBA (Regular), BBA (Entrepreneurship) and BBA (Professional- Finance and Accountancy). The college also offers six one-year Post Graduate Diploma programmes.

The college aims at a holistic and integral formation of its students, fostering in them a spirit of academic excellence, social concern and character formation, shaping them to become "men and women for and with others".

The motto of the College is 'Fide et Labore' ('Faith and Toil'), which serves as the inspiration for the vision and the educational praxis of the college.

Principal's Foreword

Distinguished Chief Guest of this evening Prof. H.S. Venkatesh Murthy, retired and most respected professor of SJCC, Principals from our Jesuit institutions, Rev. Fathers, Rev. Sisters, respected Members of the Staff, Parents, the president of the OSA- Ms. Kavitha Muthappa, all the OSA members, Guests and my dear Students – good evening and a warm welcome to the 50th College Day Celebrations of St Joseph's College of Commerce.

The year 2022 marks the 50th Anniversary of SJCC's journey as an independent college. In these five decades the college has built a rich legacy as an institution of excellence, providing holistic education to thousands of students. As we celebrate the golden jubilee of the institution, we also remember the selfless service of the previous principals, staff and students of the college who made this long and successful journey possible.

This year also marks the 500th anniversary of St. Ignatius' "Cannonball Moment" and his transformation, a significant event in the life of St. Ignatius of Loyola, which inspired a new spiritual movement all over the world.

The institutional ethos formed around cultural diversity, constitutional values and the Jesuit philosophy has shaped generations of Josephites. The college has established itself as an institution of great social relevance by adhering to its motto of 'forming men and women for and with others'. Learning at SJCC, defined by the three pillars of SJCC education: Academic Excellence, Character Formation and Social Concern, focuses on its mission to educate and empower the deserving and the marginalized.

During this academic year the college transitioned from online mode to on-campus classes and activities. The limitations

Institutional Response to Covid-19 Pandemic

In 2020, at the initial stage of the pandemic, St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) effectively responded to the challenges that the marginalized communities faced. In this regard, the institution reached out to support the vulnerable individuals and families in dealing with the issues evolved. Similarly, this academic year too, the college continued the outreach initiatives through the Outreach Department, Associations, and Clubs. A detailed report of all the initiatives undertaken by the institution is furnished below:

Vaccination Drive

SJCC in collaboration with BBMP, Ashok Nagar, organised a Covid Vaccination Drive on 5th July and 4th August, 2021 for the students, faculty members, administrative and support staff. This drive was organized to help those who couldn't take the first dose of vaccination. 219 people including the teaching and non-teaching staff got vaccinated with Covishield in the 1st drive. In the 2nd drive 96 people got vaccinated with Covaxin and 142 were vaccinated with Covishield. In total 457 people were vaccinated during the drive.

Food Distribution Drive

On account of 75th Independence Day, the National Service Scheme (NSS) volunteers of SJCC visited the Gerizim orphanage on 15th August 2021 to organize a food drive. 15 volunteers from the association attended this drive. Participating in the Drive allowed the volunteers to comprehend the challenges faced by the children living in orphanages.

Social Visit and Fruits Distribution

CSA organized Social Visit and Fruits Distribution programme on 18th September 2022. A team of 27 volunteers from the association visited Khader Sheriff Garden Slum, Lalbagh Road. Students interacted with the members of the community which helped each member to understand the unpleasant living conditions of those who live in slums. The visit also made each one acknowledges the privileges, often taken for granted.

Covid Awareness Street Play

A group of 75 members from the Hashmi Theatre Forum of SJCC formed five teams and performed more than 90 shows of the street play 'Go Corona Go', written and directed by Dr. T H Lavakumar, HoD of the Department of

Kannada SJCC. The performances were organized to create awareness among the audience on the importance of community health and hygiene during the pandemic. The play was performed in different localities of Bengaluru, such as slums, bus stands, markets, playgrounds, community centres, places of worship, migrant and nomadic communities, a few places in the tribal belt of Doddaballapura, Fakir Colony — where rag pickers from religious minority communities live. Planning for each performance was carried out bearing in mind religious diversity, caste identities, and occupational identities. The team also performed for school children and specially abled communities in association with the 'Association for People with Disability'.

The play was scripted in Kannada, English, Hindi, Telugu, and Tamil in order to make the performance series an engaging and inclusive experience. It was conceived around the theme of cultural inclusivity which enabled the audience to reflect on the need to analyse the numerous ways in which stereotypes influence social relations. The play also looked at how stereotypes prevent individuals, especially those who belong to the marginalized strata from attaining social mobility. The oral feedback received from the audience indicated that they perceived the play watching experience as an opportunity to educate themselves on diverse socio-political and cultural repercussions of the pandemic.

National Education Policy (NEP) Implementation at SJCC

Karnataka was the first state in India to implement the New Education Policy announced in the year 2020. The state set up a Task Force to facilitate the implementation of the Policy in Higher Educational Institutions across the state. As a proactive response to the Karnataka Government's decision to implement NEP from the academic year 2021-2022, St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) constituted an Internal Task Force to study the National Education Policy document and suggest a roadmap for implementing it in the institution. The NEP Task Force was formed with the following faculty members as its members:

The NEP Task Force was created to undertake the following two tasks:

1. To design the Curriculum Framework for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes offered at SJCC, in the light of Directives/Policy Framework recommended by the UGC for the implementation of NEP.
2. To suggest the procedural measures that need to be followed in the implementation of the NEP at SJCC with effect from the academic year 2021-2022.

The Task Force studied the report prepared by the Task Force for Implementation of NEP 2020 in Karnataka and other related documents including the government orders. After holding several rounds of discussions, deliberations and consultations, the SJCC Task Force prepared a roadmap for implementation of NEP at SJCC and offered a list of suggestions. The Task Force held meetings with the Registrar, Vice-principals, Head of the Departments and Programme coordinators and guided them in developing new Curriculum Framework in alignment with the NEP.

Institutional Best Practices now part of NEP

St. Joseph's College of Commerce excels in the holistic development of the student community through a set of well-designed educational practices. These practices represent the ongoing interventions made by SJCC, responding to the changes in the industry and academia to augment the standard of learning experiences. Orientation Sessions

The implementation of NEP at SJCC began with a series of orientation programmes to various stakeholders of the institution. First set of orientations were conducted to the Registrar, Vice-principals, HoDs and Programme Coordinators to help them prepare the curriculum framework. In order to prepare the administrative staff for the implementation of NEP a separate set of orientation was conducted to them. An orientation session was conducted to

the teaching staff briefing them about the NEP implementation plan at SJCC. Several rounds of orientation programme were conducted to the students in order to introduce them to the new curriculum framework.

Functional Kannada:

The teaching of Functional Kannada was made mandatory under the NEP curriculum. The Department of Kannada created an innovative and creative teaching plan for the conduct of Functional Kannada classes by using theatre, folk art and song and music. These classes helped students from outside Karnataka to pick up basic conversational Kannada. The classes were well appreciated by the students.

Open Elective and Skill Courses

Under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) Open Elective courses were offered in the third and fourth semesters. However, in the NEP curriculum Open Electives were to be offered for all of first four semesters. Despite SJCC being a single discipline college, the institution has provided students with a wide range of open elective courses like Graphic Designing, Sustainable Development, Film Criticism, Media Studies, and others, thereby providing a truly multidisciplinary education to the students. Students are also provided with discipline specific skill courses to equip them with the global competencies and skills.

Online Education

SJCC responded effectively to the challenges brought forth by the pandemic by implementing a few meticulously planned initiatives. Without much delay, the college shifted all the curricular and cocurricular activities to the online space. The college selected MS Teams as the online platform for conducting all the curricular and co-curricular activities, such as regular classes, examinations, evaluation, webinars, e-conferences, guest lectures, and cultural and sports activities. The admission process for the new batches was also completed online. The institution organized adequate number of training sessions for both the staff and students to facilitate the transition into the online mode. The shift of all activities to the online learning space allowed the faculty members to identify the possibilities in the online learning environment to improve students' overall learning experience. The faculty members took the necessary measures to involve students more actively in collaborative learning by designing innovative assignments and activities, and offering immediate feedback to students on assignments and other submissions. The Student Council Elections and all the other activities related to it, including the election campaign were also conducted online.

In times of prolonged lockdown, the institution paid due attention to ensure the emotional well-being of students and staff members through the initiatives of the Counselling Department and Campus Ministry. The Counselling Department of SJCC conducted regular online counselling sessions for students, and organized sessions on mental and spiritual well-being for the staff members. Also, the Campus Ministry conducted an online retreat for Catholic students. On the whole all these initiatives allowed the students and staff to deal with the personal and professional challenges came with the pandemic.

Commencement of Classes

SJCC commenced the activities for this academic year on 15th July 2021 for the 2nd and 3rd year UG and 2nd year PG students. The academic year started for the 1st year UG and PG students on 19th July 2021. Orientation sessions for all first-year batches were conducted online from 19th to 30th July 2022. Online classes continued till the second week of September. As an advanced measure to combat the challenges created by the pandemic, SJCC introduced Blended Teaching from 13th September for a period of one month. The college equipped all the classrooms with cameras having inbuilt speakers in all the classrooms to conduct the classes in blended mode. Training sessions for the faculty members on conducting blended classes were organized. Students from each batch attended the blended classes on campus two days in a week. The blended learning experience gave students and staff an opportunity to prepare emotionally and academically for the offline classes which commenced on 8th November.

Examination and Evaluation

The Examination Department of SJCC conducted the End Semester Examination from 2nd December onwards. The Department organized mock exams to allow students to get back to the practice of writing exams offline. Also, with a view to enhance the performance of student community and to help them efficiently handle the exam pressure, the college arranged regular revision sessions, and remedial classes. These well-structured initiatives allowed the students, especially those who needed additional academic support, to confidently prepare the End Semester Examination.

Sports and Cultural Activities

After the commencement of offline classes, the institution also organized seminars, conferences, guest lectures, and workshops across disciplines dealing with a wide range of topics. Also, the institution organized interclass and intercollege cultural festivals, association activities, and sports activities. SJCC organized Dhwani, one of the most popular intercollege cultural festivals in Bangalore, ENACT – a national level theatre festival, SPIEL – a city level sports festival, and business competitions like Chanakya and Virtuoso. Apart from these offline cultural and sports festivals, the College also organized two NSS Camps, Blood Donation Camps, Social and Industrial Visits, and a Cyclathon to create awareness on the need to reduce carbon footprint. These festivals, witnessed active participation from students from different states, and offered ample opportunities to participate in the 'beyond the classroom learning' – a unique aspect of the curriculum at SJCC.

Academic Programmes with a Futuristic Vision

All the programmes, such as the seminars, conferences, guest lectures and cultural activities that SJCC organized since the commencement

of online classes emphasized on the need to adapt to the new normal. Seminars and conferences, and guest lectures discussed diverse dimensions of the road ahead by looking at the ways to decode the changes affecting the contemporary Indian higher education sector, especially in the context of NEP- 2020. The events also addressed concerns related to the necessity for continuous innovation in the digital space, diverse aspects of new normal in travel business, and raised questions about the future scope of cryptocurrency. The discussions also shed light on the significance of devising a set of effective mechanism that synthesises both online and offline services. This enabled the institution to develop strategies to convert setbacks into comebacks and challenges into opportunities, in the new world that thrives on innovative practices.

All the above-mentioned systematic deliberations adopted by the institution enabled SJCC's transition from offline to online and later back to offline environment.

BJES Twinning Programme

The twinning programme is an outreach initiative of BJES, to bridge the gap in learning and resources between the rural and the urban society. This collaborative work of fifteen sister Institutions in Bangalore is carried out, in order to reach out to the less privileged in its mission stations of North Karnataka. Each institution of BJES works with another Jesuit institution in rural Karnataka to share its resources and expertise. BJES has the following priority areas under this programme:

- Collaborate to conscientize and empower the target groups in twinning centres
- Enhance health, hygiene and emotional well-being
- Skilled training for livelihood and employment

A four days Faculty Development Programme was conducted for the faculty members of Loyola College, Manavi. The FDP was held from 23rd August to 2021 to 26th August 2021. The FDP began with a General Orientation by the Ms. Sneha Rai and Dr. Raja Jebasingh, Vice Principals of SJCC. The faculty members of Loyola College visited the facilities at SJCC following which they attended a session on 'Introduction to Research' with Dr. Deepika

Joshi as the resource person. The next session was on 'Research Paper Writing' with Dr. Raja Jebasingh as the resource person. The faculty members were engaged with SPSS training workshop for the last two days by Dr Sridhar.

Leadership Camp for students from SJC, Hassan

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)



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Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) ensures that all the academic activities conducted on campus adhere to the established policies of the institution and all the other agencies and academic bodies under the state and central bodies. The Cell also offers support to all the departments in the college in academic matters — specifically with regard to meeting the expected level of excellence. It functions with a view to raise the benchmarks in the educational practices of the institution by applying numerous time-tested pedagogical approaches that offer ample scope to the instructors and learners to go beyond classroom learning and conventional learning practices. The Cell also plays a central role in introducing initiatives that cater to the holistic development of the student community, focusing primarily on quality enhancement in teaching, learning, evaluation, research, extension and consultancy activities.

Autonomy Status Extension

This academic year SJCC applied for the extension of its autonomous status. The A++ grade with a CGPA of 3.57 was awarded to the institution in the fourth cycle of NAAC accreditation makes it eligible for applying for the extension of autonomy up to ten years without conducting the onsite visit. Therefore, SJCC's autonomous status was extended for a period of ten years till the academic year 2031-2032.

Participation in Rankings

SJCC successfully completed the AQAR submission procedure by 24th February 2022. The college submitted details of academic activities conducted during this academic year to several top-notch college ranking frameworks i.e., ARIIA, NIRF — set up by the Ministry of Education, India, and submitted the report to AISHE portal on 18th February 2022. Also, the institution submitted the data for the surveys conducted by India Today and The Week Hansa.

Feedback

IQAC, through a structured feedback mechanism, annually collects the feedback from various stakeholders of the institution — teachers, students, employers, alumni and parents. Feedback from the aforementioned stakeholders and the subsequent actions taken play a significant role in improving the quality of the practices followed in the institution, and is instrumental in developing the plan of action for the upcoming academic year. The Cell submitted a detailed report to the Principal's Office after analyzing the feedback.

The Parent Teacher meeting for the first year B. Com and BBA students was held on campus on 26th February, 2022. Also, the class mentors organized

Open House 2021-22

The Open House is a forum which is conducted by the IQAC at the end of every Academic year to collect feedback from the students. Student representatives from all classes and associations of the undergraduate and postgraduate programmes attended the 2021-2022 Open House. It was conducted on 9th May 2022 in three batches at 10 am and 11: 30 am for the first and second batch students. The Open House for the members of Women's Forum was held on 10th May at 11 am. around 180 students attended the Open House.

The Open House discussions were conducted on the basis of the parameters mentioned below:

- Learning and evaluation process
- Infrastructural facilities, such as WIFI connection, ICT tools used in classrooms, cafeteria, computer labs, and washrooms
- Feedback on cocurricular and extracurricular activities
- Placement facilities

PARAMARSH

Paramarsh is the UGC scheme for mentoring NAAC Accreditation aspirant institutions to promote quality assurance in Higher Education. SJCC was identified as a mentor

institution under this scheme and the college had adopted 6 mentee institutions under the PARAMARSH scheme. This academic year, faculty members and students from St. Joseph's College, Hassan (mentee institution) visited SJCC campus from 7th to 14th September 2021 to understand the student support practices and extension activities. Faculty members from Loyola College, Manvi, (mentee institution) stayed at SJCC for a period of two weeks from 23rd August to 4th of September 2021 to learn the complete process of NAAC, the best practices and research activities of the institution. The extension approved for the scheme under PARAMARSH ended on 30th September, 2021. The college successfully completed the requirements of the scheme and assisted the six mentee institutions in implementing several best practices.

International Virtual Conference on 'Enhancing Teaching Competencies through Professional Ethics'

IQAC of SJCC organised a 2 Day International Virtual Conference on 'Enhancing Teaching Competencies through Professional Ethics' (ETCPE2021) on 7th and 8th October, 2021. The conference was a maiden academic interface, collaboratively organised by the institution and Globethics.net Foundation, headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland, after signing a Cooperation Agreement this year. Globethics.net is an international organization committed to furthering its vision of ethics in higher education and provides a unique platform for knowledge sharing.

Dr. Charles Lasrado SJ, Principal, welcomed the participants. Rev. Dr. Jose Nandhikkara, National Director, Globethics.net India spoke about the necessity of making learning accessible, besides touching upon the four pillars of learning. Prof. Goh Kim Chuan, former faculty member at the University

of Science, Penang Malaysia, University of Brunei and National Institute of Education, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore, was the Keynote Speaker. He reflected on the assessment levels of knowledge application and the need for HEIs to inculcate practices of knowledge dissemination blended with ethical values. Dr. Ignace Haaz, Programme Executive Online Ethics Library, Publication Manager, Globethics.net Geneva, Switzerland introduced the unique resources available at Globethics and acquainted the audience on how the resources could be accessed to optimize their efficacies as teachers and knowledge facilitators.

The first speaker for the second day Dr. Joye James SJ, Secretary, Jesuit Higher Education, South Asia emphasised on the need for the teachers to prioritise the emotional well-being of the students. Dr. John Methuselah, faculty member at the Adikavi Nannaya University, Rajahmundry, AP focused on the role of the educators in propagating ethical code in the society, and critically examined the violation of ethics in the academic world. Ms. Christine Housel, in-charge, Donor Relations and Strategic Partnership, Gloebthics.net, Geneva, Switzerland accentuated the need for a holistic approach to ethics, especially within the context of higher education.

The paper presentations in the conference converged on ethical values in higher education emerging from an array of researches based on adult education, interpretation of ethics in contemporary narratives, the implications of the National Education Policy-2020 to maximising well-being and happiness for learners and educators.

The conference received 708 registrations from across the globe including Kenya, Saudi

Arabia, Switzerland, Muscat, Abu Dhabi, Sharjah, Croatia, Singapore, Malaysia and India.

IQAC also completed the following activities in the academic year 2021-2022:

- a) IQAC conducted the Student Satisfaction Survey for the academic year 2020-2021 in November 2021.
- b) The staff evaluation by students for the odd semester was carried out between 18th and 23rd of February 2022.
- c) A survey was conducted on student progression across all programmes between 28th October and 15th November 2021.
- d) Staff feedback was collected as part of the biannual review process.
- e) The feedback on the curriculum was initiated by the IQAC, along with the HODs in the Subject Teacher Meeting and the Pre-BoS meetings, which helped in revising courses that required changes.

Faculty Development Programmes

- a) With a view to encourage research interest among the faculty members, IQAC and Innovation & Incubation Centre of SJCC in collaboration with the Centre for Intellectual Property Rights & Advocacy (CIPRA), National Law School of India organized a National Level Workshop on 'Intellectual Property Rights for Commerce and Management Institutions' in July 2022.
- b) IQAC initiated an FDP on international affairs titled "War and Peace in Czar's Land: Russia Ukraine Conflict." This interactive session was steered by Dr. Olvin Viegas, SJ on 28th February 2022.

c) The IQAC organized a presentation on “BJES Institutional Policy and Protocol on Protection of Minors and Vulnerable Adults” on 3rd March 2022. Members of BJES and faculty members of St. Joseph’s Evening College, St. Joseph’s College of Law, St. Joseph’s Institute of Management and St. Joseph’s College of Commerce attended the session. The presentation was conducted by Adv. Gerard Dsouza SJ, Director, St. Joseph’s College of Law and Fr. Felix Victor SJ, St. Aloysius College, Mangalore.

Other Initiatives:

a) The IQAC organized ‘Basic Life Support’ a Health Awareness Programme (CPR Demonstration) on 29th March, 2022. The Resource Persons were Dr. V.K Srinivas, Chief Cardiologist, Mallya Hospital Bangalore and Dr. Kiran

Kumar, Critical Care Intensive Care Physician and AHA Trainer, Mallya Hospital. The session included - simulation via video and practices with mannequins.

b) A Financial Literacy Programme ‘Savings, Investing, and the Possibility of Using Funds from Diverse Sources.’ was conducted in Kannada for the support staff of the institution on April 5th, 2022. The Resource persons were Mr. Ashoka (Assistant Professor), and Dr. Hanumanthraya, (Assistant Professor), from SJCC.

Department of English

Department of Kannada

The Board of Studies meeting of Department of Kannada was conducted on 8 October 2021 for the odd semester and on 18 March, 2022 for the even semester. Possibilities of including texts that explore the question of identities, socio-political issues, challenges faced by Indian languages and issues of national importance. The Board also approved the syllabus for Functional Kannada to be taught to the NEP batch. The third and fourth semester syllabi were revised extensively to include text from diverse genres. Special emphasis was given to audio and visual texts, folk and film texts, travelogues, and texts on regionality, gender equality and challenges faced by the Kannada language.

Department of Hindi

of B.Com and BBA. The changes were made in the light of NEP with emphasis on Hindi IT Tools as an embedded applicative unit within the course structure under skill-based components. The students will have hands on experience using Hindi IT tools. In addition, as per the NEP committee recommendations, Open Electives for the first semester and second semester of B.Com & BBA will be introduced. In the first semester Communicative Hindi will commence, and in the second semester Globalization & Hindi Literature will be introduced as per the NEP curriculum model. Also, in the first semester a basic Functional Hindi will be proposed to students who are interested to learn Hindi, especially for non-Hindi students. The internal and external assessment ratio will be 40:60 in compliance with the NEP mandate.

Outcome Based Education

The Institution follows Outcome Based Education (OBE) model of learning that has created the space for the institution to redesign its curriculum, teaching-learning process and assessment. In order to create an outcome-based curriculum, the institution's specific Programme Education Objectives (PEOs) were first designed. These objectives led to the development of Programme Learning Outcomes (PLOs). Programme Education Objectives and the Programme Learning Outcomes form the base for the development of the curriculum containing multiple courses, each with specific objectives. Course Objectives help in deriving the Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs), the competencies required and indicators of the same. At SJCC, the

Programme Educational Objectives, Programme Learning Outcomes, Course Objectives, Course Learning Outcomes, competencies and its indicators are aligned with the vision and mission of the institution.

The OBE Committee of SJCC redesigned the OBE Framework in compliance with the directives recommended by the National Education Policy 2020. The restructuring of the Curricular Framework helped the institution to offer Programmes as per the National Education Policy from 1 October 2021. The Curricular Framework of all the Programmes and syllabus of the Courses have been revised according to New OBE Framework. The new Outcome Based Education framework is comprised of the revised Graduate Attributes (GAs), Programme Education Objectives (PEOs), Programme Learning Outcomes (PLOs), Course Objectives and Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs). Hence, the Commerce, Business Administration, Languages, and Post Graduate Departments at SJCC restructured the syllabuses of the courses pertaining to all NEP batches along with the teaching-learning practices and assessment methods in alignment with the revised OBE Framework.

Interdisciplinary Approach

SJCC aims to find new ways to expand the horizons of knowledge through innovative teaching-learning practices. An interdisciplinary nature is imperative to any curricular's framework. Students pursuing both Commerce and Business Administration Programmes at SJCC are expected to complete certain number

of Core Papers in their respective field of study. Apart from the Core Papers, students are offered open elective papers from other fields of study, including Theatre, Arts and Literature. This offers students an opportunity to familiarize themselves with different fields of study to understand the world around in a better manner. Some of the Core Papers have been redesigned as interdisciplinary papers to enrich the understanding of different subjects, like the way the Business Ethics paper is designed — in this Paper concepts related to ethics in the field of business and commerce are discussed through literature. The students feedback suggests that this practice helps students in understanding the concepts and also to involve actively in the learning process.

Practice Orientation

The industry demands skilled professionals who can adapt easily to the dynamic work environment. Classroom teaching equips students with the necessary conceptual skills. The procedural skills are required in the field of commerce, and to get an exposure to the industry practices. In this regard, the practice orientation for industry is introduced into the curriculum, in a phased manner, spread across the entire Programme. In the first and the second academic years, students go on industrial visits to familiarize themselves with the work processes. After completing two years, the students are expected to do a six-week internship, which will be evaluated by the college. The Second year Master's students are allocated an entire semester for internship. They are mentored and

guided by the faculty members. Thus, the practice orientation allows the students to become familiar with the work atmosphere and equips them with the necessary skills.

Student Research Engagement

Research orientation is included in the curriculum for the graduate and postgraduate programmes. The Research Centre of the college, along with the subject teachers, guide and mentor the undergraduate and postgraduate students in research work. Research Methodology Paper is taught as part of the curriculum. Students are motivated to take up independent research projects, and the research carried out by students in the form of case studies and research papers are compiled, edited and published by the college. Students are encouraged to engage in research in the field of Commerce and Business Administration with an orientation to support the society in dealing with the diverse challenges. Research culture is an integral aspect of the curricular framework of the institution. The dissertations along with minor and major research projects allow students to become industry-ready.

Curriculum Enrichment

Holistic development of students is the central focus of education imparted at SJCC. With programmes such as BBA (Entrepreneurship), B.Com (Professional International Accounting) B.Com (BPM-Industry Integrated), B.Com (Analytics), B.Com (Professional – Strategic Finance) and B.Com (Travel and Tourism). The holistic learning practices followed by all

the departments in the institution enhance the scope of employability among the students. The curriculum is also enriched with courses like Advanced Excel, Tally, SPSS, Financial Modelling, R Programming and SAP, to give the students hands-on experience with skills that enable easy transition into the desired careers.

MOOCs

Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) are free online courses available for any aspirant to enrol. MOOCs have dramatically changed the way the world learns. MOOC platforms offer students an opportunity to pursue variety of multidisciplinary courses that would enhance students' skills.

The institution has restructured the curricular framework with a view to allow students to pursue the MOOC courses. In this regard, students pursue courses offered by SWAYAM under the Open Elective Course category.

Open Elective courses available on MOOC platforms are chosen by the students every semester, four hours per week is allotted for the students to complete the assignments and tests assigned by the Course Instructors of the courses registered.

Students started enrolling for MOOCs from June 2021, for the odd semester 2021-2022. There were a few mandatory specifications for the students to follow while enrolling for the courses in SWAYAM. The same was followed for even semester as well. Students have selected courses ranging for a period of minimum 12 weeks. It was communicated to students who

enrolled for the MOOCs that it is mandatory to take up the examination scheduled in SWAYAM to become eligible for receiving the certificate.

Evaluation Procedure

VIVA: 50 marks will be evaluated based on the viva conducted by the internal faculty members and the remaining 50 marks will be finalized on the basis of certificate received.

Teaching & Learning



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Teaching-Learning Process

It is the institution's constant endeavour to enhance and improve the teaching- learning process, by adopting innovative pedagogical methods. Every teacher is encouraged to combine traditional and innovative methods of teaching and learning. Although the teacher's role is central in controlling and directing the activity involved in a pedagogical method, emphasis is laid on the experiences and experiments of the learners too. Subject specific research for students, simulation games, role plays, case study analysis, rural camps, rural exposure programmes, social visits, internship programmes, articleship programmes and industrial visits are some of the many innovative pedagogical methods adopted.

The Covid-19 pandemic affected every aspect of human life and changed the very definition of 'normalcy'. Educational institutions were affected very badly as the entire educational process had to be migrated to online space. Institutions that did not have the necessary infrastructure and training found it difficult to adjust to the new mode of teaching and learning. Teachers had to reinvent their teaching strategy and adapt themselves to the digital world. Students had to adjust to the online spaces and reorient themselves in order to concentrate during the online classes. Apart from learning how to interact using technology teachers and students had also to deal with the economic, social and psychological impact of the pandemic and lockdowns.

St. Joseph's College of Commerce took lead in developing a safe and interactive online classroom. The institution very quickly set up the infrastructure required for online classes and developed a policy for the conduct of online classes. The teaching and administrative staff were given a thorough hands-on training to set-up online classes and develop a new online teaching strategy. Students were given several rounds of orientation to help them to login and attend online classes. Standard protocols, guidelines and FAQs were developed along with setting up of helplines for students.

The online classes demanded a new teaching-learning strategy. The institution conducted several brainstorming session and faculty development programmes and held wide ranging consultations to develop new teaching and evaluation strategies. The result was a range of innovative teaching and evaluation practices well suited for an online environment. Teachers and students were made familiar with new online tools that would help them in the teaching-learning process.

In this regard, to mould the faculty members according to the progressing education system St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) regularly organizes Faculty Development Programmes.

Jesuit Education

The FDP on Jesuit Education steered by Dr. Joye James, SJ — Secretary of Jesuit Higher Education Association South Asia (JHEASA) was conducted from 12th to 14th of July 2021. Mr. Roger Joseph Lurshay, a Leadership Trainer from Bengaluru led the first session of the FDP. The introductory session highlighted the importance of developing self-awareness as a leader to improve individual performance and thereby organizational performance as a whole. The resource person pointed at the significance of self-discovery and the impact it holds on leadership.

The second session of the FDP insisted on collaboration and conflict management. where the speaker brought up how conflicts are generated. The session also focused on effective ways to manage people, and listen to their concerns. The session was helpful in understanding the importance to practice empathy and mutual respect at workplace. The final session of the day was on Goal setting and Performance Management dealt with goal setting, and discussed ideas to enhance the performance management process.

d) E-content Development Methods and Good Practices

An FDP was conducted on the topic ‘Designing an Effective E-content Development Methods and Good Practices on 30th of November, 2021. The FDP focussed on ways to improve the opportunities to further the academic and research careers. Dr. K. a) International Webinar Series on Sustainable Development Goals - 2030

The International Webinar Series on Sustainable Development Goals-2030 was inaugurated in the academic year 2020-21 with an objective of organizing international webinars on sustainable development goals by inviting eminent speakers. Three episodes with titles 'Synergising Sustainable Goals: Envisioning the Future We Want', 'Can We Achieve the SDGs Without Human Rights?' and 'Child Rights in The Conflict Zones of Asia', were organised in the previous academic year. This year two episodes were organized which invited participants from all over the world. Along with the webinars, the IWSSDG team had organized podcasts, discussions and other events.

Episode Four

The fourth episode of IWSSDGs-2030 **"Accelerating and Revitalising Grassroot Level Education: A Perspective on India and Africa"** was held on 19th November, 2021. Creating awareness on the reality of the education system at the grassroots and rural level has become very important in the context of development. The webinar received an overwhelming participation of more than 500 people across globe from different sectors.

The speakers of the day were Mr. Kassaga James Arinaitwe, Co-founder of Teach for Uganda and Ramesh Balasundaram, Co-founder of Bal Utsav and the session was moderated by Dr. A Alan Godfrey, Assistant Professor at St. Joseph's College

(Autonomous). The webinar focussed on the challenges faced by the children in different parts of Africa and India which pose a great obstacle in the path to achieve the SDGs. Mr. Arinaitwe shed light on the hurdles in the path of educational development in Africa, especially in Uganda. Similarly, Mr. Balasundaram highlighted the efforts undertaken by Bal Utsav to increase enrolment in the primary schools, especially of the girls. Episode Five

The speaker for the day was Ms. Nafisa Barot, the founder and former Executive Director of Utthan, a public charitable trust in Gujarat, India. Ms. Barot delivered a talk titled "Are we listening to women and environment?"

The talk focused on the speaker's experience with the rural women in Gujarat, especially in the Bhal region where her organisation has supported women in accessing clean and hygienic water for domestic and other community usage. Session 1:

E-security in Banking System, highlighting the frauds that take place in the digital world and the possible preventive measures.

Session 2:

Mr. Satyaratna, Divisional Manager of Canara Bank shared his expertise on the topic Emerging Trends in the Cyber World. The session looked into the evolving trends in the banking sector and how the pandemic affected the banking sector. He explained that 'password' shall remain as a standard for cybersecurity best practices; however more companies will adopt Multi Factor Authentication (MFA) as an additional measure against data breaches and malicious attacks by 2023.

Session 3:

The webinar attempted to answer some of the intuitive questions around digital transformation in the area of marketing, accounting and human resource. The day witnessed 22 Doctoral Colloquium Presentations and 18 Research Paper presentations. At the end of the research paper presentation sessions, the evaluation sheet from each track were compiled by both the institutions and the best 3 papers were selected for the certificate of merit.

The day two of the conference began with a keynote address by Dr. Mia Mikic, Advisor at large for the Asia - Pacific Research and Training Network on Trade (ARTNeT). The first session of the day was handled by Dr. Anju Kalluvelli Janardhan, Lecturer at Crown Institute of Higher Education, North Sydney, NSW, Australia. Session 2 was by Dr. Ram Roy, Senior Academic, Eastern Institute of Technology, New Zealand. Session 3 was by Dr. Upasak Das, Presidential Fellow, Economics of poverty reduction Global Development Institute, University of Manchester, UK.

The conference was attended by 165 participants from across the globe.

During the valedictory, the “Best Paper” award winners under the ‘Research paper presentation’ and ‘Doctoral Colloquium’ category were announced by the Vice Principal Rev. Fr. Peter Arockiam SJ of St. Xavier’s College (Autonomous) Kolkata followed by the vote of thanks by Dr. Ruqsana Anjum HOD, BBA department, St. Joseph’s College of Commerce (Autonomous), Bengaluru.

Department of Post Graduate Studies

k) National Conference- ‘Decoding Contemporary Changes Affecting 21st Century Higher Education in India: In the Context of NEP- 2020 by the Postgraduate Department on 11th May 2022

On the occasion of SJCC’s Golden Jubilee Celebration, the Postgraduate Department of SJCC organized a national level conference titled Decoding Contemporary Changes Affecting 21st Century Higher Education in India: In the Context of NEP 2020 on 11th May 2022. The conference was conceptualized with a view to understand the developments in the field of higher education after the implementation of NEP 2020. The conference also addressed the growing relevance of research in higher education sector. Prof. Lingaraj Gandhi, the Vice Chancellor of Bengaluru City University and Director of College Development Council delivered the Inaugural Address.

The Keynote Address was delivered by Dr. K. Kasturirangan, Indian space scientist and Former Chief of Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), Chairperson of the NEP 2020 Drafting Committee, Chairman of Curriculum Development National Curriculum Framework (NCF), and recipient

of three major civilian awards. The Keynote Address was followed by two technical sessions. Session one titled, ‘SDG4- Flexible Learning Pathways in Higher Education Without Compromising on Quality and Sustained Learning’ was chaired by Dr. Moses Satralkar. The second session titled ‘Decoding Contemporary Changes Affecting 21st Century Higher Education in India: In the context of NEP-2020’ was steered by Dr. Chetan Singai, Associate Professor, School of Social Sciences, M.S Ramaiah University of Applied Sciences, Bengaluru.

The conference witnessed 295 participants including faculty members and research scholars representing different colleges across the nation.

Session One

Session one titled, ‘SDG4 - Flexible Learning Pathways in Higher Education Without Compromising on Quality and Sustained Learning’ was chaired by Dr. Moses Satralkar. The speaker shed light on different patterns and priorities practiced by different countries in order to ensure flexibility in learning. He spoke about how people who join higher educational institutions in countries like UK practice a routine of 3-day work and 3-day study week. He compared this scenario with that of the practices followed in countries like India. The Speaker mentioned how NEP makes the education system more flexible by allowing students to pursue dual courses, courses from MOOCs, and Coursera. Dr. Satralkar also highlighted about twinning programmes and the extended scope it offers to students in gaining multicultural experience.

Session Two

The second session titled ‘Decoding Contemporary Changes Affecting 21st Century Higher Education in India: In the

context of NEP-2020' was steered by Dr. Chetan Singai, Associate Professor, School of Social Sciences, M.S Ramaiah University of Applied Sciences, Bengaluru. The session emphasized on the theme 'Research and the Changing Role of a Teacher in the light of NEP - 2020'. He stressed on the vision of the National Education Policy 2020 i.e., to achieve 100% gross enrolment ratio in school education by 2030. Dr. Singai highlighted the role of NEP 2020 in creating a conducive environment for research. He also shared his outlook on diverse academic reforms — need for more multi-disciplinary options to students, implementing more student centric learning practices, continuous faculty development initiatives, and National Research Organization.

The conference witnessed 295 participants including faculty members and research scholars representing different colleges across the nation. The event was covered by the Daily Newspaper, and Indian Express, Bangalore.

I) One Day National Conference on 'Reinventing Business Practices- Imagining and Delivering a Robust Inclusive and Sustainable Recovery'

The Postgraduate Department of SJCC organized a one-day national level conference on 8th October 2021. Mr. Aditya Shah, CA Asha Merugu, and CA Anand Prakash Jangid were the guest speakers for the event. CA Padmini moderated the event. Principal, Dr. Charles Lasrado, SJ, delivered the inaugural address, and declared the conference open. Mr. Mohammed Ashfaque, Convener of the Conference read out the Concept note. CA Anand Prakash Jangid, the Keynote Speaker spoke about the fourth industrial revolution, the impact of this revolution on the Internet of Things, business dynamics, supply chain and finance.

Session One

Mr. Aditya Shah handled the first session of the national conference titled 'Impact of Covid-19 Pandemic on Agri Business with Special Reference to Tea Business', where he stressed on the impact of pandemic on agricultural business. According to the estimate he shared, the tea output dropped by 15% during the pandemic times. Demand and supply issues resulted in the buyers paying 4 times more than usual. Also, he opined that post pandemic the production focus of tea companies shifted to Indian Markets.

Session Two

The second session of the conference — Change of Career Opportunities in Accounting, a Post Covid-19 Scenario was steered by CA Asha Merugu. The speaker led the session around how accounting career has changed enormously with the advent of technology. The session also looked at the range of emerging opportunities in the field of accounting, core accounting domain, sustainability accounting and Programme Management Roles (PMOs). He concluded the session by highlighting the challenges brought forth by fin-techs, crypto currency, smart contracts, and Ethereum.

The Moderator of the conference CA Padmini expressed her perspective on the role technology plays in the field of accounting. The speaker explained how the pandemic made the employers ask questions about the need for a physical workspace. The speaker particularly mentioned about the four positive ways adopted by organizations to sustain during the Covid-19 pandemic. They are business model innovation, automation, and global to local and social engagement. 8 external participants and 266 students pursuing PG programmes at SJCC attended the seminar.

m) Agamy - Annual National Level Research Conference

The Post-graduation Department organized the Tenth Annual National Level Research Conference for the Post-graduate students focusing on the theme 'Progressive Transition in Business and Economics – A Sustainable Evaluation to Strategic Shift'. The sub-themes for the conference were Finance & Accounting, Business, Marketing, Human Resources and other related topics. The conference also witnessed participants from outside the college including Christ University and Sacred Heart College, Kerala.

The conference commenced with the inauguration and welcome address by the Head of Department, Dr. Komal A Dave, followed by a speech by Dr. Himachalopathy, the Chairperson of Agamy-2022. The Keynote Address was delivered by Dr. Anand Shankar Raja M from Christ University, Bengaluru, on the lines of importance of research in higher education.

The speaker mentioned primarily about the importance of networking with people. Besides making research a part of one's academic life, it should ultimately contain a motive of solving bigger problems of the society. He has also shared his thoughts on the selection of a research topic which required the scholars to deliberate upon a well-discussed topic to dwell upon.

Moreover, addressing the Post Graduate students the speaker stressed on the importance of them being equipped with skills that can help them in analyzing big data. Networking among people in the workplace carries importance and collaboration was mentioned as one of the easiest ways of connecting and expanding with the companies of people

from different institutions. Dr. Bhargavi V R gave insights on how strategic shift exists in business practices when the world is moving towards a recovery mode from the pandemic.

Post the sessions, panel chairs for various tracks assumed their roles as moderators in order to evaluate the research papers presented by the scholars. The panel consisted of Dr. Soney Matthews, Dr. Ritty Francis, Dr. Preemal D Souza, Dr. Raja Jebasingh and Dr. Shubhra Rahul. 114 students presented research papers on various topics.

n) UGC-NET Workshop

The College aims at developing students academically for the competitive world by providing coaching classes for one of the common competitive exams being National Eligibility Test conducted by the National Testing Agency.

- Guidance to face relevant other competitive exams
- Improve the skill set and prepare students for their future career

These classes were scheduled to happen on a weekly basis on Wednesdays and Thursdays conducted by Mr. Vinay Krishna. With an intention to guide students who wish to appear for UGC NET, the PG Department of Commerce at SJCC initiated the guidance program for the students from the month of August to October 2021. Examination and Evaluation

The year 2021-2022 was a year filled with a lot of uncertainties due to Covid-19 with offline and online mode of classes. Only after February 2022 the regular offline classes resumed.

Performance in examination continues to be a fundamental aspect of every student's academic life. Hence, St. Joseph's College of Commerce attributes considerable significance to the examination and evaluation process. Considering this, the Examination Department at St. Joseph's College of Commerce convened a series of meetings with the Exam Committee, the Total Quality Management Committee, and various other stakeholders. These meetings were instrumental in conducting the examinations in a hassle-free manner. The Department also organized an orientation session for students in order to familiarize them with the rules & regulations that need to be followed during the End Semester Examination.

Exam Department External Audit Report 2022

An External Audit of the Exam Department was organized by the IQAC on 22nd January, 2022. Dr. N. Arun Nagendran, former Controller of Examinations and IQAC Coordinator, Thiagarajar College, Autonomous, Madurai, and Professor Vijay Kumar, Controller of Examination, Sri Ramakrishna College of Arts and Science, Autonomous, Coimbatore were the members of the Audit Team. The suggestions and recommendations given by the Audit Team were scrutinized by the Examination Department, and the necessary actions were initiated.

New initiative 2021-2022: *Summa Cum Laude* and *Magna Cum Laude* Certificates

It has been observed that there is a constant increase in the number of students applying to the foreign universities. Most of the premier universities abroad expect students to produce evidence to prove that they figured under top 10% in the Undergraduate Examination. Considering this point, the Exam Department designed special certificates similar to the Latin Honors *Summa Cum Laude* and *Magna Cum Laude*. *Summa Cum Laude* certificates are awarded to top three students in the Undergraduate Examination and *Magna Cum Laude* to students who are placed within the top 10% category.

This initiative will be applicable to all batches of UG&PG students from the academic year 2019 and 2020 based on their total CGPA.

The End Semester Examination

The Odd Semester Examinations were conducted in two phases.

First Phase

The first phase of the End Semester Examination (ESE) was conducted for B.Com and BBA Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes from 2nd to 15th December 2021. However, exams were not conducted for the first-year students of all the NEP Undergraduate batches as the commencement of classes was delayed.

Second Phase

The second phase of the End Semester Exams was conducted for all the first year NEP batch students from 12th to 25th March 2022.

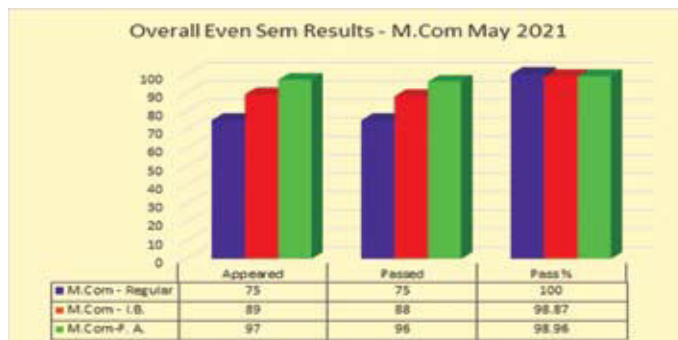
The Even Semester Examinations for all batches across programmes will be conducted from 11th June to 25th June 2022.

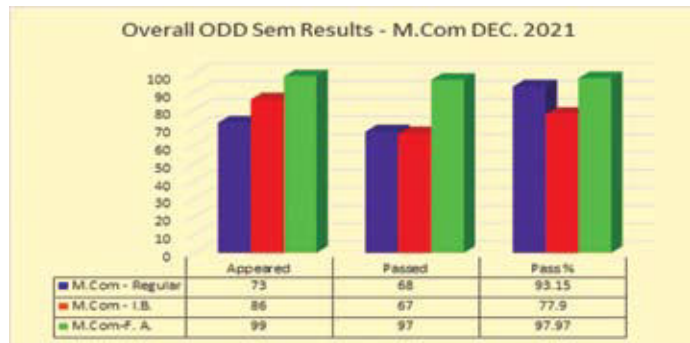
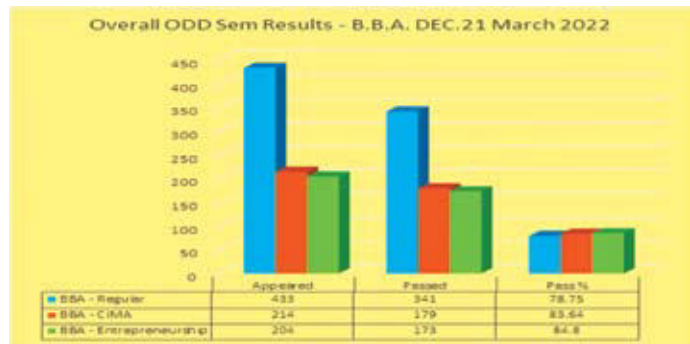

Research Culture

Research is an integral component of academic excellence at SJCC. College facilitates research in three significant manners:

- Individual Research — faculty members and students pursue research individually/jointly.
- Departmental Research — respective departments motivate students to undertake research on contemporary issues in the field of Commerce, Management and Humanities,
- Seed Money Project — faculty members conduct research on apostolic preferences to support social causes.

Department Research

B.Com, BBA and PG departments attribute great importance to research. These departments have formed exclusive associations to nurture the research culture among students. Mainframe Research Forum is an initiative of B. Com Department aimed at helping the students develop an ability to effectively engage in research. Also, to guide them in the entire process by organizing guest lectures, workshops and training programmes in the field of computer software and formatting.

The Quest Club of BBA Department helps students with logical reasoning and critical thinking. The club organizes programmes like Nirmana that allow students from BBA Department to learn the required research skills. The activities of the club supplements the skill set of students in the field of research.

The PG Department organized a one-week Training Programme in order to give an overview of research to the students working on the dissertation. A training programme was conducted to offer hands on training to students in learning SPSS and writing Literature Review was conducted for the students. The Department also organized a one-day session for students on the use E-resources and library databases to conduct research.

Individual/Joint Research:

SJCC faculty members published/presented their research outcome at various platforms of national and international repute. In this academic year the faculty members participated in 130 seminars/conferences/FDPs, published 23 research articles, and authored 2 books. Two project proposals funded by ICSSR are under progress, and the findings will be submitted to the committee concerned soon. The faculty members were part of Review Committees and Advisory Committees of reputed conferences and journals. They shared their expertise in the field of research, in the capacity of Conveners, Resource Persons, and panellists at conferences and seminars in various institutions across the country.

Activities and Achievements of the Research Centre in the Academic Year 202-2022

Research Centre renewed its Research Centre status under Bangalore City University for next five years.

Programmes Organized by the Research Centre

I. Government Sponsored Events

a. AICTE Sponsored Faculty Development Programme:

In its endeavour to enhance research-oriented teaching pedagogy, a five-day national level Faculty Development Programme was organized by the Research Centre from Oct 25 – 29, 2021. The programme was sponsored by ATAL Academy, a unit of AICTE. Dr. Deepika Joshi was the Course Director of the Faculty Development Programme. The key objective of the FDP was to help the researchers structure a case study and choose the right journal for publishing the case study. Learned professionals from IIM Calcutta, IIT Lucknow, NIT Hmirpur and VIT Vellore delivered the 14 sessions on topics related to their area of expertise. 200 participants from nine different states of the country participated in the FDP.

b. ICSSR Sponsored Experiential Training Programme:

With an objective to expose scholars to various elements of Research Methodology, a Seven -Day Training Programme was organized by the Research Centre from 18th April 2022 to 24th April 2022. The programme was sponsored by Indian Council of Social Science Research Southern Regional Centre, Hyderabad.

Experienced professors from IIM Raipur, Pondicherry University, and PSG institute of Management conducted sessions on selected topics. The Workshop was organized under the leadership of Dr. Sridhar L. S., Workshop Director and Dr. D. Rajesh Jebasingh, Workshop Co-Director. The Workshop witnessed 106 participants from eight states in India.

II. Management Sponsored Capacity Building Programmes

a. National Level Faculty development programme

In academic research, publishing articles in journals indexed by reputed agencies play a significant role in the career advancement of researchers and academicians. A National level FDP on “Research Writing and Publication” sponsored by SJCC was conducted on 10th and 11th of August 2021 by SJCC Research Centre. The first day’s session on the topic “Writing for Indexed Journal” was led by Dr. Ritika Mahajan, Assistant Professor MNIT Jaipur. The second day’s session on the topic “Identification of Fake/Predatory/Cloned Journals in Academics” was delivered by Dr. Sumit Narula, Deputy Dean Research, Amity School of Communication and Public Relations, Gwalior.

b. Faculty Development Programme for In-house Faculty Members

The in-house faculty members attended a two-day FDP on ‘Secondary Data Analysis’. Thirty faculty members participated in this programme. Mr. Gurumurthy, Assistant Manager - Customer Support for Capital Market Publishers India Pvt. Ltd., shared the knowledge required to access capital market information from the CAPITALINE Database. Mr. Bipin, Senior Deputy Director of the EPW Research Foundation (EPWRF)

in Mumbai demonstrated how to obtain time series data from the EPWRF database. Dr. P. Srinivasan, Associate Professor at the School of Management (SOM) at Presidency University in Bangalore, offered insights on using E- Views to analyse time series data. Dr. Amuthan, Associate Professor at Karunya University in Coimbatore, presented forecasting modelling. The event was sponsored by the College Management.

III. PhD program of Bangalore University

of the said objectives, the Institution has collaborated with Swansea University -UK, Kobe College-Japan, Eastern Institute of Technology - New Zealand, Seattle University, Concordia College – New York, FIGS – France, MUST–Malaysia, Women in Tech - Maldives and MAHSA, Malaysia.

a) Swansea University, UK

Swansea University is a research driven institute that thrives on exploration and discovery. It shares a profusion of values with St. Joseph's College of Commerce, such as its emphatic drive to provide top-notch education to its students. Over the past few years, the college has established a strong relationship with Swansea in terms of academic twinning and cultural exchange programmes. This initiative seeks to explore the possibility of developing collaborative and mutually beneficial activities. Undergraduate students of St. Joseph's College of Commerce have been participating in this 1 + 2 -year twinning programme since 2010.

b) Kobe College, Japan

Kobe College is an Institution of higher learning for women in the field of liberal arts and sciences, Japan. Kobe College and St. Joseph's College of Commerce have been collaborating on a cultural exchange programme from the year 2010. Every year both the Institutions host a 10- day cultural exchange programme which includes lectures on the global economy, social conditions, communicative language classes, workshop on traditional crafts and, visit historical places and industries. This year the exchange programme was cancelled due the travel restrictions imposed on account of the pandemic.

c) Eastern Institute of Technology, New Zealand

The Eastern Institute of Technology (EIT) offers a wide array of over 130 qualifications from certificate and diploma to degree and postgraduate level. A Twinning Programme with one plus two-year (one-year study in India and two years in New Zealand) is available for St Joseph's College of Commerce students. The International Transfer Programme was suspended for the past two years due to the pandemic. After two years, SJCC and EIT are happy to continue with the International Transfer Programme for the academic year 2022-2023 for which an orientation programme was conducted for students.

d) Seattle University, USA

Seattle University (SU) is a Jesuit Catholic university in the north-western United States, located in the First Hill neighborhood of Seattle, Washington. SU is the largest independent university in the Northwest US, with over 7,500 students enrolled in undergraduate and graduate programmes within eight schools, and is one of 28-member institutions of the Association of Jesuit Colleges and Universities. St. Joseph's College of Commerce has signed a MoU with Seattle University to encourage direct contact and collaboration among students, faculty and staff in the areas of research, teaching, organizing of conferences, lectures and seminars. This collaboration will benefit the students and staff of both the institutions.

e) Concordia University, USA

Concordia College is located in Bronxville, NY, a picturesque suburban village in Westchester County, just 20 miles (32 kilometers) north of New York City. It is a Christian higher education community of

learning where mutual respect flourishes, responsibility is developed and reverence for God is cultivated so that students can pursue lives of passion, purpose and service.

SJCC has a collaboration with Concordia College, New York for 2+1 year twinning programme for undergraduate degree. Upon successful completion of the academic programme of study the students will be conferred a degree by Concordia College, NY. The twinning programme was suspended in the current academic year due to the pandemic.

f) Malaysia University of Science and Technology, Malaysia

In its formative years, MUST was fully assisted and supported by MIT, a world-renowned university noted for its education and research in advanced science and technology. Malaysia University of Science and Technology emulates world class method of teaching and learning which encourages creativity, analytical thinking, problem-solving, innovation and team-building. These are qualities that have been proven to be successful in producing entrepreneurial leadership in technology and business.

An MoU has been signed with Malaysia University of Science and Technology (MUST) with the intention of exploring possibilities of offering study programs, opportunities of faculty exchange, study tours and partnering in research initiatives.

g) France International Graduate School

SJCC has initiated a partnership with France International Graduate Schools (FIGS) to collaborate in areas of joint research

and publication, resource sharing, study programs, faculty and student exchange and mutual participation in conferences, lectures and seminars.

h) Kongu Arts and Science College, Erode, India

The Kongu Arts and Science College is an arts and science college in Nanjanapuram, Erode, Tamil Nadu, India, founded in 1994. The college belongs to the Kongu Vellalar Institute of Technology Trust, which also includes Kongu Engineering College, Kongu Polytechnic College, Kongu Industrial Training Center, and the Kongu National Matriculation Hr. School.

SJCC has signed an MOU with Kongu Arts and Science College in order to share best practices between the institutions and as a result of it several visits were organized to share and understand each other's best practices.

i) Malaysian Allied Health Sciences Academy (MAHSA)

Malaysian Allied Health Sciences Academy (MAHSA) was founded in 2004. The vision of the university involves the creation of a stronghold academic excellence in the fields of Medicine, Biosciences, Dentistry, Pharmacy, Health Sciences, Nursing, Business, Finance, Hospitality Management, Information Technology, and Engineering in the South-East Asian region.

St. Joseph's College of Commerce has initiated a collaboration with MAHSA in this academic year for joint research and knowledge sharing. Also, in the coming academic years, both the institutions have

agreed to promote cultural, educational and scientific cooperation through interactive platforms such as lectures and seminar series, research work, publication and exchange programmes for students. (IWSSDG)

j) Women in Tech Maldives

Women in Tech Maldives (Women in Techmv) is a non-profit organisation working to inspire, empower and celebrate women in Science and Technology. Women in Tech Maldives aims to accelerate the growth of women in science and technology by creating opportunities that foster innovation and build the community. SJCC signed an MoU with Women in Tech Maldives (Women in Techmv) and the purpose is to actively and regularly organize several awareness programs, workshops and events which are designed around women empowerment. The collaboration with Women in Tech Maldives continued in organising the “International Webinar Talk Series on Sustainable Development Goals”.

k) Sampurna Montfort College

Montfort College Bangalore was established in the year 1995 to offer Post Graduate Diploma in Holistic Psychological Counselling. In the year. 1998, having been affiliated to Bangalore University, it started to offer M Sc in Psychological Counselling and later, in 2005 it started offering M Sc in Psychology. Montfort College became an affiliated college of Bengaluru North University in the year 2018. Currently, the college offers undergraduate (BA, BSc. B.Com and BBA) and postgraduate (MSc. Counselling Psychology and MSc. Psychology) programmes. The programmes

at Montfort provide students with the support, guidance and opportunities to effectively address issues concerning all aspects of mental health.

An MoU was signed between Montfort College and St. Joseph’s College of Commerce (Autonomous) Bangalore, to strengthen ties of friendship and to promote cultural, educational and scientific cooperation. Both Institutions believe that it is of mutual benefit to encourage direct contact and collaboration among their students, faculty and staff.

l) St. Joseph’s Evening College (Autonomous)

St. Joseph’s Evening College, affiliated to Bangalore University, was established as an independent college in the year 1972 and it is managed by the Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society. The College draws its inspiration from St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus which is popularly known as the ‘Jesuit order’.

Over the past 47 years, the college has established a name and fame of its own through its equity, academic excellence, quality and inclusive educational services. It became an autonomous institution in October 2004. It also has a rare distinction of being the only independent Evening College in the country to be conferred Autonomous status by University Grants Commission and is ranked among the top 150 Colleges in India by National Institutional ranking Framework (NIRF) and 8th best college in the state of Karnataka. The college in the year 2016 was re-accredited by NAAC.

St. Joseph’s Evening College (Autonomous) Bangalore and St. Joseph’s College of Commerce (Autonomous) Bangalore have

entered into an MoU to promote Joint research activities, publications and library exchanges, sharing of infrastructure and exchange of faculties and students for study, teaching and research purposes.

m) St. Joseph's College (Autonomous)

The college was founded in 1882, and is managed by the Society of Jesus, also known as Jesuits. St. Joseph's College, a 138-year-old institution, is one of the biggest Jesuit educational institutions in India. St. Joseph's College opens its gates to every student irrespective of caste, creed and gender. In keeping with the admission policy of the management, the socio-economically marginalized groups receive special preference. St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) Bangalore and St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) Bangalore have entered into an MoU to offer multidisciplinary courses to students under the NEP curriculum.

n) Patrician College of Arts and Science, Chennai

Patrician College of Arts and Science, established in 2001, is a co-educational self-financing institution affiliated to the University of Madras. With a noble spirit to serve humanity, the Patrician Brothers stepped into the vocation of educating the youth to free them from the bonds of ignorance. With their exceptional skill in leadership, governance and the strong hand of the Almighty, the congregation has established schools & colleges throughout the world.

Patrician College of Arts and Science and St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) Bangalore have entered into

an MoU to promote Joint research activities, publications and library exchanges, sharing of infrastructure and exchange of faculties and students for study, teaching and research purposes.

o) Sri Ramakrishna College of Arts and Science

Sri Ramakrishna College of Arts and Science is a renowned Arts and Science college in the country, where excellence is tradition. It is situated at the heart of the city and has a beautiful campus sprawling over an area of 15.9 acres with excellent infrastructure. It is affiliated to Bharathiar University and accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council since 2001, with grade A+ in its 4th cycle. The College is under the STAR College Scheme of the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India since 2019.

The college was started in the year 1987 by SNR Sons Charitable Trust. The institution fulfilled the long felt need for a premiere organisation to bring in constructive transformation in younger generation by imparting technical, behavioural and value-based education. An MoU was signed to build a collaboration between the two institutions for sharing of resources, study materials and to organise student/teaching exchange programmes.

p) St. Joseph's College, Hassan

St. Joseph's College was established in the year 2009. The college is affiliated to the University of Mysore, one of the premier universities in Karnataka. St. Joseph's Institutions in Hassan had its humble beginnings in the year 1957. It is one of the oldest educational institutions established in the heart of the city of Hassan. The

department of commerce was established in the year 2009 and the department of Business management in the year 2010. SJCC mentors the institution under the BJES Twinning Programme.

q) Loyola College, Manvi

Loyola College, Manvi, was founded by the Society of Jesus in Karnataka State, India, in 2012, in Manvi, Raichur District. It is a coeducational institution and tries to maintain a large enrolment of girls. SJCC mentors the institution under the BJES Twinning Programme.

The intention behind this MoU is to encourage the dissemination of knowledge and innovative practices in both the institutions, in the form of FDPs, and interactive sessions. The two institutions also intend to encourage the entrepreneurial mindset among the students and fostering a startup ecosystem in both the campuses.

a) Session on Copyrights in Social Sciences & Humanities

The Innovation and Incubation Centre of St. Josephs College of commerce hosted a session on IPR on 3rd March 2022. 40 faculty members participated in the session.

The first speaker was Mr. Jnana Teja, IP Attorney & Patent Agent of India (IN PA 3704), Research Associate at the DPIIT Chair on IPR under Ministry of Commerce and Industries at NLSIU Bangalore. He spoke about IPR and patents.

Mr. Divyesh Pratap, Senior Research Fellow at the National Law School of India University (NLSIU), Bengaluru was the second speaker for the session. Mr. Divyesh formerly served as a Research Officer in the NLSIU's Commons Cell and continues to be a part of the activities organized by NLSIU's Research Centre. He explained various aspects related to copyright law.

The speakers also stressed on the rights of the copyright holder, such as copyright

for research papers, PhD thesis, research projects in social sciences and humanities. They offered insights on patents and how it is an exclusive right granted for an invention.

b) Interactive Session on Fundamentals of Intellectual Property Rights

The interactive session on fundamentals of intellectual property rights was conducted online on 26th August 2021 which witnessed thirty-six participants. Dr. Rene Robin CR, Professor, Author, Social Activist, Sairam Group of Institutions was the guest speaker for the session.

Professor Robin spoke about the importance of Intellectual Property Rights and highlighted how start-ups and IPR are the pillars of higher education institutions. He also emphasized on the measures taken by governments is promoting IIC in all institutions. The speaker also stressed on the significance of the ATAL certification and different types of IPR namely, patents, trademarks, and copyrights.

c) Quarterly Mentors Meeting

The Innovation and Incubation Centre of St. Josephs College of Commerce held an interactive session on 13th August with Dr. Charles Lasrado, SJ, Principal of St. Joseph's College of Commerce, mentors, — Mr. Shashi Lewis, Mr. Phill, Mr. Sriram, Mr. Lawson, incubates, and the core team.

The meeting commenced with all the incubates introducing themselves and sharing the details about their small businesses. The mentors and faculty

members were happy to see the young minds working so hard at their ventures. Father Principal then interacted with all the students and each student was given a chance to speak to all the mentors.

d) Mentoring Workshop for the Pre-incubates

The Innovation and Incubation Centre hosted a 3-day mentoring workshop on 25th, 26th, and 27th August 2021 from 4:00 pm – 5:30 pm for the pre-incubates. The workshop was led by Mr. Shashi Kiran Lewis, mentor for the incubates at IIC, SJCC.

In the first session Mr. Shashi Kiran Lewis briefed the participants about the college motto *fide et labore*. He motivated the participants to write down their business plans in a book and read it every morning as soon as they wake up. He then gave them tips, such as creating databases of their work and being well aware of their surroundings. He also emphasized on being consistent with the goals on a day-to-day basis.

The 2nd session was held on the following day wherein the students were given an opportunity to explain the ideas they had in mind, the challenges that they may face while executing their business ideas, and more significantly to express their business. Mr. Lewis highlighted to the students how working with an expert in the field of their interest would help them in understanding the loopholes, and idea about market demand which would be useful in placing the product/ service rightly.

On the 3rd day of the workshop, Mr. Lewis reached out to those students who did not have any concrete business idea, but were enthusiastic about starting an entrepreneurial career. He discussed about the ways to develop an idea and go about the SWOT analysis.

e) National level workshop

A national level workshop was conducted by the IIC of SJCC on 27th August 2021 on the topic 'Scope of Patent Filing in Commerce and Management Institutions'. Mr. Jnana Teja

During the first session of the workshop, Mr. Jnana Teja Bandi shared his perspective on the scope of patent filing in commerce and management institutions. He spoke in detail about the rights of IPR and its different categories: which include patents, copyrights, and trademarks.

In the second session Ms. Josna Chikkodi explained the importance of IPR and gave us insights about intellectual property commercialization and monetization. She highlighted the need for IP in businesses and how the core competitive advantage of a company would be its IP portfolio. The speaker also helped the participants develop an understanding of the tools of commercialization, such as licensing, assignment, franchising, mergers acquisitions, and joint ventures. 217 students attended the workshop.

With the view to extend the horizon of knowledge disseminated, the institution collaborated with other multi-disciplinary colleges such as Sampurna Montfort College on the 12th of January 2022, Sri Ramakrishna College on the 2nd December 2021 and St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) in the month of December 2021. International Desk

The educational practices followed at St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) have been designed considering the international academic and industrial demands. The International Desk of SJCC in consultation with all other Departments of the institution designs various international exposure programmes for students, including student exchange programmes, international industrial visits, and cultural exposure programmes. The Desk also initiates academic collaboration with renowned international universities and colleges. In the academic year 2021-2022, the international interventions of the institution were limited due to the pandemic. Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) Signed

St. Joseph's College of Commerce has a working MoU with selected foreign universities for academic and cultural exposure. This year, SJCC signed a new MoU with Globethics.net. located in Geneva, Switzerland. It is an international organization focussing on creating awareness among teachers, students, and other stakeholders about the need to follow ethical practices in higher education. The collaboration aims to achieve the goal through training programmes, research, collaborative projects, and by introducing

best practices. As a result of this collaboration, a two-day virtual International Conference titled, 'Enhancing Teaching Competencies through Professional Ethics' (ETCPE2021) was organized on 7th and 8th October, 2021.

Global Summer School Programmes

The college encourages and supports its students to participate in diverse short-term programmes offered by foreign universities. In its constant effort to provide students with opportunities for international exposure, the International Desk of St. Joseph's College of Commerce encourages the students to attend the Annual Summer School Programme which invites participants from all over the world. This academic year, three students from SJCC were selected for the 3-4 weeks long Summer School Programme at London School of Economics. Additionally, one student from BBA was selected to attend the Business Summer School at Stanford University, California (USA).

In July and August, 2022 4 students from SJCC will be attending the Summer School Programmes. The candidates were selected through a meticulous process and they were given necessary support to ensure an engaging learning experience abroad.

International Conference

International desk in collaboration with IQAC, UN Global Compact Network India, Eastern Institute of Technology, New Zealand, and Sri Ramakrishna College of Arts & Science (Autonomous) Coimbatore hosted a two-day virtual International Conference on 'Synergizing Technology, Language, and Literature: Towards Mapping New Directions in Higher Education' on 21 - 22 January 2022. The Keynote speaker for the inauguration was Dr. Sumitra Kukreti, Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Indira Gandhi

National Open University (IGNOU) Delhi, followed by a panel discussion. Dr. Kirti Kapur, English professor at the Department of Education and Languages, NCERT Delhi, Dr. Smriti Singh, Professor Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Patna, Dr. Dhriti Sundar Gupta, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Rajiv Gandhi University Arunachal Pradesh and Ms. Yesmina Khedhir, University of Debrecen, Hungary. Day 1 of the virtual conference was comprised of two technical sessions, titled 'Technology, Education, and Teaching', and 'Literature and Arts'. And day 2 was comprised of five lectures. The conference ended with the valedictory speech delivered by Prof. Shridhara, Department of English, Vijaya College, Bangalore university. The conference witnessed 270 registrations, and 50 paper presentations by faculty members and research scholars from institutions across the globe.

AIIESEC International Internship

AIIESEC, an organization involving seven youth from seven different countries was established in 1948 after World War II to promote international cultural understanding through internship programmes. The organization conducts internships on world issues, leadership and management. Sainyam Dumwat of 1 B.Com completed 45 days Leadership Internship

at AIESEC in AAST Alexandria, Egypt in February and March 2022.

Foreign University Delegate Visit

SJCC has an active MoU with MAHSA University, Malaysia. As part of the ongoing collaboration, Professor Syriac Nellikunnel Devasia, Dean, Faculty of Business, Finance & IT (FOBFIT) from MAHSA visited SJCC campus on 29th April, 2022 from MAHSA University visited SJCC. Further, the institutions collaboratively organized a series of interactive sessions on prospective activities related to co-writing, e-content, supervising PhD projects, business pitching, grant for research, and student exchange initiatives in the field of Hospitality Management.

International Transfer Programme

St. Joseph's College of Commerce has a functional MoU with Eastern Institute of Technology (EIT), Napier New Zealand to offer transfer programmes, opportunities for higher studies and research. This collaboration allows BBA students of SJCC to enrol for a 3-year Twinning Programme. It is a 3-year full time programme — 1 year in India and 2 years in New Zealand. The International Desk shortlisted students for the Exchange Programme 2022-2023 and organized an online orientation session on May 26th, 2022. Mr. Siva Guda, International Marketing Manager from EIT oriented the students on the programme.

Thomas Cook

St. Joseph's College of Commerce has an active MoU with Thomas Cook to assist the institution in organizing international study tours. The study tours include visit to various universities, educational institutions and organizations of international repute. This year Thomas Cook has proposed three study tours to UK, Spain and Western Europe. Subsequently, Ms. Teja, a representative from Thomas Cook conducted an orientation session on 25th April, 2022.

Other Services

The international desk has extended support to the respective departments of SJCC in contacting Foreign Universities to conduct guest lectures, internships, seminars, conferences and workshops. The Desk assisted the BBA Department in organizing International E-conference on "Disruptions in Business and Economy: Challenges and Opportunities to a Sustainable Future" on 30th November 2021. The Desk also extended support to the IWSSDG team in collaborating with MAHSA University and Women in Tech Maldives for the lecture series. Apart from fulfilling these commitments, the International Desk also carries out academic counselling with faculty members and students about various scholarships, Global Summer School Programme (Online/Offline), and higher studies opportunities, such as Campus France's Virtual Tour to France, and SI-UK Study Abroad webinars.

Student Support

Student support is one of the significant aspects of holistic learning practices followed at SJCC. The institution, through its diversified curricular programmes and cocurricular activities, the institution aims to offer a wide variety of platforms to help students identify their passion and encourage their intellectual curiosity. In order to realize this vision, the institution has designed an effective student support framework. The institution has established mentorship programmes, workshops, pre-placement support and guidance aid amongst many others to meet the changing demands of holistic education pedagogy.

The institution also offers an inclusive learning environment for students irrespective of their social and religious backgrounds, especially to those who come from marginalized backgrounds. The college extends financial aid to deserving candidates through scholarships and freeships. Students with disabilities are also given additional support in terms of their movement on campus and during examination. The Remedial Class Committee identifies slow learners through Bridge Course Test and conducts individual tutoring sessions and

remedial classes. The Counselling Centre arranges confidential counselling sessions for students to ensure their emotional well-being. Thus, the student support initiatives of the institution have been instrumental in enhancing the overall learning experience of the student community. Above all, the multidimensional training offered at SJCC prepares students for efficiently dealing with diverse real-life challenges.

Orientation Programmes

The orientation programmes for the first year Undergraduate and Postgraduate students were held from 19th to 30 July 2021. Along with the general orientation programme, specific orientation programmes were also conducted.

The Principal welcomed all students to the campus on behalf of the management. The orientation committee briefed students about the rules and regulations of the college, the course structure, code of conduct, organization structure of BJES, and examination process and placement procedure for all students.

The orientation team updated the newcomers about the ethos of the institution and the role of IQAC in ensuring

quality of teaching and learning practices. The Counselling Centre of SJCC briefed about the holistic development programmes offered by the institution. Separate sessions were conducted to educate the first-year students about the upcoming sports events, association and extension activities.

The students also had an interactive with the faculty members of the Postgraduate Department, and Management Representatives. The values of faith and toil were highlighted throughout the orientation programme.

Student Welfare Committees

Grievance and Malpractice (Prevention & Redressal) Committee

Any type of grievance that students want to express, pertaining to other students, management, staff, infrastructure, CIA, examinations, and any other concerns can be discussed with teachers/Class Mentor/ and the Controller of Examinations respectively. It could also be brought to the notice of the committee depending upon the gravity of the issue. The committee will examine the complaint and suggest appropriate measures and actions to ensure justice to the students.

Sexual Harassment (Prevention and Redressal) Committee

The institution has constituted a Sexual Harassment (Prevention and Redressal) Committee to ensure that the students, teachers and non-teaching staff can work together in an environment that is free of gender violence, sexual harassment and discrimination. Students who come across any form of sexual harassment are expected to bring it to the attention of the Committee.

The Sexual Harassment (Prevention and Redressal) Committee of St. Joseph's College of Commerce began the meeting for its plan and action for the academic year 2021-2022. The committee oriented the members of the cell to create awareness among the student community at SJCC. The committee through the class mentors informed the new members about the Sexual Harassment (P&R) Committee. The committee conducted various talks in collaboration with women cell activities and Counselling Department of St. Joseph's College of Commerce to create awareness on the Legal protection for victims. The committee conducted an online quiz to understand the level of awareness among the students at SJCC. It was analysed that 80% – 85% of the students who took up the quiz, had an understanding on the various indicators of sexual harassment and its complexities. Therefore, quiz was a good initiative to educate the students about the differences between harassment and sexual harassment and the rights and responsibilities to act in various circumstances in a professional set up.

Anti-Ragging Cell

To root out ragging in all its forms from the institution, an anti-ragging cell has been established as per the guidelines of UGC. Ragging in any form on campus is banned by the institution. The Anti-Ragging Cell takes strict action against those found guilty of ragging or abetting ragging. All complaints pertaining to any kind of ragging by any student or group of students within or outside the campus should be reported to the 'Anti-ragging Cell'.

Equal Opportunity Centre

The institution has established an Equal Opportunity Centre as per the guidelines of

UGC to oversee the effective implementation of policies and programmes for students from disadvantaged communities, to provide guidance and counselling with respect to academic, financial, social and other matters and also to enhance the diversity within the campus. The Equal Opportunity Centre hosted a talk by Mr. Manohar Ranganathan on gender sensitivity on 24 May 2022.

Support for Girl Students

The institution strives to make the college a safe space for girl students. Girl students are provided with extra support in various ways to enhance their learning experience here. Some of them are mentioned below:

- The Ladies Room - A common space for girls with necessary facilities
- Sexual Harassment Prevention Cell - A statutory committee formed to ensure speedy grievance redressal and prevention of sexual harassment
- Health & well-being support - physical, mental health and well-being are given equal importance
- Women's Forum – an association to educate, empower and ensure an encouraging space for women that promotes meaningful discussions
- Class Ladies Representatives – To ensure representation of girl students and also to establish a formal contact point for girl students to express their concerns
- Women Empowerment Programmes - To empower girl students through talks, workshops and campaigns
- Safety & Surveillance - CCTV cameras installed to deter unruly behaviour and ensure the safety of women on campus

- Women Counsellors – personal and social counselling, specifically by lady counsellors to listen to the concerns of girl students
- Representation of Women in Student Council – the institution ensures equal gender-representation in leadership positions
- Exclusive Open House for Women – IQAC organizes Open House to listen to and address the concerns of girl students

In addition to the above stated initiatives, the college ensures that female faculty members accompany students on every off-campus camp, study tours and other academic activities. The college strives to build healthy spaces that promote harmonious coexistence of students irrespective of their gender and other backgrounds.

Bridge courses

The institution conducted Bridge Course in Mathematics and Accounts for first-year students to support those who have either not studied the subjects or found them difficult to comprehend. The Bridge Course coordinator shared the details of the Bridge Course with all BBA and BCOM first-year students during their admission. The course materials were made available on the college website. Students were asked to access the learning materials, such as the Bridge Course videos and worksheets once their admission was confirmed. The bridge course for both Basic Mathematics and Accounts have been made available online. Online content in terms of lecture series was developed with the help of institution's media team and it was made available to the first-year students.

Students started with the Basic Mathematics bridge course in the month of July 2021.

They were evaluated upon completion of the course on 16th August 2021. This was followed by bridge course on Accounts which started on 6th of September 2021 and students were evaluated on 4th of October 2021. The Bridge Course tests were conducted on MS Teams by the respective subject teachers. The results were sent to the students and the Remedial Programme Coordinator. The Remedial Class Committee identifies slow learners through Bridge Course Test and eventually these students get enrolled to the remedial classes. 593 students attended the Accounts Bridge Course and 574 students attended Mathematics.

Remedial Programme

Remedial Coaching is a midcourse improvement programme that is organized after each semester with the objective of hand-holding our students and providing learning support to improve their academic performance. The institution believes in the Latin maxim 'Cura personalis' - personal care and concern for the individual and it is one of the hallmarks of the Ignatian philosophy. Here individual care and attention is given to each and every learner. Remedial coaching is one of the efforts undertaken in this regard.

The institution restructured remedial programmes with the Peer Learning Model in order to enhance the students' interest in learning and to make the learning process a more joyful experience. In this model of peer support, the teaching is handled by a 'student-tutor' who will be responsible to teach the 'student-tutees' under the guidance of the subject teacher. The remedial coaching classes were scheduled online on the MS Teams platform as well as the offline mode to make the programme effective.

Remedial classes were conducted in the month of November 2021 for Second and third-year UG students while the first-year students had their remedial classes in the month of January 2022. The remedial program kick-started by identifying the list of courses that require additional reinforcements through remedial sessions. Each class mentor scheduled a mentor meeting and discussed with their respective classes and identified the list of courses. The list was shared by the remedial programme coordinator with the respective subject teachers. Each subject teacher identified student tutees and tutors for their respective subjects. The tutees were selected by subject teachers on the basis of low CIA grades, low attendance percentage, students with incomplete notes (in the case of practical subjects) and any student who voluntarily requests to be added to the remedial class. Proactive students who are capable of handling the peer teaching were chosen by subject teachers and were entrusted with the responsibility of student-tutor. The tutors were guided with respect to the concepts and topics to be covered by the respective subject teachers. There was an excellent collaboration among the students through this faculty-guided peer-learning model.

Remedial Sessions for 2021-22 even semester has been planned in a similar manner with 29 courses being made available for students to take benefit.

Mentorship

Mentoring is often defined as a professional relationship in which a mentor assists a student in developing specific skills and knowledge that will enhance their strengths, professional and personal growth for the future. A mentor also provides feedback and guidance for the overall development of the mentee.

Mentoring is useful, during their three-year journey of under-graduation, since students are navigating through college life, social life, career paths and also working towards forming an independent life.

An efficient mentoring system has proved to be effective in enhancing students' overall performance. It works as a support system for them and provides comfort as they know that there is someone they can turn to if they face any trouble, be it curricular, co-curricular or personal.

At St. Joseph's College of Commerce, every first-year class gets two mentors (about 40 students to each mentor). The mentors arrange meetings with students individually and help them address their concerns. Through this, mentors are able to assess student's condition on a more personal level and help or guide them where necessary.

Mentors arrange an 'Open Hour' every week to listen to students. They keep track of academic performance, leave records and meet parents when required. In addition, they educate students about the college rules and facilities that they can avail. This academic year, class mentors utilized the online platforms for meeting students and tracking their performance.

Class mentors maintain student file which contains students' details and is kept up-to-date. This file is passed on to the teachers who handles the class in the following years.

St Joseph's College of Commerce, stresses on holistic and integrated development of students, by providing them with appropriate guidance and assistance to facilitate their transition from school to college life. Through the mentoring process, the institution aims to enhance the overall development of the students. The counselling centre of the college, through four full time counsellors provides the students with emotional, mental and spiritual support, in addition to academics.

Scholarship & Freeship

The institution believes that life is lived well when it is lived generously in the service of others. The Jesuits have believed that lack of financial resources should not hinder one's educational pursuits. They have always given importance to empowering the marginalized and provide financial aid to students who deserve such support.

This academic year financial aid was given to deserving students in the form of Management Scholarships of Rs. 1,17,12,160 to 963 students.

Members of SJCC Alumni Association have contributed Rs. 13,35,000 towards student scholarships, which benefitted 119 students.

The institution facilitated the Government Scholarship of Rs. 75,200, which benefitted 80 students, SC/ST Government Scholarship of Rs. 1,38,983, which benefitted 17 students and SPDC Scholarship of Rs. 1,37,625, which benefitted one student.

Counselling Centre

INTRODUCTION:

St Joseph's College of Commerce stresses on the holistic development of the students. To achieve that objective, the college provides counselling services to the students through four full time counsellors.

The Counsellors ensure a safe and judgement-free space for students to share the concerns and challenges they face. With the help of empathic listening, students are guided towards a better understanding of themselves, their feelings, thoughts, behaviours, which in-turn empowers them.

OBJECTIVES:

- To enable therapeutic communication in an atmosphere of safety, trust and confidentiality
- To provide customized counselling support based on the evolving needs of students
- To nurture self-awareness and meaningful relationship skills
- To help in the development of emotional quotient

Counselling

Personal Counselling:

Counsellors meet students for one-on-one personal counselling sessions. Students come with issues related to low self-esteem, peer-pressure, adjustment issues, family issues, abuse, emotional issues like fear, anger, grief, anxiety, academic issues like performance, attendance, etc.

Counselling provides guidance and assistance to the students and gives them a space to talk about their concerns and explore difficult feelings in an open environment that is free from intrusion and is confidential. Counsellors assist students to gain an insight into their feelings. A supportive atmosphere is provided to the students for them to feel comfortable. With the help of empathic listening students are guided towards a better understanding of themselves which makes the students feel empowered.

Group Counselling:

The counsellors meet the students in groups of 5-8. This session provides them a safe space to interact with their peers and with the counsellor. It helps them to create bonds with each other and reduces the sense of alienation and loneliness. It helps to promote their inter-personal awareness and acceptance of others, leading to healthier relationships with the people around them.

Number of groups conducted: 86

PSYHO-EDUCATIVE PROGRAMME:

Psychological Well-being Sessions

Number of students benefitted: 940 (1st year students)

Structure:

- Sessions are kept interactive with input from the students on their understanding of the topic. As the class progresses and each topic is discussed in more detail, students are asked about their understanding or experiences of the same.

- Each session includes various activities of personal reflection, group work, art therapy, guided visualizations, etc.
- Sessions are backed with plenty of real-life examples that students can relate to.

Topics covered:

- o Myths and facts about counselling
- o Facing peer pressure
- o Self-esteem
- o Understanding our emotions
- o Anger management
- o Handling fear/anxiety
- o Building healthy relationships
- o Dealing with loss/grief

Students were asked to submit a personal reflection after each HRD session in the Class Notebook on MS Teams. This helped to assess the impact of the topic on them and also helped the students become more aware of themselves as they reflected on the topic.

PROFESSIONAL INPUT SESSIONS:

1. A session on 'Human Trafficking and Addiction', in association with the Harmony Club of SJCC, by Rev. Albert PJ, Founder and Executive Director, Abhayam De-addiction centre.

Date: 13th of May, 2022.

No. of students: 45

The session covered aspects like types of addiction, ways of trafficking, effects and ways to get out of this phase. He also illustrated few behavioural patterns to make the session interactive. It was a very interactive, fruitful and enriching session.

2. A talk on 'Human Trafficking', by Ms. Geeta Menon. A women's rights activist and a representative of Stree Jagruti Samiti and the Domestic Workers Rights Union, she has worked on issues like domestic violence, sexual harassment, issues of domestic labour, etc.

Dates: 26th May and 1st June, 2022 (4 sessions).

No. of students: 940 (all first year students)

Ms. Menon gave the students very relevant cases from her work experience as a social worker as well as showed them a documentary video on Human Trafficking, which made the seminar all the more wholesome and interesting. She educated the students on how people are trafficked and highlighted the depth at which women and children are affected by this issue.

The students were moved by her talk and had several important questions to ask. Their enthusiasm and curiosity shows us that their level of awareness has been increased and they have become sensitized to the world they live in.

Training and Placement Cell

The Placement Cell has completed another successful year of placement activities by placing more than 219 students. The placement Department started its activities by organizing a detailed orientation programme regarding the placement process. Placement at SJCC involves the two following processes:

Pre-placement Process and Skill Development

Both the aforementioned processes are designed to prepare the second-year and final-year students of the institution for placement opportunities. Second-year students take up corporate internships in order to familiarize themselves with the recruitment process and professional requirements which prepare them for the final recruitment process.

Placement Workshops 2021-2022

Employability Workshop - A two-week Employability Training Workshop was organized to finetune the skills of students and make them familiar with the industry requirements. CRT Prep conducted this workshop for the final year students from 21st August 2021 to 27th August 2021. Spread over a period of two weeks, this workshop included quantitative modules, logical reasoning, resume building, mock interviews, and soft skills development sessions.

The recruitment process commenced in the second week of August 2021. Information about placements was made available to students through ERP notifications, college SMS system, college website, social media platforms, and placement notice board.

The highest compensation offered this year has been Rs. 8,00,000 approximately, for the job position of Digital Marketing Analyst followed by 6,25,000 for analyst roles in finance and operations. Internships

In its constant endeavour to provide students the opportunity to gain a perfect blend of academic excellence and practical exposure to the industry, St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous), encourages the students to pursue internships which help the students to connect and apply the concepts learnt in the classroom. This learning experience furthers the growth of students and makes them industry-ready. Internships are a compulsory part of the Under Graduate and Post Graduate courses at St. Joseph's College of Commerce as it is believed that internships facilitate the integration of theoretical learning with its application and practice in the workplace.

Following are the different types of internships that the students are expected to complete during their Semester Break to experience the changing cultures of a fast-paced work environment and their impact on the global economy.

- a. Corporate Internships for Second year B.Com and BBA students - Academic Year 2021-22 being an unprecedented year that led to economic and social disruption worldwide also negatively impacted the corporate internship opportunities and exposure that our students used to obtain year after year. St. Joseph's College of Commerce, keeping in view the academic requirements of students, non-availability of opportunities off-campus, the digital inclination of students and the interdisciplinary requirements of Higher Education, committed itself to provide students with the opportunity of pursuing MOOC courses in lieu of Corporate Internships.

The list of inter-disciplinary courses from SWAYAM, Coursera and Udemy were made available to the students and the students of second year B.Com and BBA were expected to choose one online course of their choice, register for the course, pursue the course, take up the assignments, quizzes, assessments conducted and complete the course. After the completion of the course, the students were assessed based on the MOOC summary report submitted by them.

Around 600 second year B.Com and BBA students pursued MOOC courses in lieu of Corporate Internships during the summer of 2021 and about 300 students pursued corporate internships through the 'Work from Home' mode of operations.

b. Social Internship – St. Joseph’s College of Commerce encompasses Academic Excellence, Character Formation and Social Concern. Students of BBA (Regular) and BBA (Professional) are encouraged to take up Social Internships during their second year that will help them develop sensitivity towards social issues and engage in activities that will help make the Society better. In this regard, the prominent organisations that our students pursued their social internship for a minimum of 60 hours include U&I, Little Smiles Initiative, Durga Foundation, Collective action for Basic Rights Foundation etc.

c. Start Up Internship - The BBA Entrepreneurship Program of St. Joseph’s College of Commerce has been designed with a vision to infuse experiential and high-quality education with a global focus. This Program involves a unique and dynamic combination of creativity, innovation, critical-thinking and organization, provided on an interactive platform which hones the students into becoming competent future entrepreneurs.

In line with the objective of the Programme, even during the pandemic, the Students of 2nd Semester BBA (Entrepreneurship) students undertook internships in both online and offline mode for a period of 4 to 6 weeks during their second year.

d. Corporate Internships or Teaching Practice for M.Com (Regular) and M.Com (International Business) students - As part of the PG curriculum, M.Com (Regular) and M.Com (IB) students are required to take up either a corporate internship of eight weeks or 60 hours of Teaching Practice during their II semester summer break. Due to the pandemic, the internship component was replaced to ensure that the learning process continues despite the uncertainty of the situation. The students were provided with the opportunity to pursue MOOC courses available on the Coursera Platform. Students were expected to choose two online courses of their choice, register for the course, pursue the course, take up the assignments, quizzes, assessments conducted and complete the course. Further, the students also prepared summary reports on the specific MOOC courses completed by them. Some of the courses taken were Resilience skills in a time of uncertainty, Job success: get hired or promoted in 3 steps, Green business strategy, Get interactive: Practical teaching with technology etc. A total of 178 courses were completed by 89 students.

e. Semester Corporate Internships for M. Com (Financial Analysis) Students

As a part of the PG curriculum, II M.Com FA students are expected to complete 6 months of corporate internship in any

vertical that is finance related, during their fourth semester. The class of 50 students are pursuing a combination of both offline internships and internships through 'Work from Home' option in organizations such as Grant Thornton, HSKA & Associates, Deloitte, CSK Bank, Stockholding Corporation of India Limited etc in the divisions of Finance, Audit, Tax and Inventory Management.

The Academic Forum

Centre for Social Action

On the same evening, there was a short gathering and a talk by Mr. Katsumasa Maruo, the Deputy Council General of Japan and a performance by the college choir.
- A session on Human Trafficking and Addiction was organised by Harmony club in collaboration with Counselling Department of SJCC on 13th May, 2022. Rev. Albert P J, founder and executive director of Abhayam. The session covered aspects like types of addiction, ways of trafficking, effects and ways to get out of this phase. Youth for Democracy and Constitution

- The Youth for Democracy and Constitution association works in collaboration with Amnesty International. The association focuses on concerns of democratic rights of every individual and the involvement of the present-day youths. On 7th October 2021 involving 20 students, this was the first session conducted by YDC to familiarise the new members with the association's objectives.

- 'Enact 2022', the annual inter college fest of Hashmi Theatre Forum was organised from 4th to 6th May 2022. A Kannada play, Dhootha Ghatothkacha- an extract from the Mahabharata directed by Shivu

Honniganahalli, was performed by the members of the theatre forum. The play consisted of 29 students including the actors, dancers, musicians and technical team who performed a host show for enact. The play was ticketed and was well-received by the audience.

- “What Fools These Mortals Be” which is a dialogue in the forum’s proscenium production “A Midsummer Night’s Dream”. ‘Enact 2022’ hosted a total of 10 spectacular events with a participation of 15 colleges from 4th to 6th May 2022. The events performed included proscenium, street play, mime, mime (solo), mono-acting, femilogue, reality check, cosplay, improv and short filmmaking.
- On 22nd April 2022, 30 members of The Hashmi Theatre Forum performed a play at the auditorium of St Joseph’s college of Law, Bangalore. This story was set on the life of St Ignatius of Loyola. The play was directed by Dr Lava Kumar, the Director of the Hashmi theatre forum. This play depicts the struggles and the transformation of St Ignatius of Loyola.

- 'Initiate to Mix' was an ice breaking event held with the objective to ease the freshers into the student community and to throw light on the various college associations and clubs. This two-day event was held on the 30th and 31st of August 2021 on MS Teams platform.
- Zest was organized for all the second-year students to help rekindle the classroom environment. The event was held on the 3rd of September 2021 on MS Teams platform. Each of the eight second-year classes were assigned two student organizers from the core team of ComUnity.
- On 2nd November 2021, ComUnity conducted a workshop titled "Personal Finance and Investment". The guest speaker was Mr. Swarup Das, a senior manager working in Investment Banking Operations, State Street Bank. Students were given an insight into the functioning of the stock market, covering various aspects of stock trading.
- Inside Edge was a competition conducted in collaboration with community with 12 teams participating. The event was held during Commerce Week in the month of April and invited participants from the Department of Commerce. The event aimed at making students think creatively. Mr. Manavu Mehta, alumnus of SJCC, pursuing Financial Risk Management and working as a

Editorial Committee

- 'Skryf' a creative writing workshop was organized by B.Com Newsroom, the editorial committee of the Department of Commerce on 21st and 22nd of February 2022. The event aimed at equipping its member with creative writing and the significance of editing. The workshop ended with an editing activity.
- News Line was organized by the B.Com Editorial committee on 20th April 2022, it was the first event of the Commerce week. This event was similar to a public relations event,

where the teams were responsible for the reputation of the companies assigned to them and were required to steer away from the crises.

Colosseum

- As a part of Commerce Week, Colosseum and Techally were given a chance to conduct a marketing competition titled “Brand Race” on 21st April 2022. Aaren Thomas, SJCC alumnus was the judge for the event. The event in total had 5 teams that participated.
- On November 6th 2021, Colosseum, organized a workshop on ‘Delivering presentations that matter: A guide to Effective Public Speaking and Presentation Skills’, to teach students to thrive in public speaking. The speaker Ms. Anna Lynn Tom, a former assistant professor at SJCC. The focus of the session was on understanding the 4Ps: People, Purpose, Plan, and Practice, which were presented in detail with practical examples.

Department of Business Administration

Josephite Business Club

- The club organized an icebreaking activity IMPROV followed by the activity SCAVENGER HUNT, wherein, the students were given a hypothetical situation on survival and were asked to bring an item which they thought would help them survive. This activity familiarized many people with each other.
- The Corporate Odyssey, organized by the Josephite Business Club revived the annual tradition of hosting fests.

The season consisted of 6 events namely Marketing, Human Resources, Public relations, Entrepreneurship development, and Best Manager. The participants were provided with event-specific tips and guidance which helped the participants learn and grow every step of the way.

- Decoding Budget 2022 emphasized on the highlights of the budget with respect to various sectors such as: Railways, Agriculture, Capital Expenditure, Small Industries, etc. The resource person spoke about the budget 2022 and the changes that will affect our economy and financial markets.
- ‘Beyond The Fine Print’ was an interactive session with CA Niddhi Rathi hosted by JBC on the 1st of February, 2022 the session was on the importance of laws and regulations while running various businesses. She engaged with the audience and created an atmosphere of critical learning, which helped the participants understand the importance of having a dynamic business plan in order to make the best use of the economic regulations.
- Commixture, an ‘Ice Breaker’ event organized by The Josephite Business Club in association with the BBA Department for the first-year students. It was conducted on the 26th of August, 2021. The aim of the event was to familiarize the students with other departmental associations.
- JBC conducted an event ‘Journey from Passion to Profitability’ with

Adrian Onea as the resource person, from Sweden. This session helped the students understand the need of gaining substantial experience, following which one can freelance and try out new ventures. The key takeaway was to always take an advance of 50% from clients as graphic designing falls under intellectual property and many tend to take advantage of that very fact.

- JBC hosted 'Enhancing Presentations', an activity that demonstrated the difference between good and bad presentations by the directors. The students were asked to make presentations after the demonstration on the topics of their choice. They were instructed to meticulously consider what they would exclude, include, and explain the same.
- 'Banned Ads' was organized to provide the students with an insight of the fields of marketing and public relations of a company. The activity dealt with problem solving in marketing and public relations. The students actively participated and gained a keen insight into the roles of a marketing and PR head.
- An icebreaker session was conducted on the 14th of September 2021. The new members of the association were oriented.

Fountainhead

- The icebreaker session was conducted on the 9th of September 2021. The core team members oriented about the activities conducted at Fountainhead. An activity was conducted to get to know each other. The first years introduced themselves by talking about their hobbies and

how it has helped them through the quarantine period.

- 'Divergent' was a team-oriented activity that focussed on bringing out the different perspectives of the participants, based on a book/ movie by adding their own twist to the plot. All the participants had shown immense interest in the activity. Moreover, the presentations went on in a systematic manner where each team had lived up to the mark of the rules and regulations of the event.
- 'Atelier of Words: Writing Creatively for social media' was a workshop organized by Fountainhead with the resource person, Ms. Anna Lynn. The resource person emphasized on engaging the readers, writers, and on creative writing as a whole. After this workshop, participants had gained knowledge and confidence in creative writing.
- The event 'It's Lit' was hosted on 9th and 10th of May 2022. The ideas inspired from many genres of Literature had been converted into a series of fixtures in which students could compete. A total of four events were curated, namely, Story Pedia, JAM, Poetry Slam and Air Crash.
- Episode 2 of 'Atelier of Words' was conducted on 12th May, 2022. The resource person Ms. Nida Syeda spoke about the pre-independence era and how ethical practices were followed by different communities. She moved on to speak about the transition in the current political scenario and gave the students an enlightening explanation of free speech, and other legal terms used in ethical writing practices.

The Association of International Management Studies

- Découvri Series 1 was hosted by AIMS on the 7th October, 2021 for the 2nd and 3rd year BBA CIMA students. Students were oriented on the association and about CIMA a programme.
- Decouvrir Series 2 was a peer-to-peer learning initiative conducted on the 25th of October 2021 by The Association of International Management Studies (AIMS). This event provided the participants with cues and insights and clarifying doubts about the Case Study examinations. The event was insightful and the participants found the event extremely helpful.
- AIMS organized 'Industry Dialogue – Season 1 and 2 on 2nd November, 2021, the resource persons were Mr. Kal Ali and Ms. Janani Sekar. The resource persons spoke about their professional journey to motivate the students pursuing CIMA. The students clarified their doubts in the Q & A session.
- The Department of Business Administration in association with AIMS started the semester with an orientation on the importance of Financial Inclusion by Mr. Karnati Rakesh as the resource person. The event was conducted via MS Teams, on the 28th August, 2021. The event aimed at the difficulties that rural India faces with respect to knowledge in finance and about the strategies that have been developed to come to the aid of people in rural India.
- The association organized an icebreaker session on 9th September 2021. The activity for the session was 'Spin the wheel game'.
- Ad Invatio' was conducted on the 7th of November 2021 in order to promote creativity in marketing among the first year CIMA students. The students were assigned products and were asked to market the same to the two judges.
- 'Binge Bingo' was held on the 14th of January, 2022. The activity revolved around a game of Bingo. Students answered questions from the topics covered in the BBA2 Study Text issued by CIMA, every right answer was awarded with points. Overall, students were engaged and enjoyed the session held by the Core Committee, with positive feedback after the event.
- AIMSorganised a seminar titled 'Ready Resume'. The speaker Ms. Nireeksha introduced the students to various types of resumes and tricks to make a resume more appealing and stand out to potential employers. Students who attended the webinar found it resourceful and extremely helpful.
- 'Briefex Season 2' was a series of 3 classes covering 3 important chapters. On the 5th of March, 2022, a revision on the chapter 'Short Term Decision Making' in the classroom. Following which, 'Standard Costing and Variance Analysis' and 'Budgeting', was conducted via Zoom platform.
- The session Business Strategy Blockbuster V/S Netflix began with a short introduction on the term Business Strategy and analysed the nature of case study. The session included the analysis of the Case 'Blockbuster vs Netflix', downfall of Blockbuster and the taking over by Netflix with

the right strategy. The speaker made the discussion interactive by asking questions to the students and involving them in the discussion.

- ‘Directors Cut’ organized by AIMS introduced students to guerrilla marketing strategies. Most successful music videos of all time were taken up for discussion. Mainly focussing on the financial, cultural & social impact of strategies employed by musicians and labels to advance their music.
- The Virtuoso theme encircles around the journey of finding reliable sources while exploring unfamiliar paths. A purposeful trail to navigate around an exhilarating era of management and leadership. In the two days of Virtuoso ‘22, participants had to orient towards the effect of processes within an organization and look into the cohesive part of these processes.

Quest Club

- The Quest Club hosted an icebreaker session on 9th September 2021. The session was initiated with a formal introduction and encased a presentation with details of the core team. This was followed by introducing the members to the objectives and aims of the club.
- Prelude to Research Methodology was conducted by Dr. Sridhar L. The session was about various opportunities in the field of research and the importance of research in today’s changing markets. Also, topics like cost of research and its benefits, research design, important terminology, and the Scopus journal metrics were discussed. The resource person, furthermore, introduced the

p participants to the concept of report writing approach - introductions, setting out your research questions and aims, a literature review, study of project design, creating a timeline, and setting expected outcomes and impacts.

- ‘All About Research’ was another session hosted by the Quest Club. Dr. Babu V guided the attendees through a detailed explanation of the mechanics involved in writing a research paper. Along with the breakdown of the research process, he also elucidated on the possibility of various types of research in different fields of study.
- ‘An Orientation on Online Databases’ was an event that aimed at teaching the attendees to extract information from the college library’s databases and make them aware of the different e-resources available. Mr. Lakshmi pathi, the resource person, commenced the orientation by introducing all the different e-resources available on the SJCC digital library and gave the attendees a guided tour on how to navigate through the same. He demonstrated on finding the research articles and papers from EBSCO and Capitalline.

Leadership Development Cell (LDC)

- Exordium was an icebreaking session conducted on the 9th of September 2021. “Poster making” and “Let’s be Honest” were the two activities conducted. The participants engaged in discussion during the meeting. They were also eager to know each other and participate in further LDC activities.

- The session 'Mentorship Programme' was conducted to create a sense of trust and build a relationship between the core team and the members of the association. The session was also curated to help and guide the participants with career opportunities and choices, to help familiarise the members with the college, and to offer mentorship programmes.
- Cognito was LDC's self-development hybrid event, hosted both online and offline. The objective was to help the members understand themselves better and discover their strengths and weaknesses. It was also meant to help them overcome their challenges to achieve their personal goals, and envision their future selves. The event helped to motivate the students to go out and face the world with confidence.
- The second session of the Mentorship Programme organised by LDC was more interactive and enjoyable. The members were given a task to think of a common day-to-day problem and solution for the same. Also, the discussion focussed on capitalizing the solution in different ways.
- 'Perplexia' aimed at enhancing the problem solving and the critical analysis abilities of the members in a crisis situation. Participants had to come up with the solutions for the given case study. The case studies were based on either finance, health care or environmental affairs. With 'Perplexia', the LDC team was able to promote the crisis solving ability of the members and at the same time instil a sense of competition.
- Nexus was organized in order to enhance the networking skills of the participants and allow them to connect better within the group. The activities were aimed at getting to know the members of the group well.
- In 'Repertum' the resource person Varun Agarwal spoke about being curious in our 20s where he urged students to be curious, take risks and see what the world is like. He then spoke about self-awareness and made the session interactive. The seminar ended with a lively Q&A session.
- LDC hosted 'Ventura' on 29th April 2022. The participants were given situations to solve and were judged based on their ability to think on the spot as well as come up with creative solutions.
- Retorica was conducted on the 12th of May 2022 with Rahul Kollé, a famed TedX Speaker, show host and storyteller as the guest speaker for the event. The session was curated for the participants to learn to own the stage in less than 60 minutes by familiarizing them with the art of public speaking.
- The icebreaker session was conducted on 9th September 2021. Trivia Thursday was an ice breaker that was organized by ELI. This event served as an effective way of networking and team building. The students were kept at the edge of their seats while the teams competed with each other.
- 'Minute To Wing It' is an activity that focussed on the concept Elevator Pitch. The concept was explained and

demonstrated to the participants. The event went forward with students taking turns and presenting companies and ideas to the team that funded them, the session was a mock on 'pitch your business'.

- 'Lights, Camera, Reaction!' was a public relation based activity that was organized by ELI. This event catered to the needs of enhancing the students' communication skills as well as preparing them to manage the various issues and crises that are put forth, which helped them in working under pressure.
- 'Business Taboo' is an activity that aims at enhancing the communication and understanding skills. The session began with questions that are considered taboo in business. The session also helped the students think out loud and communicate effectively to deliver the right message and make the other person understand, while providing lateral thinking which proves to be an important skill set.
- 'REVAMP' is an activity that was conducted by ELI. Participants were asked to rebrand and revamp the products available in the household followed by eventually marketing and selling the same products. The interactive session acted as a foundation for the students to think quickly on their feet.
- In the event 'Fix-tion' the participants were asked to come up with an alternative ending or a sequel for the movies of their choice in order to increase the fan base among the audience, the entire participants rated the team presenting out of

5. The members were able to work together as a team and improve their existing skills. They developed lateral thinking which proves to be an important skill set even in the corporate world today.

Project Smiles

- 'Artsy' is an activity that was conducted by project smiles in the Government Tamil Medium School which was held for 8 students to help them learn the Japanese Art - "Origami". The children were excited to learn the craft that was made by a few association members. Infrastructure, Information and Technology



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Library and Information Services

In light of the pandemic, the library at St. Joseph's College of Commerce encouraged faculty, research scholars, and students to access the e-resources to which it has subscribed. All user communities have received online orientations on the use of Library E-Resources and Web-based Services.

IT Infrastructure

The institution on a regular basis upgrades the technological facilities in the college, given the increasing reliance on online platforms. The technological advancements adopted by the college, as part of the infrastructure development during 2021-2022, are as follows:

- The Internet Leased Line was upgraded from 350 mbps to 450 mbps to provide a good speed internet on campus.
- The Wi-Fi Access Points were increased to 29 in numbers for better connectivity and range on campus.
- To ensure smooth functioning of Blended mode classes (online and offline) 15 All-in-One Conference Camera (HD) were purchased.
- To reduce the inconvenience of the cables while using projectors, two wireless projectors were procured to test the performance which are installed in the Library and Computer Lab.
- An All-in-One Computer and an iPad were purchased for managerial use.
- The ID Card Printer for staff and students was replaced with a new one.
- For better surveillance 15 new CCTV Cameras were installed on campus adding to the existing ones.

- The annual subscription of Office 365 (Office Suite) used for Online Teaching and Learning, Training, Seminars and Conferences.
- Majority of the systems in the computer lab was upgraded to Windows 11, Windows 10 from Windows 8 and Windows 7.
- Official Email IDs were created for all the students on campus and staff members for official communication.
- DJI Mavic 3 drone camera, Rode Wireless Go 2 Microphone and Rode NGT 4 plus microphone were purchased to enhance the media centre.
- The existing Adobe Creative Cloud subscription was extended to one more year and a data recovery software 'Wondershare Recoverit' was purchased.
- The website was updated with new information related to college

Advancements in the Enterprise Resource Planning

The ERP department of the college is in the process of upgrading the software to adapt to the NEP curriculum framework. The following are the changes made in this academic year.

Admissions

- a) Proctored Online Exam module with enhanced audio & video options was introduced and used to conduct Online Entrance Exam in 2021-22.
- b) A software Update (Versions V.2) for Linways Platform was introduced with complete automation for the admission process with advanced reports for easy access.
- c) UPI payments were introduced for Quick Payments.

Reports:

- a) New modules were created to generate reports for various purposes like Academics, Admissions

and Examination, were created and modified as per the requirement.

- b) ExAT module has been mapped to a new module to generate reports required for various NAAC criteria.

Examination

- a) Marks card format was changed for the students of NEP Batch to incorporate the new scoring pattern and the naming conventions used by UUCMS for CIA, End Semester Examination.
- b) Option to include and exclude subjects for exam registration has been enabled. This option also allows customization of Hall Ticket and Timetable generation.


